## OAKLAND ATHLETICS (20-21) VS. BOSTON RED SOX (28-13)

TUESDAY, MAY 15, 2018 — FENWAY PARK — 7:10 P.M. EDT

ABOUT THE A'S: Won for just the second time in the last seven games last night...are now 15-11 (.577) over the last 26 games dating back to April 15, which is the third best record in the American League, after starting the year 5-10 (.333)...are in fourth place in the AL West for the 20th consecutive day... have spent one day tied for first, one day tied for second, two days tied for third, 36 days in fourth and seven days tied for fourth.

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's improved to 7-2 (.778) in one-run games with the win last night...that is the best record in the majors, but the nine one-run decisions are fourth fewest in the American League... are 3-1 in extra inning games and are tied for third in the AL in extra inning wins...had their first last at bat loss of the season Saturday at New York (AL)... have six last at bat wins, which is third most in the AL...have three walk-off

LATE INNINGS: The A's have compiled a 3.42 ERA (47 er in 123.2 ip) in the seventh inning or later, which is third lowest in the American League...have a 4.83 ERA (132 er in 246.0 ip) over innings one through six...are batting .262 (126-for-481) in the seventh inning or later compared to .242 (226-for-933) in innings 1-6...are batting a Major League leading .275 (36-for-131) with 21 runs scored in the ninth inning...the runs scored are tied with Atlanta and New York (AL) for the most in the majors.

AGAINST THE EAST: The A's are 7-3 (.700) against American League East teams, which is the best record in the majors...each of the A's 10 games on this road trip are against the East and Oakland will play New York, Boston and Toronto on the same trip for the first time since April 11-17, 1997...have an 11-4 (.733) record in interdivision play compared to 9-17 (.346) against the AL West...have the worst intradivision record in the AL and the third worst in the majors...are batting .235 (202-for-861) and are averaging 3.69 runs per game (96 runs in 26 games) against the AL West, .271 (150-for-553) with an average of 6.00 runs per game (90 runs in 15 games) against everyone else...the pitching staff has a 4.92 ERA (124 er in 227.0 ip) against the AL West, 3.47 (55 er in 142.2 ip) against all other teams.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are scheduled to face a left-handed starting pitcher today and tomorrow...have won six of the last nine games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher...are 7-8 against left-handed starters and the 15 games are fourth most in the American League...are batting .259 (110-for-425) against left-handed pitchers, .245 (242-for-989) against right-hander.

AGAINST THE BEST: The A's are in a 19-game stretch from May 7 to 27 where they will play Houston, New York, Boston, Toronto, Seattle and Arizona... those six teams are currently a combined 150-96 (.610) and the A's are 2-5 during that stretch...played six consecutive games against teams with at least a share of first place in its division from May 8 through yesterday and went 2-4 over that stretch.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-2 on this 10-game road trip to New York-AL (1-2), Boston (1-0) and Toronto (four games)...have lost six of their last nine road games...this trip concludes a stretch that began on April 23 where the A's will play 19 of 25 games on the road...are 9-12 (.429) on the road compared to 11-9 (.550) at home...the A's have compiled a 5.01 ERA (100 er in 179.2 ip) on the road compared to 3.74 at home...have the fifth highest road ERA in the AL and the fourth lowest home ERA...have allowed a Major League leading 35 home runs on the road...the offense has hit 37 home runs on the road, which is second most in the majors (Atlanta, 39)...have 14 at home, which is fourth fewest...went 3-3 on the last homestand against Baltimore (3-0) and Houston (0-3).

*OFFENSE:* The A's have scored 24 runs over the first four games of the road trip (6.0 per game) after scoring 15 runs in six games on the last homestand (2.5 per game)...are averaging 4.95 runs per game on the road (104 runs in 21 games), 4.10 at home (82 runs in 20 games)...are hitting .215 (109-for-506) with 50 runs scored over the last 15 games (3.3 runs per game) after batting .268 and averaging 5.2 runs per game over the first 26 contests...are batting .195 (23-for-118) with runners in scoring position over the last 17 games after hitting .288 with RISP over the first 24 contests...rank fourth in the American League in walks (136) but have the second most strikeouts (375).

**PITCHING:** The A's have compiled a 5.51 ERA (39 er in 63.2 ip) and .307 (81-for-264) opponents batting average over the last seven games...however, have a 3.98 ERA (105 er in 237.2 ip) over the last 26 games after logging a 5.05 ERA over the first 15 contests...have allowed at least one home run in each of the last eight games (15 home runs total) and 14 of the last 15 (24 home runs)...

have surrendered 55 home runs for the season, which is fifth most in the American League...are averaging 2.65 walks per nine innings, which is third lowest in the AL...had two wild pitches last night for the second consecutive game and now have a Major League leading 31 for the season...set an Athletics franchise record with 84 wild pitches last year.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 3-8 with a 5.18 ERA (46 er in 80.0 ip) over the last 15 games after going 6-2 with a 2.93 ERA over an 11-game stretch from April 15-27...are 12-18 with a 4.65 ERA (116 er in 224.2 ip) for the season...are tied for fourth in the American League in losses...starters have issued two free passes or fewer in 36 of the 41 games this year and are second in the majors in fewest walks per nine innings (2.28) to Cleveland (2.18).

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's committed two errors last night after making two in the previous nine games...the four errors over the last 10 games have led to eight unearned runs...have 22 unearned runs for the season, which is tied with Baltimore for second most in the American League (Texas, 23)... have turned 29 double plays, which is tied for fourth fewest in the AL...A's outfielders have just two assists (both by Chad Pinder), which is tied for second fewest in the majors (Washington, 1).

*ON THE BASES:* The A's are 1-for-6 (16.7%) in stolen base attempts over the last 16 games...are 7-for-14 (50.0%) for the season and the stolen base percentage is the lowest in the majors...also rank last in the majors in stolen bases and stolen base attempts...opponents have stolen 33 bases, which is the most in the American League and second most in the majors (New York, 34)...however, they have been caught stealing 13 times, which is tied with Toronto for second most in the AL (Chicago, 15).

*THE DISABLED LIST:* The have six players on the disabled list (Blackburn, Buchter, Cahill, Cotton, Hendriks, Powell)...have used the DL 10 times this year and had a season-high seven on the DL from April 7-14...Blackburn and Cotton are on the 60-day DL...have had at least four players on the DL every day since Aug. 24, 2015, at least three every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on DL since end of 2006 season (1).

**A's ON THE RADIO:** 95.7 FM The Game is in its eighth season as flagship of the A's Radio Network...due to conflicts with the Warriors, the following games will air in the Bay Area on 1550 AM: Wednesday against Boston and a week from today against Seattle...additional updates will be announced based on the Warriors postseason schedule.

A's vs. RED SOX: The A's lead the season series 3-1 and need to win one of the remaining two games to win the season series for the second consecutive year (went 4-3 last year)...have not won back-to-back season series against the Red Sox since 1987-88 (8-4 and 9-3)...won the first game in Boston last night after taking two of three in Oakland April 20-22...have now won eight of their last 12 games against the Red Sox after losing nine straight...have won six of the last eight games in the Coliseum but have lost eight of the last 10 at Fenway...the save by Treinen last night was the first in an A's vs. Red Sox game since June 7, 2015 (Tommy Layne)...it was the first by an Athletic since Sean Doolittle on June 20, 2014...nine of the 17 games over the last three years have been decided by five runs or more, including five by nine or more...are 243-295 against Boston since moving to Oakland in 1968...that includes 147-122 in Oakland, 95-172 in Boston and 1-1 in Tokyo...all-time, the A's are 885-1076 against the Red Sox.

## TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Chapman leads Major League third baseman with 149 total chances, which is 32 more than any other third baseman...Khris Davis leads the majors in go-ahead home runs (8) and is tied for the American League lead in go-ahead RBI (11)...is also tied for second in the AL in RBI (36) and tied for fourth in home runs (12)...Jed Lowrie is tied for the AL lead in go-ahead RBI (11) and tied for second in hits (54), RBI (36) and multiple hit games (17)... Blake Treinen ranks third among AL relievers with a 0.93 ERA.

#### OAKLAND A'S 50th ANNIVERSARY MOMENT

In 1985 the A's set what was then a club record for margin of victory when they defeat the Brewers at Milwaukee 19-3...Mike Davis homers twice and drives in six runs and four Athletics collect three hits each...in 2016 Danny Valencia hits three home runs, including the game-winning two-run shot in the ninth inning of the A's 7-6 win at Tampa Bay.

## TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Daniel Mengden (2-4, 4.06 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is 2-2 with a 3.24 ERA (12 er in 33.1 ip) over his last six starts after going 0-2 with a 6.55 ERA over his first two starts...is now 5-5 with a 2.95 ERA (26 er in 79.1 ip) over his last 13 starts dating back to Sept. 9, 2017 after going 2-10 with a 6.86 ERA over the first 16 starts of his career.

**DON'T WALK:** Has walked one batter or fewer in each of his first eight starts... has issued just five walks in 44.1 innings and his average of 1.02 walks per nine innings is second lowest in the American League (Colon, TEX 0.83)...has a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 6.60, which is fifth best...now has 14 walks in 87.1 innings over the last two years (1.45 per nine innings) after issuing 33 walks in 72.0 innings in his first season in 2016 (4.13 per nine innings)...has a streak of eight consecutive games with two or more innings and one walk or fewer, which matches the longest season-opening streak in Oakland history (Colon, 2013).

*OPPONENTS BATTING:* Has held left-handed hitters to a .185 (15-for-81) batting average while right-handers are batting .320 (31-for-97)...last year, he had a .268 average against lefties, .187 against righties...has issued all five of his walks this year to right-handed hitters and his on-base percentage against lefties (.183) is lower than his batting average...has issued 12 of his 14 walks over the last two years to righties...has walked just one batter to lead off an inning this year...all five of the home runs he has surrendered have been solo shots...has held the three-hitter to a .136 (3-for-22) batting average but the clean-up hitter is batting .421 (8-for-19)...has a .328 (22-for-67) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .164 (11-for-67) the second time and .295 (13-for-44) after that...last year, he had a .179 opponents average the first time through the lineup, .257 after that.

**NIGHT AND DAY:** Is 2-1 with a 3.98 ERA (9 er in 20.1 ip) in four starts at night compared to 0-3 with a 4.13 ERA (11 er in 24.0 ip) in four starts during the day...over the last two years, he has made nine of his 15 starts during the day...is 5-5 with a 5.89 ERA (48 er in 73.1 ip) in 14 career starts at night, 2-10 with a 4.08 ERA (39 er in 86.0 ip) in 15 starts during the day.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 1-3 with a 3.16 ERA (13 er in 37.0 ip) and .231 (33-for-143) opponents batting average in six starts at home compared to 1-1 with an 8.59 ERA (7 er in 7.1 ip) and .371 (13-for-35) opponents batting average in two starts on the road...however, is 1-10 with a 5.13 ERA (53 er in 93.0 ip) in 17 career starts in the Coliseum compared to 6-4 with a 4.61 ERA (34 er in 66.1 ip) in 12 starts on the road...picked up his first career win in the Coliseum April 16 against Chicago (AL), snapping a career-opening 10-game home losing streak...that is the longest career-opening home losing streak by an A's pitcher since Bobby Hasty lost 11 straight from Sept. 11, 1919 to Aug. 11, 1921...it is the second longest home losing streak in Oakland history and fell three short of the record of 14 set by Matt Keough from July 14, 1978 to Aug. 8, 1979...allowed a run in the first inning of his first road start this year, snapping a 23.0-inning road scoreless streak...that fell two short of the Oakland record of 25.0 set by Gene Nelson (Aug. 21, 1989-April 25, 1990) and matched by Dennis Eckersley (June 5, 1990-April 16, 1991).

**DAYS REST:** Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 1-2 with a 2.70 ERA (6 er in 20.0 ip) in three starts on four days rest, 1-2 with a 5.18 ERA (14 er in 24.1 ip) in five starts on five days rest or more...his career splits are 4-4 with a 3.49 ERA (26 er in 67.0 ip) in 11 starts on four days rest, 3-11 with a 5.94 ERA (61 er in 92.1 ip) in 18 starts on five days rest or more.

THE WEST AND THE REST: Is 0-4 with a 6.30 ERA (14 er in 20.0 ip) in four starts American League West teams compared to 2-0 with a 2.22 ERA (6 er in 24.1 ip) in four starts against everyone else...is now 1-10 with a 5.89 ERA (48 er in 73.1 ip) in 14 career starts against divisional foes, 6-5 with a 4.08 ERA (39 er in 86.0 ip) in 15 starts against all other teams...his only win against an AL West team came on Oct. 1, 2017 at Texas.

2018 START-BY-START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-3 loss to Los Angeles (AL) on March 31 in Oakland...allowed a RBI double to Trout in the first and two more runs, one earned, in the third...also yielded a RBI double to Pujols in the fifth...was relieved by Hendriks with two outs and runners on first and second in the sixth and the A's trailing 4-0...Hendriks allowed both inherited runners to score...lost his second consecutive start in the A's 6-3 loss to Texas on April 5 in Oakland...allowed four runs, three earned, all in the second inning...yielded a RBI single to Odor and then his own throwing error on a Rua sacrifice allowed two more runs to score...Robinson added a RBI single to give the Rangers a 4-0 lead...picked up his first win of the season in the A's 16-6 win at Los Angeles (NL) April 11...the A's scored twice in the first, but he allowed a Seager RBI ground out in the bottom of the first... Oakland added five more in the fourth before he allowed a solo home run to Grandal in the bottom of the fourth...had a 9-2 lead when he was relieved by Petit with no outs and runners on first and third in the sixth...Petit allowed both runs to score...won his second consecutive start in the A's 8-1 win over Chicago (AL) April 16 in Oakland...allowed one hit in each of the first four innings but retired 11 straight from the last out in the fourth through the first out in the eighth...had an 8-0 lead when he allowed a leadoff home run to Abreu in the ninth...was relieved by Petit, who retired the final three batters to preserve the win...had a no decision in the A's 4-1 win over Boston April 22 in Oakland...the A's scored a run in the first and he shut out the Red Sox on three hits over the first six innings, retiring 12 straight at one point...allowed the game tying RBI double to Holt in the seventh inning but the A's scored three times in the bottom of the eighth for the win...was the losing pitcher in the A's 11-0 loss at Houston April 28...tossed a career-low 2.1 innings...allowed three runs in the first inning on sacrifice flies by Gurriel and Reddick and a Bregman RBI double...also allowed an Altuve RBI double in the second and was relieved by Coulombe with one out and runners on first and third in the third...Coulombe allowed one of those runs to score...had a no decision in the A's 6-4 win over Baltimore May 4 in Oakland...allowed a solo home run to the second batter he faced, Jones, but that was the only run he would allow in five innings of work...was relieved by Petit to start the sixth inning with the A's leading 4-1 and Petit allowed three runs for the blown save.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-1 loss to Houston last Wednesday in Oakland...blanked the Astros on four hits over the first six innings...had a 1-0 lead entering the seventh inning and retired the first two batters before surrendering back-to-back home runs to Stassi and Fisher for the loss.
