OAKLAND ATHLETICS (30-29) VS. KANSAS CITY ROYALS (21-37)

SUNDAY, JUNE 3, 2018 — KAUFFMAN STADIUM — 1:15 P.M. CDT

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's fell to the Royals late yesterday after tying the game in the eighth...set a new season high for margin of victory the previous night with a 16-0 defeat of the Royals in Kansas City...also set a new season high for runs scored in an inning, plating seven in both the third and ninth innings...was the fourth time the A's have shut out their opponent this season (last, May 26 vs. Arizona at the Coliseum)...are now 30-29 for the season...went 5-10 (.333) over the first 15 games, 20-12 (.625) over a 32-game stretch from April 15-May 20, and are 5-7 (.417) in 12 games since then...the A's are 10-19 (.345) against American League West competition, 20-10 (.667) against all other teams...are in fourth place in the AL West for the 39th consecutive day and trail first place Houston and Los Angeles (AL) by 6½ games...that is one short of the season high of 7½ (last on May 25)...have spent one day tied for first, one day tied for second, two days tied for third, 54 days in fourth and seven days tied for fourth.

WHAT A RELIEF: Athletics closer **Blake Treinen** was named the American League Relief Pitcher of the Month for May yesterday...finished May 1-0 and 10-for-10 in save chances with a 0.59 ERA in 15.1 innings of work spanning 14 appearances...also had 19 strikeouts and five walks with a .151 opponent's batting average...for the season, he ranks third in the AL with a 0.99 ERA and his 13 saves rank tied for fourth...since joining the Athletics via trade in 2017, Treinen is 5-5 with a 1.65 ERA and a 1.10 WHIP in 57 appearances, including 26 saves and 75 strikeouts in 65.1 innings pitched...this season, he has gone more than one inning in 10 of his 22 outings...six of his saves have been more than one inning...this is the first time an Athletics player has won Reliever of the Month and it is Treinen's first time receiving a monthly award in his career.

THE HOT CORNER: Athletics third baseman **Matt Chapman** leads all Major League third baseman in nearly every major defensive statistic...he ranks first in total chances (212)...Kyle Seger, SEA is in second place with 173 total chances...Chapman also ranks first in putouts (49), assists (155), assists per nine innings (2.66), range factor per nine innings (3.51), range factor per game (3.46), and zone rating (.865)...Chapman has 50 more chances and 37 more assists than Nolan Arenado (162 chances, 118 assists)...Chapman leads all players across all positions in defensive runs saved (14)...he has a consecutive games played streak of 139 dating back to last season...offensively, Chapman has nine home runs and 24 RBI in 59 games, including eight doubles and three triples.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-1 on their current five-game road trip after going 4-6 on their 10-game homestand against Seattle (1-2), Arizona (2-1) and Tampa Bay (1-3)...have not lost more than six games on a homestand since June 30-July 9, 2006 (3-7)...went 7-3 on the last road trip to New York-AL (1-2), Boston (2-1) and Toronto (4-0), which was the A's first seven-win trip since April 7-16, 2014 (7-2)...now continue their five-game road trip to Kansas City (three games, 1-1) and Texas (two games)...these are the A's only five road games over a 25-game stretch from May 22-June 17...before yesterday's loss, had won four straight on the road and have now won six of their last eight road tilts...are 15-15 at home (.500) compared to 15-14 (.517) on the road.

OFFENSE: The A's have scored 27 runs over their last three games after scoring five runs over their previous four...he A's scored 16 runs Friday night, matching their highest total of the season...recorded two seven-run innings as a part of the 16-run barrage...the previous season high for runs in an inning was six...the 16-0 win set a new high for margin of victory...were held to one hit on Wednesday night for the first time since July 31, 2015 against Cleveland (Danny Salazar, Cody Allen)...have 25 hits in the last two games after snapping a 10 game streak of seven or fewer hits, which was the longest such streak in Oakland history...are batting .240 for the season, which is fifth lowest in the American League...also have the fifth lowest on-base percentage (.311).

SCORING POSITION: The A's are hitting .625 (10-for-16) with runners in scoring position over the first two games of June...had been 3-for-37 (.081) with runners in scoring position over the previous seven contests...hit .194 (37-for-191) with RISP in May after batting .271 with RISP in April...are now hitting .251 with RISP for the season, which is eighth best in the American League.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: Have not committed an error in three-straight games...their longest errorless streak of the season is five games (April 15-20)...

had a season-high tying four errors Wednesday night (April 29 at Houston) and have 38 for the season, which is tied for fourth most in the American League...are tied for the ninth most double plays (48) and tied for the fifth most unearned runs (23)...lead the majors with 623 assists...A's outfielders have five assists, which is the fewest in the AL.

PITCHING: The A's have a 2.65 ERA (41 er in 139.0 ip) and .210 (105-for-501) opponents batting average over the last 15 games...overall, have the third fewest walks per nine innings in the American League (2.71) and the third fewest strikeouts per nine innings (7.47)...lead the majors with 39 wild pitches...A's starting pitchers are 4-4 with a 3.13 ERA (30 er in 86.1 ip) over the last 15 games

HOME RUNS: The A's have hit 22 home runs in 30 games at home compared to 52 home runs in 29 games on the road...lead the majors in home runs on the road and are tied for the third fewest at home...28 of the A's 73 home runs have given Oakland the lead and the A's rank tied for first in go-ahead home runs in the American League...are second in the majors to Washington (29)...have homered in each of their last 16 games on the road...the pitching staff has allowed 41 home runs on the road, which is tied for second most in the majors...have 28 at home, which is sixth fewest among all Major League teams.

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: Seven of the A's last 12 games have been decided by one run and the A's are 2-5 in those games...are 10-7 (.588) in one-run games for the season...are 3-3 in extra inning games...are 6-3 in games decided in the last at bat...have three walk-off wins.

THE SEVENTH INNING OR LATER: The A's have compiled a 3.19 ERA (64 er in 180.2 ip) in the seventh inning or later, which is the lowest in the American League and fifth lowest in the majors...have a 4.30 ERA (169 er in 354.0 ip) over innings one through six...are 23-0 when leading after seven innings and are one of two teams in the majors that has not lost a game when leading after seven (Milwaukee, 31-0).

ON THE BASES: The A's are 11-for-23 (47.8%) in stolen base attempts...have the lowest stolen base percentage in the majors, the fewest stolen bases and the third fewest attempts...opponents have stolen 41 bases, which is the third most in the American League, but they have been caught stealing 17 times, which is tied for the most.

A'S ON RADIO: Due to conflicts with the Warriors, the following games will air in the Bay Area on 1550 AM: today at Kansas City, next Wednesday at Texas and June 8 against Kansas City...additional updates will be announced based on the Warriors postseason schedule.

A'S vs. ROYALS: The season series is tied 1-1 after yesterday's contest...the A's have won 10 of the last 14 games dating back to 2016...have won three season series, lost three season series, and split one season series over the last seven years and are 33-28 against Kansas City since 2010...all-time, the A's are 318-264 against the Royals...that breaks down to 172-117 in Oakland and 146-147 in Kansas City.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Blake Treinen was named American League Reliever of the Month to May...converted each of his 10 save opportunities in May and had a 0.59 ERA (1 er in 15.1 ip) in 14 games in May...he tied the A's record for saves in the month of May, which was 10 by Dennis Eckersley (1992)...**Stephen Piscotty** has doubled in five of his last six games, giving him 14 on the year...is hitting .304 with a .522 slugging percentage over the last six games, including five runs and four RBI.

OAKLAND A'S 50th ANNIVERSARY MOMENTS

In **1980**, the A's trail 4-1 entering the ninth inning at Cleveland when Dave Revering, Mitchell Page and Tony Armas hit consecutive home runs to send the game into extra innings...the A's would go on to lose 6-4 in 10 innings...in **2004** the A's tie an Oakland record by playing their third straight extra inning game, a 2-1 win against Toronto in 11 innings...in **2017** Ryon Healy ties an Athletics record with four extra base hits after going 4-for-4 with two doubles and two home runs against Washington.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Daniel Gossett (0-3, 6.05 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville May 23 for his second stint with the A's this year and is 0-2 with a 3.00 ERA (4 er in 12.0 ip) in two starts since his return...was on the Opening Day roster and went 0-1 with an 11.05 ERA in two starts before he was optioned to Nashville April 7...went 4-0 with a 1.63 ERA in seven games, five starts, with the Sounds.

LOSSES: Is 0-3 in four starts this year after going 4-11 in 18 starts last year... is now 4-14 in 22 career starts...since 1908, the only other A's pitcher to lose 14 games over his first 22 career appearances is Johnny Gray, who went 3-14 over his first 22 games from July 18, 1954 to May 10, 1955 with the Philadelphia and Kansas City A's...Gray did not lose his 15th game until his 26th game...the last Major Leaguer with 14 or more losses over his first 22 career appearances is Jeremy Bonderman, who started 5-15 for Detroit in 2003 (won game 23).

SIX-GAME LOSING STREAK: Is 0-6 with an 8.41 ERA (33 er in 35.1 ip) and .324 (48-for-148) opponents batting average over his last eight starts dating back to Sept. 14, 2017...that is the longest losing streak of his career...has surrendered 12 home runs during the streak (3.06 per nine innings)...his last win came on Sept. 9, 2017 against Houston.

THE LONG BALL: Allowed three consecutive home runs in the third inning of his last start last Tuesday against Tampa Bay (Cron, Wendle, Ramos)...became the first A's pitcher to allow three straight home runs since Keith Foulke on Sept. 18, 2008 against Los Angeles-AL (Morales, Napoli and Wood)...has surrendered four home runs in 19.1 innings with Oakland compared to one home run in 38.2 innings with Nashville...has allowed 25 career home runs in 1110.2 innings in the majors (2.03 per nine innings) compared to 32 in 437.1 innings in the minors (0.66 per nine innings)...the 25 home runs are the most in Athletics history by a pitcher over the first 22 games of his career (Trevor Cahil, 23).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has surrendered all four of his home runs with two outs...all four have been solo sots...has a .409 (18-for-44) opponents batting average with the bases empty, .152 (5-for-33) with runners on...opponents are 8-for-19 (.421) when leading off an inning.

FOUR RUNS OR MORE, FEWER THAN FIVE INNINGS: Had a streak of five consecutive starts with four runs or more and fewer than five innings pitched from Sept. 19, 2017 to April 6, 2018...that matches the longest such streak by an A's pitcher since at least 1908 (Rick Langford, April 4-July 17, 1983)...is the seventh pitcher in Oakland history with five consecutive starts of fewer than five innings (previous: Dallas Braden, Aug. 12 to Sept. 29, 2007).

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-4 loss to Los Angeles (AL) April 1 in Oakland...did not strike out a batter for the second time in his career...the other time was in his final start of 2017 (Sept. 30 at Texas)...allowed back-to-back RBI doubles to Valbuena and Marte in the second inning but Matt Chapman hit a three-run home run in the bottom of the inning to give the A's a 3-2 lead...was relieved by Petit with no outs in the fifth inning and runners on first and second...Petit allowed both inherited runners to score to give Gossett the loss.

SECOND START: He had a no decision in the A's 13-0 loss at Los Angeles (AL) April 6...Oakland scored a run in the first and five more in the second to take a 6-0 lead...he allowed a solo home run to Ohtani in the second and four more runs in the fourth...yielded a RBI double to Simmons and a two-run single to Valbuena...was relieved by Petit with a 6-4 lead, one out and a runner on second and Petit allowed that runner to score.

THIRD START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 1-0 loss to Seattle on May 23 in Oakland...tossed a career-high tying 7.0 innings and a career-high 104 pitches...blanked the Mariners on one hit over the first three innings and then allowed a leadoff double to Heredia in the fourth...Heredia went to third on a fly ball and scored on a Seager fielders choice/Semien error...Gonzales, Nicasio and Diaz combined to shut out the A's on three hits.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-3 loss to Tampa Bay last Monday in Oakland...blanked the Rays on two hits and a walk over the first two innings and struck out the first two batters in the third...then allowed back-to-back-to-back home runs to Cron, Wendle and Ramos to give Tampa Bay a 3-0 lead...those were the only runs he allowed in five innings of work.

WITH NASHVILLE: Was 4-0 with a 1.63 ERA in seven games, including five starts, with Triple-A Nashville...was leading the Pacific Coast League in ERA and opponents batting average (.190) and was tied for fifth in wins at the time of his May 23 promotion to Oakland...his opponents batting average includes a mark of .146 (6-for-41) against left-handed hitters compared to .208 (20-for-96) against right-handers...held the opposition to a .128 batting average with runners in scoring position...the Sounds were 5-0 in his starting assignments...allowed two runs or fewer in six of his seven appearances and five hits or fewer six times...pitched 4.0 scoreless innings of relief and allowed just one hit in his first outing April 12 against Iowa...then started in his next appearance April 17 at Iowa and allowed one hit in a 4.0 scoreless innings...picked up his first win in his third outing April 23 at Omaha...issued six of his 16 walks at Triple-A in his fourth appearance April 29 against New Orleans...allowed two unearned runs in 4.2 innings and had a no decision...pitched 7.0 innings in relief of Chris Bassitt May 5 against Memphis and struck out a season-high nine...did not walk a batter and allowed just one run for the win...allowed a season-high five runs and a season-high eight hits in 7.0 innings against Colorado Springs May 10 but picked up the win in a 12-7 decision...then tossed 6.0 scoreless innings and allowed just two hits and two walks in a 7-4 win in his final start at Memphis May 15.

2017 RECAP: Went 4-11 with a 6.11 ERA in 18 starts over two stints with Oakland in his Major League debut...his .267 winning percentage was third lowest in the American League and tied for fourth lowest in Oakland history...it was the lowest since Steve Karsay went 3-12 (.200) in 1997...had 91.1 innings pitched and did not qualify for the league leaders...based on a minimum of 90 innings pitched, he had the second highest opponents slugging percentage in the AL (.549), the fourth highest batting average (.306) and OPS (.906) and the fifth highest ERA...using the 90 inning minimum, his slugging percentage, OPS and average of 2.07 home runs per nine innings were second highest in Oakland history to Gil Heredia in 2001 (.554, .911, 2.22)...his ERA was sixth highest and the highest since Omar Olivares had a 6.75 ERA in 2000...ranked fifth among AL rookies in games started (18), sixth in innings pitched (91.1) and eighth in strikeouts (72)...tied for eighth among all AL pitchers in wild pitches (10)...his opponents batting average included a .296 (63-for-213) mark against right-handed hitters compared to .319 (53-for-166) against left-handers...surrendered 15 of his 21 home runs to righties...had a .225 opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .360 after that...compiled a 1.50 ERA in the first inning, a 5.19 ERA in innings two and three and a 9.08 ERA from the fourth inning on...received one run of support or fewer in 11 of his 18 starts and was 0-10 in those starts...went 4-1 in seven starts more than one run of support...was 1-7 in eight starts against AL West competition, 3-4 against all other teams.

2017 WITH NASHVILLE: Compiled a 4-4 record with a 3.66 ERA and .239 opponents batting average in 14 starts with Nashville...surrendered just six home runs in 76.1 innings, an average of 0.71 per nine innings...his opponents batting average included a mark of .230 (37-for-161) against right-handed hitters compared to .250 (33-for-132) against left-handers...opponents hit .161 with runners in scoring position and two outs...walked one batter or fewer in nine of his 14 starts.

LHP Sean Manaea (5-6, 3.60 ERA): Has allowed four runs or more in each of his last six starts after yielding two runs or fewer in each of his first six starts (including one run or fewer five times)...is 1-4 with a 7.18 ERA and .295 opponents batting average over his last six starts after going 4-2 with a 1.03 ERA and .134 opponents batting average over his first six starts...has walked two batters or fewer in 11 of his 12 starts and ranks fifth in the American League in fewest walks per nine innings (1.68)...has received two runs of support or fewer in eight of his 12 starts this year and his season run support average of 3.36 is seventh lowest in the AL...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 6-0 loss to Tampa Bay in Oakland (5.0 ip, 4 r, 4 er, bb, 3 so, hr)...is 4-2 with a 3.51 ERA and 45 strikeouts in 48.2 career innings pitched against the Texas Rangers...is 1-2 with a 4.74 ERA in four starts at Globe Life Park dating back to 2016.

- Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville May 19 for his second stint with the A's this year and has pitched three times since his return (4.0 ip, 5 h, 2 r, 2 er, 3 so, 4.50 ERA)...was optioned to Nashville the day before but returned when Anderson went on the DL.
- Has allowed seven runs in his last seven outings (6.1 ip, 9.95 ERA) after allowing no runs over his previous seven contests (6.2 ip).
- Has held left-handed hitters to a .222 (4-for-18) batting average compared to .368 (14-for-38) against right-handers.
- Has a 1.93 ERA (1 er in 4.2 ip) in five career outings against Kansas City.
- Began the season on the 10-day disabled list with a strained right shoulder...was reinstated April 14.

Last Year: Went 2-2 with a 5.14 ERA and .236 opponents batting average in 49 games in a season shortened by a two-month stint on the disabled list with a strained right knee...struck out 45 batters in 42.0 innings.
