OAKLAND ATHLETICS (19-19) VS. NEW YORK YANKEES (26-12)

SATURDAY, MAY 12, 2018 — YANKEE STADIUM — 1:05 P.M. EDT
RHP ANDREW TRIGGS (3-1, 4.41) VS. RHP DOMINGO GERMÁN (0-1, 2.66)

ABOUT THE A'S: Won last night following a homestand vs. Baltimore (3-0) and Houston (0-3)...are 14-9 (.609) over the last 23 games dating back to April 15 after starting the year 5-10 (.333)...are in fourth place in AL West for 17th consecutive day...have spent one day tied for first, one day tied for second, two days tied for third, 33 days in fourth and seven days tied for fourth.

THEY'LL DRIVE YOU HOME: This series features four of the top five RBI players in the American League...Jed Lowrie (2nd, 34), Khris Davis (T3rd, 32), Aaron Judge (T3rd, 32) and Didi Gregorius (5th, 31) all trail Baltimore's Manny Machado (35)...Lowrie did not have an RBI in his first four games of the season, but has driven in 34 runs over his last 33 games.

ROAD WARRIOR: Jed Lowrie is hitting .370 (27-for-73) with 11 runs, 2 doubles, 1 triple, 7 home runs, 18 RBI with a .418 on-base percentage and a .712 slugging mark in 18 road games...his seven home runs on the road this season, T3rd in the American League, while his 18 road RBI are T3rd.

MORE BANG FOR THE BUCK: Khris Davis has driven in a run in 6 of the last 7 games for a total of 9 RBI...while he only has 5 hits in the last 7 games, four of them have gone for extra bases (2B, 3 HR)...since the start of the 2017 season, he has driven in 142 runs, the 5th-most in the Major Leagues behind Giancarlo Stanton (155), Colorado's Nolan Arenado (152), Aaron Judge (146), and St. Louis' Marcell Ozuna (144).

NOT TO BE OVERLOOKED: Closer Blake Treinen has posted a 1.72 ERA (11 er, 57.2 ip) with 64 strikeouts over his last 50 relief appearances since July 4, 2017...his 1.72 mark is the 4th-best by a Major League reliever (min. 40.0 ip) behind Milwaukee's Matt Albers (1.13), Chicago's Steve Cishek (1.49) and San Diego's Craig Stammen (1.65)...of his 47 appearances since joining Oakland, he has tossed 1.1+ innings in 15 of those games, including in 8 of his 12 relief appearances this season.

SEEING STRIPES: Jonathan Lucroy has hit safely in all 8 of his career games against New York-AL...during the streak, he is hitting .423 (11-for-26) with 4 runs, 2 doubles, 1 home run and 4 RBI...in five games at this ballpark, he's hitting .412 (7-for-17).

ABOUT LAST NIGHT: Dustin Fowler collected his first Major League hit last night...he was selected by New York-AL in the 18th round of the 2013 First-Year Player Draft...according to Elias, he became the second player this season to record his first career hit against the team that drafted him, joining Atlanta's LHP Jesse Biddle on April 29 at Philadelphia.

A's vs. YANKEES: The A's won the season series last year, 5-2...swept a four-game series in Oakland and lost two of three at New York...have now won the season series four times in the previous five years and are 22-12 (.647) over that span, which dates back to 2013...that is the best record by an American League team against the Yankees over that span...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 248-278 against the Yankees...that includes 136-127 in Oakland and 112-151 in New York...are 15-20 at Yankee Stadium...all-time, the A's are 789-1144 against the Yankees/Orioles.

FIRST PLACE AND OTHER TOUGH TEAMS: Tonight's game marks the A's fourth straight contest against a team with at least a share of the lead in its division...are currently in a 19-game stretch that began on Monday and runs through May 27 where they will play Houston, New York, Boston, Toronto, Seattle and Arizona...those six teams are currently a combined 142-87 (.620)...the A's are 1-3 during this stretch.

AGAINST THE EAST: The A's are 6-1 against the American League East after winning two of three from Boston last month, sweeping a three-game series from Baltimore last homestand and the win last night...each of the A's 10 games on this road trip are against the East...Oakland will play New York, Boston and Toronto on the same trip for the first time since April 11-17, 1997...have a 10-2 (.833) record in interdivision play compared to 9-17 (.346) against the AL West...have the second worst intradivision record in the AL to Baltimore (5-8)...are batting .235 (202-for-861) and are averaging 3.69 runs per game (96 runs in 26 games) against the AL West, .280 (125-for-446) with an average of 6.33 runs per game (76 runs in 12 games) against everyone else...the pitching staff has a 4.92 ERA (124 er in 277.0 ip) against the AL West, 2.97 (38 er in 115.0 ip) against all other teams.

PITCHING: The A's have a 3.77 ERA (88 er in 210.0 ip) over the last 23 games after logging a 5.05 ERA over the first 15 contests...are averaging 2.50 walks per nine innings, which is the lowest mark in the majors ahead of Houston (2.59).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's continue a 10-game road trip to New York-AL (1-0), Boston (three games) and Toronto (four games) today...this trip concludes a stretch that began on April 23 where the A's will play 19 of 25 games on the road...went 4-5 on the last road trip to Texas (2-1), Houston (1-2) and Seattle (1-2) and are now 8-10 (.444) on the road compared to 11-9 (.550) at home...the A's have compiled a 4.91 ERA (83 er in 152.0 ip) on the road compared to 3.74 at home...have the sixth highest road ERA in the American League and the fourth lowest home ERA...have allowed 29 home runs on the road, which is the second most in the AL...the offense has hit 32 home runs on the road, which is second most in the AL (Boston, 34), compared to 14 at home, which is tied for second fewest...went 3-3 on the last homestand against Baltimore (3-0) and Houston (0-3).

OFFENSE: The A's scored 10 runs last night...in the previous 11 games, hit .196 (70-for-358) with 26 runs scored (2.4 runs per game) after hitting .268 and average 5.2 runs per game over the first 26 contests...rank tied for fourth in the American League in walks (125), tied for fourth in hit by pitches (18) and fourth in extra base hits (126)...also have the fifth most strikeouts (345) and the fifth most grounded into double plays (31).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 2-7 with a 4.59 ERA (33 er in 64.2 ip) over the last 12 games (the wins by Andrew Triggs on May 6 & Kendall Graveman on May 11)...that follows an 11-game stretch from April 15-27 where the starters went 6-2 with a 2.93 ERA...are now 11-17 with a 4.43 ERA (103 er in 209.1 ip) for the season...starters have not walked a batter in three of the last five games and have issued two free passes or fewer in 34 of the 38 games this year.

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's have won each of their last five one-run games and are 6-1 (.857) in one-run decisions for the season...including 3-0 on the road...the A's .857 winning percentage in one-run games is the best in the majors, but the seven decisions are tied with Texas for the second fewest...are 6-0 in games decided in the last at bat...are 3-0 in extra inning games and are tied for third in the AL in extra inning wins (Texas and Toronto, 4)...have three walk-off wins.

LATE INNINGS: The A's lead the majors with a .273 (121-for-444) batting average in the seventh inning or later and are tied for third with 67 runs scored...are hitting .239 (206-for-863) over the first six innings...the pitching staff has a 3.32 ERA (42 er in 114.0 ip) in the seventh inning or later, which is second lowest in the American League (Toronto, 2.56)...have a 4.74 (120 er in 228.0 ip) over innings one through six...have 20 runs scored in the ninth inning, which is third most in the majors.

THE DISABLED LIST: The have six players on the disabled list (Blackburn, Buchter, Cahill, Cotton, Hendriks, Powell)...have used the DL 10 times this year and had a season-high seven on the DL from April 7-14...Blackburn and Cotton are on the 60-day DL...have had at least four players on the DL every day since Aug. 24, 2015, at least three every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on DL since end of 2006 season (1).

A'S ON THE RADIO: 95.7 FM The Game is in its eighth season as flagship of the A's Radio Network...due to conflicts with the Warriors, the following games will air in the Bay Area on 1550 AM: Monday and Wednesday against Boston and May 22 against Seattle...additional updates will be announced based on the Warriors postseason schedule.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Santiago Casilla has the lowest opponents slugging percentage among American League relievers (.125), the second best opponent's on-base percentage (.200), and the third lowest batting average (.104)...**Matt Chapman** leads Major League third baseman with 139 total chances, which is 39 more than any other third baseman...**Jed Lowrie** is second in the AL in RBI (34), first in go-ahead RBI (11) and is tied for first in hits (52) and multiple hit games (16)...**Lou Trivino** has not allowed a run in eight of his nine appearances and his 0.75 ERA ranks third lowest among AL relievers.

In 1992 Dave Stewart records his 1000th strikeout in an Oakland uniform in the A's 3-0 loss at Toronto...he becomes the third pitcher in Oakland history to strikeout 1000.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Andrew Triggs (3-1, 4.41 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his eighth start of the season...logged a 2.87 ERA over his first three starts but has a 5.68 ERA (12 er in 19.0 ip) in four starts since then...has allowed two runs or fewer in five of his seven starts and six hits or fewer in all seven starts.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has held the opposition to a .197 (12-for-61) batting average with runners on base, but has surrendered three of his four home runs...opponents are 8-for-33 (.242) with runners in scoring position but they are 2-for-15 (.133) with RISP and two outs...has allowed a .158 (6-for-38) batting average with two outs, compared to .255 (24-for-94) with zero or one out...has issued 12 walks, five of which have come to the first batter in an inning...opponents are batting .290 (9-for-31) with a .389 on-base percentage leading off an inning...has a .267 (16-for-60) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .176 (9-for-51) the second time and .238 (5-for-21) after that.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to pitch on five days rest today...is 2-0 with a 5.79 ERA (9 er in 14.0 ip) in three starts on four days rest, 1-1 with a 3.48 ERA (8 er in 20.2 ip) in four starts on five days rest or more...his career numbers are 3-4 with a 6.29 ERA (31 er in 44.1 ip) in 10 starts on four days rest or fewer, 6-4 with a 2.77 ERA (25 er in 81.1 ip) in 15 starts on five days rest or more.

THE WEST AND THE REST: Is 2-1 with a 3.42 ERA (10 er in 26.1 ip) in five starts against American League West teams, 1-1 with a 7.56 ERA (7 er in 8.1 ip) in two starts against everyone else...his career numbers are 6-2 with a 3.42 ERA (31 er in 81.2 ip) in 18 games against the AL West, 3-6 with a 5.30 ERA (44 er in 74.2 ip) in 25 games against everyone else.

ON THE BASES: Opponents have stolen four bases with him on the mound, which is tied for eighth most in the American League...allowed 15 stolen bases last year, which tied for seventh most in the AL despite missing 3½ months of the season.

WITH THE BASES LOADED: Opponents are 2-for-2 with a home run, six RBI and a sacrifice fly with the bases loaded...last year, opponents were 3-for-8 (.375) with a triple and two home runs with the bases loaded and the two grand slams tied for the most in the majors...opponents are now 5-for-10 (.500) with three home runs and 19 RBI with the bases loaded over the last two years and the three grand slams are tied with Masahiro Tanaka for the most in the majors.

FIRST START: He had a no decision in the A's 3-1 win over Texas on April 2 in Oakland...blanked the Rangers on three hits and a walk over the first four innings...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed his only run in the fifth inning...Robinson walked, stole second and scored on a Gallo single...was relieved by Buchter to start the sixth and the A's scored twice in the seventh for the win.

SECOND START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 7-3 win at Los Angeles (AL) April 7...it was his first win since May 10, 2017, also against the Angels, and it snapped a career-high four-game losing streak dating back to last year...faced the minimum over the first three innings as a leadoff walk to Cozart in the first inning was erased on a double play...had a 3-0 lead when he allowed his only two runs in the fourth inning on a two-run home run by Upton...left after five innings with a 4-2 lead.

THIRD START: He had a no decision in the A's 7-4 loss at Seattle April 13...Oakland scored twice in the first, but he allowed two runs in the bottom of the first on a RBI single by Haniger and a RBI double by Seager...shutout the Mariners on a hit and two walks over his final four innings and the A's scored once in the sixth to give him a 3-2 lead...was relieved by Buchter to start the bottom of the sixth but the bullpen allowed five runs in the seventh for the blown save.

FOURTH START: He had a no decision in the A's 12-11, 14-inning win over Chicago (AL) April 18 in Oakland...tossed 1.1 innings, which was the shortest start of his career...allowed a RBI single to Delmonico in the first inning but the A's tied the game with a run in the bottom of the first...then faced seven batters in the second and recorded just one out...yielded a RBI single to Engel and a grand slam to Moncada...left after 1.1 innings trailing 6-1.

FIFTH START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 3-2 win at Texas May 24...shut out the Rangers on three hits over the first five innings but Hamels blanked the A's on two hits, two walks and three hit by pitches over the first five innings...Oakland scored a run in the sixth but he gave that run back in the bottom of the sixth on a Beltre sacrifice fly...the A's then scored once in the seventh to take the lead for good.

SIXTH START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 10-3 loss at Seattle on May 1...walked a career-high tying three batters...the A's scored a run in the first but he gave that run back in the second on a Zunino RBI double...then allowed a three-run home run to Cruz in the fifth inning for the loss.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 2-1 win over Baltimore last Sunday in Oakland...matched his career highs with 7.0 innings pitched and nine strikeouts and allowed just two base runners...retired each of the first five hitters before Alvarez homered with two outs in the second...also allowed a leadoff single to Peterson in the fourth before retiring each of the final 12 batters he faced.

2017 RECAP: Was on the A's Opening Day roster and went 5-6 with a 4.27 ERA in 12 starts before his season ended June 10 with a hip injury...had surgery to repair the labrum in his left hip July 13...was 5-2 with a 2.12 ERA and .209 opponents batting average over his first eight starts...then went 0-4 with a 9.64 ERA and .381 opponents average over his final four starts...despite missing 3½ months of the season, he tied for seventh in the American League in unearned runs (11)...allowed a .266 opponents batting average, which included .215 (23-for-107) against left-handed hitters compared to .302 (45-for-149) against right-handers.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Brett Anderson (0-1, 8.68 ERA): Is scheduled to make his third start since he was selected from Triple-A Nashville May 2...allowed two runs in 6.1 innings in his first start but then took the loss in his last start, a 16-2 A's loss to Houston last Monday in Oakland (3.0 ip, 10 h, 9 r, 7 er, 3 bb)...is 0-5 with a 6.81 ERA (35.2 ip, 52 h, 31 r, 27 er, 9 bb, 26 so, 6 hr) in seven career starts against New York...the five losses are his most against any team...went 0-1 with a 8.44 ERA (5.1 ip, 9 h, 5 r, 5 er, 0 bb, 4 so) in two starts last year...went 1-1 with a 1.89 ERA and .230 opponents batting average in four starts with Triple-A Nashville...did not allow a home run in 19.0 innings...struck out 25 and walked just two for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 12.5...was signed by the A's to a minor league contract March 19...was originally selected by Arizona in the 2nd round of the 2006 draft but was one of six players traded to Oakland in the Dan Haren trade following the 2007 season.
