OAKLAND ATHLETICS (36-36) VS. SAN DIEGO PADRES (34-40)

TUESDAY, JUNE 19, 2018 — PETCO PARK — 7:10 P.M. PDT

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won two straight after season-high four-game losing streak...are 5-5 over the last 10 games and 36-36 for the season...that marks the 13th time this year the A's have been exactly .500...went 5-10 (.333) over the first 15 games, 20-12 (.625) over a 32-game stretch from April 15-May 20, and are 11-14 (.440) in 25 games since then...are in fourth place in the American League West and trail first place Houston by a season-high 12 games...have been alone in fourth every day dating back to April 25 and have spent 71 of 82 days this year in fourth...also have one day tied for first, one day tied for second, two days tied for third and seven days tied for fourth.

LEFT AND RIGHT: Are scheduled to face a left-handed starting pitcher for the fourth consecutive game today...faced left-handed starters in five consecutive games earlier this year from April 20-24...have won each of the last two games in which the opponent has started a lefty after losing seven consecutive games started by southpaws...are 10-15 (.400) in games started by left-handers compared to 26-21 (.553) against right-handers...the 25 games against lefties are tied for third most in the American League.

HOMESTANDS AND ROAD TRIPS: The A's begin their second of three 10-game road trips tonight, featuring stops in San Diego (two games), Chicago-AL (four games) and Detroit (four games)...concluded a stretch of 20 of 25 games at home on Sunday and will now play 20 of their next 25 games and 27 of their next 35 on the road...are 16-16 on the road compared to 20-20 at home...went 2-3 on the last road trip to Kansas City (2-1) and Texas (0-2)...went 5-5 on the last homestand against Kansas City (3-1), Houston (0-3) and Los Angeles-AL (2-1).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's have homered in 19 consecutive road games (32 home runs total), which is the second longest streak in Athletics history...the longest is 21 games from July 21-Sept. 13, 2013...have hit 55 home runs in 32 games on the road, which is tied with Houston and New York (AL) for the most in the majors...have 36 home runs in 40 games at home...are batting .259 (291-for-1123) with an average of 5.34 runs per game on the road (171 runs in 32 games) compared to .223 with an average of 3.63 runs per game at home...rank second in the American League in runs per game on the road and fourth in batting...however, are last in batting at home and second to last in runs per game...have a 4.62 ERA (141 er in 274.2 ip) on the road compared to 3.63 at home...have the fifth highest road ERA in the AL and the fifth lowest home ERA...rank second in the majors with 51 home runs allowed in 32 games on the road (Miami, 52)...have yielded 43 home runs in 40 games at home.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's are 3-2 in interleague play (1-1 vs. Los Angeles, 2-1 vs. Arizona)...have a 24-11 (.686) record in interdivision play compared to 12-25 (.324) against the American League West...in addition to this two-game series with San Diego, Oakland will also travel to San Francisco (July 13-15) and Colorado (July 27-29)...will host San Diego (July 3-4), San Francisco (July 20-22) and the Dodgers (Aug. 7-8)...went 7-13 (.350) in interleague play last year, which matched the 2016 club for the second worst interleague mark in Oakland history (5-13 in 2009)...finished with a losing record against the National League for the second consecutive season and seventh time in 21 seasons...are 208-181 (.535) all-time in interleague play, which is fifth best in Major League history.

PITCHERS HITTING: A's pitchers are 1-for-4 with a run, RBI and strikeout this year after going 2-for-17 (.118) with two runs, two walks, 10 strikeouts and four sacrifice hits last year...they are batting .082 (32-for-391) with four doubles, 12 RBI, 12 walks and 186 strikeouts since interleague play began in 1997...the batting average is the lowest in the majors over that span (New York-AL, .084)...the last triple by an A's pitcher was by Blue Moon Odom on Aug. 22, 1971 against Boston...Odom also hit the last home run on Sept. 4, 1972 against California...the last extra base hit was by Joe Kennedy, a double on June 12, 2007 at Houston.

CLOSE AND LATE: The A's trailed 5-3 entering the bottom of the ninth on Sunday and tied the game before winning in the 11th...it marked the first time this year Oakland won a game when trailing after eight innings...the A's have

now scored 35 runs in the ninth inning, which is the most in the American League and tied with Cincinnati for second most in the majors (Atlanta, 32)...rank second in the AL with 116 runs in the seventh inning or later (Houston, 137)...have compiled a 3.24 ERA (79 er in 219.2 ip) in the seventh inning or later, which is third lowest in the AL...have a 4.46 ERA (214 er in 432.0 ip) over the first six innings...are 26-0 when leading after seven innings and are the only team in the majors that has not lost a game when leading after seven...are 31-0 when leading after eight inning and are one of four AL teams without a loss in those games (New York, Seattle, Texas)...the win on Sunday was the A's fourth extra inning win of the season, which matches their season total from last year...improved to 12-7 (.632) in one-run games, which is the third best record in the AL.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .249 (127-for-510) with 72 runs scored in 15 games in June (4.80 runs per game) after hitting .211 and averaging 3.59 runs per game in 29 games in May...are tied for second in the American League in runs scored in June and rank fourth in batting after ranking last in both categories in May...are hitting .337 (33-for-98) with runners in scoring position in June after batting .194 with RISP in May...have hit 91 home runs and 32 of those have put the A's ahead, which is second most in the AL (New York, 38).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 4.92 ERA (59 er in 108.0 ip) over the last 12 games after posting a 2.55 ERA over the previous 16 contests...rank fourth in the American League in fewest walks per nine innings (2.89) but are averaging the fewest strikeouts per nine innings in the majors (7.24)...have allowed at least one home run in each of the last 14 games (26 home runs total), which is two short of the Oakland record of 16 (Aug. 5-22, 2015)...A's starting pitchers are 3-6 with a 5.72 ERA (47 er in 74.0 ip) over the last 14 games...the A's have used 11 different starting pitchers, which is tied with the Dodgers for second most in the majors (Tampa Bay, 13).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed five errors in the last four games, which has led to six unearned runs...rank third in the American League in most errors (47) and unearned runs (29)...lead the majors with 750 assists...A's outfielders have six assists, which is the fewest in the AL and tied with San Francisco for second fewest in the majors (Washington, 5).

ON THE BASES: The A's have not attempted a stolen base in the last 12 games, which is one short of the Oakland record for consecutive games without a stolen base attempt (13, July 28-Aug. 11, 2000 and July 21-Aug. 3, 2005)...are 12-for-25 (48.0%) in stolen base attempts for the season...have the lowest stolen base percentage in the majors, the fewest stolen bases and the fewest attempts...opponents have stolen 47 bases, which is tied for third most in the American League, but they have been caught stealing 20 times, which is tied with Toronto for the most.

A's vs. PADRES: The A's and Padres last met in 2015 when Oakland won three of four...swept a two-game series at Petco Park and split a two-game set in Oakland...the A's have won five of the last six games here in San Diego...have won three consecutive season series and seven of nine overall...lead the all-time series, 19-10 (.655)...the only team the A's have a better record against is Pittsburgh (11-4, .733)...are 9-4 in Oakland and 10-6 in San Diego...including 5-3 at Petco Park.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Khris Davis ranks fourth in the American League in home runs (20) and RBI (49)...**Matt Olson** has 14 home runs, which are the most among AL first basemen...**Blake Treinen** has converted each of his last 12 save opportunities and has a 0.90 ERA (2 er in 20.0 ip) in 18 games total over that span...ranks second among AL relievers in ERA (1.06) and tied for sixth in saves (15).

OAKLAND A'S 50th ANNIVERSARY MOMENTS

In **1979** Wayne Gross, Dave Revering and Mike Heath hit consecutive homers in the fourth inning of the A's 6-5 win against Kansas City...Gross, Mike Edwards and Revering also turn a triple play, the second of the A's major league recording tying three triple plays in 1979...in **2003** Miguel Tejada ties an Oakland record with five hits as the A's defeat Texas, 9-2.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Paul Blackburn (1-1, 11.05 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was reinstated from the 60-day disabled list June 7 and will be making his third start of 2018...was 0-3 with a 6.75 ERA in six games, including three starts, this spring before being placed on the 10-day DL March 28, retroactive to March 26 with a strained right forearm...was transferred to the 60-day DL April 5 and was sent to Single-A Stockton on a rehab assignment May 31...made one start on May 31 vs. Modesto and had a no decision in the Ports 6-3 win (3.2 ip, 8 h, 3 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 1 so, 62 pitches).

STRIKEOUTS: Did not strike out a batter in 1.1 innings in his last start and has now fanned four batters or fewer in each of his 12 career starts...has three strikeouts in 7.1 innings this year (3.68 strikeouts per nine innings) and 25 in 66.0 innings in his career (3.41 per nine innings)...prior to tossing 1.1 innings in his last start, had a career-opening streak of 11 consecutive games with four innings or more and four strikeouts or fewer, which was the longest by an A's pitcher since at least 1908.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: Is 1-1 with a 4.58 ERA (17.2 ip, 17 h, 10 r, 9 er, 3 bb, 9 so, 1 hr) in three career interleague starts, all last year.

WITH THE BAT: Went 0-for-3 with two strikeouts last year on July 21 at New York (NL) in his only at bats in the majors...his lone at bats in the minors came in 2016 with Double-A Tennessee in the Chicago Cubs organization...was 1-for-15 (.067) with two strikeouts and a sacrifice hit.

FIRST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 4-1 victory over Kansas City June 7 in Oakland...allowed a lead-off home run to Escobar in the third inning but that was the only run he would allow in six innings of work...retired 11 of the final 12 batters he faced following the home run.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 13-5 loss to Houston last Wednesday in Oakland...allowed a career-high eight runs in a career-low 1.1 innings...yielded three runs in the first inning on a two-run single by Gurriel and a sacrifice fly by Gattis...then surrendered five of the Astros seven runs in the second...Correa had a two-run triple and Gurriel a RBI single and he was relieved by Pagán with runners on first and second and one out...Pagán surrendered back-to-back home run.

2017 RECAP: Made both his Triple-A and Major League debuts in 2017...spent the first three months of the season at Nashville where he went 5-6 with a 3.05 ERA in 15 games, including 14 starts...was promoted to Oakland July 1 and compiled a 3-1 record and a 3.22 ERA in 10 starts before a right hand contusion ended his season Aug. 23...struck out just 22 batters in 58.2 innings with the A's, an average of 3.38 per nine innings...that was the lowest mark in the majors among pitchers with 50 or more innings pitched...it was second lowest by an A's pitcher over the last 27 years (Saarloos, 2.99 in 2005)...went 1-1 with a 2.25 ERA and .212 opponents batting average over his first five starts through July 26...then went 2-0 despite a 4.39 ERA and .315 opponents average over his final five starts...allowed a .262 opponents batting average, including .225 (23-for-102) against left-handed hitters compared to .294 (35-for-119) against right-handers...yielded four of his five home runs to righties but issued 11 of his 16 walks to lefties...had a .585 OPS against lefties, .773 against righties...was 2-1 with a 1.47 ERA and .222 opponents batting average in five starts on the road compared to 1-0 with a 5.14 ERA and .301 opponents average in five starts at home...logged a 1.50 ERA over the first three innings of a game, a 5.02 ERA from the fourth inning on...opponents hit .133 with runners in scoring position and two outs...had a .212 opponents average the first time through the lineup, .294 after that...was 3-0 with a 2.84 ERA in five starts on four days rest, 0-1 with a 3.67 ERA in five starts on five days rest or more...allowed one run or fewer in five of his 10 starts and four runs or more four times...the A's were 6-4 (.600) in his starting assignments.

2017 WITH OAKLAND: Made his Major League debut July 1 against Atlanta and had a no decision in the A's 4-3 loss...allowed just one unearned run in 6.0 innings of work and retired 14 of the final 16 batters he faced...tossed a career-high 7.2 innings and allowed one run in the A's 7-4 victory at Seattle July 6 to earn his first ML win...walked one batter in each outing to become the first Athletics pitcher since at least 1913 to toss six or more innings, allow one run or fewer and walk one batter or fewer in each of his first two games...is the eighth Major Leaguer to do it...was charged with his first loss

in a 7-5 decision at New York (NL) July 21...tossed seven scoreless innings and allowed just two hits July 26 at Toronto but had a no decision in the A's 3-2 loss...left after seven innings with a 2-0 lead but Casilla allowed three runs in the ninth for the blown save and loss...combined with Dull, Casilla and Treinen on a six-hit shutout in the A's 5-0 win at Los Angeles (AL) Aug. 5...tossed 6.2 innings and yielded five of the hits...did not walk a batter for the first time in his career...tossed 4.0 innings Aug. 16 against Kansas City to snap a career-opening streak of eight consecutive games of more than five innings pitched...that was the second longest such streak in Oakland history to Willie Adams, who had a 10-game streak in 1996...tossed 4.0 scoreless innings in his final start Aug. 22 at Baltimore and left the game early with a right hand contusion...was placed on the 10-day disabled list Aug. 25 retroactive to Aug. 23 and missed the remainder of the season...was transferred to the 60-day DL Sept. 5.

2017 WITH NASHVILLE: Ranked second in the Pacific Coast League in ERA (3.05) and fourth in opponents batting average (.231) when he was promoted to Oakland July 1...was named to the PCL Midseason All-Star team...went 4-2 with a 1.84 ERA over his last eight starts after going 1-4 with a 4.54 ERA over his first seven games (six starts)...his opponents batting average included a .216 (33-for-153) mark against right-handed hitters compared to .247 (36-for-146) against left-handers...lefties had 24 of the 32 RBI against him...allowed a .321 batting average with runners in scoring position, including .400 with RISP and two outs...was 3-4 with a 3.80 ERA and .269 opponents batting average in nine games at home, 2-2 with a 2.08 ERA and .177 opponents average in six starts on the road...surrendered five of his six home runs at home...was 4-3 with a 2.54 ERA in 11 games at night, 1-3 with a 4.30 ERA in four starts during the day...compiled a 3.95 ERA over the first three innings of the game, a 2.09 ERA from the fourth inning on...struck out a season-high eight batters in back-to-back starts on April 15 against Colorado Springs and April 21 at Oklahoma City...picked up his first win April 28 against New Orleans and went 1-2 despite a 1.64 ERA and .195 opponents batting average in four starts in April...made his only relief appearance on May 8 against El Paso in a game started by Daniel Mengden on a rehab assignment...allowed three runs on four hits and two walks in 4.0 innings...put together consecutive wins for the only time on May 19 at Sacramento and May 24 against Omaha...tossed 6.0 scoreless innings against the River Cats (2 h, 2 bb, 4 so) and 7.0 scoreless innings against the Storm Chasers (5 h, 2 bb, 6 so) as part of a 14.0-inning scoreless streak from May 19 to 29...had the scoreless streak snapped when he allowed a season-high tying six runs on a season-high 10 hits in 5.0 innings on May 29 against Colorado springs...finished May 2-3 with a 5.12 ERA in six games...threw a season-high 100 pitches June 9 against Memphis...walked a season-high four batters June 15 against Iowa...started the second game of a June 20 doubleheader against New Orleans and pitched a season-low 2.0 innings...compiled a 2-1 record and a 1.75 ERA in five starts in June.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Frankie Montas (3-1, 2.67 ERA): Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville May 27 for his first stint with the A's this year and is scheduled to make his fifth start...started and won each of his first three games and allowed two runs or fewer while tossing six or more innings in each start (1.25 ERA)...then took the loss in his last start, a 7-3 A's loss to Houston last Thursday in Oakland (5.1 ip, 11 h, 7 r, 5 er, 4 bb, 1 so)...has never faced the Padres in his career...is 1-0 with an 8.64 ERA (8.1 ip, 10 h, 8 r, 8 er, 5 bb, 10 so, 3 hr) in four career interleague appearances, including one start this year on May 27 against Arizona, a win (6.0 ip, 3 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 7 so)...has never batted as a professional...went 1-5 with a 4.39 ERA in nine starts, including one complete game, with Nashville...was 0-3 with a 6.19 ERA in five starts in April and tossed four innings or fewer four times...then went 1-2 with a 3.24 ERA in four starts in May and tossed at least five innings in each start.
