## OAKLAND ATHLETICS (15-15) VS. SEATTLE MARINERS (17-12)

THURSDAY, MAY 3, 2018 — SAFECO FIELD — 7:10 P.M. PDT LHP SEAN MANAEA (4-2, 1.03) VS. LHP WADE LEBLANC (0-0, 4.61) NBCSCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME)

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Snapped their losing streak at a season-high tying three games last night...are 2-4 over the last six games...however, are 10-5 over the last 15 contests after starting the year 5-10...lost two of three at Houston over the weekend after winning each of their previous three series...are in fourth place in the American League West for the eighth consecutive day... have spent one day tied for first, one day tied for second, two days tied for third, 24 days in fourth and seven days tied for fourth.

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's defeated the Mariners last night 3-2 to improve to 5-1 (.833) in one-run games...that is the best record in the majors but the six one-run decisions are tied for second fewest in the majors (Texas, 3)...scored the winning run in the ninth inning last night to improve to 5-0 in games decided in the last at bat...the wins are second most in the American League (Toronto, 6) and the A's are one of three teams in the majors without a last at bat loss (Colorado, Toronto)...won for the second time this year last night when trailing after seven innings, which is tied for the most in the AL...are 2-0 in extra inning games and 2-0 in walk-off games

LATE INNINGS: The A's scored the winning run in the ninth inning last night and now have a Major League leading 16 runs in the ninth inning...lead the majors with a .285 (101-for-354) batting average and 59 runs scored in the seventh inning or later...are hitting .244 (166-for-681) over the first six innings...the pitching staff has a 3.27 ERA (32 er in 88.0 ip) in the seventh inning or later compared to 4.95 (99 er in 180.0 ip) over innings one through six

AGAINST LEFT-HANDERS: With the win last night, the A's have now won six of their last seven games when the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher... lost five of their first six against lefties and are 7-6 for the season...the 13 games against left-handed starters are tied with Kansas City for the most in the American League.

STRIKEOUTS: The A's struck out a season-high 16 times last night and won... it was the 20th time in Oakland history the A's fanned 16 or more times in a nine-inning game and the sixth time they won...have struck out at least 13 times in each of the last three games (43 strikeouts total), which is the longest such streak in Athletics history...now have 281 strikeouts for the season, which is fifth most in the American League.

THE WEST AND THE REST: This three-game series with Seattle concludes this nine-game road trip, which featured all American League West competition (also Texas and Houston)...are 9-13 (.409) against divisional foes compared to 6-2 (.750) against all other teams...are batting .242 (178-for-736) and are averaging 4.09 runs per game (90 runs in 22 games) against the West compared to .298 with an average of 7.00 runs per game against everyone else... the pitching staff has a 4.69 ERA (100 er in 192.0 ip) against the West, 3.67 against all other teams.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 7-9 (.438) on the road compared to 8-6 (.571) at home...have a 5.13 ERA (77 er in 135.0 ip) on the road, 3.65 at home...have the fifth highest road ERA in the American League and the third lowest home ERA...lead the majors with 26 home runs allowed on the road and are tied with Texas for second with 27 home runs hit on the road (Colorado, 28)...are 4-4 on the second road trip of the season, a nine-game, 11-day trip to Texas (2-1), Houston (1-2) and Seattle (1-1)...this road trip begins a stretch where the A's are scheduled to play 19 of 25 games on the road from April 23 to May 20...return home following the game tonight for the only home games over that stretch, a six-game homestand against Baltimore (three games) and Houston (three games)...went 5-1 on the last homestand against Chicago-AL (3-0) and Boston (2-1), which was the A's best homestand of four or more games since going 5-1 on a six-game homestand against Detroit and Minnesota from May 27-June 1, 2016.

*OFFENSE:* The A's are batting .236 (86-for-364) and are averaging 3.8 runs per game (42 runs) over the last 11 games...hit .245 and averaged 3.7 runs per game over the first 12 games and then batted .306 with 8.6 runs per game over a seven-game stretch from April 11-19...overall, Oakland ranks third in the American League in batting (.258), on-base percentage (.333), extra base hits (104), hit by pitches (17) and OPS (.771), tied for third in triples (6), fourth in slugging (.438), doubles (60) and walks (104) and fifth in runs (146)...are fourth in most grounded into double plays (26)...have six stolen bases, which is tied with the Cubs for the fewest in the majors.

*PITCHING:* The A's have compiled a 3.77 ERA (57 er in 136.0 ip) over the last 15 games after logging a 5.05 ERA over the first 15 contests...have allowed seven home runs in the last four games after surrendering just one over the previous six contests...are averaging 2.52 walks per nine innings, which is the third lowest mark in the American League, and 7.62 strikeouts per nine innings, which is fourth lowest...have 22 wild pitches, which is the most in the AL and second most in the majors (Pittsburgh, 27)...opponents have stolen 23 bases, which is the most in the AL and fourth most in the majors.

*STARTING PITCHING:* A's starting pitchers have allowed one run or fewer in seven of the last 15 games and are 6-5 with a 3.62 ERA (35 er in 87.0 ip) over that stretch...went 5-10 with a 5.61 ERA over the first 15 contests...Sean Manaea is 4-2 with a 1.03 ERA while the rest of Oakland's starters are 5-11 with a 5.83 ERA (78 er in 120.1 ip).

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed 11 errors in the last 10 games after making just 10 over the first 20 contests...have 21 errors for the season, which is tied for fourth most in the American League...the errors have led to 14 unearned runs, which is fourth most in the AL...committed four errors Sunday at Houston, which were their most in a game since June 19, 2015 against Los Angeles (AL) when they also had four...A's outfielders have just two assists, both by Chad Pinder...are tied with Minnesota and Seattle for the fewest outfield assists in the AL.

*IN APRIL:* The A's finished April with a 13-12 record for the second time in the last three years (also 2016)...set a franchise record for strikeouts in the month of April with 224...broke the previous mark of 221 set last year...were hit by a pitch 15 times, which is the most by an A's team in April since at least 1908...slugged .449, which was the third best April slugging percentage in Oakland history...hit 33 home runs, which was fifth best and the most since 2006 (34)...stole six bases, which were the A's fewest in April since 2006 (3)... the pitching staff had 17 wild pitches, which was the most by an A's team since at least 1908...allowed 32 home runs, which tied for second most in April in Oakland history and was the most since 2001 (also 32).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have five players on the disabled list (Blackburn, Buchter, Cotton, Hendriks, Powell)...have used the DL eight times this year and had a season-high seven on the DL from April 7-14...Blackburn and Cotton are on the 60-day DL...have had at least four players on the DL every day since Aug. 24, 2015, at least three every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on DL since end of 2006 season (1).

**A's ON THE RADIO:** 95.7 FM The Game is in its eighth season as flagship of the A's Radio Network...due to conflicts with the Warriors, the following games will air on 1550 AM: Friday and Sunday against Baltimore...additional updates will be announced based on the Warriors postseason schedule.

**A's vs. MARINERS:** The A's trail in the season series 2-3...have split the first two games of this series after losing two of three at Seattle to conclude the last road trip (April 13-15)...following this series, the next 10 meetings between the two clubs will be in Oakland...went 7-12 against Seattle last year and lost the season series for the fifth consecutive season...prior to this streak, had never lost more than four straight season series to the Mariners...are 39-61 (.390) against the Mariners dating back to the start of the 2013 season, which is the second worst record by any American League team against Seattle (TB, 12-20/.375)...went 4-5 in Oakland last year and 3-7 in Seattle... all-time, the A's are 343-285 against the Mariners...that includes 184-127 in Oakland, 158-157 in Seattle and 1-1 in Tokyo...are 82-93 at Safeco Field.

## TODAY'S TIDBITS

*Mark Canha* has five home runs and 13 RBI in 17 games this year after tallying five home runs and 14 RBI in 57 games last year...*Matt Chapman* has started all 30 games and now has a consecutive games played streak of 110 dating back to last year...*Jed Lowrie* is tied for the Major League lead in RBI (30) and go-ahead RBI (9), ranks second in hits (42) and tied for second in multiple hit games (13).

## OAKLAND A'S 50th ANNIVERSARY MOMENT

In **1980** Wayne Gross and Dwayne Murphy both steal home in the A's 5-3 win against Detroit...Murphy's comes as part of a triple steal with Gross and Mitchell Page...in **2000** the A's set an Oakland record with 10 hits and 21 total bases in the seventh inning in a 14-5 win at Kansas City.

## TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Manaea (4-2, 1.03 ERA)

AMONG THE LEADERS: Has the lowest opponents batting average (.134), on-base percentage (.178) and OPS (.400) in the majors...has a 1.03 ERA and .221 opponents slugging percentage, which is second lowest to the Giants Johnny Cueto (0.84 ERA, .206 slugging percentage)...is tied for third in the American League in wins (4), ranks third in fewest walks per nine innings (1.44), fourth in innings pitched (43.2) and eighth in strikeout-to-walk ratio (5.29)...is also tied for seventh in wild pitches (3)...is averaging the fewest pitches per inning in the majors (13.0).

FIVE INNINGS OR MORE. TWO RUNS OR FEWER: Has allowed two runs or fewer and tossed five innings or more in each of his first six starts, which is tied for the third longest such season-opening streak in Oakland history...it is the longest since Dave Stewart had a seven-game streak in 1990...the record is eight games by Mike Norris in 1980.

THREE-GAME WINNING STREAK: Has picked up the win in each of his last three starts...has tossed seven or more innings and allowed one run or fewer in each start...has a 0.39 ERA (1 er in 23.0 ip) and .078 (6-for-77) opponents batting average during the streak...went 1-2 with a 1.74 ERA and .194 opponents average over his first three starts.

IN APRIL: Was named American League Pitcher of the Month for the month of April after going 4-1 with a 1.00 ERA and .130 opponents batting average in five starts...it was his first Pitcher of the Month honor...it was the first time in his career he won four games in a month and the four wins match the most by an A's pitcher in the month of April over the last 27 years (ninth time, last: Triggs in 2017)...his ERA tied for the fourth lowest in any month in Oakland history among pitchers with 30 or more innings pitched...it was the lowest since Cory Lidle had a 0.20 ERA in Aug., 2002...had a .395 OPS and is the fourth pitcher in Oakland history with an OPS under .400 in a month with a minimum of 100 batters faced (.358, Lidle in Aug. 2002; .376, Torrez in Sept. 1976; .390, Ontiveros in June 1987).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents are 2-for-42 (.048) with a walk and a hit by pitch (.091 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning...they are 3-for-34 (.088) with runners on base, including 1-for-10 (.100) with runners in scoring position...has not allowed a hit to the opponents number six hitter and the clean-up hitter is 1-for-18 (.056)...has a .047 (2-for-43) opponents average in the sixth inning or later...has surrendered four home runs, all solo

NO-HITTER: Tossed the seventh nohitter in Oakland history and the 12th in Athletics history on April 1 against Boston in Oakland...was named American League Co-Player of the Week for the week of April 16-22 along with Manny Machado for his efforts...it was his first Player of the Week award...finished his previous start on April 15 with two hitless

innings and did not allow a hit over the first three innings of his next start last Friday against Houston for an Oakland record 14.0-inning hitless streak... broke the previous mark of 13.0 by John "Blue Moon" Odom from June 1-7, 1968...opponents went 0-for-47 off him during the hitless streak...his no-hitter was the earliest by date (Catfish Hunter, May 8, 1968 vs. Minnesota) and second earliest by game number (Chief Bender, May 12, 1910 vs. Cleveland, game 18) in Athletics history...it was the 10th no-hitter in Coliseum history (six by A's, four by opponents)...it was the first since Dallas Braden's perfect game on May 9, 2010 vs. Tampa Bay...is the third Oakland pitcher to strikeout 10 or more in a no-hitter...Dave Stewart had 12 and Catfish Hunter had 11...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, the Red Sox .895 winning percentage entering the game was the highest in Major League history by a team that was no-hit at least five games into the season...the last pitcher to no hit a team that led the majors in runs per game entering the game was the A's Dave Stewart, who did it against Toronto on June 29, 1990 (also Elias).

GO THE DISTANCE: His no-hitter was the first complete game of his career and it came in his 59th game and 58th start...his streak of 57 consecutive starts without a complete game was fourth longest in Oakland history...it was the longest since Barry Zito's Oakland record streak of 113 from Aug. 12, 2003-Sept. 28, 2006...the shutout came in the A's 21st game of the season and it was the second earliest nine-inning shutout by an Athletic over the last 28 years...the earliest over that stretch was by Zito on April 18, 2003 vs. Texas, the A's 17th game of the season.

THIS AND THAT: Has allowed three of his six runs in the first inning (3 er in 6.0 ip, 4.50 ERA) and has a 0.48 ERA (2 er in 37.2 ip) from the second inning on...has walked two batters or fewer in each of his six starts...has received no runs of support in his two losses this year and 10 of his 21 career losses... had back-to-back starts of seven innings or more and two hits or fewer on

April 21 and 2 and is the first A's pitcher to do that since since Barry Zito (July 9-15, 2005).

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 2-1 loss to Los Angeles (AL) March 30 in Oakland...allowed a solo home run to the second batter of the game, Mike Trout, but that was the only run he would allow in 7.2 innings.. retired 12 straight at one point and set down 21 of the final 23 hitters...left trailing 1-0 as the A's scored their only run in the bottom of the ninth.

SECOND START: He picked up his first win of the season in the A's 6-2 win over Texas April 4 in Oakland...tossed 8.0 innings and allowed just one run for the second consecutive start...became the first A's pitcher on an Opening Day roster to start the season with back-to-back outings of seven innings or more and one run or fewer since Steve Karsay in 1994...blanked the Angels on two hits over the first four innings and had a 5-0 lead when he allowed his only run in the fifth inning... Mazara led off with a single, went to second on a Chrinos walk, third on a Profar sacrifice fly and scored on a Rua fielders choice...did not allow a run over his final three innings and retired each of the final 12 batters he faced.

THIRD START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-0 loss at Los Angeles (NL) on April 10...allowed back-to-back home runs to Taylor and Seager to start the bottom of the first but those were the only runs he would allow in five innings of work...Ryu and three Dodgers relievers combined to shutout the A's on five hits.

FOURTH START: He was the wining pitcher in the A's 2-1 win at Seattle April 15...the A's scored twice in the top of the first and he did not allow a hit over the first three innings...shutout the Mariners on a hit and two walks before Motter hit a one-out solo home run in the fifth inning...that was the only run  $\,$ he would allow in seven innings of work.

FIFTH START: He no-hit the Boston Red Sox in the A's 3-0 victory in Oakland last Saturday...walked Betts to start the game but then retired 14 straight before Leon reached on a Semien error...set down the next 12 before walking Benintendi with two outs in the ninth...then got Ramirez to hit into a game-ending force out for his first career complete game...walked two and matched his career high with 10 strikeouts.

LAST START: He won his third consecutive start in the A's 8-1 win at Houston last Friday...retired each of the first nine hitters before Springer reached on an error to start the fourth...one out later Correa had a RBI single to end Manaea's hitless streak at 14.0 innings...that was the only run he would allow in 7.0 innings and it was unearned, giving him an 18.0-inning streak without yielding an earned run.

MANAEA vs. SEATTLE: Is 4-3 with a 3.88 ERA (48.2 ip, 39 h, 21 r, 21 er, 19 bb, 38 so, 5 hr) in eight career starts... is 2-0 with a 4.24 ERA (8 er in 17.0 ip) in three starts in Oakland and 2-3 with a 3.69 ERA (13 er in 31.2 ip) in five starts in Seattle...was the winning pitcher in his only start this year, a 2-1 A's win at Seattle on April 15 (see fourth start above)...went 1-3 with a 4.01 ERA (24.2 ip, 22 h, 11 r, 11 er, 12 bb, 19 so, 2 hr) in four starts last year.

RHP Daniel Mengden (2-3, 4.68 ERA): Is 2-1 with a 3.74 ERA (9 er in 21.2 ip) over his last four starts after going 0-2 with a 6.55 ERA over his first two starts...is now 5-4 with a 3.06 ERA (23 er in 67.2 ip) over his last 11 starts dating back to Sept. 9, 2017 after going 2-10 with a 6.86 ERA over the first 16  $\,$ starts of his career...has issued just four walks in 32.2 innings and his average of 1.10 walks per nine innings is second lowest in the American League.. has a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 6.00, which is tied for fifth best...has allowed just two home runs in 32.2 innings and his average of 0.55 home runs per nine innings is tied for fourth lowest in the AL...is 0-3 with an 8.10 ERA in three starts AL West teams compared to 2-0 with a 2.37 ERA in three starts against everyone else...was the losing pitcher in his last start, an 11-0 A's loss at Houston last Saturday (2.1 ip, 6 h, 5 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 1 so)...has never faced Baltimore in his career.
