## OAKLAND ATHLETICS (23-22) VS. TORONTO BLUE JAYS (22-23)

SATURDAY, MAY 19, 2018 — ROGERS CENTRE — 1:07 P.M. EDT

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Have won four of the last five games after losing five of the previous six games...are 23-22, and are looking to tie their high water mark of two games over .500...are in fourth place in the AL West for the 24th consecutive day...have spent one day tied for first, one day tied for second, two days tied for third, 39 days in fourth and seven days tied for fourth.

**WINNING BALL:** Oakland is 18-12 (.600) in their last 30 games since April 15, the 4th-best record in the American League in that span behind New York (21-6), Tampa Bay (18-11) and Houston (19-12)...during this stretch, the A's are 8-4 at home and 10-8 on the road...began the season 5-10 in the first 15 games of the season.

**LEADERBOARD:** Khris Davis ranks among the American League leaders in go-ahead home runs (1st, 9), go-ahead RBI (1st, 12), home runs (T3rd, 13), RBI (T2nd, 38) and game-winning RBI (T5th, 5)...Jed Lowrie is among the AL leaders in hits (T3rd, 58), game-winning RBI (T1st, 6), RBI (4th, 37), go-ahead RBI (2nd, 11) and batting average (6th, .328)...Sean Manaea ranks among the leaders in wins (T4th, 5), opponent batting average (5th, .186), innings (5th, 61.1) and ERA (7th, 2.35).

**EXTRA, EXTRA!** Oakland recorded a season-high eight extra-base hits last night and are 2nd in the American League with 155 hits for extras (89 2B, 7 3B, 59 HR) behind Boston (175) and ahead of Toronto (154), Detroit (151), Cleveland (148) and New York-AL (148)...Jed Lowrie (22) is 9th in the American League in extra bases, while Khris Davis (21) is T10th.

**LONG RELIEF:** Oakland's bullpen has had to cover 14.2 innings during the first two games of this series (6.2 on Thursday, 8.0 on Friday)...it is the 7th time this season that the A's pen has had to cover 6.0+ innings this season, including 3 times in the last 7 games...Oakland's pen has tossed 165.2 innings this season, 2nd-most in the American League behind Los Angeles-AL (178.1)...Yusmeiro Petit leads American League relievers with 27.1 innings.

**AGAINST THE EAST:** The A's are 10-4 (.714) against American League East teams, which is the best record in the AL against the East (Boston, 18-9, .667)...each of the A's 10 games on this road trip are against the East and Oakland will play New York, Boston and Toronto on the same trip for the first time since April 11-17, 1997...have a 14-5 (.737) record in interdivision play compared to 9-17 (.346) against the AL West.

**THE LONG BALL:** The A's have homered in all eight games on the road trip (17 home runs total), including three three-homer games and one four-homer game...have nine games with three or more home runs for the season, which is tied with Baltimore and Los Angeles (AL) for the most in the majors...have hit a Major League leading 45 home runs on the road but have just 14 home runs at home, which is tied with the Mets for the fewest in the majors...have 59 home runs overall, which is tied for fourth in the American League...have allowed 27 home runs in the last 19 games and 58 for the season, which is sixth most in the AL.

**OFFENSE:** The A's are batting .229 (134-for-584) and are averaging 4.00 runs per game in May (68 runs in 17 games), after hitting .265 and averaging 5.20 runs per games in April...are hitting .208 (25-for-120) with runners in scoring position in May after batting .271 with RISP in April...overall, rank fourth in the AL in walks (151) and slugging percentage (.430) and in OPS (.753).

**PITCHING:** The A's have compiled a 4.12 ERA (41 er in 89.2 ip) and .263 (93-for-354) opponents batting average over the last 10 games...however, have a 3.93 ERA (119 er in 272.2 ip) over the last 30 games after logging a 5.05 ERA over the first 15 contests...are averaging 2.71 walks per nine innings, which is third fewest in the majors, but are averaging 7.6 strikeouts per nine innings, which is also third fewest...have a Major League leading 33 wild pitches...set an Athletics franchise record with 84 wild pitches last year.

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers are 4-9 with a 4.87 ERA (51 er in 94.1 ip) over the last 19 games after going 6-2 with a 2.93 ERA over an 11-game stretch from April 15-27...are 13-19 with a 4.56 ERA (121 er in 239.0 ip) for the season...have issued two free passes or fewer in 39 of the 45 games this year and are third in the majors in fewest walks per nine innings (2.71) to Houston (2.43) and Cleveland (2.58).

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 5-3 on this 10-game road trip to New York-AL (1-2), Boston (2-1) and Toronto (2-0)...are 12-13 (.480) on the road compared to 11-9 (.550) at home...have compiled a 4.78 ERA (114 er in 214.2 ip) on the road compared to 3.74 at home...went 3-3 on the last homestand against Baltimore (3-0) and Houston (0-3)...return home following the game Sunday and start a season-long 10-game homestand against Seattle (three games), Arizona (three games) and Tampa Bay (four games) on Tuesday (first of three 10-game homestands).

**ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS:** The A's are 7-2 (.778) in one-run games, which is the best record in the majors...however, the nine games are tied for fifth fewest...are 3-1 in extra inning games...have six last at bat wins...have three walk-off wins.

**LATE INNINGS:** The A's have compiled a 3.27 ERA (49 er in 134.2 ip) in the seventh inning or later, which is third lowest in the American League (Toronto, 2.77; Houston, 3.19)...have a 4.80 ERA (144 er in 270.0 ip) over innings one through six...are batting .264 (139-for-527) in the seventh inning or later compared to .243 (250-for-1028) in innings 1-6...are batting .274 (40-for-146) with 23 runs scored and seven home runs in the ninth inning...lead the majors in runs and batting average in the ninth inning and are second in home runs (Milwaukee, 8).

**SCHEDULE NOTES:** This four-game series with Toronto will conclude a stretch that began on April 23 where the A's will play 19 of 25 games on the road...are 21-11 over that stretch...beginning Tuesday, the A's will play 20 of their next 25 games at home...have a pair of 10-game homestands sandwiched around a five-game road trip to Kansas City and Texas...are currently in a 19-game stretch from May 7 to 27 where they will play Houston, New York, Boston, Toronto, Seattle and Arizona...those six teams are currently a combined 159-106 (.600) and the A's are 5-6 during that stretch.

**TELEVISION AND RADIO:** Today's game will air on Fox Sports 1...Sunday's against the Blue Jays will air in the Bay Area on NBCSCA...95.7 FM The Game is in its eighth season as flagship of the A's Radio Network...due to conflicts with the Warriors, the games of next Tuesday and Thursday against Seattle will air in the Bay Area on 1550 AM...additional radio updates will be announced based on the Warriors postseason schedule.

**THE DISABLED LIST:** The A's have seven players on the disabled list (Anderson, Blackburn, Buchter, Cotton, Hendriks, Powell, Triggs)...have used the DL 12 times this year and had a season-high seven on the DL from April 7-14...Blackburn and Cotton are on the 60-day DL...have had at least four players on the DL every day since Aug. 24, 2015, at least three every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on DL since end of 2006 season (1).

**A's vs. BLUE JAYS:** The A's have won the first two meetings of 2018, snapping a five-game losing streak against Toronto and a six-game losing streak at Rogers Centre...lost the season series last year as they went 2-5...won two of three in Oakland but were swept in a four-game series at Toronto...are 8-13 against the Blue Jays over the last four seasons...have lost 12 of the last 15 games at Rogers Centre but have won nine of the last 13 in the Coliseum...are 219-195 all-time against the Blue Jays, including 109-97 in Oakland, 110-96 in Toronto and 0-2 in Las Vegas...are 69-64 (.519) in Rogers Centre and the A's are just one of two American League teams (besides Toronto) with a winning record in this ballpark (Boston, 134-103, .565).

### TODAY'S TIDBITS

Khris Davis is 10-for-32 (.313) with four home runs seven RBI in eight games on the road trip...Blake Treinen ranks sixth among AL relievers with a 1.25 ERA and Lou Trivino is second (0.59).

### OAKLAND A'S 50th ANNIVERSARY MOMENT

In 1971 Vida Blue tosses a three-hit shutout and Rick Monday and Reggie Jackson homer in the A's 3-0 win over Milwaukee...in 2004 Bobby Kielty homers twice and drives in four runs as the A's defeat Detroit, 6-2...in 2006 Dan Haren and Huston Street combine on a two-hit shutout as the A's defeat San Francisco, 1-0.

## TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Manaea (5-4, 2.35 ERA)

**FOR STARTERS:** Has allowed four runs in each of his last three starts after allowing six runs total over his first six starts...is 1-2 with a 5.60 ERA (11 er in 17.2 ip) and .296 (21-for-71) opponents batting average over his last three starts after going 4-2 with a 1.03 ERA and .134 opponents batting average over his first six starts...has walked two batters or fewer in each of his nine starts and allowed four hits or fewer five times.

**AMONG THE LEADERS:** Ranks third in the American League in fewest walks per nine innings (1.17), tied for fourth in wins (5), fifth in opponents on-base percentage (.228) and fourth OPS (.538), fifth in batting (.186) and sixth in slugging (.309), fifth in strikeout-to-walk ratio (6.13), fifth in innings pitched (61.1) and seventh in ERA (2.35)...is also tied for third in wild pitches (5) and tied for ninth in hit batters (4)...is averaging the fewest pitches per inning in the majors (13.4).

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Opponents are 7-for-60 (.117) with two walks and a hit by pitch (.159 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning...the batting average and on-base percentage are fifth lowest in the American League...six of the seven home runs he has allowed have been solo shots...has a .135 (10-for-74) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .276 (21-for-76) the second time and .143 (10-for-70) after that...the opponents number six hitter is 2-for-24 (.083).

**HOME AND AWAY:** Is 2-2 with a 1.78 ERA (6 er in 30.1 ip) and .137 (14-for-102) opponents batting average in four starts at home compared to 3-2 with a 2.90 ERA (10 er in 31.0 ip) and .229 (27-for-118) opponents average in five starts on the road...has allowed five of his seven home runs on the road...is now 13-8 with a 3.43 ERA (66 er in 173.1 ip) in 31 career games at home, 11-15 with a 4.39 ERA (89 er in 182.1 ip) in 32 starts on the road.

**RUN SUPPORT:** Has received two runs of support or fewer in each of his four losses this year (3 rs in 24.1 ip, 1.11 RSA) and 22 of his 23 career losses (23 rs in 117.2 ip, 1.76 RSA)...is 15-0 in 22 career starts with run support of four or more and 21-1 in 29 starts with three runs of support or more.

**IN APRIL:** Was named American League Pitcher of the Month for the month of April after going 4-1 with a 1.00 ERA and .130 opponents batting average in five starts...it was his first Pitcher of the Month honor...it was the first time in his career he won four games in a month and the four wins match the most by an A's pitcher in the month of April over the last 27 years (ninth time, last: Triggs in 2017)...his ERA tied for the fourth lowest in any month in Oakland history among pitchers with 30 or more innings pitched...it was the lowest since Cory Lidle had a 0.20 ERA in Aug., 2002...had a .395 OPS and is the fourth pitcher in Oakland history with an OPS under .400 in a month with a minimum of 100 batters faced (.358, Lidle in Aug. 2002; .376, Torrez in Sept. 1976; .390, Ontiveros in June 1987).

**NO-HITTER:** Tossed the seventh no-hitter in Oakland history and the 12th in Athletics history on April 1 against Boston in Oakland...was named American League Co-Player of the Week for the week of April 16-22 along with Manny Machado for his efforts...it was his first Player of the Week award...his no-hitter was the earliest by date (Catfish Hunter, May 8, 1968 vs. Minnesota) and second earliest by game number (Chief Bender, May 12, 1910 vs. Cleveland, game 18) in Athletics history...it was the 10th no-hitter in Coliseum history (six by A's, four by opponents)...it was the first since Dallas Braden's perfect game on May 9, 2010 vs. Tampa Bay...is the third Oakland pitcher to strikeout 10 or more in a no-hitter...Dave Stewart had 12 and Catfish Hunter had 11...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, the Red Sox .895 winning percentage entering the game was the highest in Major League history by a team that was no-hit at least five games into the season...the last pitcher to no hit a team that led the majors in runs per game entering the game was the A's Dave Stewart, who did it against Toronto on June 29, 1990 (also Elias).

**2018 HIGHLIGHTS:** Allowed one run in 7.2 innings in his first start on March 30 against Los Angeles (AL) and one run in 8.0 innings in his second start on April 4 against Texas to become the first A's pitcher on an Opening Day roster to start the season with back-to-back outings of seven innings or more and one run or fewer since Steve Karsay in 1994...won three consecutive starts from April 15 to 27 and allowed just two runs (one earned) on six hits over that stretch (0.39 ERA, .078 opponents batting average)...allowed two hits in seven innings at Seattle April 15 and then no-hit Boston on April 21 to become the first A's pitcher with back-to-back starts of seven innings or more and two hits or fewer since Barry Zito (July 9-15, 2005)...shutout the Red Sox 3-0 in the no-hitter...walked Betts to start the game but then retired 14 straight before Leon reached on a Semien error...set down the next 12 before walking Benintendi with two outs in the ninth...then got Ramirez to hit into a game-ending force out for his first career complete game...it came in his 59th game and 58th start and his streak of 57 consecutive starts without a complete game was fourth longest in Oakland history...walked two and matched his career high with 10 strikeouts...the shutout came in the A's 21st game of the season and it was the earliest shutout by an Athletic since

Barry Zito on April 18, 2003 vs. Texas, the A's 17th game of the season...allowed a fourth-inning single to Correa in his first start after the no-hitter on April 27 at Houston, snapping his streak of consecutive hitless innings at an Oakland record 14.0 innings...broke the previous mark of 13.0 held by John "Blue Moon" Odum from June 1-7, 1968...opponents went 0-for-47 off him during the hitless streak...yielded four runs on six hits in a 4-1 loss at Seattle May 3 to snap a season-opening streak where he allowed two runs or fewer and tossed five innings or more in each of his first six starts...that tied for the third longest such season-opening streak in Oakland history...it was the longest since Dave Stewart had a seven-game streak in 1990.

**LAST START:** He was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-5 win at Boston on Monday...Oakland scored a run in the third but he allowed two in the bottom of the third on RBI singles by Benintendi and Ramirez...then A's then scored three times in the fourth to take the lead for good...allowed another run in the fifth and a leadoff home run to Devers in the seventh...left with a 5-4 lead, a runner on first and no outs in the seventh and Petit stranded the runner.

**MANAEA vs. TORONTO:** Is 1-0 with a 3.50 ERA (18.0 ip, 14 h, 7 r, 7 er, 3 bb, 18 so, 3 hr) in three career appearances, two starts...including 1-0 with a 3.46 ERA (13.0 ip, 11 h, 5 r, 5 er, 3 bb, 14 so, 2 hr) in two starts last year...the win

came in a 5-3 decision in Oakland on June 5...allowed a RBI double to Donaldson in the first inning but the A's came back with three in the bottom of the second and two more in the fourth...also yielded a RBI double to Pillar in the fifth and was relieved by Axford to start the seventh with the A's leading 5-2...then had a no decision in the A's 8-4, 10-inning loss at Toronto July 27...Oakland scored three times in the first inning but he allowed a solo home run to Donaldson in the bottom of the first...also surrendered a leadoff home run to Morales in the fifth and a RBI single to Smoak in the sixth to tie the game...the A's scored once in the eighth to take a 4-3 lead but Treinen allowed a run in the ninth for the blown save...his other outing came in relief in the A's 5-3 loss on July 17, 2016 in Oakland and he had a no decision (5.0 ip, 3 h, 2 r, 2 er, 0 bb, 4 so, 1 hr)...entered the game to start the second inning in relief of Andrew Triggs, who left the game with a left shin contusion, who relieved Rich Hill, who left after five pitchers with a blister.

**2017 RECAP:** Compiled a 12-10 record and a 4.37 ERA in 29 starts in his second season in the majors...went 1-3 with a 5.52 ERA and .179 opponents batting average over his first six starts, 7-2 with a 2.92 ERA and .246 opponents average over an 11-start span from May 20 to July 16 and 4-5 with a 5.55 ERA and .328 opponents average over his final 12 starts...led the A's in wins, games started, innings pitched (158.2), strikeouts (140), hits (167), walks (55) and hit batters (10)...allowed a .268 opponents batting average, including .227 (30-for-132) against left-handed hitters compared to .279 (137-for-491) against right-handers...had a .593 OPS against lefties, .809 against righties.

**TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER**  
**RHP Daniel Mengden (3-4, 3.75 ERA):** Is 3-2 with a 2.97 ERA over his last seven starts after going 0-2 with a 6.55 ERA over his first two starts...is now 6-5 with a 2.85 ERA over his last 14 starts dating back to Sept. 9, 2017 after going 2-10 with a 6.86 ERA over the first 16 starts of his career...has walked one batter or fewer in each of his nine starts and his average of 0.89 walks per nine innings is second lowest in the American League (Colon, TEX 0.71)...has a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 7.20, which is second best (Colon, TEX 8.00)...has yielded six home runs, all solo shots...has walked just one batter to lead off an inning...is scheduled to make his 10th start of the season, his fifth in a day game...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 5-3 A's win at Boston on Tuesday (6.0 ip, 8 h, 2 r, 1 er, 0 bb, 3 so)...had a no decision in his only career appearance against Toronto, a start in the A's 8-7 win in Oakland on July 15, 2016 (3.1 ip, 6 h, 7 r, 6 er, 3 bb, 2 so, 16.20 ERA).

- Has converted 10-of-14 (71.4%) save opportunities, which is tied for the second best save percentage in the American League...are tied for the second fewest save opportunities and are tied for the sixth fewest saves.
- Second in AL in win percentage (.769) and tied for fourth in wins (10).
- Have the third most home runs allowed in AL (22).
- Allowed 31-of-78 (39.7%) inherited runners to score, fourth highest in AL.
