## OAKLAND ATHLETICS (24-22) VS. TORONTO BLUE JAYS (22-24)

SUNDAY, MAY 20, 2018 — ROGERS CENTRE — 1:07 P.M. EDT

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Have won five of the last six games after losing five of the previous six games...are 24-22, the third time they've been two games over .500 this season...are in fourth place in the AL West for the 25th consecutive day...have spent one day tied for first, one day tied for second, two days tied for third, 40 days in fourth and seven days tied for fourth.

**WINNING BALL:** Oakland is 19-12 (.613) in their last 31 games since April 15, the 5th-best record in the Major Leagues and 3rd-best record in the American League in that span behind New York (22-6) and Tampa Bay (19-11)...during this stretch, the A's are 8-4 at home and 11-8 on the road...began the season 5-10 in the first 15 games of the season.

**HOW SWEEP IT IS:** Oakland is looking for its first 4-game sweep since Sept. 8-10, 2017 (double-header on the 9th) vs. Houston...looking to sweep Toronto in a 4-game set for the first time since July 3-6, 2014 in Oakland...the A's are looking for their first 4-game sweep on the road since Sept. 12-15, 2016 at Kansas City...if completed, this would be the third sweep this season of 3-plus games (also: April 16-18 vs. Chicago-AL and May 4-6 vs. Baltimore).

**QUITE THE TRIP:** Oakland is 6-3 during this three-city, 10-day road trip to New York-AL (1-2), Boston (2-1) and Toronto (3-0)...a win today would give Oakland seven wins this trip, the first 7-win trip for the A's since they went 7-2 from April 7-16, 2014 vs. Minnesota (3-0), Seattle (2-1) and Los Angeles-AL (2-1)...their last 6-win trip was Sept. 12-20, 2017 at Boston (1-2), Philadelphia (2-1) and Detroit (3-0).

**UP & OVER:** Chad Pinder's go-ahead grand slam in the 8th inning was Oakland's Major League leading 25th go-ahead home run of the season ahead of St. Louis (22), Baltimore (21), Milwaukee (21) and Pittsburgh (21)...A's leaders in the category are Khris Davis (9), Jed Lowrie (5), Matt Chapman (3), Mark Canha (2) and Chad Pinder (2).

**LEADERBOARD:** Khris Davis ranks among the American League leaders in go-ahead home runs (1st, 9), go-ahead RBI (1st, 12), home runs (T4th, 13), RBI (T2nd, 38) and game-winning RBI (T5th, 5)...Jed Lowrie is among the AL leaders in hits (T5th, 58), game-winning RBI (T2nd, 6), RBI (4th, 37), go-ahead RBI (2nd, 11) and batting average (6th, .328).

**EXTRA, EXTRA!** Oakland ranks T2nd in the American League with 158 hits for extras (91 2B, 7 3B, 60 HR) behind Boston (180) and tied with Toronto (158), ahead of New York-AL (156)...Jed Lowrie (22) and Khris Davis (22) are tied for 9th in the American League in extra bases.

**LONG RELIEF:** Oakland's bullpen has had to cover 18.2 innings during the first three games of this series (6.2 on Thursday, 8.0 on Friday, 4.0 on Saturday)...the A's pen has had to cover 6.0+ innings 7 times this season, including 3 times in the last 8 games...Oakland's pen has tossed 169.2 innings this season, 3rd-most in the American League behind Los Angeles-AL (181.1)...Yusmeiro Petit is 2nd among American League relievers with 28.0 innings.

**AGAINST THE EAST:** The A's are 11-4 (.733) against American League East teams, which is the best record in the AL against the East (Boston, 19-9, .679)...each of the A's 10 games on this road trip are against the East and Oakland will play New York, Boston and Toronto on the same trip for the first time since April 11-17, 1997...have a 15-5 (.750) record in interdivision play compared to 9-17 (.346) against the AL West.

**THE LONG BALL:** The A's have homered in all nine games on the road trip (18 home runs total), including three three-homer games and one four-homer game...have nine games with three or more home runs for the season, which is tied with Baltimore, New York-AL & Los Angeles (AL) for most in majors...have hit a Major League leading 46 home runs on the road but have just 14 home runs at home, which is the fewest in the majors...have 60 home runs overall, which is T4th in the American League.

**OFFENSE:** The A's are batting .232 (144-for-621) and are averaging 4.1 runs per game in May (73 runs in 18 games), after hitting .265 and averaging 5.20 runs per games in April...are hitting .208 (27-for-130) with runners in scoring position in May after batting .271 with RISP in April...overall, rank fourth in the AL in walks (155) and slugging percentage (.430) and 5th in OPS (.753).

**ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS:** The A's are 8-2 (.800) in one-run games, the best record in the majors...the 10 games are tied for 4th fewest...are 3-1 in extra innings...have six last at bat wins...have three walk-off wins.

**PITCHING:** The A's have compiled a 4.10 ERA (45 er in 98.2 ip) and .256 (99-for-386) opponents batting average over the last 11 games...however, have a 3.93 ERA (123 er in 281.2 ip) over the last 31 games after logging a 5.05 ERA over the first 15 contests...are averaging 2.78 walks per nine innings, which is third fewest in the majors, but are averaging 757 strikeouts per nine innings, which is fourth fewest...have a Major League leading 33 wild pitches...set an Athletics franchise record with 84 wild pitches last year.

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers are 4-9 with a 4.98 ERA (55 er in 99.1 ip) over the last 20 games after going 6-2 with a 2.93 ERA over an 11-game stretch from April 15-27...are 13-19 with a 4.61 ERA (125 er in 244.0 ip) for the season...have issued two free passes or fewer in 39 of the 46 games this year and are second in the majors in fewest walks per nine innings (2.32) to Cleveland (2.10) and ahead of Los Angeles-NL (2.49).

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 6-3 on this 10-game road trip to New York-AL (1-2), Boston (2-1) and Toronto (3-0)...are 13-13 (.500) on the road compared to 11-9 (.550) at home...have compiled a 4.75 ERA (118 er in 223.2 ip) on the road compared to 3.74 at home...went 3-3 on the last homestand against Baltimore (3-0) and Houston (0-3)...return home following the game Sunday and start a season-long 10-game homestand against Seattle (3 G), Arizona (3 G) and Tampa Bay (4 G) on Tuesday (first of three 10-game homestands).

**LATE INNINGS:** The A's have a 3.20 ERA (49 er in 137.2 ip) in the seventh inning or later, which is third lowest in the American League (Toronto, 3.04; Houston, 3.12)...have a 4.83 ERA (148 er in 276.0 ip) over innings one through six...are batting .265 (143-for-540) in the seventh inning or later compared to .243 (256-for-1052) in innings 1-6...are batting .268 (40-for-149) with 23 runs scored and seven home runs in the ninth inning...tied for lead in majors in runs and 3rd in batting average in ninth inning and are tied for second in home runs (Milwaukee, 8).

**SCHEDULE NOTES:** This four-game series with Toronto will conclude a stretch that began on April 23 where the A's will play 19 of 25 games on the road...are 13-11 over that stretch...beginning Tuesday, the A's will play 20 of their next 25 games at home...have a pair of 10-game homestands sandwiched around a five-game road trip to Kansas City and Texas...are currently in a 19-game stretch from May 7 to 27 where they will play Houston, New York, Boston, Toronto, Seattle and Arizona...those six teams are currently a combined 162-109 (.598) and the A's are 6-6 during that stretch.

**TELEVISION AND RADIO:** Today's game against Toronto will air in the Bay Area on NBCSCA...95.7 FM The Game is in its eighth season as flagship of the A's Radio Network...due to conflicts with the Warriors, the games on Tuesday and Thursday vs. Seattle will air in the Bay Area on 1550 AM...additional radio updates will be announced based on the Warriors postseason schedule.

**A's vs. BLUE JAYS:** The A's have won the first three meetings of 2018, snapping a five-game losing streak against Toronto and a six-game losing streak at Rogers Centre...lost the season series last year as they went 2-5...won two of three in Oakland but were swept in a four-game series at Toronto...are 9-13 against the Blue Jays over the last four seasons...have lost 12 of the last 16 games at Rogers Centre but have won nine of the last 13 in the Coliseum...are 220-195 all-time against the Blue Jays, including 109-97 in Oakland, 111-96 in Toronto and 0-2 in Las Vegas...are 70-64 (.522) in Rogers Centre and the A's are just one of two American League teams (besides Toronto) with a winning record in this ballpark (Boston, 134-103, .565).

### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Khris Davis** is 12-for-37 (.324) with one double, four home runs seven RBI in nine games on the road trip...**Blake Treinen** ranks fifth among AL relievers with a 1.19 ERA and **Lou Trivino** is second (0.55).

### OAKLAND A'S 50th ANNIVERSARY MOMENT

In 1977 Wayne Gross has five RBI and Earl Williams drives in four as the A's defeat Seattle 14-5...in 2005 Keith Ginter has one hit in one official at bat but drives in five runs on a three-run home run and two sacrifice flies in the A's 8-4 win at San Francisco...in 2011 Mark Ellis singles in the second inning off San Francisco's Ryan Vogelsong for his 1000<sup>th</sup> career hit to become the 12<sup>th</sup> player in Oakland history to collect 1000 hits.

## TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Daniel Mengden (3-4, 3.75 ERA)

**FOR STARTERS:** Is 3-2 with a 2.97 ERA (13 er in 39.1 ip) over his last seven starts after going 0-2 with a 6.55 ERA over his first two starts...is now 6-5 with a 2.85 ERA (27 er in 85.1 ip) over his last 14 starts dating back to Sept. 9, 2017 after going 2-10 with a 6.86 ERA over the first 16 starts of his career.

**DON'T WALK:** Has walked one batter or fewer in each of his first nine starts, including four starts with no walks...has issued just five walks in 50.1 innings and his average of 0.89 walks per nine innings is second lowest in the American League (Colon, TEX 0.71)...has a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 7.20, which is second best (Colon, TEX 8.00)...now has 14 walks in 93.1 innings over the last two years (1.35 per nine innings) after issuing 33 walks in 72.0 innings in his first season in 2016 (4.13 per nine innings)...has a season-opening streak of nine consecutive games with two or more innings and one walk or fewer, which is the longest such season-opening streak by an Athletics pitcher since at least 1908...has a streak of 10 consecutive games with two innings or more and one walk or fewer, which is tied for third longest in Oakland history...the longest is 14 by Tommy Milone and Gil Heredia.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has yielded six home runs, all solo shots...has walked just one batter to lead off an inning...has held left-handed hitters to a .211 (19-for-90) batting average while right-handers are batting .307 (35-for-114)...last year, he had a .268 average against lefties, .187 against righties...has issued all five of his walks this year to right-handed hitters and his on-base percentage against lefties (.209) is lower than his batting average...has issued 12 of his 14 walks over the last two years to righties...has a .342 (26-for-76) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup this year, .158 (12-for-76) the second time and .308 (16-for-52) after that...last year, he had a .179 opponents average the first time through the lineup.

**NIGHT AND DAY:** Is scheduled to make his 10th start of the season, his fifth during the day...it will be his 17th start over the last two years, his 10th in a day game...is 0-3 with a 4.13 ERA (11 er in 24.0 ip) in four starts during the day this year, 3-1 with a 3.42 ERA (10 er in 26.1 ip) in five starts at night...is 2-10 with a 4.08 ERA (39 er in 86.0 ip) in 15 career starts during the day, 6-5 with a 5.56 ERA (49 er in 79.1 ip) in 15 starts at night.

**HOME AND AWAY:** Is 1-3 with a 3.16 ERA (13 er in 37.0 ip) and .231 (33-for-143) opponents batting average in six starts at home compared to 2-1 with a 5.40 ERA (8 er in 13.1 ip) and .344 (21-for-61) opponents batting average in three starts on the road...is now 1-10 with a 5.13 ERA (53 er in 93.0 ip) in 17 career starts in the Coliseum compared to 7-4 with a 4.35 ERA (35 er in 72.1 ip) in 13 starts on the road...picked up his first career win in the Coliseum April 16 against Chicago (AL), snapping a career-opening 10-game home losing streak...that is the longest career-opening home losing streak by an A's pitcher since Bobby Hasty lost 11 straight from Sept. 11, 1919 to Aug. 11, 1921...it is the second longest home losing streak in Oakland history and fell three short of the record of 14 set by Matt Keough from July 14, 1978 to Aug. 8, 1979...allowed a run in the first inning of his first road start this year, snapping a 23.0-inning road scoreless streak...that fell two short of the Oakland record of 25.0 set by Gene Nelson (Aug. 21, 1989-April 25, 1990) and matched by Dennis Eckersley (June 5, 1990-April 16, 1991).

**DAYS REST:** Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 1-2 with a 2.70 ERA (6 er in 20.0 ip) in three starts on four days rest, 2-2 with a 4.45 ERA (15 er in 30.1 ip) in six starts on five days rest or more...his career splits are 4-4 with a 3.49 ERA (26 er in 67.0 ip) in 11 starts on four days rest, 4-11 with a 5.56 ERA (62 er in 98.1 ip) in 19 starts on five days rest or more.

**THE WEST AND THE REST:** Is 0-4 with a 6.30 ERA (14 er in 20.0 ip) in four starts American League West teams compared to 3-0 with a 2.08 ERA (7 er in 30.1 ip) in five starts against everyone else...is now 1-10 with a 5.89 ERA (48 er in 73.1 ip) in 14 career starts against divisional foes, 7-5 with a 3.91 ERA (40 er in 92.0 ip) in 16 starts against all other teams...his only win against an AL West team came on Oct. 1, 2017 at Texas.

**2018 START-BY-START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-3 loss to Los Angeles (AL) on **March 31** in Oakland...allowed a RBI double to Trout in the first and two more runs, one earned, in the third...also yielded a RBI double to Pujols in the fifth...was relieved by Hendriks with two outs and runners on first and second in the sixth and the A's trailing 4-0...Hendriks allowed both inherited runners to score...lost his second consecutive start in the A's 6-3 loss to Texas on **April 5** in Oakland...allowed four runs, three earned, all in the second inning...yielded a RBI single to Odor and then his own throwing error on a Rua sacrifice allowed two more runs to score...Robinson added a RBI single to give the Rangers a 4-0 lead...picked up his first win of the season in the A's 16-6 win at Los Angeles (NL) **April 11**...the A's scored twice in the first, but he allowed a Seager RBI ground out in the bottom of the first...Oakland added five more in the fourth before he allowed a solo home run to Grandal in the bottom of the fourth...had a 9-2 lead when he was relieved by Petit with no outs and runners on first and third in the sixth...Petit allowed both runs to score...won his second consecutive start in the A's 8-1 win over

Chicago (AL) **April 16** in Oakland...allowed one hit in each of the first four innings but retired 11 straight from the last out in the fourth through the first out in the eighth...had an 8-0 lead when he allowed a leadoff home run to Abreu in the ninth...was relieved by Petit, who retired the final three batters to preserve the win...had a no decision in the A's 4-1 win over Boston **April 22** in Oakland...the A's scored a run in the first and he shut out the Red Sox on three hits over the first six innings, retiring 12 straight at one point...allowed the game tying RBI double to Holt in the seventh inning but the A's scored three times in the bottom of the eighth for the win...was the losing pitcher in the A's 11-0 loss at Houston **April 28**...tossed a career-low 2.1 innings...allowed three runs in the first inning on sacrifice flies by Gurriel and Reddick and a Bregman RBI double...also allowed an Altuve RBI double in the second and was relieved by Coulombe with one out and runners on first and third in the third...Coulombe allowed one of those runs to score...had a no decision in the A's 6-4 win over Baltimore **May 4** in Oakland...allowed a solo home run to the second batter he faced, Jones, but that was the only run he would allow in five innings of work...was relieved by Petit to start the sixth inning with the A's leading 4-1 and Petit allowed three runs for the blown save...was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-1 loss to Houston on **May 9** in Oakland...blanked the Astros on four hits over the first six innings...had a 1-0 lead entering the seventh inning and retired the first two batters before surrendering back-to-back home runs to Stassi and Fisher for the loss.

**LAST START:** He was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-3 win at Boston on Tuesday...blanked the Red Sox on four hits over the first three innings and had a 3-0 lead when he allowed an unearned run in the fourth...also surrendered a Benintendi home run in the fifth but those were the only runs he would allow in six innings of work.

### TUESDAY'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

**RHP Trevor Cahill (1-2, 2.76 ERA):** Was reinstated from the 10-day disabled list last Wednesday and is 0-1 with a 5.40 ERA (3 er in 5.0 ip) in one start since his return...was recalled from Triple-A Nashville April 17 and went 1-1 with a 2.25 ERA in four starts before he was placed on the DL May 9 retroactive to May 6 with a right elbow impingement...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 6-4 A's loss at Boston on Wednesday (5.0 ip, 5 h, 3 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 1 so)...is 5-4 with a 3.48 ERA (75.0 ip, 80 h, 31 r, 29 er, 24 bb, 52 so, 7 hr) in 13 career starts against Seattle...that includes 1-2 with a 1.82 ERA in five starts in the Coliseum...had a no decision in his only start last year, a 6-4 Royals win at Kansas City on Aug. 3 (4.2 ip, 6 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 3 so, 2 hr, 3.86 ERA)...was signed by the A's as a free agent March 19 and made two spring training appearances before he was optioned to Nashville March 28...went 0-1 with a 3.72 ERA and .121 opponents batting average in two starts with the Sounds.

- Has committed six errors in his last 25 games and has eight for the season...that is tied with Lindor (CLE) and Profar (TEX) for the most among Major League shortstops.

**Last Year:** Batted .249 with 10 HR and 40 RBI in 85 games in a season shortened by a stint on the disabled list from April 15 to July 5...missed 74 games while on the DL after playing in all but 10 games over the previous two seasons...stole a career-high 12 bases.
