OAKLAND ATHLETICS (21-22) VS. TORONTO BLUE JAYS (22-21)

THURSDAY, MAY 17, 2018 — ROGERS CENTRE — 7:10 P.M. EDT
RHP ANDREW TRIGGS (3-1, 5.31) VS. RHP AARON SANCHEZ (2-3, 4.08)

ABOUT THE A'S: Won two of three at Boston after losing five of the previous six games...are now 16-12 (.571) over the last 28 games dating back to April 15, which is the fifth best record in the American League over that span, after starting the year 5-10 (.333)...are in fourth place in the AL West for the 22nd consecutive day...have spent one day tied for first, one day tied for second, two days tied for third, 37 days in fourth and seven days tied for fourth.

TELEVISION AND RADIO: Two of the A's four games against the Blue Jays will air in the Bay Area on NBCSCA: Friday and Sunday...tonight's game will air on MLB Network and Saturday's game will air on Fox Sports 1...95.7 FM The Game is in its eighth season as flagship of the A's Radio Network...due to conflicts with the Warriors, Tuesday's game against Seattle will air in the Bay Area on 1550 AM...additional radio updates will be announced based on the Warriors postseason schedule.

AGAINST THE EAST: The A's are 8-4 (.667) against American League East teams, which is the second best record in the AL against the East (Boston, 17-8, .680)...each of the A's 10 games on this road trip are against the East and Oakland will play New York, Boston and Toronto on the same trip for the first time since April 11-17, 1997...are batting .242 (101-for-418) against the East and are averaging 4.42 runs per game (53 runs in 12 games), but have a 3.25 ERA (40 in 110.2 ip)...have a 12-5 (.706) record in interdivision play compared to 9-17 (.346) against the AL West...have the worst intradivision record in the AL and third worst in the majors.

THE LONG BALL: The A's pitching staff has allowed at least one home run in each of the last 10 games (18 home runs total) and 16 of the last 17 (27 home runs)...has surrendered 58 home runs for the season, which is third most in the American League...the offense has homered in all six games on the road trip (13 home runs total) after going homerless in the final four games of the last homestand...have hit a Major League leading 41 home runs on the road but the pitching staff has surrendered a ML leading 38...have hit 14 home runs at home, which is tied with the Mets for the fewest in the majors, and have allowed 20, which is third fewest in the AL.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .219 (111-for-508) and are averaging 3.67 runs per game in May (55 runs in 15 games), after hitting .265 and averaging 5.20 runs per games in April...the May batting average is the lowest in the American League and third lowest in the majors (Arizona .190, St. Louis .216)...the May runs per game are third fewest in the AL...are hitting .192 (19-for-99) with runners in scoring position in May after batting .271 with RISP in April...overall, rank fourth in the AL in walks (144) but have the third most strikeouts (393).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed six errors in the last nine games, which have led to nine earned runs...have 23 unearned runs for the season, which is second most in the American League (Texas, 24)...are tied for third in most errors (28)...have turned 29 double plays, which is tied for second fewest (New York, 22)...A's outfielders have just two assists (both by Chad Pinder), which is tied for second fewest in the majors (Washington, 1).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 5.24 ERA (47 er in 80.2 ip) and .299 (100-for-334) opponents batting average over the last nine games...however, have a 3.99 ERA (113 er in 254.2 ip) over the last 28 games after logging a 5.05 ERA over the first 15 contests...are averaging 2.61 walks per nine innings, which is third fewest in the American League...have a Major League leading 32 wild pitches...set an Athletics franchise record with 84 wild pitches last year.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 4-9 with a 4.95 ERA (50 er in 91.0 ip) over the last 17 games after going 6-2 with a 2.93 ERA over an 11-game stretch from April 15-27...are 13-19 with a 4.58 ERA (120 er in 235.2 ip) for the season and the losses are tied for third most in the American League...have issued two free passes or fewer in 38 of the 43 games this year and are second in the majors in fewest walks per nine innings (2.21) to Cleveland (2.07).

ON THE BASES: The A's are 1-for-6 (16.7%) in stolen base attempts over the last 16 games...are 7-for-14 (50.0%) for the season and the stolen base percentage is the lowest in the majors...also rank last in the majors in stolen bases and stolen base attempts...opponents have stolen 33 bases, which is second most in the majors (New York-NL, 35)...however, they have been caught stealing 14 times, which is fourth most.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-3 on this 10-game road trip to New York-AL (1-2), Boston (2-1) and Toronto (four games)...are 10-13 (.435) on the road compared to 11-9 (.550) at home...have compiled a 4.94 ERA (108 er in 196.2 ip) on the road compared to 3.74 at home...went 3-3 on the last homestand against Baltimore (3-0) and Houston (0-3)...return home following the game Sunday and start a 10-game homestand against Seattle (three games), Arizona (three games) and Tampa Bay (four games) on Tuesday.

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 7-2 (.778) in one-run games, which is the best record in the majors...however, the nine games are tied for fourth fewest...are 3-1 in extra inning games and are tied for third in the American League in extra inning wins...had their first last at bat loss of the season last Saturday at New York (AL)...have six last at bat wins, which is third most in the AL (Toronto 10, New York 8)...have three walk-off wins.

LATE INNINGS: The A's have compiled a 3.36 ERA (48 er in 128.2 ip) in the seventh inning or later, which is third lowest in the American League (Toronto, 2.76; Houston, 3.20)...have a 4.85 ERA (139 er in 258.0 ip) over innings one through six...are batting .261 (131-for-502) in the seventh inning or later compared to .241 (235-for-977) in innings 1-6...are batting .268 (37-for-138) with 22 runs scored in the ninth inning...lead the majors in runs in the ninth inning and rank second in batting (Los Angeles-AL, .271)

THIS AND THAT: The A's have won seven of the last 11 games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher and are 8-9 against lefties for the season...the 17 games are tied with Kansas City and Toronto for the most in the American League...are 19-13 when homering, 2-9 when going homerless...are 16-14 at night, 5-8 during the day.

SCHEDULE NOTES: This four-game series with Toronto will conclude a stretch that began on April 23 where the A's will play 19 of 25 games on the road...are 10-11 over that stretch...beginning next Tuesday, the A's will play 20 of their next 25 games at home...have a pair of 10-game homestands sandwiched around a five-game road trip to Kansas City and Texas...are currently in a 19-game stretch from May 7 to 27 where they will play Houston, New York, Boston, Toronto, Seattle and Arizona...those six teams are currently a combined 156-100 (.609) and the A's are 3-6 during that stretch.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have five players on the disabled list (Blackburn, Buchter, Cotton, Hendriks, Powell)...have used the DL 10 times this year and had a season-high seven on the DL from April 7-14...Blackburn and Cotton are on the 60-day DL...have had at least four players on the DL every day since Aug. 24, 2015, at least three every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on DL since end of 2006 season (1).

A's vs. BLUE JAYS: The A's lost the season series last year as they went 2-5...won two of three in Oakland but were swept in a four-game series at Toronto...have a five-game losing streak and are 6-13 against the Blue Jays over the previous three seasons...have lost six straight at Rogers Centre, which matches the A's longest road losing streak against Toronto...lost six straight from May 23, 2014-Aug. 13, 2015, won on April 22, 2016 and have lost six straight since then...have lost 12 of the last 13 games at Rogers Centre but have won nine of the last 13 in the Coliseum...are 217-195 all-time against the Blue Jays, including 109-97 in Oakland, 108-96 in Toronto and 0-2 in Las Vegas...are 67-64 (.511) in Rogers Centre and the A's are just one of two American League teams (besides Toronto) with a winning record in this ballpark (Boston, 134-103, .565).

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Chapman leads Major League third baseman with 156 total chances, which is 33 more than any other third baseman...**Khris Davis** leads the majors in go-ahead home runs (8) and is tied for the American League lead in go-ahead RBI (11)...is also tied for second in the AL in RBI (36) and tied for fifth in home runs (12)...**Jed Lowrie** is tied for the AL lead in go-ahead RBI (11) and tied for second in hits (55) and RBI (36)...**Blake Treinen** ranks seventh among AL relievers with a 1.33 ERA and **Lou Trivino** is second (0.64).

In 1996 Jason Giambi homers off Boston's Tim Wakefield for the 4000th home run in Oakland A's history...in 2016 Khris Davis has three home runs and six RBI, including a walk-off grand slam, in the A's 8-5 win over Texas.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Andrew Triggs (3-1, 5.31 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his ninth start of the season...went 1-0 with a 2.87 ERA over his first three starts but is 2-1 despite a 6.94 ERA (18 er in 23.1 ip) in five starts since then...has allowed six runs twice over that stretch but ended up with no decisions each time as both of those games went extra innings...has allowed two runs or fewer in five of his eight starts and six hits or fewer in all eight starts.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has held opponents to a .216 (8-for-37) batting average with runners in scoring position, including .118 (2-for-17) with RISP and two outs...has allowed a .163 (7-for-43) batting average with two outs, compared to .269 (29-for-108) with zero or one out...has a .279 (19-for-68) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .169 (10-for-59) the second time and .292 (7-for-24) after that.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 2-1 with a 3.42 ERA (10 er in 26.1 ip) in five starts at night compared to 1-0 with a 9.24 ERA (13 er in 12.2 ip) in three starts in day games...has allowed two home runs in 26.1 innings at night, five in 12.2 innings during the day.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to pitch on four days rest today...is 2-0 with a 5.79 ERA (9 er in 14.0 ip) in three starts on four days rest, 1-1 with a 5.04 ERA (14 er in 25.0 ip) in five starts on five days rest or more...his career numbers are 3-4 with a 6.29 ERA (31 er in 44.1 ip) in 10 starts on four days rest or fewer, 6-4 with a 3.26 ERA (31 er in 85.2 ip) in 16 starts on five days rest or more.

ON THE BASES: Opponents have stolen five bases with him on the mound, which is tied for eighth most in the American League...allowed 15 stolen bases last year, which tied for seventh most in the AL despite missing 3½ months of the season.

WITH THE BASES LOADED: Opponents are 2-for-2 with a home run, six RBI and a sacrifice fly with the bases loaded...last year, opponents were 3-for-8 (.375) with a triple and two home runs with the bases loaded and the two grand slams tied for the most in the majors...opponents are now 5-for-10 (.500) with three home runs and 19 RBI with the bases loaded over the last two years and the three grand slams are tied with Masahiro Tanaka for the most in the majors.

THE WEST AND THE REST: Is 2-1 with a 3.42 ERA (10 er in 26.1 ip) in five starts against American League West teams, 1-1 with a 9.24 ERA (13 er in 12.2 ip) in three starts against everyone else...his career numbers are 6-2 with a 3.42 ERA (31 er in 81.2 ip) in 18 games against the AL West, 3-6 with a 5.70 ERA (50 er in 79.0 ip) in 26 games against everyone else.

FIRST START: He had a no decision in the A's 3-1 win over Texas on April 2 in Oakland...blanked the Rangers on three hits and a walk over the first four innings...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed his only run in the fifth inning...Robinson walked, stole second and scored on a Gallo single...was relieved by Buchter to start the sixth and the A's scored twice in the seventh for the win.

SECOND START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 7-3 win at Los Angeles (AL) April 7...it was his first win since May 10, 2017, also against the Angels, and it snapped a career-high four-game losing streak dating back to last year...faced the minimum over the first three innings as a leadoff walk to Cozart in the first inning was erased on a double play...had a 3-0 lead when he allowed his only two runs in the fourth inning on a two-run home run by Upton...left after five innings with a 4-2 lead.

THIRD START: He had a no decision in the A's 7-4 loss at Seattle April 13...Oakland scored twice in the first, but he allowed two runs in the bottom of the first on a RBI single by Haniger and a RBI double by Seager...shutout the Mariners on a hit and two walks over his final four innings and the A's scored once in the sixth to give him a 3-2 lead...was relieved by Buchter to start the bottom of the sixth but the bullpen allowed five runs in the seventh for the blown save.

FOURTH START: He had a no decision in the A's 12-11, 14-inning win over Chicago (AL) April 18 in Oakland...tossed 1.1 innings, which was the shortest start of his career...allowed a RBI single to Delmonico in the first inning but the A's tied the game with a run in the bottom of the first...then faced seven batters in the second and recorded just one out...yielded a RBI single to Engel and a grand slam to Moncada...left after 1.1 innings trailing 6-1.

FIFTH START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 3-2 win at Texas May 24...shut out the Rangers on three hits over the first five innings but Hamels blanked the A's on two hits, two walks and three hit by pitches over the first five innings...Oakland scored a run in the sixth but he gave that run back in the bottom of the sixth on a Beltre sacrifice fly...the A's then scored once in the seventh to take the lead for good.

SIXTH START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 10-3 loss at Seattle on May 1...the A's scored a run in the first but he gave that run back in the second on

a Zunino RBI double...then allowed a three-run home run to Cruz in the fifth inning for the loss.

SEVENTH START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 2-1 win over Baltimore on May 6 in Oakland...matched his career highs with 7.0 innings pitched and nine strikeouts and allowed just two base runners...retired each of the first five hitters before Alvarez homered with two outs in the second...also allowed a leadoff single to Peterson in the fourth before retiring each of the final 12 batters he faced.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 7-6, 11-inning loss at New York (AL) last Saturday...issued a career-high four walks and surrendered a career-high tying three home runs...allowed back-to-back home runs to Sanchez and Hicks in the second inning but the A's scored five times in the fourth and once in the fifth to take a 6-2 lead...allowed a two-run home run to Judge in the fifth...left with runners on first and second and one out in the fifth and the bullpen allowed both of the runners to score, tying the game at 6-6.

2017 RECAP: Was on the A's Opening Day roster and went 5-6 with a 4.27 ERA in 12 starts before his season ended June 10 with a hip injury...had surgery to repair the labrum in his left hip July 13...was 5-2 with a 2.12 ERA and .209 opponents batting average over his first eight starts...then went 0-4 with a 9.64 ERA and .381 opponents average over his final four starts...despite missing 3½ months of the season, he tied for seventh in the American League in unearned runs (11)...allowed a .266 opponents batting average, which included .215 (23-for-107) against left-handed hitters compared to .302 (45-for-149) against right-handers.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Brett Anderson (0-2, 8.16 ERA): Is scheduled to make his fourth start since he was selected from Triple-A Nashville May 2...allowed two runs in 6.1 innings for a no decision in his first start that day but is 0-2 with a 12.38 ERA (11 er in 8.0 ip) and .462 (18-for-39) opponents batting average in two starts since then...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 6-2 A's loss at New York (AL) on Sunday (5.0 ip, 8 h, 4 r, 4 er, 2 bb, 4 so)...was the losing pitcher in his only career appearance against Toronto, a start for the A's in a 3-1 loss in Oakland on Aug. 16, 2010 (6.0 ip, 7 h, 3 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 5 so)...went 1-1 with a 1.89 ERA and .230 opponents batting average in four starts with Nashville...did not allow a home run in 19.0 innings...struck out 25 and walked just two...was signed by the A's to a minor league contract March 19...was originally selected by Arizona in the 2006 draft but was one of six players traded to Oakland in the Dan Haren trade following the 2007 season.
