## OAKLAND ATHLETICS (14-15) VS. SEATTLE MARINERS (17-11)

WEDNESDAY, MAY 2, 2018 — SAFECO FIELD — 7:10 P.M. PDT

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Have lost three straight, which matches the A's longest losing streak of the season (March 30-April 1)...the losing streak drops Oakland's overall record to 14-15, which marks the first time the A's have been under .500 since April 21 (10-11)...have now lost four of the last five games after winning eight of the previous nine contests...are 9-5 over the last 14 games after starting the year 5-10...lost two of three at Houston over the weekend after winning each of their previous three series...are in fourth place in the American League West for the seventh consecutive day...have spent one day tied for first, one day tied for second, two days tied for third, 23 days in fourth and seven days tied for fourth.

**AGAINST LEFT-HANDERS:** The A's have won five of their last six games when the opponent starts a left-hander and are now 6-6 in those games for the season...the 12 games against left-handed starters are tied with Kansas City and Toronto for the most in the American League.

**THE WEST AND THE REST:** This three-game series with Seattle concludes this nine-game road trip, which featured all American League West competition (also Texas and Houston)...are 8-13 (.381) against divisional foes compared to 6-2 (.750) against all other teams...are batting .243 (170-for-701) and are averaging 4.14 runs per game (87 runs in 21 games) against the West compared to .298 with an average of 7.00 runs per game against everyone else...the pitching staff has a 4.82 ERA (98 er in 183.0 ip) against the West, 3.67 against all other teams.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 6-9 (.400) on the road compared to 8-6 (.571) at home...have a 5.36 ERA (75 er in 126.0 ip) on the road, 3.65 at home...have the third highest road ERA in the American League and the third lowest home ERA...have hit 25 home runs on the road, which is second most in the majors to the White Sox (26), but have allowed 25, which is tied for the most with the Mariners...are 3-4 on their second road trip of the season, a nine-game, 11-day trip to Texas (2-1), Houston (1-2) and Seattle (0-1)...return home following the game tomorrow for a six-game homestand against Baltimore (three games) and Houston (three games)...went 5-1 on the last homestand against Chicago-AL (3-0) and Boston (2-1), which was the A's best homestand of four or more games since going 5-1 on a six-game homestand against Detroit and Minnesota from May 27-June 1, 2016.

**OFFENSE:** The A's are batting .237 (78-for-329) and are averaging 3.9 runs per game (39 runs) over the last 10 games...hit .245 and averaged 3.7 runs per game over the first 12 games and then batted .306 with 8.6 runs per game over a seven-game stretch from April 11-19...overall, Oakland ranks third in the American League in batting (.259), on-base percentage (.336), hit by pitches (17) and OPS (.772), tied for third in triples (6), fourth in slugging (.436), extra base hits (99) and walks (103) and fifth in runs (143)...are tied for second in most grounded into double plays (26) and rank fifth in most strikeouts (265)...have six stolen bases, which is tied with the Cubs for the fewest in the majors.

**PITCHING:** The A's have allowed 25 runs over the last three games (22 er in 24.0 ip, 8.25 ERA) after yielding 12 runs over the previous six contests (1.87 ERA)...have allowed six home runs in the last four games after surrendering just one over the previous six contests...are averaging 2.50 walks per nine innings, which is the third lowest mark in the American League, and 7.61 strikeouts per nine innings, which is fourth lowest...have 22 wild pitches, which is the most in the AL and second most in the majors (Pittsburgh, 27)...opponents have stolen 23 bases, which is the most in the AL and fourth most in the majors.

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers have allowed one run or fewer in seven of the last 14 games and are 6-5 with a 3.68 ERA (33 er in 80.2 ip) over that stretch...went 5-10 with a 5.61 ERA over the first 15 contests...are 9-13 overall and the losses are tied for third most in the American League...Sean Manaea is 4-2 with a 1.03 ERA while the rest of Oakland's starters are 5-11 with a 6.00 ERA (76 er in 114.0 ip).

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed 11 errors in the last nine games after making just 10 over the first 20 contests...have 21 errors for the season, which is fourth most in the American League...the errors have led to 14 unearned runs, which is also fourth most in the AL...committed four errors Sunday at Houston, which were their most in a game since June 19, 2015 against Los Angeles (AL) when they also had four...A's outfielders have just

one assist (Chad Pinder on April 3), which is tied with Miami, San Francisco and Washington for the fewest in the majors.

**ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS:** The A's are 4-1 (.800) in one-run games, which is the best record in the majors...however, only Texas has played fewer one-run games than the A's (3)...are 4-0 in game decided in the last at bat...the wins are tied for second most in the American League (Toronto, 6) and the A's are one of four teams in the majors without a last at bat loss (Colorado, Seattle, Toronto)...are 2-0 in extra inning games and 2-0 in walk-off games.

**THIS AND THAT:** This road trip begins a stretch where the A's are scheduled to play 19 of 25 games on the road from April 23 to May 20...are 11-6 when scoring first, 3-9 when the opponent scores first...are tied with Detroit for the Major League lead in runs scored in the ninth inning (15)...the pitching staff has a 3.39 ERA (32 er in 85.0 ip) in the seventh inning or later, 5.02 (97 er in 174.0 ip) over innings one through six.

**IN APRIL:** The A's finished April with a 13-12 record for the second time in the last three years (also 2016)...set a franchise record for strikeouts in the month of April with 224...broke the previous mark of 221 set last year...were hit by a pitch 15 times, which is the most by an A's team in April since at least 1908...slugged .449, which was the third best April slugging percentage in Oakland history...hit 33 home runs, which was fifth best and the most since 2006 (34)...stole six bases, which were the A's fewest in April since 2006 (3)...the pitching staff had 17 wild pitches, which was the most by an A's team since at least 1908...allowed 32 home runs, which tied for second most in April in Oakland history and was the most since 2001 (also 32)...had a 4.42 ERA, which was the A's highest April ERA since 2006 (4.74).

**THE DISABLED LIST:** The A's have five players on the disabled list (Blackburn, Buchter, Cotton, Hendriks, Powell)...have used the DL eight times this year and had a season-high seven on the DL from April 7-14...Blackburn and Cotton are on the 60-day DL...Oakland used the DL 23 times last year, which marked the third consecutive season and seventh time in the last 11 years the A's have used the DL at least 20 times...have had at least four players on the DL every day since Aug. 24, 2015, at least three every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on DL since end of 2006 season (1).

**A'S ON THE RADIO:** 95.7 FM The Game is in its eighth season as flagship of the A's Radio Network...due to conflicts with the Warriors, the following games will air on 1550 AM: Friday and Sunday against Baltimore...additional updates will be announced based on the Warriors postseason schedule.

**A'S vs. MARINERS:** The A's trail in the season series 1-3...lost the first game of this series last night after losing two of three at Seattle to conclude the last road trip (April 13-15)...following this series, the next 10 meetings between the two clubs will be in Oakland...went 7-12 against Seattle last year and lost the season series for the fifth consecutive season...prior to this streak, had never lost more than four straight season series to the Mariners...are 38-61 (.384) against the Mariners dating back to the start of the 2013 season, which is the second worst record by any American League team against Seattle (TB, 12-20/.375)...went 4-5 in Oakland last year and 3-7 in Seattle...all-time, the A's are 342-285 against the Mariners...that includes 184-127 in Oakland, 157-157 in Seattle and 1-1 in Tokyo...are 81-93 at Safeco Field.

### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Matt Chapman** has started all 29 games and now has a consecutive games played streak of 109 dating back to last year...**Jed Lowrie** is tied for the Major League lead in go-ahead RBI (8), ranks second in RBI (28) and third in hits (40)...set an Athletics record for hits in the month of April with 35 and tied the mark for RBI with 27.

### OAKLAND A'S 50th ANNIVERSARY MOMENT

In **1975** Reggie Jackson collects his 1000th hit in an Oakland uniform in the A's 4-3 win at Chicago...in **2001** Mark Mulder tosses a three-hit shutout in the A's 6-0 win over Toronto...Miguel Tejada homers twice and drives in four runs...in **2012** Brian Fuentes records the 200<sup>th</sup> save of his career in the A's 4-2 win at Boston...he becomes the sixth left-hander in Major League history to reach the 200 save plateau.

## TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Brett Anderson (1-1, 1.89 ERA with Nashville)

**FOR STARTERS:** Was signed by the A's to a minor league contract March 19 and was selected from Triple-A Nashville today...it is his first appearance as an Athletic since Game 4 of the 2013 ALDS at Detroit on Oct. 8 (0.1 ip, 1 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 1 so)...it is his first start as an Athletic since April 24, 2013, a loss in a 6-5 decision at Boston (4.0 ip, 8 h, 6 r, 6 er, 2 bb, 5 so)...was originally selected by Arizona in the 2nd round of the 2006 draft but was one of six players traded to Oakland in the Dan Haren trade following the 2007 season...made his Major League debut with the A's in 2009 at the age of 21 and went 26-29 with a 3.81 ERA (191 er in 450.2 ip) in 84 games, 73 starts, in five seasons with Oakland from 2009-13...has gone 16-18 with a 4.40 ERA in 56 games, 55 starts, in four seasons since then with Colorado (2014), Los Angeles-NL (2015-16), Chicago-NL (2017) and Toronto (2017).

**ANDERSON vs. SEATTLE:** Is 8-4 with a 1.90 ERA (94.2 ip, 87 h, 26 r, 20 er, 22 bb, 76 so, 6 hr) in 16 career appearances, including 15 starts...the eight wins are his most against any team...is 3-2 with a 0.98 ERA (5 er in 46.0 ip) in eight games at Safeco Field and 5-2 with a 2.77 ERA (15 er in 48.2 ip) in eight starts in his home ballparks...is 4-2 with a 2.68 ERA (13 er in 43.2 ip) in seven starts in the Coliseum...has not faced the Mariners since April 15, 2015 while pitching for Los Angeles (NL)...was the winning pitcher in a 5-2 win at Dodger Stadium...had a 5-0 lead when he allowed a solo home run to Cruz in the fourth...loaded the bases with no outs in the sixth and the bullpen allowed one of the runs to score.

**WITH NASHVILLE:** Went 1-1 with a 1.89 ERA and .230 opponents batting average in four starts with Triple-A Nashville...did not allow a home run in 19.0 innings...struck out 25 (11.84 per nine innings) and walked just two (0.95 per nine innings) for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 12.5...his opponents batting average included a .193 (11-for-57) mark against right-handed hitters compared to .353 (6-for-17) against left-handers...yielded a .167 batting average and just one walk to batters leading off an inning...opponents hit .143 with the bases empty, .344 with runners on.

**LAST MINOR LEAGUE START:** He was the winning pitcher in the Sounds 4-2 win over New Orleans a week ago today at Nashville...the Sounds scored a run in the first but he allowed two runs in the second inning on a RBI ground out and a Johnny Giavotella RBI single...those were the only runs he would allow in six innings of work and Nashville scored twice in the sixth to give him the win.

**2017 RECAP:** Was signed by the Chicago Cubs Jan. 30 and went 2-2 with an 8.18 ERA in six starts before going on the disabled list May 7 with a strained lower back...missed nearly three months of the season and would not pitch for the Cubs again as he was released July 31...signed a minor league deal with Toronto Aug. 15 and returned to the majors Aug. 29...went 2-2 with a 5.13 ERA in seven starts for the Blue Jays and combined with both clubs for a 404 record and a 6.34 ERA in 13 starts.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Allowed a .322 opponents batting average, including .298 (56-for-188) against right-handed hitters compared to .436 (17-for-39) against left-handers...surrendered all five of his home runs to righties...yielded a .371 batting average with runners in scoring position...opponents hit .345 when leading off an inning, but he issued just one walk.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
<b>LHP Sean Manaea (4-2, 1.03 ERA):</b> Has the lowest opponents batting average (.134), on-base percentage (.178) and OPS (.400) in the majors...has a 1.03 ERA and .221 opponents slugging percentage, which is second lowest to the Giants Johnny Cueto (0.84 ERA, .206 slugging percentage)...is 3-0 with a 0.39 ERA and .078 opponents batting average over his last three starts...went 4-1 with a 1.00 ERA and .395 OPS in April...the OPS was fourth lowest in Oakland history for any month (min. 100 BF) and the ERA tied for fourth (min. 30.0 ip)...was the winning pitcher in his last start, an 8-1 A's win at Houston last Friday (7.0 ip, 4 h, 1 r, 0 er, 1 bb, 7 so)...had his consecutive hitless innings streak snapped at an Oakland record 14.0 in the fourth inning of that start...is 4-3 with a 3.88 ERA (48.2 ip, 39 h, 21 r, 21 er, 19 bb, 38 so, 5 hr) in eight career starts against the Mariners...including a win in his only start this year on April 15 at Seattle (7.0 ip, 2 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 4 so).

**HOME AND AWAY:** Went 1-2 with a 15.68 ERA in four starts at Wrigley Field and 1-2 with a 7.62 ERA in three starts in Rogers Centre for an 11.19 ERA in seven starts in his home ballparks...was 2-0 with a 2.81 ERA in six starts on the road.

**SPLITS:** Was 2-0 with a 2.05 ERA in four starts during the day, 2-4 with a 9.18 ERA in nine starts at night...was 1-1 with an 8.84 ERA in five starts on four days rest, 3-3 with a 5.00 ERA in eight starts on five days rest or more.

**THIS AND THAT:** Had a 7.04 ERA over the first two innings of his starts, 3.06 after that...opponents were successful in 6-of-7 (85.7%) stolen base attempts...allowed five runs in 0.1 innings for the loss in his only interleague start and is now 1-6 with a 5.76 ERA (29 er in 45.1 ip) in nine career interleague starts...went 1-for-7 (.143) with a RBI, walk and three strikeouts in eight plate appearances with the Cubs.

**MORE 2017:** Was in the Cubs starting rotation to open the season and allowed just one run over his first two starts...struck out a season-high five batters and allowed six runs on a season-high eight hits in 3.2 innings on April 18 against Milwaukee, but had a no decision in a 9-7 win...walked a career-high six batters April 24 at Pittsburgh, but allowed three runs in a season-high 6.0 innings for the win...finished April 2-0 with a 3.54 ERA in four starts...then allowed seven runs on seven hits in 1.1 innings May 1 against Philadelphia and five runs in 0.1 innings on May 6 against New York (AL), both losses...was placed on the 10-day disabled list May 7 with a strained lower back...it was his 10th career stint on the DL...was transferred to the 60-day DL June 8...went 2-2 with a 4.61 ERA in six games, including five starts, on a rehab assignment with Double-A Tennessee from June 25 to July 23...was reinstated from the DL and designated for assignment July 26...was released July 31 and signed a minor league deal with Toronto Aug. 15...went 1-1 with a 0.93 ERA in two starts with Triple-A Buffalo before he was selected by the Blue Jays Aug. 29...started and lost that day to Boston, despite allowing just one run in 5.2 innings...tossed a season-high tying 6.0 innings in his next two starts on Sept. 3 at Baltimore and Sept. 9 against Detroit...picked up his first win as a Blue Jay and matched his season-best with five strikeouts in the start against the Tigers...yielded a season-high eight runs on seven hits and two walks in 1.1 innings in a 15-5 loss to Kansas City on Sept. 25...then had a win and a 2.70 ERA over his final two starts.

- Was on the A's Opening Day roster and posted a 5.79 ERA in nine games before he was optioned to Nashville April 20.
- Made one appearance for the Sounds following his option (2.0 ip, 1 h, 3 so).
- Owns an 0-1 mark with a 7.63 ERA in 18 games against Seattle (15.1 ip, 16 h, 15 r, 13 er, 6 bb, 13 so, 3 hr).
