OAKLAND ATHLETICS (22-22) VS. TORONTO BLUE JAYS (22-22)

FRIDAY, MAY 18, 2018 — ROGERS CENTRE — 7:07 P.M. EDT

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won three of the last four games after losing five of the previous six contests...are now 17-12 (.586) over the last 29 games dating back to April 15, which is the fifth best record in the American League over that span, after starting the year 5-10 (.333)...are 22-22 for the season, which marks the ninth time this year the A's have been exactly .500...are in fourth place in the AL West for the 23rd consecutive day...have spent one day tied for first, one day tied for second, two days tied for third, 38 days in fourth and seven days tied for fourth.

AGAINST THE EAST: The A's are 9-4 (.692) against American League East teams, which is tied for the best record in the AL against the East (Boston, 18-8, .692)...each of the A's 10 games on this road trip are against the East and Oakland will play New York, Boston and Toronto on the same trip for the first time since April 11-17, 1997...have a 13-5 (.722) record in interdivision play compared to 9-17 (.346) against the AL West...have the worst intradivision record in the AL and third worst in the majors.

THE LONG BALL: The A's have homered in all seven games on the road trip (16 home runs total), including three three-homer games and one four-homer game...now have nine games with three or more home runs for the season, which is tied with Baltimore and Los Angeles (AL) for the most in the majors...have hit a Major League leading 44 home runs on the road but have just 14 home runs at home, which is tied with the Mets for the fewest in the majors...have 58 home runs overall, which is tied for fifth in the American League...the pitching staff did not allow a home run last night, ending a streak of 10 consecutive games with a home run allowed...have allowed 27 home runs in the last 18 games and 58 for the season, which is tied for fifth most in the AL...have surrendered a ML leading 38 home runs on the road and have allowed 20 at home, which is third fewest in the AL.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .228 (125-for-549) and are averaging 4.06 runs per game in May (65 runs in 16 games), after hitting .265 and averaging 5.20 runs per games in April...the May batting average is second lowest in the American League (Texas, .222) and the runs per game are third fewest...are hitting .209 (23-for-110) with runners in scoring position in May after batting .271 with RISP in April...overall, rank fourth in the AL in walks (150) and slugging percentage (.428) and fifth in OPS (.751)...however, have the second most strikeouts (406).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed at least one error in each of the last four games (five errors total)...now have seven errors in the last 10 games, which have led to nine earned runs...have 23 unearned runs for the season, which is second most in the American League (Texas, 28)...rank third in most errors (29)...have turned 30 double plays, which is tied for third fewest...A's outfielders have just two assists (both by Chad Pinder), which is tied for second fewest in the majors (Washington, 1).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 5.22 ERA (52 er in 890.2 ip) and .292 (107-for-367) opponents batting average over the last 10 games...however, have a 4.03 ERA (118 er in 263.2 ip) over the last 29 games after logging a 5.05 ERA over the first 15 contests...are averaging 2.71 walks per nine innings, which is third fewest in the majors, but are averaging 7.46 strikeouts per nine innings, which is also third fewest...have a Major League leading 33 wild pitches...set an Athletics franchise record with 84 wild pitches last year.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 4-9 with a 4.92 ERA (51 er in 93.1 ip) over the last 18 games after going 6-2 with a 2.93 ERA over an 11-game stretch from April 15-27...are 13-19 with a 4.58 ERA (121 er in 238.0 ip) for the season and the losses are tied for fourth most in the American League...have issued two free passes or fewer in 39 of the 44 games this year and are second in the majors in fewest walks per nine innings (2.27) to Cleveland (2.07).

ON THE BASES: The A's are 2-for-7 (28.6%) in stolen base attempts over the last 17 games...are 8-for-15 (53.3%) for the season and the stolen base percentage is the lowest in the majors...also rank last in the majors in stolen bases and stolen base attempts...opponents have stolen 33 bases, which is tied with Toronto for second most in the majors (New York-NL, 35)...however, they have been caught stealing 14 times, which is fourth most.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 4-3 on this 10-game road trip to New York-AL (1-2), Boston (2-1) and Toronto (1-0)...are 11-13 (.458) on the road compared to 11-9 (.550) at home...have compiled a 4.94 ERA (113 er in 205.2 ip) on the road compared to 3.74 at home...went 3-3 on the last homestand against Baltimore (3-0) and Houston (0-3)...return home following the game Sunday

and start a season-long 10-game homestand against Seattle (three games), Arizona (three games) and Tampa Bay (four games) on Tuesday (first of three 10-game homestands).

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 7-2 (.778) in one-run games, which is the best record in the majors...however, the nine games are tied for fourth fewest...are 3-1 in extra inning games and are tied for third in the American League in extra inning wins...have six last at bat wins, which is third most in the AL (Toronto 10, New York 8)...have three walk-off wins.

LATE INNINGS: The A's have compiled a 3.35 ERA (49 er in 131.2 ip) in the seventh inning or later, which is third lowest in the American League (Toronto, 2.70; Houston, 3.20)...have a 4.88 ERA (143 er in 264.0 ip) over innings one through six...are batting .261 (134-for-514) in the seventh inning or later compared to .245 (246-for-1006) in innings 1-6...are batting .273 (39-for-143) with 23 runs scored and seven home runs in the ninth inning...lead the majors in runs and batting average in the ninth inning and are second in home runs (Milwaukee, 8).

THIS AND THAT: The A's have won seven of the last 11 games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher and are 8-9 against lefties for the season...the 17 games are tied with Kansas City and Toronto for the most in the American League...are 20-13 when homering, 2-9 when going homerless...are 17-14 at night, 5-8 during the day.

SCHEDULE NOTES: This four-game series with Toronto will conclude a stretch that began on April 23 where the A's will play 19 of 25 games on the road...are 11-11 over that stretch...beginning next Tuesday, the A's will play 20 of their next 25 games at home...have a pair of 10-game homestands sandwiched around a five-game road trip to Kansas City and Texas...are currently in a 19-game stretch from May 7 to 27 where they will play Houston, New York, Boston, Toronto, Seattle and Arizona...those six teams are currently a combined 157-102 (.606) and the A's are 4-6 during that stretch.

TELEVISION AND RADIO: Two of the A's three remaining games against the Blue Jays will air in the Bay Area on NBCSCA: Friday and Sunday...Saturday's game will air on Fox Sports 1...95.7 FM The Game is in its eighth season as flagship of the A's Radio Network...due to conflicts with the Warriors, the games of next Tuesday and Thursday against Seattle will air in the Bay Area on 1550 AM...additional radio updates will be announced based on the Warriors postseason schedule.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have five players on the disabled list (Blackburn, Buchter, Cotton, Hendriks, Powell)...have used the DL 10 times this year and had a season-high seven on the DL from April 7-14...Blackburn and Cotton are on the 60-day DL...have had at least four players on the DL every day since Aug. 24, 2015, at least three every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on DL since end of 2006 season (1).

A's vs. BLUE JAYS: The A's won the first meeting of 2018 last night, snapping a five-game losing streak against Toronto and a six-game losing streak at Rogers Centre...lost the season series last year as they went 2-5...won two of three in Oakland but were swept in a four-game series at Toronto...are 7-13 against the Blue Jays over the last four seasons...have lost 12 of the last 14 games at Rogers Centre but have won nine of the last 13 in the Coliseum...are 218-195 all-time against the Blue Jays, including 109-97 in Oakland, 109-96 in Toronto and 0-2 in Las Vegas...are 68-64 (.515) in Rogers Centre and the A's are just one of two American League teams (besides Toronto) with a winning record in this ballpark (Boston, 134-103, .565).

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Khris Davis is 9-for-28 (.321) with four home runs seven RBI in seven games on the road trip...is tied for second in the majors in home runs (13) and RBI (40)...leads the majors in go-ahead home runs (9) and is tied for the lead in go-ahead RBI (12)...**Jed Lowrie** is tied for the Major League lead in hits (56), ranks third in go-ahead RBI (11) and fourth in RBI (37)...**Blake Treinen** ranks sixth among AL relievers with a 1.33 ERA and **Lou Trivino** is second (0.59).

OAKLAND A'S 50th ANNIVERSARY MOMENT

In 1998 Mike Blowers becomes the second player in Oakland history to hit for the cycle in the A's 14-0 win at Chicago...in 2003 the A's score three runs in the eighth inning and five in the ninth to come from behind and defeat Cleveland, 8-5...in 2014 Josh Donaldson and Brandon Moss score four runs each as the A's win at Cleveland, 13-3.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Brett Anderson (0-2, 8.16 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his fourth start since he was selected from Triple-A Nashville May 2...allowed two runs in 6.1 innings for a no decision in his first start that day but is 0-2 with a 12.38 ERA (11 er in 8.0 ip) and .462 (18-for-39) opponents batting average in two starts since then... was signed by the A's to a minor league contract March 19...was originally selected by Arizona in the 2nd round of the 2006 draft but was one of six players traded to Oakland in the Dan Haren trade following the 2007 season...made his Major League debut with the A's in 2009 at the age of 21 and went 26-29 with a 3.81 ERA in 84 games, 73 starts, in five seasons with Oakland from 2009-13...then went 16-18 with a 4.40 ERA in 56 games, 55 starts, over his next four seasons with Colorado (2014), Los Angeles-NL (2015-16), Chicago-NL (2017) and Toronto (2017).

FIRST START: He had a no decision in the A's 3-2 win at Seattle May 2...allowed his only two runs in the third inning on a leadoff home run by Healy and a RBI single by Segura...retired 11 straight before allowing back-to-back singles to Haniger and Seager with one out in the seventh...was relieved by Dull with Oakland trailing 2-0 but the A's scored twice in the eighth to get him off the hook and once in the ninth for the win.

SECOND START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 16-2 loss to Houston on May 7 in Oakland...allowed nine runs on 10 hits in 3.0 innings...yielded a two-run single to Gonzalez in the first and a three-run home run to Springer in the second...then allowed a RBI double to Stassi and a RBI single to Altuve in the fourth and was relieved by Hatcher with runners on first and second and no outs...Hatcher allowed both runs to score plus two more of his own.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-2 loss at New York (AL) last Sunday...allowed three runs in the first inning on a two-run single by Stanton and a RBI single by Hicks...Oakland scored a run in the fifth, but he allowed a run in the bottom of the fifth on a Stanton home run...left after five innings trailing 4-1.

WITH NASHVILLE: Went 1-1 with a 1.89 ERA and .230 opponents batting average in four starts with Triple-A Nashville...did not allow a home run in 19.0 innings...struck out 25 (11.84 per nine innings) and walked just two (0.95 per nine innings) for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 12.5...his opponents batting average included a .193 (11-for-57) mark against right-handed hitters compared to .353 (6-for-17) against left-handers...yielded a .167 batting average and just one walk to batters leading off an inning...opponents hit .143 with the bases empty, .344 with runners on.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Sean Manaea (5-4, 2.35 ERA): Has allowed four runs in each of his last three starts after allowing six runs total over his first six starts...is 1-2 with a 5.60 ERA (11 er in 17.2 ip) and .296 (21-for-71) opponents batting average over his last three starts after going 4-2 with a 1.03 ERA and .134 opponents batting average over his first six starts...ranks third in the American League in fewest walks per nine innings (1.17), tied for third in wins (5), fourth in opponents OPS (.538), fifth in batting (.186), on-base percentage (.228), strikeout-to-walk ratio (6.13) and innings pitched (61.1), sixth in slugging (.309) and seventh in ERA (2.35)...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 6-5 A's win at Boston on Monday (6.0 ip, 8 h, 4 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 4 so)...is 1-0 with a 3.50 ERA (18.0 ip, 14 h, 7 r, 7 er, 3 bb, 18 so, 3 hr) in three career appearances, two starts, against Toronto...including 1-0 with a 3.46 ERA (13.0 ip, 11 h, 5 r, 5 er, 3 bb, 14 so, 2 hr) in two starts last year.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .322 opponents batting average, including .298 (56-for-188) against right-handed hitters compared to .436 (17-for-39) against left-handers...surrendered all five of his home runs to righties...yielded a .371 batting average with runners in scoring position...opponents hit .345 when leading off an inning, but he issued just one walk.

HOME AND AWAY: Went 1-2 with a 15.68 ERA in four starts at Wrigley Field and 1-2 with a 7.62 ERA in three starts in Rogers Centre for an 11.19 ERA in seven starts in his home ballparks...was 2-0 with a 2.81 ERA in six starts on the road.

SPLITS: Was 2-0 with a 2.05 ERA in four starts during the day, 2-4 with a 9.18 ERA in nine starts at night...was 1-1 with an 8.84 ERA in five starts on four days rest, 3-3 with a 5.00 ERA in eight starts on five days rest or more.

THIS AND THAT: Had a 7.04 ERA over the first two innings of his starts, 3.06 after that...opponents were successful in 6-of-7 (85.7%) stolen base attempts...allowed five runs in 0.1 innings for the loss in his only interleague start and is now 1-6 with a 5.76 ERA (29 er in 45.1 ip) in nine career interleague starts...went 1-for-7 (.143) with a RBI, walk and three strikeouts in eight plate appearances with the Cubs.

MORE 2017: Was in the Cubs starting rotation to open the season and allowed just one run over his first two starts...struck out a season-high five batters and allowed six runs on a season-high eight hits in 3.2 innings on April 18 against Milwaukee, but had a no decision in a 9-7 win...walked a career-high six batters April 24 at Pittsburgh, but allowed three runs in a season-high 6.0 innings for the win...finished April 2-0 with a 3.54 ERA in four starts...then allowed seven runs on seven hits in 1.1 innings May 1 against Philadelphia and five runs in 0.1 innings on May 6 against New York (AL), both losses...was placed on the 10-day disabled list May 7 with a strained lower back...it was his 10th career stint on the DL...was transferred to the 60-day DL June 8...went 2-2 with a 4.61 ERA in six games, including five starts, on a rehab assignment with Double-A Tennessee from June 25 to July 23...was reinstated from the DL and designated for assignment July 26...was released July 31 and signed a minor league deal with Toronto Aug. 15...went 1-1 with a 0.93 ERA in two starts with Triple-A Buffalo before he was selected by the Blue Jays Aug. 29...started and lost that day to Boston, despite allowing just one run in 5.2 innings...tossed a season-high tying 6.0 innings in his next two starts on Sept. 3 at Baltimore and Sept. 9 against Detroit...picked up his first win as a Blue Jay and matched his season-best with five strikeouts in the start against the Tigers...yielded a season-high eight runs on seven hits and two walks in 1.1 innings in a 15-5 loss to Kansas City on Sept. 25...then had a win and a 2.70 ERA over his final two starts.
