OAKLAND ATHLETICS (13-11) VS. TEXAS RANGERS (8-17)

WEDNESDAY, APRIL 25, 2018 — GLOBE LIFE PARK — 7:05 P.M. CDT

ABOUT THE A'S: Have a season-high tying four-game winning streak and have now won eight of the last nine games after starting the year 5-10... are a season-high two games over .500 at 13-11...the two games over .500 matches the A's season-high from last year (10-8 on April 22)...have not been three games over .500 since April 22, 2016 (10-7)...have won the first two games of this series and have now won three straight series after going 0-3-2 over the first five series...the five straight series without a win matched the 1973 A's for the second longest season-opening streak without a series win in Oakland history...the longest was in 1998 when the A's went 0-3-3 before winning their seventh series...remain in a tie for third place in the American League West for the second consecutive day after 23 consecutive days in fourth or tied for fourth...have spent one day this year tied for first, one day tied for second, two days tied for third, 16 days in fourth and seven days tied for fourth.

IN APRIL: The A's are 12-9 (.571) in the month of April and need one more win to clinch a winning record in April for the second time in the last four years (13-12 in 2016)...have an .820 OPS this month, which is currently the best April OPS in Oakland history (.814 in 1994)...have a .463 slugging percentage, which is currently tied with the 2002 club for the best April slugging percentage...have been hit by a pitch 14 times, which is the most by an A's team in April since at least 1908.

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's improved to 4-1 (.800) in one-run games with the 3-2 win last night...the winning percentage is third best in the American League but the five one-run games are tied for third fewest...are 3-0 in games decided by seven runs or more...are 4-0 in game decided in the last at bat...the wins are second most in the AL (Toronto, 5) and the A's are one of four teams in the majors without a last at bat loss (Colorado, Seattle, Toronto)...are 2-0 in extra inning games and 2-0 in walk-off games.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .297 (131-for-441) over the last 12 games and are averaging 6.8 runs per game with 55 extra base hits (34 doubles, 3 triples, 18 home runs)...hit .245 with 3.7 runs per game and 31 extra base hits over the first 12 contests...lead the majors with a .353 on-base percentage...are tied for the American League lead in hit by pitches (16), rank second in batting (.272), doubles (51) and OPS (.805), third in runs (127), home runs (30), extra base hits (86), walks (93) and slugging (.452) and tied for third in triples (5)...are tied with Chicago (AL) and Miami for the most grounded into double plays in the majors (21)...have the second fewest stolen bases in the AL (6) and rank fourth in most strikeouts (215).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 3.03 ERA (29 er in 86.0 ip) and .203 (63-for-311) opponents batting average over the last nine games...have allowed two runs or fewer six times over that stretch...posted a 5.05 ERA and .287 opponents batting average over the first 15 contests...are averaging 2.15 walks per nine innings, which is the second lowest mark in the majors (Cleveland, 2.13), and 7.39 strikeouts per nine innings, which is also second lowest (Kansas City, 6.99)...have 19 wild pitches, which is second most to Pittsburgh (21)...opponents have stolen 19 bases, which is second most in the majors to the Mets (25)...have surrendered 31 home runs, which is tied for third most in the American League.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed one run or fewer in six of the last nine games and are 5-1 with a 3.13 ERA (19 er in 54.2 ip) over that stretch...went 5-10 with a 5.61 ERA over the first 15 contests...starters have walked more than two batters just once this year (4, Kendall Graveman on April 8 at Los Angeles-AL)...Sean Manaea is 3-2 with a 1.23 ERA while the rest of Oakland's starters are 5-7 with a 5.87 ERA (62 er in 95.0 ip).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-0 on their second road trip of the season, a nine-game, 11-day trip to Texas (2-0), Houston (three games) and Seattle (three games)...went 3-5 on the first road trip to Los Angeles-AL (1-2), Los Angeles-NL (1-1) and Seattle (1-2) and are now 5-5 on the road compared to 8-6 at home...are averaging a 5.90 runs per game on the road (59 runs in 10 games), 4.79 at home...the road runs per game are second best in the majors (Los Angeles-AL, 6.25)...have 19 home runs in 10 road games, 11 in 14 home games...have a 5.19 ERA (49 er in 85.0 ip) on the road, 3.65 at home...went 5-1 on the last homestand against Chicago-AL (3-0) and Boston (2-1), which

was the A's best homestand of four or more games since going 5-1 on a six-game homestand against Detroit and Minnesota from May 27-June 1, 2016.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's faced a left-handed starting pitcher in each of the previous five games and went 4-1 in those contests...for the season, are 5-6 (.455) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 8-5 (.615) against right-handers...the 11 games against left-handed starters are the most in the American League and tied for second most in the majors.

THE WEST AND THE REST: The A's will play all nine games on this road trip against American League West competition...are 7-9 (.438) against divisional foes compared to 6-2 (.750) against all other teams...are batting .258 (140-for-542) and are averaging 4.38 runs per game (70 runs in 16 games) against the West compared to .298 with an average of 7.00 runs per game against everyone else...the pitching staff has a 4.56 ERA (72 er in 142.0 ip) against the West, 3.67 against all other teams.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 11-3 when scoring first, 2-8 when the opponent scores first...are 3-0 on Wednesday...lead the majors with 14 runs scored in the ninth inning...the pitching staff has a 2.80 ERA (23 er in 74.0 ip) in the seventh inning or later, 4.90 (80 er in 147.0 ip) over innings one through six.

SCHEDULE NOTES: Following this three-games against Texas, the A's travel to Houston for a three-game series...it marks the fifth time since the Astros moved to the American League in 2013 that the A's have played Houston and Texas on the same trip...however, its just the fourth time they have played the two clubs in back-to-back series...this road trip begins a stretch where the A's are scheduled to play 19 of 25 games on the road.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have a season-low four players on the disabled list (Blackburn, Cotton, Hendriks, Powell)...have used the DL eight times this year and had a season-high seven on the DL from April 7-14...Blackburn and Cotton are on the 60-day DL...Oakland used the DL 23 times last year, which marked the third consecutive season and seventh time in the last 11 years the A's have used the DL at least 20 times...have had at least four players on the DL every day since Aug. 24, 2015, at least three every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on DL since end of 2006 season (1).

A's vs. RANGERS: The A's lead the season series, 4-2...have won the first two games in Texas after splitting a four-game series in Oakland April 2-5...the A's won the season series last year, 11-8...went 8-1 in Oakland and 3-7 in Texas...the eight home wins match the A's most ever against the Rangers (8-2 in 2001, 8-1 in 2003)...have won 10 of the last 12 home games but have lost 11 of the last 18 road games...over the previous five seasons, the A's have won the season series in odd numbered years and the Rangers in even numbered years...are 53-48 against Texas dating back to the start of the 2013 season...are 356-363 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 189-172 in Oakland and 168-191 in Texas...are 101-103 at Globe Life Park...have an all-time record of 453-444 against the Rangers/Senators franchise.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Mark Canha extended his hitting streak to a career-high eight games last night...is 11-for-29 (.379) during the streak...**Khris Davis** is a .287 (43-for-150) career hitter against Texas with 18 home runs and 41 RBI in 43 games...the home runs and RBI are his most against any team...is a .316 (24-for-76) hitter at Globe Life Park with eight home runs and 15 RBI in 20 games...**Jed Lowrie** leads the majors with a .363 batting average, 37 hits, 12 multiple hit games, eight go-ahead RBI and five games with three or more hits and is tied for the lead with 63 total bases...is 19-for-44 (.432) with five doubles, three home runs, 13 RBI and seven multiple hit games over his last 10 games.

OAKLAND A'S 50th ANNIVERSARY MOMENT

In 1987 Dennis Eckersley pitches the final 2 1/3 innings of the A's 7-3 win over Seattle for his first save in an Oakland uniform...he would go on to save an Oakland record 320 games...in 2002 Miguel Tejada hits his 100th career home run in the A's 6-2 win over New York.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Kendall Graveman (0-4, 10.07 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is 0-4 with a 10.07 ERA over his first five starts...the four losses are tied for the Major League lead...all four have come in April, which matches the most April losses in Oakland history (13th time, last: Anderson and Parker in 2013)...no pitcher in Athletics history has ever lost five games in April...leads the majors with 25 runs allowed and is tied for second in the American League with 35 hits allowed...his ERA is the highest in the majors among pitchers with at least 13 innings pitched...is the first A's pitcher on an Opening Day roster to start the year 0-4 since Jarrod Parker in 2013...the last to go 0-5 is Joe Blanton in 2005...is in his fifth season in the majors and is on his fourth consecutive Opening Day roster.

FIVE INNINGS OR FEWER, FOUR RUNS OR MORE: Has allowed at least four runs while tossing 5.0 innings or fewer in each of his first five starts...that matches the longest such streak by an Athletics pitcher at any point in the season since at least 1908...he is the sixth pitcher to do it, the first since Daniel Gossett (Sept. 19, 2017-April 6, 2018)...the only one to do it to start the A's season is Rick Langford in 1983 but he had two stints in the minors over that stretch, which spanned from April 4 to July 17 (0-4, 13.50 ERA)...Graveman is the only one to do it while allowing at least one home run in each start.

THE LONG BALL: Has surrendered at least one home run in each of his first five starts and now has a streak of seven consecutive games with a home run allowed dating back to Sept. 22, 2017 (nine home runs total)...has surrendered seven home runs in 22.1 innings this year (2.82 per nine innings) after allowing 12 in 105.1 innings last year (1.03 per nine innings)...the seven home runs are tied for third most in the American League (Hamels, TEX and Tomlin, CLE 8 each)...five of the seven home runs are solo shots...last year, eight of his 12 home runs came with runners on base.

OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average breaks down to .316 (18-for-57) against right-handed hitters compared to .415 (17-for-41) with six of his seven walks against left-handers...held lefties to a .238 batting average last year...opponents are 10-for-22 (.455) with runners in scoring position and 9-for-25 (.360) with three home runs when leading off an inning...they are 8-for-9 (.889) with two home runs when putting the first pitch in play...the opponents five hitter is 7-for-8 (.875) with two doubles, a triple and a home run.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 0-2 with a 9.00 ERA (15 er in 15.0 ip) in three starts in Oakland compared to 0-2 with a 12.27 ERA (10 er in 7.1 ip) in two starts on the road...last year, he went 5-0 with a 2.94 ERA in 11 starts at home compared to 1-4 with a 6.39 ERA in eight starts on the road...joins Kenny Rogers (11-0 in 1998) and Todd Burns (5-0 in 1988) as the only starting pitchers in Oakland history to go undefeated at home with five or more decisions...in four seasons with the A's, he is 12-12 with a 3.82 ERA (98 er in 231.0 ip) in 38 starts in Oakland compared to 10-16 with a 5.13 ERA (113 er in 198.1 ip) in 38 starts on the road.

FIRST START: He had a no decision in the A's 6-5, 11-inning win on Opening Day, March 29 in Oakland...it was his second consecutive Opening Day start and he joins Sonny Gray (2014-15) as the only A's pitchers to start back-to-back openers over the last 13 years...allowed two runs in the first inning on a Simmons RBI single and a Maldonado RBI double...then surrendered solo home runs to Calhoun in the fourth, Cozart in the fifth and Pujols in the sixth...the three home runs allowed matched the Oakland Opening Day record set by Carlos Reyes in 1996...left trailing 5-4 but the A's tied the game with a run in the seventh to get him off the hook.

SECOND START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-1 loss to Texas on April 3 in Oakland...allowed two runs in the second inning on a Chirinos RBI ground out and an Odor RBI single, and one more in the third on a solo home run by Gallo...the A's scored a run in the bottom of the third, but he allowed another run in the fourth inning on an Odor RBI single.

THIRD START: He lost his second consecutive hit start in the A's 6-1 loss at Los Angeles (AL) April 8...issued a career-high tying four walks...allowed two runs in the first inning on a RBI double by Pujols and a RBI single by Calhoun...also surrendered a leadoff home run to Trout in the third and was charged with two more runs in the fourth...yielded a RBI single to Trout and was relieved by Hendriks who allowed one inherited runner to score.

FOURTH START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 10-8 loss at Seattle April 14...allowed a three-run home run to Segura in the second inning but Oakland tied the game with three runs in the third...he then allowed two runs in the bottom of the third on a two-run single by Haniger...was relieved by Coulombe to start the sixth with the A's trailing 5-4.

LAST START: He lost his fourth consecutive start in the A's 7-3 loss to Boston last Friday in Oakland...the A's scored three times in the bottom of the first but he allowed a three-run home run to Bradley in the second...retired 11 straight batters following the homer but then allowed three straight hits

GRAVEMAN vs. TEXAS: Is 4-3 with a 4.39 ERA (55.1 ip, 60 h, 28 r, 27 er, 10 bb, 29 so, 6 hr) in nine career starts... is 2-3 with a 4.91 ERA (16 er in 29.1 ip) in five starts in Oakland and 2-0 with a 3.81 ERA (11 er in 26.0 ip) in four starts in Texas...was the losing pitcher in his only start this year, a 4-1 A's loss on April 3 (see second start above)...went 3-0 with a 2.28 ERA (27.2 ip, 26 h, 7 r, 7 er, 5 bb, 17 so, 2 hr) in four starts last year...the first win came in a 6-1 decision at Texas on April 8...no hit the Rangers over the first six innings, allowing just two base runners on an Odor walk and Lucroy reach on error in the second...then retired 15 straight before Napoli homered with two outs in the bottom of the seventh...then had a no decision in the A's 6-4 loss at Texas May 14...allowed two runs in the first inning on an Andrus RBI single and a Lucroy grounded into double play...had a 4-2 lead when DeShields had a two-out RBI single in the bottom of the seventh...was relieved by Madson who allowed a RBI double to Andrus for the blown save...won for the second time on Aug. 25 in Oakland in a 3-1 victory...allowed a run on three hits in the first inning, including a RBI single by Beltre...then shutout the Rangers on six hits over his final six innings...did not have a 1-2-3 inning...victory number three came in the A's 4-1 win on Sept. 22 in Oakland...had a 2-0 lead when he surrendered a two-out solo home run to Choo in the third inning... that was the only run he would allow in seven innings of work.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 1-2 with a 7.53 ERA in five starts this spring... allowed a .305 (18-for-59) opponents batting average...did not allow a home run in 14.1 innings and struck out 16 (10.05 per nine innings)...surrendered one run in his first start, posted a 14.14 ERA in his second through fourth starts and then tossed 5.1 scoreless innings in his final Cactus League start on March 19 at Los Angeles (NL)...also pitched in a minor league game March 24.

2017 RECAP: Went 6-4 with a 4.19 ERA in 19 starts in a season shortened due to two stints on the disabled list with a strained right shoulder...the ERA was a career high as was his opponents batting average (.280), on-base percentage (.338), slugging percentage (.442) and OPS (.780)...allowed 12 home runs and his average of 1.03 home runs per nine innings was a career low... his 19 starts are his fewest in his three seasons with Oakland...his opponents batting average broke down to .238 (44-for-185) against left-handed hitters compared to .315 (70-for-222) against right-handers...entered the season with a .273 career average against lefties, .272 against righties...opponents batted .266 with runners in scoring position but just .186 with RISP and two outs.

FRIDAY'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
LHP Sean Manaea (3-2, 1.23 ERA): Tossed the seventh no-hitter in Oakland history and the 12th in Athletics history in his last start last Saturday against Boston in Oakland, a 3-0 A's win (9.0 ip, 2 bb, 10 so)...has the lowest opponents on-base percentage in the majors (.177)...has the lowest opponents batting average (.130) and OPS (.413) in the American League (.130), ranks second in ERA (1.23) and slugging percentage (.236) and tied for fourth in wins (3)...has allowed two runs or fewer and tossed five innings or more in each of his first five starts, which is the longest such season-opening streak by a pitcher on the A's Opening Day roster since 1990 (Dave Stewart, 7; Bob Welch, 5)...opponents are hitless in their last 36 at bats against him and are 2-for-51 (.039) over his last two starts...is 1-3 with a 2.45 ERA (44.0 ip, 35 h, 15 r, 12 er, 19 bb, 39 so, 3 hr) in eight career starts against Houston...went 1-2 with a 3.18 ERA in four starts last year.
