OAKLAND ATHLETICS (14-13) VS. HOUSTON ASTROS (18-10)

SUNDAY, APRIL 29, 2018 — MINUTE MAID PARK — 1:10 P.M. CDT RHP TREVOR CAHILL (1-0, 2.25) VS. RHP GERRIT COLE (2-1, 1.29) NBCSCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GMAE)

ABOUT THE A'S: Had their season-high tying four-game winning streak snapped on Wednesday...are now 9-3 over the last 12 games after starting the year 5-10...won two of three at Texas to start the road trip and have now won three straight series after going 0-3-2 over the first five series...the five straight series without a win matched the 1973 A's for the second longest season-opening streak without a series win in Oakland history...the longest was in 1998 when the A's went 0-3-3 before winning their seventh series... are in fourth place in the American League West...have spent one day tied for first, one day tied for second, two days tied for third, 20 days in fourth and seven days tied for fourth.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are scheduled to face a right-handed pitcher tonight for just the third time in their last nine games...for the season, are 8-7 (.533) in games in which the opponent starts a right-handed pitcher and are 6-6 (.500) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher...as a team, the A's are hitting a hearly identical .260 (156-for-601) against righthanders as their .271 (90-for-335) average against lefties.

IN APRIL: The loss last night dropped the A's record to 13-11 (.542) in the month of April...the A's have clinched a winning April record for the second time in the last four years (13-12 in 2016)...have been hit by a pitch 14 times, which is the most by an A's team in April since at least 1908.

THE WEST AND THE REST: The A's will play all nine games on this road trip against American League West competition (Texas, Houston, Seattle)...are 8-11 (.421) against divisional foes compared to 6-2 (.750) against all other teams...are batting .246 (157-for-637) and are averaging 4.21 runs per game (80 runs in 19 games) against the West compared to .298 with an average of 7.00 runs per game against everyone else...the pitching staff has a 4.61 ERA (86 er in 168.0 ip) against the West, 3.67 against all other teams.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .276 (148-for-536) over the last 15 games and are averaging 6.13 runs per game (92 runs) with 61 extra base hits (35 doubles, 4 triples, 22 home runs)...hit .245 with 3.7 runs per game and 31 extra base hits over the first 12 contests... are second in the American League in hit by pitches (16), tied for second in triples (6), third in slugging percentage (.440), OPS (.796), walks (96) and extra base hits (92), rank fourth in batting average (.263), on-base percentage (.340), and runs (136), tied for fourth in doubles (51), and tied for fifth in home runs (34)...have the fewest stolen bases (6) in the American League, and ave the second most GIDPs (24).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 3.47 ERA (43 er in 111.0 ip) and .218 (89for-409) opponents batting average over the last 12 games...have allowed two runs or fewer seven times over that stretch...posted a 5.05 ERA and .287 opponents batting average over the first 15 contests...are averaging 2.37 walks per nine innings, which is the second lowest mark in the majors (Cleveland, 2.23), and 7.56 strikeouts per nine innings, which is fourth lowest...have 20 wild pitches, which is second most to Pittsburgh (25)...opponents have stolen 20 bases, which is tied for second most in the majors to the Mets (25)...have surrendered 35 home runs, which is tied for fifth most in Major League Baseball.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed one run or fewer in seven of the last 12 games and are 6-3 with a 3.34 ERA (26 er in 70.0 ip) over that stretch...went 5-10 with a 5.61 ERA over the first 15 contests...starters have walked more than two batters just twice this year, both times by Kendall Graveman...Sean Manaea is 4-2 with a 1.03 ERA while the rest of Oakland's starters are 5-8 with a 6.01 ERA (69 er in 103.1 ip).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-2 on their second road trip of the season, a nine-game, 11-day trip to Texas (2-1), Houston (three games) and Seattle (three games)...went 3-5 on the first road trip to Los Angeles-AL (1-2), Los Angeles-NL (1-1) and Seattle (1-2) and are now 6-7 on the road compared to 8-6 at home...have hit 23 home runs in 13 road games, 11 in 14 home games...have a 5.15 ERA (63 er in 110.0 ip) on the road, 3.65 at home...went 5-1 on the last homestand against Chicago-AL (3-0) and Boston (2-1), which was the A's best homestand of four or more games since going 5-1 on a six-game homestand against Detroit and Minnesota from May 27-June 1, 2016.

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 4-1 (.800) in one-run games...the winning percentage is best in the American League but the five one-run games are third fewest...are 4-1 in games decided by seven runs or more and 6-11 in games decided by two to six runs...are 4-0 in game decided in the last at bat...are 2-0 in extra inning games and 2-0 in walk-off games.

THIS AND THAT: Yesterday's 11-0 loss was just the second time the A's have been shut out this season (4/10 at Los Angeles-NL)...are 11-4 when scoring first, 3-9 when the opponent scores first...A's outfielders have just one assist, which is tied with Miami, San Francisco and Washington for the fewest in the majors...the pitching staff has a 2.70 ERA (24 er in 80.0 ip) in the seventh inning or later, 5.01 (93 er in 167.0 ip) over innings one through six...the A's need a win today to improve their record in road series this season to .500 (2-2-1)...a win today would also give the A's four consecutive series wins after opening the season 0-3-2.

SCHEDULE NOTES: The A's continue a three-game series with Houston today after playing a three-game series at Texas to start the trip...it marks the fifth time since the Astros moved to the American League in 2013 that the A's have played Houston and Texas on the same trip...however, its just the fourth time they have played the two clubs in back-to-back series...this road trip begins a stretch where the A's are scheduled to play 19 of 25 games on the road...the A's have opened the trip with a 3-2 record (2-1 vs. Texas, 1-1 vs. Houston).

THE DISABLED LIST: After adding Ryan Buchter to the disabled list on Friday, the A's now have five players on the DL (Blackburn, Buchter, Cotton, Hendriks, Powell)...have used the DL eight times this year and had a season-high seven on the DL from April 7-14...Blackburn and Cotton are on the 60-day DL...Oakland used the DL 23 times last year, which marked the third consecutive season and seventh time in the last 11 years the A's have used the DL at least 20 times...have had at least four players on the DL every day since Aug. 24, 2015, at least three every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on DL since end of 2006 season (1).

A's ON THE RADIO: 95.7 FM The Game is in its eighth season as flagship of the A's Radio Network...due to a conflict with the Golden State Warriors, tuesday's game against the Mariners will air in the Bay Area on Q102 (102.1 FM), in addition to Friday's game at home against the Baltimore Orioles... additional updates will be announced based on the Warriors postseason schedule.

A's vs. ASTROS: The A's went 7-12 against the Astros last year and lost the season series for the third consecutive season...went 4-6 in Oakland and 3-6 in Houston...before last night's loss, the Athletics had won each of the last six games after losing 19 of the 21 previous contests...have lost 17 of the last 23 games at Minute Maid Park...are 23-36 (.390) against the Astros over the previous three years after winning each of their first four season series against Houston (31-13, .705)...the A's lead the all-time series 54-49...are 29-22 in Oakland and 25-27 in Houston...only four current Athletics position players have faced Astros starter Gerrit Cole in their career (Lucroy, Piscotty, Davis, Lowrie)...the quartet is 14-for-50 (.280) with two walks against Cole...A's starter Trevor Cahill has one career at-bat against Cole.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Khris Davis hit his seventh home run of the season Wednesday and now has a Major League leading 92 home runs over the last three years...*Jed Lowrie* leads the majors with five games with three or more hits, and is tied for the lead with 38 hits, 12 multiple hit games, and eight go-ahead RBI...has 34 hits in April, which is tied for the Oakland record for most hits in April...he set the mark with 34 hits in April of 2013...has 26 RBI, which is one short of the Oakland April RBI mark of 27, shared by Reggie Jackson (1974) and Jason Giambi (2000)...after Oakland was held to three hits yesterday against the Astros in Houston, *Stephen Piscotty* has he longest active hit streak for the A's at three games (3-for-8)...*Lou Trivino* was the only A's pitcher who didn't allow multiple base runners yesterday, and now has a 1.06 WHIP in 5.2 innings with Oakland this season.

OAKLAND A'S 50th ANNIVERSARY MOMENT

In **1998** Ben Grieve ties an Oakland record by going a perfect 5 for 5 with four runs scored in the A's 11-4 win at Cleveland...in **2000** Grieve hits his first career grand slam in the 10th inning of a 6-2 A's win at Minnesota... in **2013** the A's defeat the Angels 10-8 in a 19-inning game that lasts an Oakland record 6 hours and 32 minutes...the A's overcome a five-run deficit in the game and Brandon Moss ends it with a two-run home run in the bottom of the 19th inning.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Trevor Cahill (1-0, 2.25 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville April 17 and is scheduled to make his third start of the season...was originally selected by Oakland in the second round of the 2006 draft out of high school and made his Major League debut in 2009 at the age of 21...went 40-35 with a 3.91 ERA in 96 starts over three seasons with the A's before he was traded to Arizona following the 2011 season...went 33-44 with a 4.29 ERA in 187 games, 92 starts, over the next six seasons with the Diamondbacks (2012-14), Braves (2015), Cubs (2015-16), Padres (2017) and Royals (2017).

FIRST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 10-2 win over Chicago (AL) April 17 in Oakland...it was his first start as an Athletic since Sept. 27, 2011 at Seattle when he combined with Craig Breslow and Jerry Blevins on a fourhit shutout (7.0 ip, 4 h, 1 bb, 7 so)...tossed 7.0 shutout innings and allowed five hits and two walks...retired the side in order just once and that came in his final inning...was relieved by Dull to start the eighth inning with the A's leading 8-0.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 9-4 win at Texas on Monday... Oakland scored twice in the third but he gave one of those runs back in the bottom of the third when Kiner-Falefa scored on a wild pitch...the A's added another run in the fourth but he allowed a two-run home run to Chirinos in the bottom of the fourth...left after four inning with the score tied 3-3... Oakland scored six times in the ninth for the win.

games, three starts, with the Royals...combined for a 4-3 record and a 4.93 ERA in a career-low 21 appearances overall...missed 12 weeks of the season due to three stints on the disabled list...surrendered 16 home runs in 84.1 innings, including 10 in 23.0 innings with the Royals...his average of 1.71 home runs per nine innings was the highest mark of his career...also had career highs in walks per nine innings (4.82), strikeouts per nine innings (9.32), opponents slugging percentage (.483) and opponents OPS (.850)...had a Major League leading 16 wild pitches, including 14 with San Diego...tied for the National League in wild pitches (Arrieta, CHC) despite making just 11 starts.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .275 opponents batting average, including .241 (35-for-145) by left-handed hitters compared to .301 (56-for-186) by right-handers...13 of the 16 home runs he allowed were solo shots...opponents hit .236 with runners in scoring position.

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Went 4-3 with a 4.38 ERA in his 14 starting assignments...compiled an 8.25 ERA in seven relief appearances...did not inherit a runner and first batters faced were 2-for-5 (.400) with two walks.

HOME AND AWAY: Combined for a 4-0 record, a 1.83 ERA and .203 opponents batting average in seven games in his home ballparks...was 0-3 with a 7.07 ERA and .320 opponents batting average in 14 games on the road...now has a seven-game home winning streak and a four-game road losing streak.

THIS AND THAT: Was 3-3 with a 3.38 ERA and .226 opponents batting average in nine starts before the All-Star Break, 1-0 with a 7.29 ERA and .340 opponents average in 12 games after the break...went 1-0 with a 3.00 ERA in four interleague starts and is now 11-4 with a 3.10 ERA (47 er in 136.1 ip) in 26 career interleague appearances, including 21 starts...opponents were successful in 17-of-19 (89.5%) stolen base attempts...batted .286 (4-for-14) with a double, walk, two RBI and a run scored.

MORE 2017: Was signed by San Diego Feb. 23 and started the Padres first game of the season on April 5 at Los Angeles (NL)...allowed three runs in 5.2 innings for the loss and went on the disabled list the next day with a strained back...was reinstated April 16 and, after taking the loss that day at Atlanta, compiled a season-best three-game winning streak from April 21 to May 8... logged a 2.25 ERA and .186 opponents batting average over that four-start stretch...began the streak by allowing one run in a season-high 7.0 innings April 21 against Miami...then struck out a season-high nine batters but also allowed a season-high nine hits in 5.2 innings at Arizona on April 26...went 2-0 with a 1.56 ERA in three starts in May before returning to the disabled list on May 14 with an inflamed right shoulder...made one rehab start with Single-A Lake Elsinore on June 22 at Inland Empire (L, 2.2 ip, 3 h, 4 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 3 so) and one with Triple-A El Paso on June 28 against Sacramento (L, 3.0 ip, 4 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 4 so) before he was reinstated from the disabled list July 4...surrendered a season-high six runs in 3.2 innings in his final outing with the Padres on July 21 at San Francisco, but had a no decision in a 12-9 win... was traded to Kansas City with pitchers Ryan Buchter and Brandon Maurer for pitchers Matt Strahm and Travis Wood, minor league infielder Esteury Ruiz and cash on July 24...made each of his first three appearances as a Royal as a starter and had no decisions and an 8.18 ERA before going on the disabled list a third time Aug. 10 with right shoulder impingement syndrome... was reinstated Sept. 1 and pitched exclusively in relief following his return... logged an 8.25 ERA and .313 opponents batting average in seven outings in September...allowed six home runs and walked 12 in 12.0 innings.

TUESDAY'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Andrew Triggs (2-0, 4.70 ERA): Is scheduled to make his sixth start of the season...has allowed two runs or fewer in four of his five starts (allowed six in the other)...is 2-0 with a 2.70 ERA and .217 opponents batting average in three starts on the road compared to 0-0 with a 9.95 ERA and .310 opponents average in two starts in Oakland...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 3-2 A's win at Texas last Tuesday (6.0 ip, 4 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 6 so)...is 0-1 with a 7.13 ERA in four career appearances, three starts, against Seattle...had a no decision in his only start this year, a 7-4 A's loss at Seattle on April 13 (5.0 ip, 5 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 4 so)...went 2-2 with a 4.81 ERA in seven games, including four starts, this spring...allowed a .227 opponents batting average...tied for fourth in the Cactus League in strikeouts (25)...was on the A's Opening Day roster in 2017 and went 5-6 with a 4.27 ERA in 12 starts before his season ended June 10 with a hip injury.

- Tied an Athletics record for strikeouts in an inning with four in the eighth inning on 4/17 vs Chicago...it was the fourth time an Oakland Athletics pitcher has accomplished the feat, the first since Ryan Cook on April 27, 2012 at Baltimore...is the first to do it in the Coliseum.
- Is 0-1 with a 0.90 ERA (20.0 ip, 9 h, 6 r, 2 er, 4 bb, 20 so) in 17 games against Houston.

Last Year: Made 40 appearances after coming back from a knee injury that sidelined for two months...posted a 2-2 mark with a 5.14 ERA in 42 innings on the mound...he struck out 45 batters in 42.0 innings.
