OAKLAND ATHLETICS (37-36) VS. SAN DIEGO PADRES (34-41)

WEDNESDAY, JUNE 20, 2018 — PETCO PARK — 12:40 P.M. PDT RHP FRANKIE MONTAS (3-1, 2.67) VS. LHP JOEY LUCCHESI (3-2, 3.23) MLB NETWORK — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won three straight after season-high four-game losing streak...are 6-5 over the last 11 games and 37-36 for the season...went 5-10 (.333) over the first 15 games, 20-12 (.625) over a 32-game stretch from April 15-May 20, and are 12-14 (.462) in 26 games since then...are in fourth place in the American League West 1.5 games behind the third-place Angels...have been alone in fourth every day dating back to April 25 and have spent 72 of 83 days this year in fourth...also have one day tied for first, one day tied for second, two days tied for third and seven days tied for fourth.

DYNAMIC DUO: Blake Treinen and Lou Trivino have combined to post a 1.27 ERA (9 er, 63.2 ip) with 73 strikeouts in 52 relief appearances this season... Treinen leads American League relievers in ERA (1.03), is T6th in saves (16) and T10th in strikeouts (43)...Treinen has converted each of his last 13 save opportunities...Trivino is 8th among AL relievers in ERA (1.57).

INTERLEAGUE LUC: Jonathan Lucroy is a career .303 (135-for445) hitter during Interleague Play with 64 runs, 30 doubles, 2 triples, 17 home runs, 66 RBI and an .862 OPS in 126 games...his .303 average is <u>T2nd-best by a catcher in</u> Interleague history, trailing only Hall of Famer Mike Piazza (.340) and tied with Hall of Famer Ivan Rodriguez (.303).

ROAD POP: The A's have homered in 20 consecutive road games (34 home runs total), which is the second longest streak in Athletics history...the longest is 21 games from July 21-Sept. 13, 2013...have hit 57 home runs in 33 games on the road, which leads the Majors ahead of Houston (55), Boston (55) and New York (AL) ...have 36 home runs in 40 games at home.

HEATING UP: Stephen Piscotty is hitting .296 (16-for-54) with 8 runs, 4 doubles, 2 home runs, 13 RBI, a .371 on-base percentage, .481 slugging mark and an .852 OPS in his last 16 games (since May 31)...he began the season hitting .291 (23-for-79) in his first 21 games of the season before posting a .167 (15-for-90) mark in the 27 games from April 23-May 30.

LEFTY LIFTOFF: Mark Canha has a .606 slugging percentage against lefthanded pitchers this season...of his 21 hits vs. lefties this season, 10 have gone for extra bases (6 HR, 4 2B)...his .606 slugging percentage vs. south siders is 9th-best in American League, while his six home runs are T5th.

TWO OUTS, NO PROBLEM: The Padres and A's are first and T2nd respectively in the Majors in batting average with runners in scoring position and two outs...the A's are hitting .267, while the Padres are hitting .284...Mark Canha leads Oakland and the Majors, hitting .550 (11-for-20) with 13 RBI and a .625 on-base percentage...Jed Lowrie is hitting .476 (10-for-21) and Marcus Semien is hitting .353 (6-for-17) in that situation.

I CAN SEE CLEARLY NOW: Chad Pinder is hitting .321 (18-for-56) with 11 runs, 2 doubles, 1 triple, 4 home runs, 9 RBI with a .397 on-base percentage, a .607 slugging mark and a 1.004 OPS in 19 days games this season, including .400 (6-for-15) with a 1.304 OPS in 6 road day games.

LEFT AND RIGHT: Are scheduled to face a left-handed starting pitcher for the fifth consecutive game today...faced left-handed starters in five consecutive games earlier this year from April 20-24...have won each of the last three games in which the opponent has started a lefty after losing seven consecutive games started by southpaws...are 11-15 (.423) in games started by left-handers compared to 26-21 (.553) against right-handers...the 26 games against lefties are third most in the American League.

HOMESTANDS AND ROAD TRIPS: The A's continue their second of three 10game road trips today, featuring stops in San Diego (1-0), Chicago-AL (four games) and Detroit (four games)...concluded a stretch of 20 of 25 games at home on Sunday and are now playing 20 of their next 25 games and 27 of their next 35 on the road...are 17-16 on the road compared to 20-20 at home...went 2-3 on the last road trip to Kansas City (2-1) and Texas (0-2)... went 5-5 on the last homestand against Kansas City (3-1), Houston (0-3) and Los Angeles-AL (2-1).

HOME/ROAD SPLITS: Are batting .257 (298-for-1159) with an average of 5.30 runs per game on the road (175 runs in 33 games) compared to .223 with an average of 3.63 runs per game at home...rank second in the American League in runs per game on the road and fourth in batting...have a 4.52 ERA (143 er in 284.2 ip) on the road compared to 3.63 at home...have the fifth highest road ERA in the AL and the fifth lowest home ERA.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's are 4-2 in interleague play (1-1 vs. Los Angeles, 2-1 vs. Arizona, 1-0 vs. San Diego)...have a 25-11 (.694) record in interdivision play compared to 12-25 (.324) against the American League West...in addition to this two-game series with San Diego, will also travel to San Francisco (July 13-15) and Colorado (July 27-29)...will host San Diego (July 3-4), San Francisco (July 20-22)

Diego (July 3-4), San Francisco (July 20-22) and the Dodgers (Aug. 7-8)...went 7-13 (.350) in interleague play last year... finished with a losing record against the National League for the second consecutive season and seventh time in 21 seasons...are 209-181 (.536) all-time in interleague play, which is fifth best in Major League history.

PITCHERS HITTING: A's pitchers are 1-for-6 with a run, RBI and strikeout this year after going 2-for-17 (.118) with two runs, two walks, 10 strikeouts and four sacrifice hits last year...they are batting .081 (32-for-393) with four doubles, 12 RBI, 12 walks and 186 strikeouts since interleague play began in 1997...the batting average is the lowest in the majors over that span (New York-AL, .084)...the last triple by an A's pitcher was by Blue Moon Odom on Aug. 22, 1971 against Boston...Odom also hit the last home run on Sept. 4, 1972 against California...the last extra base hit was by Joe Kennedy, a double on June 12, 2007 at Houston.

CLOSE AND LATE: The A's have won each of the last two games despite trailing entering the 9th inning...trailed 5-3 entering the bottom of the ninth on Sunday and tied the game before winning in the 11th and trailed 2-1 entering the 9th last night before winning in the 10th...it marked the first and second times this year Oakland won a game when trailing after eight innings...the A's have now scored 36 runs in the ninth inning, which is the most in the American League and second most in the majors (Atlanta, 39)... rank second in the AL with 119 runs in the seventh inning or later (Houston, 137)...have compiled a 3.18 ERA (79 er in 223.2 ip) in the seventh inning or later, which is third lowest in the AL...have a 4.44 ERA (216 er in 438.0 ip) over the first six innings...are 26-0 when leading after seven innings and are the only team in the majors that has not lost a game when leading after seven... are 31-0 when leading after eight innings and are one of four AL teams without a loss in those games (New York, Seattle, Texas)...the win on Sunday was the A's fifth extra inning win of the season, which matches their season total from last year...are 12-7 (.632) in one-run games, which is the third best record in the AL.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .245 (134-for-546) with 76 runs in 16 games in June (4.75 runs per game) after hitting .211 and averaging 3.59 runs per game in 29 games in May...are third in the American League in runs scored in June and rank fifth in batting after ranking last in both categories in May... are hitting .333 (35-for-105) with runners in scoring position in June after batting .194 with RISP in May...have hit 93 home runs and 33 of those have put the A's ahead, the second most in the AL (New York, 39).

A's vs. PADRES: The A's and Padres last met in 2015 when Oakland won three of four...swept a two-game series at Petco Park and split a two-game set in Oakland...the A's have won six of the last seven games here in San Diego... have won three consecutive season series and seven of nine overall...lead the all-time series, 20-10 (.667)...the only team the A's have a better record against is Pittsburgh (11-4, .733)...are 9-4 in Oakland and 11-6 in San Diego... including 6-3 at Petco Park.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Khris Davis ranks fourth in American League in home runs (20) and RBI (49)...*Matt Olson* has 14 home runs, which are the most among AL first basemen.

In **1972** Catfish Hunter pitches all 11 innings of the A's 3-2 win over Detroit...Joe Rudi has three hits including the game winning homer to lead off the bottom of the 11th...in **1990** Terry Steinbach drives in six runs on a grand slam and a two-run single as the A's defeat the Tigers at Detroit, 12-7...in **2002** Billy Koch records the save in a 5-3 win at Pittsburgh, giving him the save in all three games of the three-game series vs. Pittsburgh.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Frankie Montas (3-1, 2.67

FOR STARTERS: Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville May 27 for his first stint with the A's this year and is scheduled to make his fifth start...allowed seven runs in 5.1 innings for the loss in his last start...started and won each of his first three games and allowed two runs or fewer while tossing six or more innings in each start (1.25 ERA).

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: Was the winning pitcher in his only start this year, a 2-1 win over Arizona on May 27 (see first start below)...is 1-0 with an 8.64 ERA (8.1 ip, 10 h, 8 r, 8 er, 5 bb, 10 so, 3 hr) in four career interleague appearances, including one start.

WITH THE BAT: Has never batted as a professional.

FIRST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 2-1 win over Arizona May 27 in Oakland...matched his career best with seven strikeouts...retired each of the first 10 batters he faced and no-hit the Diamondbacks over the first five innings...had a 1-0 lead when Mathis singled to lead off the sixth...allowed his only run later in the inning on a Lamb sacrifice fly and the A's came back with a run in the bottom of the sixth for the win.

SECOND START: He combined with Pagán on an eight-hit shutout in the A's 16-0 win at Kansas City June 1...tossed a career-high eight innings and a career-high 99 pitches...retired the side in order just twice (2nd and 7th) but did not allow a runner past second base.

THIRD START: He won his third consecutive start in the A's 7-2 win over Kansas City June 8 in Oakland...blanked the Royals on four hits and a walk over the first seven innings and had a 6-0 lead entering the eighth...surrendered a two-run home run to Moustakas, snapping his scoreless streak at a careerhigh 15.0 innings.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-3 loss to Houston last Thursday in Oakland...allowed a career-high seven runs on a career-high 11 hits and a career-high tying four walks...allowed a RBI double to Gurriel and a RBI single to Reddick in the first but the A's got one of those runs back in the second...then yielded a RBI single to Correa in the third, a two-run home run to McCann in the fourth, and two unearned runs in the sixth.

WITH NASHVILLE: Went 1-5 with a 4.39 ERA in nine starts, including one complete game, with Nashville...was tied for second in the Pacific Coast League in losses at the time of his May 27 promotion Oakland...had a .269 opponents batting average, including .200 (9-for-45) against left-handed hitters compared to .297 (33-for-111) against right-handers...surrendered five home runs, four to righties...four were solo shots...yielded a .300 batting average with runners in scoring position...walked just two batters to lead off an inning...went 0-3 with a 6.19 ERA in five starts in April and tossed four innings or fewer four times...then went 1-2 with a 3.24 ERA in four starts in May and tossed at least five innings in each start...was 1-1 with a 2.86 ERA in five starts at home, 0-4 with a 6.16 ERA in four starts on the road

2018 HIGHLIGHTS: Tossed just 37 pitches in his first start and allowed four runs on four hits in 0.2 innings for the loss on April 6 at New Orleans...also issued a season-high two walks...tossed 3.0 scoreless innings in his second start April 11 against Iowa when he combined with Rvan Dull (1.0 ip). Chris Bassitt (4.0 ip) and Lou Trivino (1.0 ip) on a five-hit shutout in a 6-0 win...allowed a season-high five runs on a season-high seven hits in 4.0 innings in an 8-6 loss to New Orleans April 28...went 1-0 with a 1.80 ERA over a threestart stretch from May 4 to 14...was credited with his only win of the season May 4 against Memphis when he allowed one run in 6.0 innings of work... struck out a season-high 10 batters in 6.0 innings May 9 against Colorado Springs...had a season-high 93 pitches, which he matched is his next start on May 14...tossed a complete game at Memphis on the 14th but was the losing pitcher in a 2-1 loss...allowed two runs on six hits in a season-high eight innings...matched his season high with five runs on seven hits in an 11-2 loss at Oklahoma City in his final start May 20.

2017 RECAP: Was on the A's Opening Day roster and compiled a 7.03 ERA and .302 opponents batting average in 23 games over two stints with Oakland...also went 0-2 with a 5.22 ERA in nine games, eight starts, with Triple-A Nashville before an oblique injury ended his season in mid-August...issued 20 walks in 32.0 innings (5.63 per nine innings) with the A's for a .408 opponents on-base percentage...had a .566 opponents slugging percentage and .974 OPS...the OPS was the highest in Oakland history by a reliever, the slugging percentage was second highest and the on-base percentage was third highest...had the highest OPS and on-base percentage among Major League relievers in 2017...had the second highest opponents slugging percentage among AL relievers and the sixth highest opponents batting average...struck out 36 for an average of 10.13 strikeouts per nine innings...allowed 10 home runs, an average of 2.81 home runs per nine innings...that was the second highest mark in Oakland history among pitchers with 30 or more innings pitched (Curt Young, 2.93 in 1985)...tied for seventh among AL relievers in home runs allowed...his opponents batting average included a .257 (19-for-74) mark against right-handed hitters compared to .364 (20-for-55) against left-handers...yielded seven of his 10 home runs and issued 12 of his 20 walks to lefties...had a .751 OPS against righties, 1.267 against lefties...seven of his 10 home runs came with runners on base...18 of his 23 outings were at least one inning, including seven outings of two innings or more...with Nashville, he struck out 37 batters in 29.1 innings with Nashville, an average of 11.35 per nine innings...walked just seven for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 5.29...allowed a .223 opponents batting average, including .188 (9-for-48) against right-handed hitters compared to .250 (16-for-64) against left-handers...surrendered three of his four home runs to righties.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Chris Bassitt (0-2, 2.45 ERA): Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville last Thursday for his fourth stint with the A's this year...did not appear in a game during his first two stints...returned for a third time June 9, started that day against the Royals, and was optioned back to Nashville the next day...did not pitch for the Sounds following his June 10 option and started and loss last Saturday against Los Angeles (AL) in Oakland (4.0 ip, 7 h, 6 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 3 so, 1 hr)...is now 0-8 with a 5.46 ERA over his last 12 starts dating back to Aug. 21, 2015...the eight-game losing streak is a career high and it matches the longest by an A's pitcher over the last 24 years...had a no decision in his only career appearance against Chicago (AL), a start in the A's 5-4 loss in Oakland on April 5, 2016 (5.1 ip, 8 h, 4 r, 4 er, 2 bb, 4 so)...went 2-3 with a 6.10 ERA in 10 games, including seven starts, with Triple-A Nashville...surrendered just two home runs in 38.1 innings.
