OAKLAND ATHLETICS (13-12) VS. HOUSTON ASTROS (17-9)

FRIDAY, APRIL 27, 2018 — MINUTE MAID PARK — 7:10 P.M. CDT

ABOUT THE A'S: Had their season-high tying four-game winning streak snapped on Wednesday...are now 8-2 over the last 10 games after starting the year 5-10...won two of three at Texas to start the road trip and have now won three straight series after going 0-3-2 over the first five series...the five straight series without a win matched the 1973 A's for the second longest season-opening streak without a series win in Oakland history...the longest was in 1998 when the A's went 0-3-3 before winning their seventh series...are in fourth place in the American League West for the second consecutive...have spent one day tied for first, one day tied for second, two days tied for third, 18 days in fourth and seven days tied for fourth.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are scheduled to face a left-handed starting pitcher for the sixth time in the last seven games tonight...are 4-1 over the previous five games against lefties...for the season, are 5-6 (.455) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 8-6 (.571) against right-handers...the 11 games against left-handed starters are the most in the American League and tied with Arizona and Colorado for second most in the majors (San Francisco, 14).

IN APRIL: The A's are 12-10 (.545) in the month of April and need one more win to clinch a winning record in April for the second time in the last four years (13-12 in 2016)...are slugging .453, which is currently the second best April slugging percentage in Oakland history (.463 in 2002)...have an .804 OPS, which is currently third best (.814 in 1994, .809 in 2002)...have been hit by a pitch 14 times, which is the most by an A's team in April since at least 1908.

THE WEST AND THE REST: The A's will play all nine games on this road trip against American League West competition (Texas, Houston, Seattle)...are 7-10 (.412) against divisional foes compared to 6-2 (.750) against all other teams...are batting .251 (144-for-573) and are averaging 4.24 runs per game (72 runs in 17 games) against the West compared to .298 with an average of 7.00 runs per game against everyone else...the pitching staff has a 4.56 ERA (76 er in 150.0 ip) against the West, 3.67 against all other teams.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .286 (135-for-472) over the last 13 games and are averaging 6.5 runs per game (84 runs) with 56 extra base hits (34 doubles, 3 triples, 19 home runs)...hit .245 with 3.7 runs per game and 31 extra base hits over the first 12 contests...rank second in the American League in batting average (.267), on-base percentage (.348) and hit by pitches (16), third in slugging percentage (.444), OPS (.792), runs (128), walks (96) and extra base hits (87), tied for third in triples (5) and fourth in doubles (51) and home runs (31)...are tied with Kansas City for the fewest stolen bases (6), tied for second in most grounded into double plays (21) and rank fourth in most strikeouts (223).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 3.16 ERA (33 er in 94.0 ip) and .207 (71-for-343) opponents batting average over the last 10 games...have allowed two runs or fewer six times over that stretch...posted a 5.05 ERA and .287 opponents batting average over the first 15 contests...are averaging 2.27 walks per nine innings, which is the second lowest mark in the majors (Cleveland, 2.16), and 7.57 strikeouts per nine innings, which is fourth lowest...have 19 wild pitches, which is second most to Pittsburgh (24)...opponents have stolen 20 bases, which is second most in the majors to the Mets (25)...have surrendered 31 home runs, which is tied for fourth most in the American League.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed one run or fewer in six of the last 10 games and are 5-2 with a 3.26 ERA (22 er in 60.2 ip) over that stretch...went 5-10 with a 5.61 ERA over the first 15 contests...starters have walked more than two batters just twice this year, both times by Kendall Graveman...Sean Manaea is 3-2 with a 1.23 ERA while the rest of Oakland's starters are 5-8 with a 5.79 ERA (65 er in 101.0 ip).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-1 on their second road trip of the season, a nine-game, 11-day trip to Texas (2-1), Houston (three games) and Seattle (three games)...went 3-5 on the first road trip to Los Angeles-AL (1-2), Los Angeles-NL (1-1) and Seattle (1-2) and are now 5-6 on the road compared to 8-6 at home...have hit 20 home runs in 11 road games, 11 in 14 home games...have a 5.13 ERA (53 er in 93.0 ip) on the road, 3.65 at home...went 5-1 on the last homestand against Chicago-AL (3-0) and Boston (2-1), which was the A's best homestand of four or more games since going 5-1 on a six-game homestand against Detroit and Minnesota from May 27-June 1, 2016.

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 4-1 (.800) in one-run games...the winning percentage is third best in the American League but the five one-run games are tied for third fewest...are 3-0 in games decided by seven runs or more and 6-11 in games decided by two to six runs...are 4-0 in game decided in the last at bat...the wins are second most in the AL (Toronto, 5) and the A's are one of four teams in the majors without a last at bat loss (Colorado, Seattle, Toronto)...are 2-0 in extra inning games and 2-0 in walk-off games.

THIS AND THAT: The A's had yesterday off and are 0-3 following off-days this year...are one of four teams that has not won a game following a day off (Baltimore, Cincinnati, Texas)...are 0-4 on Friday and are one of five teams that has not won on Friday (Chicago-AL, Cincinnati, Los Angeles-NL, Minnesota)...are 11-4 when scoring first, 2-8 when the opponent scores first...A's outfielders have just one assist, which is tied with Miami, San Francisco and Washington for the fewest in the majors...the A's lead the majors with 14 runs scored in the ninth inning...the pitching staff has a 2.81 ERA (24 er in 77.0 ip) in the seventh inning or later, 4.88 (83 er in 153.0 ip) over innings one through six.

SCHEDULE NOTES: The A's begin a three-game series with Houston tonight after playing a three-game series at Texas to start the trip...it marks the fifth time since the Astros moved to the American League in 2013 that the A's have played Houston and Texas on the same trip...however, its just the fourth time they have played the two clubs in back-to-back series...this road trip begins a stretch where the A's are scheduled to play 19 of 25 games on the road.

THE DISABLED LIST: After adding Ryan Buchter to the disabled list today, the A's now have five players on the DL (Blackburn, Buchter, Cotton, Hendriks, Powell)...have used the DL eight times this year and had a season-high seven on the DL from April 7-14...Blackburn and Cotton are on the 60-day DL...Oakland used the DL 23 times last year, which marked the third consecutive season and seventh time in the last 11 years the A's have used the DL at least 20 times...have had at least four players on the DL every day since Aug. 24, 2015, at least three every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on DL since end of 2006 season (1).

A'S ON THE RADIO: 95.7 FM The Game is in its eighth season as flagship of the A's Radio Network...due to a conflict with the Warriors, tomorrow's game against the Astros will air in the Bay Area on Q102 (102.1 FM)...additional updates will be announced based on the Warriors postseason schedule.

A'S vs. ASTROS: The A's went 7-12 against the Astros last year and lost the season series for the third consecutive season...went 4-6 in Oakland and 3-6 in Houston...have won each of the last five games after losing 19 of the 21 previous contests...have lost 16 of the last 21 games at Minute Maid Park...are 22-35 (.386) against the Astros over the previous three years after winning each of their first four season series against Houston (31-13, .705)...the A's lead the all-time series 53-48...are 29-22 in Oakland and 24-26 in Houston.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Khris Davis hit his seventh home run of the season Wednesday and now has a Major League leading 92 home runs over the last three years...**Jed Lowrie** leads the majors with 37 hits, 12 multiple hit games, eight go-ahead RBI and five games with three or more hits...has 33 hits in April, which is one short of the Oakland record for most hits in April...he set the mark with 34 hits in April of 2013...has 24 RBI, which is three short of the Oakland April RBI mark of 27, shared by Reggie Jackson (1974) and Jason Giambi (2000)...**Marcus Semien** has hit safely in each of his last five games and is 9-for-21 (.429) with two doubles, two home runs and four multiple hit games over that span.

OAKLAND A'S 50th ANNIVERSARY MOMENT

In 1968 Jim "Catfish" Hunter records his first win in an Oakland uniform in the A's 6-3 victory at California...he would go on to win an Oakland record 131 games which does not include 30 wins while pitching for the Kansas City A's...in 1981 former Athletic Don Baylor, playing for the California Angels, hits into a triple play, the fourth in Oakland history...in 2002 the A's tie a franchise record by hitting four home runs in the third inning...Scott Hatteberg, Terrence Long, Carlos Pena and Frank Menechino connect for the home runs.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Manaea (3-2, 1.23 ERA)

NO-HITTER: Tossed the seventh no-hitter in Oakland history and the 12th in Athletics history in his last start last Saturday against Boston in Oakland...was named American League Co-Player of the Week along with Manny Machado for his efforts...it was his first Player of the Week award...the no-hitter was the earliest by date (Catfish Hunter, May 8, 1968 vs. Minnesota) and second earliest by game number (Chief Bender, May 12, 1910 vs. Cleveland, game 18) in Athletics history...it was the 10th no-hitter in Coliseum history (six by A's, four by opponents)...it was the first since Dallas Braden's perfect game on May 9, 2010 vs. Tampa Bay...is the third Oakland pitcher to strikeout 10 or more in a no-hitter...Dave Stewart had 12 and Catfish Hunter had 11...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, the Red Sox .895 winning percentage entering the game was the highest in Major League history by a team that was no-hit at least five games into the season...the last pitcher to no hit a team that led the majors in runs per game entering the game was the A's Dave Stewart, who did it against Toronto on June 29, 1990 (also Elias).

AMONG THE LEADERS: Has the lowest opponents on-base percentage in the majors (.177) and the lowest ERA (1.23), opponents batting average (.130) and OPS (.413) in the American League...ranks second in the AL in opponents slugging percentage (.236), tied for second in innings pitched (36.2), tied for fourth in fewest walks per nine innings (1.47) and tied for fifth in wins (3)...is also tied for fourth in wild pitches (3).

FIVE INNINGS OR MORE, TWO RUNS OR FEWER: Has allowed two runs or fewer and tossed five innings or more in each of his first five starts, which is the longest such season-opening streak by a pitcher on the A's Opening Day roster since 1990...that year, Dave Stewart began the season with seven such starts and Bob Welch had five.

GO THE DISTANCE: His no-hitter was the first complete game of his career and it came in his 59th game and 58th start...his streak of 57 consecutive starts without a complete game was fourth longest in Oakland history...it was the longest since Barry Zito's Oakland record streak of 113 from Aug. 12, 2003-Sept. 28, 2006...the shutout came in the A's 21st game of the season and it was the second earliest nine-inning shutout by an Athletic over the last 28 years...the earliest over that stretch was by Zito on April 18, 2003 vs. Texas, the A's 17th game of the season.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents are hitless in their last 36 at bats against him and are 2-for-51 (.039) over his last two starts...is the first A's pitcher with back-to-back starts of seven innings or more and two hits or fewer since Barry Zito (July 9-15, 2005)...opponents are 1-for-25 (.040) with runners on base, including 0-for-7 with runners in scoring position...has surrendered four home runs, all solo shots...opponents are 2-for-35 (.057) with a walk and a hit by pitch (.108 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning...they are 1-for-36 (.028) in the seventh inning or later.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received zero runs of support in his two losses this year and 10 of his 21 career losses...has received just 11 runs of support in 36.2 innings this year and his run support average of 2.70 is eighth lowest in the American League.

THIS AND THAT: Has allowed three of his five runs in the first inning (3 er in 5.0 ip, 5.40 ERA) and has a 0.57 ERA (2 er in 31.2 ip) from the second inning on...is 3-1 with a 1.24 ERA (4 er in 29.0 ip) in four starts in April...has never won four games in a month...has walked two batters or fewer in each of his five starts.

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 2-1 loss to Los Angeles (AL) March 30 in Oakland...allowed a solo home run to the second batter of the game, Mike Trout, but that was the only run he would allow in 7.2 innings...retired 12 straight at one point and set down 21 of the final 23 hitters...left trailing 1-0 as the A's scored their only run in the bottom of the ninth.

SECOND START: He picked up his first win of the season in the A's 6-2 win over Texas April 4 in Oakland...tossed 8.0 innings and allowed just one run

for the second consecutive start...became the first A's pitcher on an Opening Day roster to start the season with back-to-back outings of seven innings or more and one run or fewer since Steve Karsay in 1994...blanked the Angels on two hits over the first four innings and had a 5-0 lead when he allowed his only run in the fifth inning...Mazara led off with a single, went to second on a Chrinos walk, third on a Profar sacrifice fly and scored on a Rua fielders choice...did not allow a run over his final three innings and retired each of the final 12 batters he faced.

THIRD START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-0 loss at Los Angeles (NL) on April 10...allowed back-to-back home runs to Taylor and Seager to start the bottom of the first but those were the only runs he would allow in five innings of work...Ryu and three Dodgers relievers combined to shutout the A's on five hits.

FOURTH START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 2-1 win at Seattle April 15...the A's scored twice in the top of the first and he did not allow a hit over the first three innings...shutout the Mariners on a hit and two walks before Motter hit a one-out solo home run in the fifth inning...that was the only run he would allow in seven innings of work.

LAST START: He no-hit the Boston Red Sox in the A's 3-0 victory in Oakland last Saturday...walked Betts to start the game but then retired 14 straight before Leon reached on a Semien error...set down the next 12 before walking Benintendi with two outs in the ninth...then got Ramirez to hit into a game-ending force out for his first career complete game...walked two and matched his career high with 10 strikeouts...has both an 11.0 inning scoreless and hitless streak as the last hit he allowed was a one-out solo home run by the Mariners Taylor Motter in the fifth inning on April 15.

no decision came in a 6-0 A's loss in Oakland on April 15...tossed 5.0 hitless innings but walked a career-high five batters and yielded two runs...the first loss come in a 5-1 decision in Oakland on June 21...blanked the Astros on two hits and two walks over the first five innings before allowing three runs in the sixth...then picked up the win in the A's 6-4 victory at Houston June 27...allowed nine hits and walked three batters in 5.2 innings but allowed just one run...then lost in a 3-1 decision at Houston Aug. 18...allowed two runs in the third inning on back-to-back home runs by Bregman and Altuve, and another in the sixth on a Reddick RBI single...Keuchel shutout the A's on three hits over the first seven innings.
