OAKLAND ATHLETICS (38-36) VS. CHICAGO WHITE SOX (24-49)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won a season-high tying four consecutive games (fourth time) after losing a season-high four consecutive games...are now 38-36 for the season and the two games over .500 is one short of the season high of three (twice, last: 28-25 on May 27)...have not been more than three games over .500 since finishing the 2014 season 88-74...went 5-10 (.333) over the first 15 games, 20-12 (.625) over a 32-game stretch from April 15-May 20, and are 13-14 (.481) in 27 games since then...are in fourth place in the American League West and trail first place Houston by 11 games, which is one short of the season high of 12 (June 18)...have been alone in fourth every day dating back to April 25 and have spent 74 of 85 days this year in fourth...also have one day tied for first, one day tied for second, two days tied for third and seven days tied for fourth.

LET'S PLAY TWO: Since 1995, the A's have played at least one doubleheader against every American League team except the White Sox...this will be the first twin-bill between the two clubs since June 12, 1983 in Oakland, a Chicago sweep (12-10 in 11 innings and 8-1)...it will be the first between the two clubs in Chicago since Sept. 18, 1982, an A's sweep (2-1 and 5-4)...it will be the 33rd doubleheader between the two clubs since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968...have won 11, lost 12 and split 9...the A's last doubleheader against any team was Sept. 9 of last year against Houston, a sweep (11-1 and 11-4).

THE LONG BALL: The A's hit a season-high tying five home runs Wednesday at San Diego (also April 6 at Los Angeles-AL) to extend their streak of consecutive road games with a home run to an Athletics record tying 21 (also July 21-Sept. 13, 2013)...the American League and modern Major League record is 24 by the Baltimore Orioles (Aug. 3-Sept. 15, 1996)...now have a ML leading 62 home runs in 34 games on the road compared to 36 home runs in 40 games at home...are on pace to break the Oakland record for road home runs (130 in 1996)...have four straight games with two or more home runs (11 home runs total) and have 98 home runs for the season, which is fifth most in the American League...34 have put the A's ahead, which is second most (New York, 41)...hit back-to-back homers in back-to-back innings on Wednesday (2nd, Barreto and Phegley; 3rd, Canha and Olson) for the first time since May 14, 1997 against Milwaukee (3rd, Canseco and McGwire; 4th, Stairs and Canseco)...the pitching staff ranks second in the majors with 52 home runs allowed in 34 games on the road (Miami, 54)...has yielded 43 home runs in 40 games at home and 95 overall, which is tied for fifth most in the AL.

AGAINST THE CENTRAL: The A's are 8-2 against American League Central teams (3-0 vs. Chicago, 5-2 vs. Kansas City)...are batting .284 (101-for-356) with 69 runs scored (6.90 per game) against the Central and the pitching staff has a 2.59 ERA (27 er in 94.0 ip)...are now 26-11 (.703) in interdivision games compared to 12-25 (.324) against the AL West.

MAY AND JUNE: The A's are batting .254 (149-for-587) with 88 runs scored and 29 home runs in 17 games in June after hitting .211 with 104 runs and 34 home runs in 29 games in May...rank second in the American League in runs scored in June, fourth in batting and tied for fourth in home runs...ranked last in batting and runs scored in May...are hitting .336 (40-for-119) with runners in scoring position in June after batting .194 with RISP in May.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are batting .261 (313-for-1200) with an average of 5.50 runs per game on the road (187 runs in 34 games) compared to .223 with an average of 3.63 runs per game at home...rank second in the American League in runs per game on the road and third in batting...however, are last in batting at home and second to last in runs per game...have a 4.47 ERA (146 er in 293.2 ip) on the road compared to 3.63 at home.

HOMESTANDS AND ROAD TRIPS: The A's are 2-0 on this 10-game road trip to San Diego (2-0), Chicago-AL (four games) and Detroit (four games)...it is their second of three 10-game road trips and it begins a stretch where Oakland will play 20 of 25 games and 27 of 35 on the road...are 18-16 on the road compared to 20-20 at home...went 2-3 on the last road trip to Kansas City (2-1) and Texas (0-2)...went 5-5 on the last homestand against Kansas City (3-1), Houston (0-3) and Los Angeles-AL (2-1).

CLOSE AND LATE: The A's are 27-0 when leading after seven innings and are the only team in the majors that has not lost a game when leading after seven...are 32-0 when leading after eight innings and are one of five teams without a loss in those games (Cincinnati, New York, Seattle, Texas)...have two wins when trailing after eight innings (back-to-back games on Sunday

and Tuesday), which is tied for second in the American League (New York, 5)...have compiled a 3.22 ERA (81 er in 226.2 ip) in the seventh inning or later, which is third lowest in the AL...have a 4.40 ERA (217 er in 444.0 ip) over the first six innings...are batting .252 (216-for-858) with 124 runs scored in the seventh inning or later...the runs rank second in the AL (Houston, 138) and the average is third...are batting .235 (395-for-1681) in innings 1-6...have scored 38 runs in the ninth inning, which is second most in the majors to Atlanta (41)...improved to 5-3 with the extra inning win on Tuesday and the five wins are one more than the season total from last year...the eight extra inning games are tied for the most in the AL...are 12-7 (.632) in one-run games, which is the third best record in the AL.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 3.47 ERA (106 er in 275.0 ip) over the last 30 games after posting a 4.37 ERA over the first 44 contests...rank fourth in the American League in fewest walks per nine innings (2.90) but are third in fewest strikeouts per nine innings (7.37)...are tied with Los Angeles for the most wild pitches (46)...A's starting pitchers are 4-6 with a 5.25 ERA (50 er in 85.2 ip) over the last 16 games...the A's have used 11 different starting pitchers, which is tied with the Angels and Dodgers for second most in the majors (Tampa Bay, 13)...this marks the fifth consecutive season the A's have used 11 or more starters.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed seven errors in the last six games, which has led to seven unearned runs...rank third in the American League in most errors (49) and unearned runs (30)...lead the majors with 768 assists...A's outfielders have six assists, which is second fewest in the majors (Washington, 5).

ON THE BASES: The A's are 13-for-26 (50.0%) in stolen base attempts...have the lowest stolen base percentage in the majors, the fewest stolen bases and the fewest attempts...opponents have been caught stealing 21 times, which is the most in the American League and third most in the majors...however, they have stolen 48 bases, which is third most in the AL

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have eight players on the disabled list (Anderson, Buchter, Cahill, Chapman, Cotton, Gossett, Powell, Triggs)...Cotton and Powell are on the 60-day DL...Buchter and Powell are on rehab assignments...have used the DL 18 times this year after using it 23 times last year...have had at least four players on the DL every day since Aug. 24, 2015, at least three every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on DL since end of 2006 season (1).

A's vs. WHITE SOX: The A's lead the season series 3-0 after sweeping a three-game series from the White Sox in Oakland, April 16-18...need one more win to clinch the season series for the second consecutive season...went 5-1 last year after losing three straight season series, and have now won eight of their last nine games from Chicago...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 310-287 against the White Sox...that breaks down to 164-138 in Oakland and 146-149 in Chicago...including 64-61 at Guaranteed Rate Field...all-time, the A's are 987-1042 against Chicago.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Khris Davis ranks fourth in the American League in home runs (20) and tied for sixth in RBI (49)...**Jed Lowrie** is tied for sixth in the AL in go-ahead RBI (13), tied for seventh in multiple hit games (26) and tied for 10th in hits (82) and doubles (20)...**Matt Olson** has 15 home runs, which are the most among AL first basemen and tied for second most in the majors...**Blake Treinen** has converted each of his last 13 save opportunities dating back to May 4 and has a 0.86 ERA (2 er in 21.0 ip) in 19 games total over that span...leads AL relievers in ERA (1.03) and is tied for sixth in saves (16).

OAKLAND A'S 50th ANNIVERSARY MOMENTS

In **1971** Vida Blue improves his record to 15-2 and strikes out 13 as the A's defeat the Twins at Minnesota, 3-2...in **1989** Rickey Henderson returns to Oakland when the A's send Greg Cadaret, Eric Plunk and Luis Polonia to the Yankees...in **2000** Eric Chavez becomes the first player to hit for the cycle in the Coliseum as the A's defeat Baltimore, 10-3...at the age of 22 years, 197 days, Chavez becomes the eighth youngest player in major league history to hit for the cycle...in **2002** Billy Koch records the save in the A's 5-3 win at Cincinnati, making him the first pitcher in Oakland history with five saves in five consecutive team games.

TODAY'S GAME 1 STARTING PITCHER: Sean Manaea (6-6, 3.56 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Began the season by going 4-2 with a 1.03 ERA and .134 opponents batting average over his first six starts through the end of April... then went 1-4 with a 7.18 ERA and .295 opponents batting average in six starts in May...is 1-0 with a 3.38 ERA (7 er in 18.2 ip) and .200 (14-for-70) opponent average in three starts since then.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Has walked two batters or fewer in 13 of his 15 starts and ranks fifth in the American League in fewest walks per nine innings (1.83)...is also seventh in opponents on-base percentage (.262)...is tied for fifth in wild pitches (7) and ranks seventh in hit batters (7)...is averaging the second fewest pitches per inning (14.6)...opponents have reached base on an error seven times, which is tied for the most in the majors (Hamels, TEX).

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed at least one home run in each of his last nine starts (10 home runs total), which matches the longest streak by an A's pitcher over the last 30 years (last: Trevor Cahill, June 22-Aug. 6, 2009)...the last Oakland pitcher to allow a home run in 10 consecutive games is Bob Welch (July 29-Sept. 16, 1988)...has allowed 14 home runs for the season, which is tied for ninth most in the American League...10 of the home runs have been solo shots and 12 have been hit by right-handed hitters.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents are 12-for-90 (.133) with four walks and three hit by pitches (.196 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning... the batting average is the lowest in the American League and the on-base percentage is second lowest (Berrios, MIN .190)...has a .139 (17-for-122) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .306 (38-for-124) the second time and .171 (18-for-105) after that...the mark the first time through the lineup is fourth lowest in the AL...opponents are hitting .172 (5-for-29) with runners in scoring position and two outs.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received two runs of support or fewer in nine of his 15 starts and has a season run support average of 3.65 (38 rs in 93.2 ip)...has received two runs of support or fewer in each of his six losses this year (4 rs in 33.0 ip, 1.09 RSA) and 24 of his 25 career losses (24 rs in 126.1 ip, 1.71 RSA)...is 16-0 in 23 career starts with run support of four or more and 22-1 in 31 starts with three runs of support or more.

APRIL AND MAY: Went 1-4 with a 7.18 ERA and .295 opponents batting average in six starts in May after going 4-1 with a 1.00 ERA and .130 opponents batting average in five starts in April...tied for the American League lead in May losses and had the second highest ERA (Giolito, CWS 7.36)...it was the second time he lost four games in a month in his career (Aug. 2016)...led the AL in ERA and opponents batting in April and tied for the lead in wins...was named AL Pitcher of the Month in April, his first Pitcher of the Month honor... it was the first time in his career he won four games in a month and the four wins match the most by an A's pitcher in the month of April over the last 27 years (ninth time, last: Triggs in 2017)...his ERA tied for the fourth lowest in any month in Oakland history among pitchers with 30 or more innings pitched...it was the lowest since Cory Lidle had a 0.20 ERA in Aug., 2002...had a .395 OPS and is the fourth pitcher in Oakland history with an OPS under .400 in a month with a minimum of 100 batters faced (.358, Lidle in Aug. 2002; .376, Torrez in Sept. 1976; .390, Ontiveros in June 1987).

NO-HITTER: Tossed the seventh no-hitter in Oakland history and the 12th in Athletics history on April 1 against Boston in Oakland...was named American League Co-Player of the Week for the week of April 16-22 along with Manny Machado for his efforts...it was his first Player of the Week award...his no-hitter was the earliest by date (Catfish Hunter, May 8, 1968 vs. Minnesota) and second earliest by game number (Chief Bender, May 12, 1910 vs. Cleveland, game 18) in Athletics history...it was the 10th no-hitter in Coliseum history (six by A's, four by opponents)...it was the first since Dallas Braden's perfect game on May 9, 2010 vs. Tampa Bay...is the third Oakland pitcher to strikeout 10 or more in a no-hitter...Dave Stewart had 12 and Catfish Hunter had 11...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, the Red Sox .895 winning percentage entering the game was the highest in Major League history by a team that was no-hit at least five games into the season...the last pitcher to no hit a team that led the majors in runs per game entering the game was the A's Dave Stewart, who did it against Toronto on June 29, 1990 (also Elias).

2018 HIGHLIGHTS: Allowed one run in 7.2 innings in his first start on March 30 against Los Angeles (AL) and one run in 8.0 innings in his second start on April 4 against Texas to become the first A's pitcher on an Opening Day roster to start the season with back-to-back outings of seven innings or more and one run or fewer since Steve Karsay in 1994...won three consecutive starts from April 15 to 27 and allowed just two runs (one earned) on six hits over that stretch (0.39 ERA, .078 opponents batting average)...allowed two hits in seven innings at Seattle April 15 and then no-hit Boston on April 21 to become the first A's pitcher with back-to-back starts of seven innings or more and two hits or fewer since Barry Zito (July 9-15, 2005)...shutout the Red Sox 3-0 in the no-hitter...walked Betts to start the game but then retired 14 straight before Leon reached on a Semien error...set down the next 12

before walking Benintendi with two outs in the ninth...then got Ramirez to hit into a game-ending force out for his first career complete game...it came in his 59th game and 58th start and his streak of 57 consecutive starts without a complete game was fourth longest in Oakland history...walked two and matched his career high with 10 strikeouts...the shutout came in the A's 21st game of the season and it was the earliest shutout by an Athletic since Barry Zito on April 18, 2003 vs. Texas, the A's 17th game of the season...allowed a fourth-inning single to Correa in his first start after the no-hitter on April 27 at Houston, snapping his streak of consecutive hitless innings at an Oakland record 14.0 innings...broke the previous mark of 13.0 held by John "Blue Moon" Odom from June 1-7, 1968...opponents went 0-for-47 off him during the hitless streak...yielded four runs on six hits in a 4-1 loss at Seattle May 3 to snap a season-opening streak where he allowed two runs or fewer and tossed five innings or more in each of his first six starts...that tied for the third longest such season-opening streak in Oakland history...it was the longest since Dave Stewart had a seven-game streak in 1990.

LAST START: He snapped a two-game losing streak in the A's 6-4 win over Los Angeles (AL) last Saturday in Oakland...retired each of the first 12 batters he faced before allowing three straight hits to start the fifth...the last of those hits was a three-run home run by Young, which gave the Angels a 3-1 lead... Oakland then scored four times in the sixth and he was relieved by Petit to start the seventh with a 5-3 lead.

2017 RECAP: Compiled a 12-10 record and a 4.37 ERA in 29 starts in his second season in the majors...went 1-3 with a 5.52 ERA and .179 opponents batting average over his first six starts, 7-2 with a 2.92 ERA and .246 opponents average over an 11-start span from May 20 to July 16 and 4-5 with a 5.55 ERA and .328 opponents average over his final 12 starts...led the A's in wins, games started, innings pitched (158.2), strikeouts (140), hits (167), walks (55) and hit batters (10)...allowed a .268 opponents batting average, including .227 (30-for-132) against left-handed hitters compared to .279 (137-for-491) against right-handers...had a .593 OPS against lefties, .809 against righties.

TODAY'S GAME 2 STARTING PITCHER: Chris Bassitt (0-2, 2.45 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville June 14 for his fourth stint with the A's this year and has made one start since his return...did not appear in a game during his first two stints...was recalled for the first time April 20 but was sent back to Nashville April 26...his second stint lasted just one day as he was called up May 26 and sent back to Triple-A the next day... returned for a third time June 9, started that day against the Royals, and was optioned back to Nashville the next day...did not pitch for the Sounds following his June 10 option.

EIGHT-GAME LOSING STREAK: Has taken the loss in each of his first two starts and is now 0-8 with a 5.46 ERA (38 er in 62.2 ip) and .293 (77-for-263) opponents batting average over his last 12 starts dating back to Aug. 21, 2015... the eight-game losing streak is a career high and it matches the longest by an A's pitcher over the last 24 years (last: Tyson Ross, May 19-Sept. 4, 2012)... the last Oakland pitcher to lose more than eight straight is Bob Welch, who had a nine-game losing streak from Sept. 5, 1993-May 11, 1994...his last Major League win came on Aug. 4, 2015 against Baltimore when he tossed 7.0 scoreless innings (5 h, 2 bb, 7 so)...is now 1-12 in 25 games (20 starts) in three seasons with Oakland.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received no run support in each of his first two starts and in seven of 25 career starts...has received two runs of support or fewer in 21 of his 25 career starts and his career RSA as a starter is 2.33 (37 rs in 143.0 ip).

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 2-0 loss to Kansas City on June 9 in Oakland...it was his first Major League appearance since April 28, 2016 at Detroit as he had UCL reconstruction surgery on May 6, 2016...allowed a RBI single to Orlando in the second inning but that was the only run he would allow in seven innings of work...retired each of the final nine batters he faced...Duffy, McCarthy and Herrera combined to shut out the A's on four hits.

LAST START: He lost his second consecutive start in the A's 8-4 loss to Los Angeles (AL) a week ago today in Oakland...allowed six runs in 4.0 innings but four were unearned...his own error in the first inning led directly to two unearned runs and a Pinder error led to three runs, one earned run, in the third...surrendered a solo home run to Kinsler in the fourth.

BASSITT vs. CHICAGO: He had a no decision in his only career appearance, a start in the A's 5-4 loss in Oakland on April 5, 2016...blanked the White Sox on three hits and two walks over the first four innings and had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a three-run home run to Frazier with two outs in the fifth inning...the A's came back with one run in the bottom of the fifth but he allowed a RBI single to Jackson in the sixth and left after 5.1 innings trailing 4-2...made his Major League debut with Chicago in 2014 and is 0-1 with a 4.67 ERA (9 er in 17.1 ip) in three career starts at Guaranteed Rate Field.
