OAKLAND ATHLETICS (31-30) VS. TEXAS RANGERS (26-37)

WEDNESDAY, JUNE 6, 2018 — GLOBE LIFE PARK — 7:05 P.M. CDT

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's fell to the Rangers last night, 7-4...they move to 2-2 on this five-game road trip...after a 5-1 win in Kansas City on Sunday, the A's took the three-game set from the Royals...out-scored Kansas City 25-6 for the series...set a new season high for margin of victory on Friday night with a 16-0 defeat of the Royals in Kansas City...also set a new season high for runs scored in an inning that night, plating seven in both the third and ninth innings...are now 31-30 for the season...went 5-10 (.333) over the first 15 games, 20-12 (.625) over a 32-game stretch from April 15-May 20, and are 6-8 (.429) in 14 games since then...the A's are 10-20 (.333) against American League West competition, 21-10 (.677) against all other teams...are in fourth place in the AL West for the 42nd consecutive day and trail first place Seattle by 7½ games...that matches the season high of 7½ (last on May 25)...have spent one day tied for first, one day tied for second, two days tied for third, 57 days in fourth and seven days tied for fourth.

THE HOT CORNER: Athletics third baseman **Matt Chapman** leads all Major League third basemen in nearly every major defensive statistic...he ranks first in total chances (218)...Kyle Seager, SEA is in second place with 183 total chances...Chapman also ranks first in putouts (50), assists (160), assists per nine innings (2.66), range factor per nine innings (3.50), range factor per game (3.44), and zone rating (.870)...Chapman has 50 more chances and 38 more assists than Nolan Arenado (168 chances, 122 assists)...Chapman leads all players across all positions in defensive runs saved (15)...he has a consecutive games played streak of 141 dating back to last season...offensively, Chapman has nine home runs and 24 RBI in 61 games, including eight doubles and three triples...is getting on base at a .323 clip and has a slugging percentage of .416.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-2 on their current five-game road trip after taking a three-game set from Kansas City and dropping last night's opener in Texas...went 4-6 on their most recent homestand against Seattle (1-2), Arizona (2-1) and Tampa Bay (1-3)...have not lost more than six games on a homestand since June 30-July 9, 2006 (3-7)...went 7-3 on the last road trip to New York-AL (1-2), Boston (2-1) and Toronto (4-0), which was the A's first seven-win trip since April 7-16, 2014 (7-2)...now conclude their five-game road trip to Kansas City (2-1) and Texas (two games, 0-1)...these are the A's only five road games over a 25-game stretch from May 22-June 17...have now won seven of their last 10 road tilts...are 15-15 at home (.500) compared to 16-15 (.516) on the road...are averaging 5.45 runs per game on the road compared to 3.47 runs per game at the Coliseum.

OFFENSE: The A's have scored 36 runs over their last five games after scoring five runs over their previous four...out-scored Kansas City 25-6 during their three-game series at Kauffman Stadium...the A's scored 16 runs Friday night, matching their highest total of the season...recorded two seven-run innings as a part of the 16-run barrage...the previous season high for runs in an inning was six...the 16-0 win set a new high for margin of victory...were held to one hit on Wednesday night for the first time since July 31, 2015 against Cleveland (Danny Salazar, Cody Allen)...have 43 hits in the last four games after snapping a 10 game streak of seven or fewer hits, which was the longest such streak in Oakland history...are batting .241 for the season, which is fifth lowest in the American League...also have the fifth lowest on-base percentage (.312)...are averaging 5.45 runs per game on the road compared to 3.47 runs per game at the Coliseum.

SCORING POSITION: The A's are hitting .552 (16-for-29) with runners in scoring position over the first four games of June...had been 3-for-37 (.081) with runners in scoring position over the previous seven contests...hit .194 (37-for-191) with RISP in May after batting .271 with RISP in April...are now hitting .257 with RISP for the season, which is seventh best in the American League.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: Have not committed an error in five straight games...that matches their longest errorless streak of the season (April 15-20)...had a season-high tying four errors Wednesday night (April 29 at Houston) and have 38 for the season, which is fifth most in the American League...have the ninth most double plays (49) and tied for the fifth most unearned runs (23)...lead the majors with 643 assists...A's outfielders have five assists, which is the fewest in the AL...Oakland catchers have six passed balls, tied for sixth most in the American League.

PITCHING: The A's have a 2.83 ERA (49 er in 156.0 ip) and .207 (116-for-561) opponents batting average over the last 17 games...overall, have the fourth fewest walks per nine innings in the American League (2.77) and the third fewest strikeouts per nine innings (7.42)...lead the majors with 39 wild pitches...A's starting pitchers are 4-4 with a 3.07 ERA (33 er in 96.2 ip) over the last 17 games...Oakland relief pitchers have thrown 217.0 innings this season, fourth most in the AL...they are fifth with a 3.61 ERA and seventh with a .252 batting average against...are third in the AL with a .650 winning percentage (13-7).

HOME RUNS: The A's have hit 22 home runs in 30 games at home compared to 54 home runs in 31 games on the road...lead the majors in home runs on the road and have the third fewest at home...28 of the A's 76 home runs have given Oakland the lead and the A's rank second in go-ahead home runs in the American League (New York (AL), 30)...are tied for third in the majors to Washington (31)...have homered in each of their last 18 games on the road...after giving up a season-high five home runs last night, the pitching staff has allowed 47 home runs on the road, which is the most in the majors...have allowed 28 home runs at home, which is sixth fewest among all Major League teams and second fewest in the American League.

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: Seven of the A's last 14 games have been decided by one run and the A's are 2-5 in those games...are 10-7 (.588) in one-run games for the season...are 3-3 in extra inning games...are 6-3 in games decided in the last at bat...have three walk-off wins.

THE SEVENTH INNING OR LATER: The A's have compiled a 3.34 ERA (69 er in 185.2 ip) in the seventh inning or later, which is the second lowest in the American League (HOU, 3.24) and sixth lowest in the majors...have a 4.23 ERA (172 er in 366.0 ip) over innings one through six...are 23-0 when leading after seven innings and are one of two teams in the majors that has not lost a game when leading after seven (Milwaukee, 31-0).

ON THE BASES: The A's are 12-for-25 (48.0%) in stolen base attempts...have the lowest stolen base percentage in the majors, the fewest stolen bases and the third fewest attempts...opponents have stolen 43 bases, which is the third most in the American League, but they have been caught stealing 18 times, which is second most.

A'S ON RADIO: Due to conflicts with the Warriors, the following games will air in the Bay Area on 1550 AM: today at Texas and June 8 against Kansas City...additional updates will be announced based on the Warriors postseason schedule.

A'S vs. RANGERS: The season series is tied, 4-4...the A's won a three-game set in Texas April 23-25 after splitting a four-game series in Oakland April 2-5...the A's won the season series last year, 11-8...went 8-1 in Oakland and 3-7 in Texas...the eight home wins match the A's most ever against the Rangers (8-2 in 2001, 8-1 in 2003)...have won 10 of the last 12 home games but have lost 13 of the last 20 road games...over the previous five seasons, the A's have won the season series in odd numbered years and the Rangers in even numbered years...are 53-50 against Texas dating back to the start of the 2013 season...are 356-365 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 189-172 in Oakland and 168-193 in Texas...are 101-105 at Globe Life Park...have an all-time record of 453-446 against the Rangers/Senators franchise.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Olson has four home runs and 11 RBI in his last five games...in 21 games since May 14, Olson is hitting .308 with a .379 on-base percentage and a .679 slugging percentage (1.059 OPS), including eight home runs, five doubles, 17 RBI, and eight walks...**Khris Davis** homered last night for the first time since coming off the disabled list...moves back into a first place tie with Giancarlo Stanton for the most home runs in the majors since the start of the 2016 season.

OAKLAND A'S 50th ANNIVERSARY MOMENTS

In 1990 Rickey Henderson's collects his 1000th hit in Oakland uniform...he finished his career with the A's with an Oakland record 1640 hits...in 2003 the A's return to Philadelphia for the first time in 49 years as Oakland defeats the Philadelphia Phillies in interleague play, 7-4...Miguel Tejada collects four hits, including an Oakland record tying three doubles.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Daniel Mengden (6-4, 2.91 ERA)

SCORELESS STREAK: Before surrendering three runs in the ninth his last time out, he carried a shutout into the ninth inning in his last start after a two-hit shutout in his previous start, which was after tossing 7.0 scoreless innings of two-hit ball in his start before that...in all, put together a 25.0-inning scoreless streak, which is an A's season-high and the longest scoreless streak by an Athletics pitcher since Sean Doolittle had a 26.1 streak in 2014 and the longest by an A's starter since Cory Lidle had a 32.0 streak in 2002...his previous career high was 19.0 innings from Sept. 15-26, 2017...is just the second A's pitcher since at least 1908 with back-to-back scoreless outings of seven innings or more and two hits or fewer...the other is Bobby Witt from June 23-28, 1994.

FOUR-GAME WINNING STREAK: Has picked up the win in each of his last FOUR starts, which is the longest winning streak of his career...it's a new A's season-high...has a 1.20 ERA (4 er in 30.0 ip) and .171 (18-for-105) opponents average during the streak...now has six wins for the season, which is a career high...had three wins in seven starts last year and two in 14 starts in 2016.

IN MAY: Went 4-1 with a 1.51 ERA (7 er in 41.2 ip) and .181 (27-for-149) opponents batting average in six starts in May...allowed eight runs, four of which were scored on solo home runs...his ERA was second lowest in the American League (Verlander, HOU 0.86) and seventh lowest in the majors...tied for the American League lead in wins and ranked fifth in opponents batting average...it was the first time he has won three or more games in a month in his career.

LAST NINE STARTS: Is 5-2 with a 2.01 ERA (13 er in 58.1 ip) and .210 (45-for-214) opponents batting average over his last nine starts dating back to April 16...has the third lowest ERA in the American League over that span (Verlander, HOU 0.99; Severino, NYY 1.95).

LAST 16 STARTS/FIRST 16 STARTS: Is 8-5 with a 2.40 ERA (27 er in 101.1 ip) and two complete games over his last 16 starts dating back to Sept. 9, 2017...went 2-10 with a 6.86 ERA over the first 16 starts of his career.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Has issued just eight walks in 74.1 innings and his average of 0.97 walks per nine innings is the lowest in the majors (Kluber, STL 0.98)...has a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 6.00, which is third best in the American League (Kluber, CLE 9.50; Verlander, HOU 6.12)...also ranks fifth in the AL in opponents on-base percentage (.246) and eighth in ERA (2.91)...is tied for eighth in unearned runs (5).

DON'T WALK: Before walking two batters his last time out, he opened the year with an 11-game streak of walking one or fewer batters, which is the longest season-opening streak by an Athletics starting pitcher since at least 1908...has five starts with no walks and six with one...had a streak of 12 consecutive starts with one walk or fewer dating back to last year, which is third longest by an A's starter since at least 1908 (excludes starters who pitched in relief in between)...the longest is 14 by Tommy Milone (June 20-Sept. 9, 2012) and Gil Heredia (May 29-Aug. 11, 1999)...has 17 walks in 117.1 innings over the last two years (1.31 per nine innings) after issuing 33 walks in 72.0 innings in his first season in 2016 (4.13 per nine innings).

AGAINST THE WEST: All four of his losses this year have come against AL West opponents...is 0-4 with a 6.30 (14 er) ERA in 20.0 innings across four starts...is 6-0 with a 1.66 ERA in 54.1 innings against all other opponents this season...for his career, is 1-10 with a 5.89 ERA in 14 starts against the West spanning 73.1 innings pitched.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has walked just one batter to lead off an inning and his .200 on-base percentage against batters leading off an inning is fifth lowest in the American League...has yielded six home runs, all solo shots...has held left-handed hitters to a .200 (27-for-135) batting average while right-handers are batting .250 (37-for-148)...last year, he had a .268 average against lefties, .187 against righties...has issued all eight of his walks this year to right-handed hitters and his on-base percentage against lefties (.199) is lower than his batting average...has issued 15 of his 17 walks over the last two years to righties...has yielded a .194 (7-for-36) average to the opponent's number three hitter...has a .300 (30-for-100) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .127 (13-for-102) the second time and .259 (21-for-81) after that...last year, he had a .179 opponents average the first time through the lineup.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 3-3 with a 2.67 ERA (16 er in 54.0 ip) in eight starts at home compared to 3-1 with a 3.54 ERA (8 er in 20.1 ip) in four starts on the road...is now 3-10 with a 4.58 ERA (56 er in 110.0 ip) in 19 career starts in the Coliseum compared to 8-4 with a 3.97 ERA (35 er in 79.1 ip) in 14 starts on the road.

2018 HIGHLIGHTS: Lost each of his first two starts on March 31 against Los Angeles (AL) and April 5 against Texas and had a 6.55 ERA...then picked up his first win on April 11 at Los Angeles (NL)...allowed a run in the first in-

ning, snapping a 23.0-inning road scoreless streak...that fell two short of the Oakland record of 25.0 set by Gene Nelson (Aug. 21, 1989-April 25, 1990) and matched by Dennis Eckersley (June 5, 1990-April 16, 1991)...then defeated Chicago (AL) on April 16 for his first career win in the Coliseum...it snapped a career-opening 10-game home losing streak, which is the longest career-opening home losing streak by an A's pitcher since Bobby Hasty lost 11 straight from Sept. 11, 1919 to Aug. 11, 1921...it is the second longest home losing streak in Oakland history and fell three short of the record of 14 set by Matt Keough from July 14, 1978 to Aug. 8, 1979...tossed a career-low 2.1 innings in an 11-0 loss at Houston on April 28...left after five innings with a 4-1 lead on May 4 against Baltimore but Petit allowed three runs in the sixth inning for the blown save in a game the A's would win 6-4...put together a 25.0-inning scoreless streak, which is an A's season-high and the longest scoreless streak by an Athletics pitcher since Sean Doolittle had a 26.1 streak in 2014 and the longest by an A's starter since Cory Lidle had a 32.0 streak in 2002.

LAST START: Took a shutout into the ninth inning before yielding three earned runs in the frame...got the win after giving up three earned runs in eight innings of work...the eight scoreless frames to begin the game capped a 25.0-inning scoreless streak, which is an A's season-high and the longest scoreless streak by an Athletics pitcher since Sean Doolittle had a 26.1 streak in 2014 and the longest by an A's starter since Cory Lidle had a 32.0 streak in 2002.

MENGDEN vs. TEXAS: Is 1-2 with a 3.09 ERA (23.1 ip, 20 h, 10 r, 8 er, 6 bb, 22 so, 2 hr) in four career starts...the win came in his only start last year on Oct. 1 in a 5-2 A's win at Texas...tossed 7.0 shutout innings and allowed just four hits while striking out eight...retired each of the first 12 batters before Beltre singled to start the fifth...allowed just two baserunners to advance into scoring position.

2017 RECAP: Combined to make just 18 starts between the majors and minors due to two stints on the disabled list...went 3-2 with a 3.14 ERA and .229 opponents batting average in seven starts over two stints with Oakland...was also 2-4 with a 4.17 ERA in nine starts with Triple-A Nashville and 0-0 with a 0.00 ERA in two starts with the A's affiliate in the Arizona Rookie League...walked just nine batters in 43.0 innings (1.88 per nine innings) with the A's for a .268 on-base percentage...went 0-1 with a 10.13 ERA and .371 opponents batting average in two starts during his first stint from May 29 to June 3...then went 3-1 with a 1.54 ERA and .189 opponents batting average in five starts after returning to Oakland Sept. 5 when the Sounds season concluded.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Frankie Montas (2-0, 0.64 ERA): Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville on May 17 and made his 2018 debut that day with a start against Arizona...made his next start on June 1, tossing eight shutout innings against the Royals in Kansas City...his previous Major League experience includes 23 relief appearances with the Athletics last year and seven games, including two starts, with the Chicago White Sox in 2015...has pitched 4.1 innings against the Texas Rangers in his career, all in relief and all last season...hasn't allowed a run in those three outings, which include four hits, three walks, and five strikeouts...went 1-5 with a 4.39 ERA in nine starts, including one complete game, with Nashville...was tied for second in the Pacific Coast League in losses at the time of his promotion Oakland...had a .269 opponents batting average, including .200 against left-handed hitters compared to .297 against right-handers.
