

# **OAKLAND ATHLETICS GAME INFORMATION**

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## OAKLAND ATHLETICS (14-14) VS. SEATTLE MARINERS (16-11)

TUESDAY, MAY 1, 2018 — SAFECO FIELD — 7:10 P.M. PDT RHP ANDREW TRIGGS (2-0, 4.70) VS. RHP FÉLIX HERNÁNDEZ (3-2, 4.96) NBCSCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (1550 AM)

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Lost two of three to Houston over the weekend after winning each of their previous three series...have now lost three of the last four games after winning eight of the previous nine contests...are 9-4 over the last 13 games after starting the year 5-10...are 14-14 overall, which marks the latest in the season that Oakland has been at or above .500 over the last four years...are in fourth place in the American League West for the sixth consecutive day...have spent one day tied for first, one day tied for second, two days tied for third, 22 days in fourth and seven days tied for fourth.

**THE WEST AND THE REST:** This three-game series with Seattle concludes this nine-game road trip, which featured all American League West competition (also Texas and Houston)...are 8-12 (.400) against divisional foes compared to 6-2 (.750) against all other teams...are batting .247 (166-for-672) and are averaging 4.20 runs per game (84 runs in 207 games) against the West compared to .298 with an average of 7.00 runs per game against everyone else... the pitching staff has a 4.73 ERA (92 er in 175.0 ip) against the West, 3.67 against all other teams.

*IN APRIL:* The A's finished April with a 13-12 record for the second time in the last three years (also 2016)...set a franchise record for strikeouts in the month of April with 224...broke the previous mark of 221 set last year...were hit by a pitch 15 times, which is the most by an A's team in April since at least 1908...slugged .449, which was the third best April slugging percentage in Oakland history...hit 33 home runs, which was fifth best and the most since 2006 (34)...stole six bases, which were the A's fewest in April since 2006 (3)... the pitching staff had 17 wild pitches, which was the most by an A's team since at least 1908...allowed 32 home runs, which tied for second most in April in Oakland history and was the most since 2001 (also 32)...had a 4.42 ERA, which was the A's highest April ERA since 2006 (4.74).

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's committed four errors Sunday at Houston, which were their most in a game since June 19, 2015 against Los Angeles (AL) when they also had four...now have eight errors in the last four games...have committed 11 in the last eight contests after making just 10 over the first 16 games...have 21 errors for the season, which is fourth most in the American League...the errors have led to 14 unearned runs, which is tied for fourth in the AL and one behind the leaders (Baltimore, New York, Texas)...A's outfielders have just one assist, which is tied with Miami, San Francisco and Washington for the fewest in the majors.

**OFFENSE:** The A's hit .245 and averaged 3.7 runs per game over the first 12 games, batted .306 with 8.6 runs per game over a seven-game stretch from April 11-19 and are hitting .247 (74-for-300) and averaging 4.0 runs per game (36 runs) over the last nine contests...overall, Oakland ranks second in the American League in hit by pitches (17), third in batting (.263), on-base percentage (.338), OPS (.778) and extra base hit (97), tied for third in triples (6), fourth in slugging (.441) and walks (97), tied for fourth in doubles (56) and fifth in runs (140)...have six stolen bases, which is tied with the Cubs for the fewest in the majors...are tied for second in most grounded into double plays (25) and rank fifth in most strikeouts (252).

**PITCHING:** The A's have compiled a 3.71 ERA (49 er in 119.0 ip) and .219 (96for-438) opponents batting average over the last 13 games...have allowed two runs or fewer seven times over that stretch and seven runs or more four times...posted a 5.05 ERA and .287 opponents batting average over the first 15 contests...have allowed five home runs in the last three games after surrendering just one over the previous six contests...are averaging 2.40 walks per nine innings, which is the second lowest mark in the majors (Cleveland, 2.28), and 7.57 strikeouts per nine innings, which is fourth lowest...have 21 wild pitches, which is the most to Pittsburgh (26)...opponents have stolen 21 bases, which is the most in the American League and tied for fifth most in the majors.

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers have allowed one run or fewer in seven of the last 13 games and are 6-4 with a 3.43 ERA (29 er in 76.0 ip) over that stretch...went 5-10 with a 5.61 ERA over the first 15 contests...starters have walked more than two batters just twice this year, both times by Kendall Graveman...are averaging 2.29 walks per nine innings, which matches Cleveland for the lowest mark in the majors...Sean Manaea is 4-2 with a 1.03 ERA while the rest of Oakland's starters are 5-10 with a 5.93 ERA (72 er in 109.1 ip).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-3 on their second road trip of the season, a nine-game, 11-day trip to Texas (2-1), Houston (1-2) and Seattle (three

games)...went 3-5 on the first road trip are now 6-8 on the road compared to 8-6 at home...return home following the game Thursday for a six-game homestand against Baltimore (three games) and Houston (three games)... went 5-1 on the last homestand against Chicago-AL (3-0) and Boston (2-1), which was the A's best homestand of four or more games since going 5-1 on a six-game homestand against Detroit and Minnesota from May 27-June 1, 2016...the A's have hit 24 home runs on the road, which is second most in the majors to the White Sox (26), but have allowed 24, which is second most to the Mariners (25)...have a 5.26 ERA (69 er in 118.0 ip) on the road, 3.65 at home.

**ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS:** The A's are 4-1 (.800) in one-run games...the winning percentage is tied with Boston (8-2) for second best in the majors (Philadelphia, 6-1)...however, only Texas has played fewer one-run games than the A's (3)...are 4-0 in game decided in the last at bat...the wins are tied for second most in the American League (Toronto, 5) and the A's are one of four teams in the majors without a last at bat loss (Colorado, Seattle, Toronto)...are 2-0 in extra inning games and 2-0 in walk-off games.

*THIS AND THAT:* The A's have won five of their last six games against lefthanded starting pitchers and are now 6-6 in those games for the season...the 12 games against left-handed starters are tied with Toronto for the most in the American League...this road trip begins a stretch where the A's are scheduled to play 19 of 25 games on the road...are 11-5 when scoring first, 3-9 when the opponent scores first...are tied with Detroit for the Major League lead in runs scored in the ninth inning (15)...the pitching staff has a 3.36 ERA (31 er in 83.0 ip) in the seventh inning or later, 4.93 (92 er in 168.0 ip) over innings one through six.

**THE DISABLED LIST:** The A's have five players on the disabled list (Blackburn, Buchter, Cotton, Hendriks, Powell)...have used the DL eight times this year and had a season-high seven on the DL from April 7-14...Blackburn and Cotton are on the 60-day DL...Oakland used the DL 23 times last year, which marked the third consecutive season and seventh time in the last 11 years the A's have used the DL at least 20 times...have had at least four players on the DL every day since Aug. 24, 2015, at least three every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on DL since end of 2006 season (1).

**A's ON THE RADIO:** 95.7 FM The Game is in its eighth season as flagship of the A's Radio Network...due to conflicts with the Warriors, the following games will air on 1550 AM: today against Seattle and Friday and Sunday against Baltimore...additional updates will be announced based on the Warriors postseason schedule.

**A's vs. MARINERS:** The A's trail in the season series 1-2 as they lost two of three at Seattle to conclude the last road trip (April 13-15)...following this series, the next 10 meetings between the two clubs will be in Oakland...went 7-12 against Seattle last year and lost the season series for the fifth consecutive season...prior to this streak, had never lost more than four straight season series to the Mariners...are 38-60 (.388) against the Mariners dating back to the start of the 2013 season, which is the second worst record by any American League team against Seattle (TB, 12-20/.375)...went 4-5 in Oakland last year and 3-7 in Seattle...all-time, the A's are 342-284 against the Mariners...that includes 184-127 in Oakland, 157-156 in Seattle and 1-1 in Tokyo...are 81-92 at Safeco Field.

#### TODAY'S TIDBITS

*Jed Lowrie* is tied for the Major League lead in multiple hit games (12) and go-ahead RBI (8), ranks second in hits (39) and tied for second in RBI (27)... set an Athletics record for hits in the month of April with 35 and tied the mark for RBI with 27.

#### OAKLAND A'S 50th ANNIVERSARY MOMENT

In **1991** Rickey Henderson become's baseball's all-time stolen base leader with his 939<sup>th</sup> career steal...he steals third base with a 1-0 count on Jose Canseco in the fourth inning...the steal comes against the New York Yankees, with whom he stole 326 bases...in **1992** Rickey Henderson steals the 1000<sup>th</sup> base of his career at Detroit, one year after breaking Lou Brock's all-time record...in **1993** Rickey Henderson's third inning single is his 1356<sup>th</sup> hit as an Athletic which passes Bert Campaneris for first place on the all-time Oakland hit list.

### TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Andrew Triggs (2-0, 4.70 ERA)

**FOR OPENERS:** Is scheduled to make his sixth start of the season...has allowed two runs or fewer in four of his five starts (allowed six in the other)... is in his third season in the majors and is on his second consecutive Opening Day roster.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 2-0 with a 2.70 ERA (5 er in 16) and .217 (13-for-60) opponents batting average in three starts on the road compared to 0-0 with a 9.95 ERA (7 er in 6.1 ip) and .310 (9-for-29) opponents average in two starts in Oakland...last year, he compiled a 2-2 record and a 3.14 ERA in five starts on the road compared to 3-4 with a 5.15 ERA in seven starts at home...is now 5-2 with a 4.03 ERA (34 er in 76.0 ip) in 20 career road games, 3-5 with a 4.72 ERA (36 er in 68.2 ip) in 21 games in the Coliseum.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has issued nine walks, five of which have come to the first batter in an inning...opponents are batting .263 (5-for-19) with a .417 on-base percentage leading off an inning...opponents are 6-for-24 (.250) with runners in scoring position but they are 1-for-12 (.083) with RISP and two outs...has allowed a .160 (4-for-25) batting average with two outs, compared to .281 (18-for-64) with zero or one out...last year, he held the opposition to a .211 batting average with two outs but surrendered six of his nine home runs in that situation...opponents are 1-for-9 (.111) when putting the first pitch in play...has surrendered both of his home runs with runners on base...has not allowed a hit to the opponents number six hitter (0-for-8).

*DAYS REST:* Is scheduled to pitch on six days rest today...is 1-0 with a 10.29 ERA (8 er in 7.0 ip) in two starts on four days rest, 1-0 with a 2.25 ERA (4 er in 16.0 ip) in three starts on five days rest or more...last year, he went 1-3 with an 8.24 ERA in four starts on four days rest, 4-3 with a 2.56 ERA in eight starts on five days rest or more...his career numbers are 2-4 with a 7.23 ERA (30 er in 37.1 ip) in nine starts on four days rest or fewer, 6-3 with a 2.47 ERA (21 er in 76.2 ip) in 14 starts on five days rest or more.

**THE WEST AND THE REST:** Is 2-0 with a 2.49 ERA (6 er in 21.2 ip) in four starts against American League West teams, 0-1 with a 40.50 ERA (6 er in 1.1 ip) in one start against everyone else...last year, he went 4-1 with a 2.04 ERA in six starts against AL West competition, 1-5 with a 6.90 ERA in six starts against all other tams...his career numbers are 6-1 with a 3.16 ERA (27 er in 77.0 ip) in 17 games against the AL West, 2-6 with a 5.72 ERA (43 er in 67.2 ip) in 24 games against everyone else.

**ON THE BASES:** Opponents have stolen four bases with him on the mound, which is tied for fourth most in the American League...allowed 15 stolen bases last year, which tied for seventh most in the AL despite missing 3½ months of the season.

**WITH THE BASES LOADED:** Opponents are 2-for-2 with a home run and five RBI with the bases loaded...last year, opponents were 3-for-8 (.375) with a triple and two home runs with the bases loaded and the two grand slams tied for the most in the majors...opponents are now 5-for-10 (.500) with three home runs and 18 RBI with the bases loaded over the last two years and the three grand slams are tied with Masahiro Tanaka for the most in the majors.

*THIS AND THAT:* Has allowed eight of his 12 runs in the first two innings of a game for a 7.71 ERA (8 er in 9.1 ip)...has a 2.63 ERA (4 er in 13.2 ip) from the third inning on...the A's are 4-1 (.800) in his starting assignments.

**FIRST START:** He had a no decision in the A's 3-1 win over Texas on April 2 in Oakland...blanked the Rangers on three hits and a walk over the first four innings...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed his only run in the fifth inning... Robinson walked, stole second and scored on a Gallo single...was relieved by Buchter to start the sixth and the A's scored twice in the seventh for the win.

**SECOND START:** He was the winning pitcher in the A's 7-3 win at Los Angeles (AL) April 7...it was his first win since May 10, 2017, also against the Angels, and it snapped a career-high four-game losing streak dating back to last year...faced the minimum over the first three innings as a leadoff walk to Cozart in the first inning was erased on a double play...had a 3-0 lead when he allowed his only two runs in the fourth inning on a two-run home run by Upton...left after five innings with a 4-2 lead.

**THIRD START:** He had a no decision in the A's 7-4 loss at Seattle April 13... Oakland scored twice in the first, but he allowed two runs in the bottom of the first on a RBI single by Haniger and a RBI double by Seager...shutout the Mariners on a hit and two walks over his final four innings and the A's scored once in the sixth to give him a 3-2 lead...was relieved by Buchter to start the bottom of the sixth but the bullpen allowed five runs in the seventh for the blown save.

**FOURTH START:** He had a no decision in the A's 12-11, 14-inning win over Chicago (AL) April 18 in Oakland...tossed 1.1 innings, which was the shortest start of his career...allowed a RBI single to Delmonico in the first inning but the A's tied the game with a run in the bottom of the first...then faced seven

**LAST START:** He was the winning pitcher in the A's 3-2 win at Texas a week ago today...shut out the Rangers on three hits over the first five innings but Hamels blanked the A's on two hits, two walks and three hit by pitches over the first five innings...Oakland scored a run in the sixth but he gave that run back in the bottom of the sixth on a Beltre sacrifice fly...the A's then scored once in the seventh to take the lead for good.

ip, 9 h, 7 r, 7 er, 4 bb, 8 so) in two starts last year...the loss came in an 11-1 decision in Oakland on April 23...allowed six runs in 4.2 innings...allowed a RBI single to Cano in the first and then surrendered five runs in the third inning on a bases loaded walk to Cruz and a Motter grand slam...was relieved by Coulombe after 4.2 innings trailing 6-0...then had a no decision in a 9-6 A's win at Seattle May 16...allowed a two-out solo home run to Cruz in the first inning but that was the only run he would allow in six innings...blanked the Mariners on two hits and three walks over his final five innings and left with a 4-1 lead...the bullpen allowed three runs in the seventh inning for the blown save...his other appearance came in relief on May 25, 2016 at Seattle (2.0 ip, 6 h, 5 r, 5 er, 1 bb, 2 so)...pitched the final two innings of the A's 13-3 loss...allowed a two-run home run to Cruz in the Mariners four runs seventh and a solo home run to Cano in the eighth.

**2017 RECAP:** Was on the A's Opening Day roster and went 5-6 with a 4.27 ERA in 12 starts before his season ended June 10 with a hip injury...had surgery to repair the labrum in his left hip July 13...was 5-2 with a 2.12 ERA and .209 opponents batting average over his first eight starts...then went 0-4 with a 9.64 ERA and .381 opponents average over his final four starts...despite missing 3½ months of the season, he tied for seventh in the American League in unearned runs (11)...allowed a .266 opponents batting average, which included .215 (23-for-107) against left-handed hitters compared to .302 (45-for-149) against right-handers.

#### 5-2, 4.22 ERA (46 er in 98.0 ip) Saves/Opportunities: 4-for-7 (57.1%)

Has a 5.21 ERA (33 er in 57.0 ip) over the A's last 17 games after posting a 2.85 ERA over the first 11 contests.

- Are tied for first in the majors with 18 homers...allowed a season high four homers on Saturday, matching an Oakland A's game-high for homers allowed by the bullpen (4x, last 5/12/10 at Texas).
- Have the fourth highest opponents batting average (.275) and the thirdhighest slugging percentage (.464) in the majors.
- Have allowed 22-of-48 (45.7%) inherited runners to score, which is the third highest percentage in the American League.
- Are tied for the third fewest saves in the AL (4).
- Lead the majors with six first-batter home runs and 20 first-batter RBI.
- Posted 4.43 ERA (43 er in 87.1 ip) in the month of April after posting a 2.53 ERA (3 er in 10.1 ip) in three games in March.
- Own a 5.70 ERA (30 er in 47.1 ip) on the road while boasting a 2.84 (16 er in 50.2 ip) at home.

Last Year: Began the season as the A's closer and saved a team-leading 16 games before Blake Treinen took over in July...was 16-for-23 (69.6%) in save opportunities, which was the second lowest percentage in the majors...compiled a 4.27 ERA in 63 games.
