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OAKLAND ATHLETICS (30-28) VS. KANSAS CITY ROYALS (20-37)

SATURDAY, JUNE 2, 2018 — KAUFFMAN STADIUM — 1:15 P.M. CDT

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's set a new season high for margin of victory last night with a 16-0 defeat of the Royals in Kansas City...also set a new season high for runs scored in an inning, plating seven in both the third and ninth innings...was the fourth time the A's have shut out their opponent this season (last, May 26 vs. Arizona at the Coliseum)...are now 30-28 for the season...went 5-10 (.333) over the first 15 games, 20-12 (.625) over a 32-game stretch from April 15-May 20, and are 5-6 (.455) in 11 games since then...the A's are 10-19 (.345) against American League West competition, 20-9 (.690) against all other teams...are in fourth place in the AL West for the 38th consecutive day and trail first place Houston by 6½ games...that is one short of the season high of 7½ (last on May 25)...have spent one day tied for first, one day tied for second, two days tied for third, 53 days in fourth and seven days tied for fourth.

THE HOT CORNER: Athletics third baseman **Matt Chapman** leads all Major League third baseman in nearly every major defensive statistic...he ranks first in total chances (211)...Kyle Seager, SEA is in second place with 170 total chances...Chapman also ranks first in putouts (48), assists (155), assists per nine innings (2.71), range factor per nine innings (3.54), range factor per game (3.50), and zone rating (.865)...Chapman has 51 more chances and 39 more assists than Nolan Arenado (160 chances, 116 assists)...Chapman leads all players across all positions in defensive runs saved (14)...he has a consecutive games played streak of 138 dating back to last season...offensively, Chapman has nine home runs and 24 RBI in 58 games, including eight doubles and three triples.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's went 4-6 on their 10-game homestand against Seattle (1-2), Arizona (2-1) and Tampa Bay (1-3)...have not lost more than six games on a homestand since June 30-July 9, 2006 (3-7)...went 7-3 on the last road trip to New York-AL (1-2), Boston (2-1) and Toronto (4-0), which was the A's first seven-win trip since April 7-16, 2014 (7-2)...now continue their five-game road trip to Kansas City (three games, 1-0) and Texas (two games)...these are the A's only five road games over a 25-game stretch from May 22-June 17...have won four straight and six of the last seven on the road...are 15-15 at home (.500) compared to 15-13 (.536) on the road.

OFFENSE: The A's scored 16 runs yesterday, matching their highest total of the season...recorded two seven-run innings last night...the previous season high was six...have 23 runs over their last two games after scoring five runs over their previous four...the 16-0 win yesterday set a new high for margin of victory...were held to one hit on Wednesday night for the first time since July 31, 2015 against Cleveland (Danny Salazar, Cody Allen)...last night's 16 hit performance snapped a 10 game streak of seven or fewer hits, which was the longest such streak in Oakland history...are batting .240 for the season, which is fifth lowest in the American League...have the fourth lowest on-base percentage (.311)...were shut out Wednesday for the third time in the last 10 games and the fifth time this year.

SCORING POSITION: The A's went 7-for-10 with runners in scoring position...had been 3-for-37 (.081) with runners in scoring position over the previous seven games...hit .194 (37-for-191) with RISP in May after batting .271 with RISP in April...are now hitting .247 with RISP for the season, which is ninth best in the American League.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's committed a season-high tying four errors Wednesday night (April 29 at Houston) and now have 38 for the season, which is tied for third most in the American League...are tied for the eighth most double plays (47) and tied for the fourth most unearned runs (23)...lead the majors with 614 assists...A's outfielders have five assists, which is the fewest in the AL.

A'S IN MAY: The A's went 15-14 in May...had not had a winning record in May since 2014 (16-12)...batted .211 (207-for-981) in May, which is second lowest in the majors (Arizona, .193)...the lowest single-month batting averages in Oakland history in a month of 20 or more games are .210 in April 1969, .210 in May 2012, .211 in April 2012, .216 in June 1982 and .220 in Aug. 2008...had a .277 on-base percentage, which is also second lowest in the majors (Arizona, .264)...the lowest single-month on-base percentages in Oakland history (min. 20 games) are .267 in July 2015, .274 in Aug. 1972, .281 in June 1978, .282 in April 1979, .283 in Sept. 1978)...have 260 strikeouts, which is the third highest single-month total in Oakland history (285 in June 2017,

276 in Sept. 2012)...are 5-for-15 (33.3%) in stolen base attempts...the last time an A's team had a stolen base percentage under 40% in a month with 10 or more steals was Aug. 1958 (2-for-10, 20.0%)...the Oakland low is 42.1% in July 1974 (16-for-38)...are tied with Baltimore for the fewest stolen bases in the American League this month.

PITCHING: After throwing their fourth shutout of the season last night, the A's have a 2.47 ERA (36 er in 131.0 ip) and .206 (97-for-472) opponents batting average over the last 14 games...overall, have the third fewest walks per nine innings in the American League (2.70) and the third fewest strikeouts per nine innings (7.42)...lead the majors with 39 wild pitches...A's starting pitchers are 4-4 with a 2.87 ERA (26 er in 81.2 ip) over the last 14 games

HOME RUNS: The A's have hit 22 home runs in 30 games at home compared to 51 home runs in 28 games on the road...lead the majors in home runs on the road (Atlanta, 43) and are tied for the fourth fewest at home...28 of the A's 73 home runs have given Oakland the lead and the A's rank first in go-ahead home runs in the American League...are second in the majors to Washington (29)...have homered in each of their last 15 games on the road...the pitching staff has allowed 40 home runs on the road, which is tied for third most in the majors...have 28 at home, which is tied for eighth fewest in baseball.

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: Before setting their largest margin of victory for the season yesterday in Kansas City, six of the 10 games on the homestand were decided by one run and the A's were 2-4 in those games...are 10-6 (.625) in one-run games for the season...are 3-3 in extra inning games...are 6-3 in games decided in the last at bat...have three walk-off wins.

THE SEVENTH INNING OR LATER: The A's have compiled a 3.17 ERA (63 er in 178.2 ip) in the seventh inning or later, which is second lowest in the American League (Houston, 3.10) and sixth lowest in the majors...have a 4.27 ERA (165 er in 348.0 ip) over innings one through six...are 23-0 when leading after seven innings and are one of two teams in the majors that has not lost a game when leading after seven (Milwaukee, 30-0).

ON THE BASES: The A's are 11-for-23 (47.8%) in stolen base attempts...have the lowest stolen base percentage in the majors, the fewest stolen bases and the third fewest attempts...opponents have stolen 41 bases, which is tied with Baltimore for the second most in the American League (Toronto, 44), but they have been caught stealing 15 times, which is also tied for second most.

A'S ON RADIO: Due to conflicts with the Warriors, the following games will air in the Bay Area on 1550 AM: Sunday at Kansas City, next Wednesday at Texas and June 8 against Kansas City...additional updates will be announced based on the Warriors postseason schedule.

A'S vs. ROYALS: The A's lead the season series 1-0 after yesterday's contest...have won 10 of the last 13 games dating back to 2016...have won three season series, lost three season series, and split one season series over the last seven years and are 33-27 against Kansas City since 2010...all-time, the A's are 318-263 against the Royals...that breaks down to 172-117 in Oakland and 146-146 in Kansas City.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Olson homered in three consecutive at-bats after hitting two in his first two at-bats yesterday in Kansas City (hit one in his last at-bat on Thursday in Oakland)...he now has 11 home runs on the season and three in his last two games...**Blake Treinen** converted each of his 10 save opportunities in May and had a 0.59 ERA (1 er in 15.1 ip) in 14 games in May...he tied the A's record for saves in the month of May, which was 10 by Dennis Eckersley (1992).

In 1977 Mike Norris tosses a four-hit shutout as the A's defeat the Mariners in Seattle, 1-0...Jim Tyrone's double in the fourth inning drives in the only run of the game...in 1982 Mike Norris tosses a four-hit shutout as the A's defeat Boston 5-0.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Trevor Cahill (1-2, 2.25 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was reinstated from the 10-day disabled list May 16 and is 0-1 with a 2.25 ERA (5 er in 20.0 ip) and .183 (13-for-71) opponents batting average in three starts since his return...was recalled from Triple-A Nashville April 17 and went 1-1 with a 2.25 ERA and .202 opponents average in four starts before he was placed on the DL May 9 retroactive to May 6 with a right elbow impingement...did not make a rehab appearance...has a 2.25 ERA overall, which is fourth lowest in the American League among pitchers with at least 40 innings pitched...was signed by the A's as a free agent March 19 and made two spring training appearances before he was optioned to Nashville March 28.

FIVE HITS OR FEWER: Has allowed five hits or fewer in each of his seven starts and has tossed at least five innings in each outing...the last time an A's pitcher had seven consecutive starts in a single season with five innings or more and five hits or fewer was in 2010 when he had a nine-game streak from June 20 to Aug. 2...opponents are batting .194 (30-for-155), which is sixth lowest in the American League among pitchers with at least 40 innings pitched...has the fourth lowest on-base percentage (.242) and sixth lowest slugging percentage (.316).

RUN SUPPORT: Received 10 runs of support in his first start, but has just 10 runs of support in his six starts since then (37.0 ip, 2.43 RSA)...has three starts where he has not allowed a run but has received zero runs of support in two of those starts...the game has gone into extra innings in each of his last two starts and three starts this year...has a 0.86 ERA (2 er in 21.0 ip) in those three starts but has just two runs of support.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 1-0 with a 0.64 ERA (2 er in 28.0 ip) in four starts at home compared to 0-2 with a 5.06 ERA (9 er in 16.0 ip) in three starts on the road...last year, he combined for a 4-0 record, a 1.83 ERA and .203 opponents batting average in seven games in his home ballparks...was 0-3 with a 7.07 ERA and .320 opponents batting average in 14 games on the road...now has a seven-game home winning streak and a six-game road losing streak...has not lost at home since July 6, 2016 against Cincinnati and has not won on the road since Aug. 20 2016 at Colorado.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents are 0-for-14 with runners in scoring position and two outs...they are hitting .196 (10-for-51) with two outs overall...has allowed all four of his home runs and all 10 of his RBI to right-handed hitters...three of his home runs have come with runners on base...has walked just two batters to lead off an inning and opponents are batting .167 (7-for-42) with a .222 on-base percentage in that situation...has held the three, four and five hitters to a .148 (8-for-54) batting average...has a .155 (9-for-58) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .254 (15-for-59) the second time and .158 (6-for-38) after that...opponents are 7-for-80 (.088) with two strikes.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Opponents have been successful in 6-of-9 (66.7%) stolen bases attempts with him on the mound, and the six stolen bases are tied for 10th most in the American League...last year, opponents were successful in 17-of-19 (89.5%) stolen base attempts...they are 34-for-40 (85.0%) over the last three years...has five wild pitches, which is tied for eighth in the American League...now has 21 wild pitches over the last two years, which are the most in the majors, despite just 28 games and 128.0 innings over that stretch.

2018 START-BY-START: Was the winning pitcher in the A's 10-2 win over Chicago (AL) **April 17** in Oakland...it was his first start as an Athletic since Sept. 27, 2011 at Seattle when he combined with Craig Breslow and Jerry Blevins on a four-hit shutout (7.0 ip, 4 h, 1 bb, 7 so)...tossed 7.0 shutout innings and allowed five hits and two walks...had a no decision in the A's 9-4 win at Texas on **April 23**...left after four inning with the score tied 3-3 and Oakland scored six times in the ninth for the win...was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-4 loss at Houston **April 29**...Oakland scored a run in the third but he allowed two in the bottom of the third on a Springer RBI single and an Altuve sacrifice bunt...surrendered a solo home run to Springer in the fifth but the A's came back to tie the game, 3-3...walked Bregman to start the seventh and was relieved by Petit, who allowed that run to score plus two of his own...had a no decision in the A's 2-0, 12-inning win over Baltimore **May 5** in Oakland...struck out a career-high 12 batters in just 6.0 innings...it was his third career game of 10 or more strikeouts, his first since June 14, 2013 at San Diego...became the third A's pitcher since at least 1908 to strikeout 12 or more batters in six innings or fewer, the first since Steve Karsay on April 26, 1997 vs. Kansas City (12 so in 6.0 ip)...the other is Vida Blue on April 9, 1971 vs. Kansas City (13 so in 6.0 ip)...fanned each of the first four batters and retired each of the first eight before Peterson singled with two outs in the third...allowed only one base runner past first base...Gausman shut out the A's on two hits over the first nine innings and Khris Davis hit a walk-off two-run home run in the 12th for the win...was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-4 loss at Boston **May 16**...allowed three runs in the first inning on a Ramirez RBI ground out and a Martinez two-run home run...those were the only runs he would allow

in five innings of work as he blanked the Red Sox on two hits over his final four innings...left trailing 3-2...had a no decision in the A's 3-2, 10-inning loss to Seattle on **May 22** in Oakland...the A's scored single runs in the fourth and fifth innings and he blanked the Mariners on three hits over the first six innings...walked Vogelbach with one out in the seventh and then surrendered a game-tying two-run home run to Zunino.

LAST START: He had his second consecutive no decision in an extra inning game, a 1-0 A's loss to Tampa Bay in 13 innings last Monday in Oakland...tossed 8.0 scoreless innings and allowed just four hits while not walking a batter...it was his longest scoreless outing since June 2, 2012 at San Diego when he tossed a six-hit shutout for Arizona...Archer and five Rays relievers combined to shutout the A's on seven hits.

CAHILL vs. KANSAS CITY: Is 3-2 with a 4.74 ERA (38.0 ip, 32 h, 20 r, 20 er, 22 bb, 18 so, 6 hr) in six career appearances, including five starts...is 3-1 with a 3.08 ERA (9 er in 26.1 ip) in five games in his home ballparks, including 3-1 with a 3.33 ERA (9 er in 24.1 ip) in four starts in the Coliseum...pitched for the Royals last year and is 0-1 with a 6.86 ERA (16 er in 21.0 ip) in five games, including three starts, at Kauffman Stadium...last faced the Royals on Sept. 28, 2015 while pitching in relief for the Cubs at Chicago (2.0 ip, 1 h, 3 so)...his last start came for the A's on June 14, 2011, a loss in a 7-4 decision in Oakland...issued a career-high seven walks...allowed a RBI ground out to Treanor in the second, a RBI ground out to Escobar in the fourth and a two-run single to Butler in the fifth.

2017 RECAP: Was used exclusively as a starter with San Diego but then pitched primarily in relief for Kansas City following a July 24 trade...went 4-3 with a 3.69 ERA in 11 starts with the Padres and 0-0 with an 8.22 ERA in 10 games, three starts, with the Royals...combined for a 4-3 record and a 4.93 ERA in a career-low 21 appearances overall...missed 12 weeks of the season due to three stints on the disabled list...surrendered 16 home runs in 84.1 innings, including 10 in 23.0 innings with the Royals...his average of 1.71 home runs per nine innings was the highest mark of his career...also had career highs in walks per nine innings (4.82), strikeouts per nine innings (9.32), opponents slugging percentage (.483) and opponents OPS (.850)...had a Major League leading 16 wild pitches, including 14 with San Diego...tied for the National League in wild pitches (Arrieta, CHC) despite making just 11 starts...allowed a .275 opponents batting average, including .241 (35-for-145) by left-handed hitters compared to .301 (56-for-186) by right-handers...went 4-3 with a 4.38 ERA in his 14 starting assignments...compiled an 8.25 ERA in seven relief appearances.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Daniel Gossett (0-3, 6.05 ERA): Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville May 23 for his second stint with the A's this year and is 0-2 with a 3.00 ERA in two starts since his return...was on the Opening Day roster and went 0-1 with an 11.05 ERA in two starts before he was optioned to Nashville April 7...is 4-14 in 22 career starts...since 1908, the only other A's pitcher to lose 14 games over his first 22 career appearances is Johnny Gray, who went 3-14 over his first 22 games from July 18, 1954 to May 10, 1955...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 4-3 A's loss to Tampa Bay last Tuesday in Oakland (5.0 ip, 8 h, 3 r, 3 er, 2 bb, 3 so)...has never faced the Royals in his career...went 4-0 with a 1.63 ERA in seven games, five starts, with Nashville...was leading the Pacific Coast League in ERA and opponents batting average (.190) and was tied for fifth in wins at the time of his May 23 promotion to Oakland...held the opposition to a .128 batting average with runners in scoring position.

- Has a .242 (8-for-33) opponents batting average against right-handed hitters, .294 (10-for-34) against left-handers.
- Has allowed 2-of-14 (14.3%) inherited runners to score, which is fourth lowest percentage in the American League.
- Has a 3.38 ERA (4 er in 10.2 ip) and .243 (9-for-37) opponents average in 11 games at home, a 7.88 ERA (7 er in 8.0 ip) and .300 (9-for-30) average with all three of his home runs in nine games on the road.
