OAKLAND ATHLETICS (12-11) VS. TEXAS RANGERS (8-16)

TUESDAY, APRIL 24, 2018 — GLOBE LIFE PARK — 7:05 P.M. CDT

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won three straight and seven of the last eight games after starting the year 5-10...are 12-11 for the season and the one game over .500 matches the season high (1-0 on March 29)...are 11-9 (.550) in the month of April, matching their April win total from a year ago...the win last night moved the A's into a tie for third place in the American League West after 23 consecutive days in fourth or tied for fourth...have spent one day this year tied for first, one day tied for second, one day tied for third, 16 days in fourth and seven days tied for fourth...won two of three from Boston over the weekend and have now won back-to-back series after going 0-3-2 over the first five series...swept a three-game series from Chicago last week for the first series win of the season...it came in the sixth series of the season, which matched the 1973 club for the second latest first series win of the season...the longest was in 1998 when Oakland went 0-3-3 before winning its seventh series.

THE LAST AT BAT: The A's scored six times in the ninth inning last night and lead the majors with 14 runs scored and a .324 (24-for-74) batting average in the ninth inning...Oakland has now scored 9 of its 13 runs over the last two games in its final at bat...have back-to-back last at bat wins and are 4-0 in games decided in the final at bat for the season...are tied with Toronto for the American League lead in last at bat wins and are one of four teams in the majors without a last at bat loss (Colorado, Seattle, Toronto).

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are scheduled to face a left-handed starting pitcher for the fifth consecutive game today...are 3-1 over the first four games of this stretch...for the season, are 4-6 (.400) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 8-5 (.615) against right-handers...the 10 games against left-handed starters are the most in the American League and tied for third most in the majors...are batting .281 with a .767 OPS against left-handers, .270 with an .821 OPS against righties...the batting average against lefties is second best in the majors to Pittsburgh (.287)...the batting average and OPS against righties is also second best in the majors (Boston, .294 and .869).

OFFENSE: The A's have scored 79 runs over their last 11 games, which is their best 11-game stretch since Sept. 18-29, 2009 when they also scored 79...are batting .301 (123-for-408) over the last 11 games and are averaging 7.2 runs per game with 50 extra base hits (30 doubles, 3 triple, 17 home runs)...hit .245 with 3.7 runs per game and 31 extra base hits over the first 12 contests...lead the American League in on-base percentage (.351), rank second in batting (.274), tied for second in doubles (47) and hit by pitches (12), third in runs (123), home runs (29), extra base hits (81), walks (89), slugging (.452) and OPS (.803) and tied for third in triples (5)...are tied with Miami for the most grounded into double plays in the majors (21)...are tied with Kansas City for the fewest stolen bases in the AL (5) and rank fourth in most strikeouts (207).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 3.16 ERA (27 er in 77.0 ip) and .204 (57-for-280) opponents batting average over the last eight games...have allowed one run or fewer four times over that stretch...are averaging 2.15 walks per nine innings, which is the lowest mark in the majors, and 7.36 strikeouts per nine innings, which is second lowest (Kansas City, 7.20)...have 18 wild pitches, which is second most to Pittsburgh (21)...opponents have stolen 19 bases, which is second most in the majors to the Mets (25)...have surrendered 31 home runs, which is tied for third most in the American League.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have gone back-to-back games without a decision for the first time this year...have allowed one run or fewer in five of the last eight games and are 4-1 with a 3.33 ERA (18 er in 48.2 ip) over that stretch...went 5-10 with a 5.61 ERA over the first 15 contests...Sean Manaea is 3-2 with a 1.23 ERA while the rest of Oakland's starters are 4-7 with a 6.17 ERA (61 er in 89.0 ip).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-0 on their second road trip of the season, a nine-game, 11-day trip to Texas (1-0), Houston (three games) and Seattle (three games)...went 3-5 on the first road trip to Los Angeles-AL (1-2), Los Angeles-NL (1-1) and Seattle (1-2) and are now 4-5 on the road compared to 8-6 at home...are averaging a Major League best 6.22 runs per game on the road (56 runs in 9 games), 4.79 at home...have 18 home runs in nine road games, 11 in 14 home games...have a 5.57 ERA (47 er in 76.0 ip) on the road, 3.65 at home...went 5-1 on the last homestand against Chicago-AL (3-0) and

Boston (2-1), which was the A's best homestand of four or more games since going 5-1 on a six-game homestand against Detroit and Minnesota from May 27-June 1, 2016.

THE WEST AND THE REST: The A's will play all nine games on this road trip against American League West competition...are 6-9 (.400) against divisional foes compared to 6-2 (.750) against all other teams...are batting .259 (132-for-509) and are averaging 4.47 runs per game (67 runs in 15 games) against the West compared to .298 with an average of 7.00 runs per game against everyone else...the pitching staff has a 4.74 ERA (70 er in 133.0 ip) against the West, 3.67 against all other teams.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 10-3 when scoring first, 2-8 when the opponent scores first...are 4-2 in games decided by two runs or fewer, 8-9 in games decided by three runs or more...the pitching staff has a 2.79 ERA (22 er in 71.0 ip) in the seventh inning or later, 5.04 (79 er in 141.0 ip) over innings one through six.

SCHEDULE NOTES: Last night's game was the A's first out of the Pacific Time Zone this year...follow this three-game series against Texas with a three-game series at Houston...it marks the fifth time since the Astros moved to the American League in 2013 that the A's have played Houston and Texas on the same trip...however, its just the fourth time they have played the two clubs in back-to-back series...this road trip begins a stretch where the A's are scheduled to play 19 of 25 games on the road.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have a season-low four players on the disabled list (Blackburn, Cotton, Hendriks, Powell)...have used the DL eight times this year and had a season-high seven on the DL from April 7-14...Blackburn and Cotton are on the 60-day DL...Oakland used the DL 23 times last year, which marked the third consecutive season and seventh time in the last 11 years the A's have used the DL at least 20 times...have had at least four players on the DL every day since Aug. 24, 2015, at least three every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on DL since end of 2006 season (1).

A's vs. RANGERS: The A's lead the season series, 3-2...won the first game in Texas last night after splitting a four-game series in Oakland April 2-5...the A's won the season series last year, 11-8...went 8-1 in Oakland and 3-7 in Texas...the eight home wins match the A's most ever against the Rangers (8-2 in 2001, 8-1 in 2003)...have won 10 of the last 12 home games but have lost 11 of the last 17 road games...over the previous five seasons, the A's have won the season series in odd numbered years and the Rangers in even numbered years...are 52-48 against Texas dating back to the start of the 2013 season...are 355-363 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 189-172 in Oakland and 167-191 in Texas...are 100-103 at Globe Life Park...have an all-time record of 452-444 against the Rangers/Senators franchise.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Mark Canha has hit safely in each of his last seven games (10-for-25, .400), which matches the longest hitting streak of his career (third time)...**Matt Chapman** is one of four Athletics to start all 23 games (Davis, Lowrie, Semien) and now has a consecutive games played streak of 103 dating back to last year...**Khris Davis** is a .297 (43-for-145) career hitter against Texas with 18 home runs and 41 RBI in 42 games...the home runs and RBI are his most against any team...is a .338 (24-for-71) hitter at Globe Life Park with eight home runs and 15 RBI in 19 games...**Jed Lowrie** is 17-for-40 (.425) with four doubles, three home runs, 12 RBI and six multiple hit games over his last nine games...leads the majors with 35 hits, 11 multiple hit games and five games with three or more hits and is tied for the lead with seven go-ahead RBI.

OAKLAND A'S 50th ANNIVERSARY MOMENT

In **1969** Rick Monday establishes a club record with three doubles in the A's 6-4 win at Minnesota...in **1986** Jose Rijo strikes out 14 Seattle Mariners after fanning a club record 16 batters in his previous start, but the A's lose 3-1...in **2003** Mark Mulder tosses a three-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win over Detroit.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Andrew Triggs (1-0, 5.82 ERA)

FOR OPENERS: Is scheduled to make his fifth start of the season...allowed six runs in 1.1 innings in his last start after allowing five runs in 15.2 innings (2.87 ERA) over his first three starts...is in his third season in the majors and is on his second consecutive Opening Day roster.

WITH THE BASES LOADED: Allowed a grand slam to Moncada in his last start and opponents are 2-for-2 with five RBI with the bases loaded...last year, opponents were 3-for-8 (.375) with a triple and two home runs with the bases loaded and the two grand slams tied for the most in the majors...opponents are now 5-for-10 (.500) with three home runs and 18 RBI with the bases loaded over the last two years and the three grand slams are tied with Masahiro Tanaka for the most in the majors

HOME AND AWAY: Is 1-0 with a 3.38 ERA (4 er in 10.2 ip) in two starts on the road compared to 0-0 with a 9.95 ERA (7 er in 6.1 ip) in two starts in Oakland...last year, he compiled a 2-2 record and a 3.14 ERA in five starts on the road compared to 3-4 with a 5.15 ERA in seven starts at home...is now 4-2 with a 4.24 ERA (33 er in 70.0 ip) in 19 career road games, 3-5 with a 4.72 ERA (36 er in 68.2 ip) in 21 games in the Coliseum.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has issued eight walks, five of which have come to the first batter in an inning...opponents are batting .232 (3-for-13) with a .444 on-base percentage leading off an inning...opponents are 6-for-22 (.273) with runners in scoring position but they are 1-for-10 (.100) with RISP and two outs...has a .333 (11-for-33) opponents average the first time through the lineup, .194 (7-for-36) after that...opponents are 0-for-6 when putting the first pitch in play...has surrendered both of his home runs with runners on base.

ON THE BASES: Opponents have stolen four bases with him on the mound, which is tied for third most in the American League...allowed 15 stolen bases last year, which tied for seventh most in the AL despite missing 3½ months of the season.

FIRST START: He had a no decision in the A's 3-1 win over Texas on April 2 in Oakland...blanked the Rangers on three hits and a walk over the first four innings...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed his only run in the fifth inning...Robinson walked, stole second and scored on a Gallo single...was relieved by Buchter to start the sixth and the A's scored twice in the seventh for the win.

SECOND START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 7-3 win at Los Angeles (AL) April 7...it was his first win since May 10, 2017, also against the Angels, and it snapped a career-high four-game losing streak dating back to last year...faced the minimum over the first three innings as a leadoff walk to Cozart in the first inning was erased on a double play...had a 3-0 lead when he allowed his only two runs in the fourth inning on a two-run home run by Upton...left after five innings with a 4-2 lead.

THIRD START: He had a no decision in the A's 7-4 loss at Seattle April 13...Oakland scored twice in the first, but he allowed two runs in the bottom of the first on a RBI single by Haniger and a RBI double by Seager...shutout the Mariners on a hit and two walks over his final four innings and the A's scored once in the sixth to give him a 3-2 lead...was relieved by Buchter to start the bottom of the sixth but the bullpen allowed five runs in the seventh for the blown save.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 12-11, 14-inning win over Chicago (AL) last Wednesday in Oakland...tossed 1.1 innings, which was the shortest start of his career...allowed a RBI single to Delmonico in the first inning but the A's tied the game with a run in the bottom of the first...then faced seven batters in the second and recorded just one out...yielded a RBI single to Engel and a grand slam to Moncada...left after 1.1 innings trailing 6-1.

TRIGGS vs. TEXAS: Is 1-0 with a 1.02 ERA (17.2 ip, 9 h, 4 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 15 so) in four career appearances, including three starts...had a no decision in his only start this year (see first start above)...made one appearance last year, a start in the A's 4-2 win on April 18 in Oakland...shut out the Rangers on two hits over the first five innings but Darvish blanked the A's on one hit over that Span...Triggs then allowed two unearned runs in the sixth when an Alonso error preceded an Andrus RBI single and a Mazara RBI ground out...the A's then scored four times in the bottom of the sixth for the win...his other start came in a no decision in the

2017 RECAP: Was on the A's Opening Day roster and went 5-6 with a 4.27 ERA in 12 starts before his season ended June 10 with a hip injury...had surgery to repair the labrum in his left hip July 13...was 5-2 with a 2.12 ERA and .209 opponents batting average over his first eight starts...then went 0-4 with a 9.64 ERA and .381 opponents average over his final four starts...despite missing 3½ months of the season, he tied for seventh in the American League in unearned runs (11)...allowed a .266 opponents batting average, which included .215 (23-for-107) against left-handed hitters compared to .302 (45-for-149) against right-handers...held the opposition to a .211 batting average with two outs but surrendered six of his nine home runs in that situation...allowed a .188 average against the opponents clean-up hitter and has a .179 (12-for-67) average in that situation in his career...went 4-1 with a 2.04 ERA in six starts against AL West competition, 1-5 with a 6.90 ERA in six starts against everyone else...was 1-3 with an 8.24 ERA in four starts on four days rest, 4-3 with a 2.56 ERA in eight starts on five days rest or more...allowed one earned run or fewer in seven of his 12 starts...walked one batter or fewer six times and has now issued one free pass or fewer in 12 of his 22 career starts...eight of his 19 walks came in the first inning.

MORE 2017: Won each of his first three starts and did not allow an earned run for a season-opening 17.2-inning streak without an earned run...the season-opening streak of no earned runs was the longest in Oakland history by a starting pitcher on the Opening Day roster...since the earned run became an official stat in the AL in 1913, he is just the third A's pitcher to start the season with three games of five or more innings and no earned runs...joins Eddie Rommel (1924) and Vean Gregg (1918)...received 16 runs of support in those three starts (8.15 RSA) but had just 16 runs of support over his final nine starts (3.02 RSA)...took the loss April 23 against Seattle to snap a career-best four-game winning streak dating back to 2016...allowed his only home run over his first seven starts (40.2 ip) in that outing...surrendered at least one home run in each of his final five starts (8 hr in 24.2 ip)...struck out a career-high nine batters and logged a career-high 7.0 scoreless innings April 29 at Houston...finished April with a 4-1 record, a 1.84 ERA and .194 opponents average in five starts...tied for second in the AL in wins in April and ranked seventh in ERA...the wins matched the most by an Oakland pitcher in the month of April over the last 27 years (eighth time) and the ERA was second lowest by an A's pitcher over the last 10 years (Kazmir, 0.99 in 2015)...then went 1-3 with a 3.45 ERA and .269 opponents batting average in five starts in May...tossed a career-high 105 pitches in a 3-1 win over Los Angeles (AL) May 10...was placed on the disabled list June 10 with a strained left hip...underwent surgery on July 13 in Vail, Col when Dr. Marc Philippon repaired the labrum in Triggs' left hip.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
RHP Kendall Graveman (0-4, 10.07 ERA): Is 0-4 with a 10.07 ERA over his first five starts...the four losses are tied for the Major League lead...leads the majors with 25 runs allowed and ranks second in the American League with 35 hits allowed...has allowed at least four runs while tossing 5.0 innings or fewer in each of his first five starts...that matches the longest such streak by an Athletics pitcher at any point in the season since at least 1908...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 7-3 A's loss to Boston last Friday in Oakland (5.0 ip, 7 h, 6 r, 6 er, 0 bb, 6 so)...is 4-3 with a 4.39 ERA (55.1 ip, 60 h, 28 r, 27 er, 10 bb, 29 so, 6 hr) in nine career starts against Texas...was the losing pitcher in his only start this year, a 4-1 A's loss on April 3 (5.0 ip, 8 h, 4 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 1 so)...went 1-2 with a 7.53 ERA and .305 opponents batting average in five starts this spring...was 6-4 with a 4.19 ERA in 19 starts last year in a season shortened due to two stints on the DL.
