## OAKLAND ATHLETICS (39-37) VS. CHICAGO WHITE SOX (25-50)

SATURDAY, JUNE 23, 2018 — GUARANTEED RATE FIELD — 11:10 A.M. PDT

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Have won five of the last six games despite losing last night...the win in game one of the doubleheader gave them a season-high five-game winning streak...are now 39-37 for the season and the two games over .500 is one short of the season high of three (twice, last: 39-36 on June 22)...had not been more than three games over .500 since finishing the 2014 season 88-74...went 5-10 (.333) over the first 15 games, 20-12 (.625) over a 32-game stretch from April 15-May 20, and are 14-15 (.483) in 29 games since then...are in fourth place in the American League West and trail first place Houston by 10.5 games...have been alone in fourth every day dating back to April 25 and have spent 75 of 86 days this year in fourth...also have one day tied for first, one day tied for second, two days tied for third and seven days tied for fourth.

**NOT TO BE OVERLOOKED:** Matt Olson is among the leaders in various hitting categories among American League first basemen...he ranks first in WAR (1.2), games (76), runs (39), home runs (16), 2nd in hits (65), RBI (39), walks (26) and 5th in slugging percentage (.456)...he has 12 home runs and a .560 slugging mark in his last 36 games since May 14.

**BULLPEN BULLIES:** Oakland's bullpen has posted a 2.93 ERA (55 er, 168.2 ip) with 171 strikeouts in the last 46 games since May 2...began the season with a 4.26 ERA (48 er, 101.1 ip) with 86 strikeouts in the first 28 games of the season...overall this season, Oakland's bullpen ranks 4th in the American League with a 3.43 ERA behind Houston (2.73) New York-AL (2.79) and Boston (3.15)...since May 2nd, rank 5th in the Majors with a 2.93 ERA.

**BASH BROTHERS(?):** Khris Davis (20) and Matt Olson (16) lead the club in home runs this season...Oakland is one of eight teams in the Majors with at least a pair of teammates with 15+ home runs, joining the Indians (3), Rockies (3), Angels (2), Braves (2), Red Sox (2), Yankees (2) and Mariners (2)...Olson has hit 12 home runs in his last 36 games after hitting four in his first 40 games...Davis has hit 7 home runs in his last 15 games.

**ROAD WARRIORS:** Oakland is 11-5 over the last 16 road games since May 14, averaging 6.5 runs per game...began the season 8-12 in the first 20 road games of the season...Jed Lowrie is leading the team, hitting .317 (44-for-139) with 22 runs, 8 doubles, 1 triple, 9 home runs, 29 RBI and a .963 OPS in 36 road games this season.

**KNOCK YOUR SOX OFF:** Khris Davis is hitting .339 (20-for-59) with 10 runs, 3 doubles, 3 home runs and 13 RBI with a .960 OPS in his last 14 games against Chicago-AL...he's hit safely in five straight games and 12 of the 14 games...this season, he's hitting .348 (8-for-23) with 3 runs, 2 doubles and 6 RBI in five games against the White Sox.

**THE LONG BALL:** The A's extended their streak of consecutive road games with a home run to an Athletics record 23 (previous: 21, July 21-Sept. 13, 2013)...the American League and modern Major League record is 24 by the Baltimore Orioles (Aug. 3-Sept. 15, 1996)...now have a ML leading 65 home runs in 36 games on the road compared to 36 home runs in 40 games at home...are on pace to break the Oakland record for road home runs (130 in 1996)...have 101 home runs for the season, which is fifth most in the Majors...34 have put the A's ahead, which is second most (New York, 41)...hit back-to-back homers in back-to-back innings on Wednesday (2nd, Barreto and Phegley; 3rd, Canha and Olson) for the first time since May 14, 1997 vs. Milwaukee (3rd, Canseco and McGwire; 4th, Stairs and Canseco).

**AGAINST THE CENTRAL:** The A's are 9-3 against American League Central teams (4-1 vs. Chicago, 5-2 vs. Kansas City)...are batting .280 (120-for-429) with 84 runs scored (7.00 per game) against the Central and the pitching staff has a 2.76 ERA (34 er in 111.0 ip)...are now 27-12 (.692) in interdivision games compared to 12-25 (.324) against the AL West.

**MAY AND JUNE:** The A's are batting .255 (168-for-660) with 103 runs scored and 32 home runs in 19 games in June after hitting .211 with 104 runs and 34 home runs in 29 games in May...rank second in the American League in runs scored in June, fifth in batting and tied for second in home runs...are hitting .343 (47-for-137) with runners in scoring position in June after batting .194 with RISP in May.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are batting .261 (332-for-1273) with an average of 5.61 runs per game on the road (202 runs in 36 games) compared to .223 with an average of 3.63 runs per game at home...rank second in the Majors in runs per game on the road and sixth in batting...however, are second to last in runs per game...have a 4.43 ERA (153 er in 310.2 ip) on the road compared to 3.63 at home.

**HOMESTANDS AND ROAD TRIPS:** The A's are 3-1 on this 10-game road trip to San Diego (2-0), Chicago-AL (1-1) and Detroit (four games)...it is their second of three 10-game road trips and it begins a stretch where Oakland will play 20 of 25 games and 27 of 35 on the road...are 19-17 on the road compared to 20-20 at home...went 2-3 on the last road trip to Kansas City (2-1) and Texas (0-2)...went 5-5 on the last homestand against Kansas City (3-1), Houston (0-3) and Los Angeles-AL (2-1).

**CLOSE AND LATE:** The A's are 28-0 when leading after seven innings and are the only team in the majors that has not lost a game when leading after seven...are 33-0 when leading after eight innings and are one of five teams without a loss in those games (Cincinnati, New York, Seattle, Texas)...have two wins when trailing after eight innings (back-to-back games on Sunday and Tuesday), which is tied for second in the American League (New York, 5)...have compiled a 3.22 ERA (83 er in 231.2 ip) in the seventh inning or later, which is third lowest in the AL...have a 4.38 ERA (222 er in 456.0 ip) over the first six innings...are batting .256 (226-for-884) with 129 runs scored in the seventh inning or later...the runs rank second in the AL (Houston, 138) and the average is second...are batting .234 (404-for-1728) in innings 1-6...have scored 38 runs in the ninth inning, which is third most in the majors to Atlanta (45) and San Diego (39)...improved to 5-3 with the extra inning win on Tuesday and the five wins are one more than the season total from last year...the eight extra inning games are tied for the most in the AL...are 12-7 (.632) in one-run games, which is the third best record in the AL.

**PITCHING:** The A's have compiled a 3.48 ERA (113 er in 292.0 ip) over the last 32 games after posting a 4.37 ERA over the first 44 contests...rank fourth in the American League in fewest walks per nine innings (2.85) but are third in fewest strikeouts per nine innings (7.39)...are tied with Los Angeles for the most wild pitches (46)...A's starting pitchers are 5-7 with a 5.05 ERA (55 er in 98.2 ip) over the last 18 games...the A's have used 11 different starting pitchers, which is tied with the Angels and Dodgers for second most in the majors (Tampa Bay, 13)...this marks the fifth consecutive season the A's have used 11 or more starters.

**THE DISABLED LIST:** The A's have eight players on the disabled list (Anderson, Buchter, Cahill, Chapman, Cotton, Gossett, Powell, Triggs)...Cotton and Powell are on the 60-day DL...Buchter and Powell are on rehab assignments...have used the DL 18 times this year after using it 23 times last year...have had at least four players on the DL every day since Aug. 24, 2015, at least three every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on DL since end of 2006 season (1).

**A's vs. WHITE SOX:** The A's lead the season series 4-1 after sweeping a three-game series from the White Sox in Oakland, April 16-18...have clinched the season series for the second consecutive season...went 5-1 last year after losing three straight season series, and have now won nine of their last 11 games from Chicago...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 311-288 against the White Sox...that breaks down to 164-138 in Oakland and 147-150 in Chicago...including 65-62 at Guaranteed Rate Field...all-time, the A's are 988-1043 against Chicago.

### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Khris Davis** ranks tied for fourth in the American League in home runs (20) and tied for fourth in RBI (52)...**Jed Lowrie** is tied for seventh in the AL in go-ahead RBI (13), tied for sixth in multiple hit games (27) and tied for 10th in hits (84) and doubles (20)...**Blake Treinen** has converted each of his last 13 save opportunities dating back to May 4 and has a 0.86 ERA (2 er in 21.0 ip) in 19 games total over that span...leads AL relievers in ERA (1.03) and is tied for sixth in saves (16).

### OAKLAND A'S 50th ANNIVERSARY MOMENTS

In **1978** Tim Conroy becomes the youngest Oakland pitcher to start a game at the age of 18 years, 81 days...he had a no decision in the A's 5-4 win at Kansas City (3.1 ip, 2 h, 2 r, 1 er, 5 bb, 1 so)...in **1979**, four days after turning their second triple play of the season, the A's turn their third against Texas, tying a major league record...in **1992** the A's score 10 runs in the third inning of a 12-7 win against Seattle...Harold Baines has five RBI in the inning with a two-run double and a three-run homer and has seven RBI for the day...in **1997** Jason Giambi extends his hitting streak to an Oakland record 25 games in a 6-5 loss at Seattle, breaking the mark of 24 set by Carney Lansford in 1984.

## TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Daniel Mengden (6-6, 4.06 ERA)

**FOR STARTERS:** Is 0-2 with a 10.05 ERA (12 er in 8.2 ip) and .322 (19-for-59) opponents batting average in three starts in the month of June...went 2-3 with a 4.68 ERA and .276 opponents average over his first six starts through the end of April and 4-1 with a 1.51 ERA and .181 opponents average in six starts in May...has six wins in 15 starts this year after combining for five wins in 21 starts over the first two seasons of his career...also has career highs in innings (88.2), games started (15) and home runs allowed (14) and has matched his high in hits (83).

**BASES ON BALLS:** Has walked 12 batters in 22.1 innings over his last four starts (4.84 per nine innings) after walking just six batters in 66.1 innings over his first 11 starts (0.81 per nine innings)...has walked 18 batters in 88.2 innings for the season and his average of 1.83 walks per nine innings is sixth lowest in the American League...has the third fewest strikeouts per nine innings...walked one batter or fewer in each of his first 11 starts, which was the longest season-opening streak by an Athletics starting pitcher since at least 1908...had a streak of 12 consecutive starts with one walk or fewer dating back to last year, which was third longest by an A's starter since at least 1908 (excludes starters who pitched in relief in between)...has 27 walks in 131.2 innings over the last two years (1.85 per nine innings) after issuing 33 walks in 72.0 innings in his first season in 2016 (4.13 per nine innings).

**THE LONG BALL:** Has surrendered at least two home runs in each of his last three starts...yielded six home runs over his first 12 starts...has allowed 14 home runs for the season, which is tied for tenth most in the American League...11 of those have come with the bases empty...is also tied for ninth in doubles (22) and tied for seventh in extra base hits (37).

**NIGHT AND DAY:** Is scheduled to make his 16th start of the season, his ninth in a day game...it will be his 23rd start over the last two years, his 14th in a day game...is 3-3 with a 3.02 (18 er in 53.2 ip) and .202 (40-for-198) opponents batting average in eight starts during the day this year compared to 3-2 with a 5.66 ERA (22 er in 35.0 ip) and .299 (43-for-144) opponents average in six starts at night...has allowed four home runs in 53.2 innings during the day, 10 in 35.0 innings at night...his career numbers are 5-10 with a 3.58 ERA (46 er in 115.2 ip) in 19 career starts during the day, 6-7 with a 6.24 ERA (61 er in 88.0 ip) in 17 starts at night.

**AGAINST THE CENTRAL:** Picked up the win in his only start against an American League Central team this year (April 16 vs. Chicago) and is now 3-1 with a 2.13 ERA (6 er in 25.1 ip) in four career starts against AL Central teams.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has walked just three batters to lead off an inning and his .322 on-base percentage against batters leading off an inning is ninth lowest in the American League...has issued 15 of his 18 walks this year and 22 of 27 over the last two years to right-handed hitters...has held the opponents three hitter to a .186 (8-for-43) batting average but the clean-up hitter is batting .395 (15-for-38) with four home runs and 11 RBI...has a .311 (38-for-122) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .151 (19-for-126) the second time and .277 (26-for-94) after that

**HOME AND AWAY:** Is 3-4 with a 3.64 ERA (22 er in 58.2 ip) and .225 (55-for-244) opponents batting average in 10 starts at home compared to 3-2 with a 5.18 ERA (14 er in 24.1 ip) and .286 (28-for-98) opponents average in five starts on the road...is now 3-12 in 21 career starts in the Coliseum compared to 8-5 in 15 starts on the road.

**DAYS REST:** Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 3-2 with a 2.88 ERA (13 er in 40.2 ip) in six starts on four days rest, 3-4 with a 5.06 ERA (27 er in 48.0 ip) in nine starts on five days rest or more...his career splits are 6-4 with a 3.39 ERA (33 er in 87.2 ip) in 14 starts on four days rest, 5-13 with a 5.74 ERA (74 er in 116.0 ip) in 22 starts on five days rest or more.

**WINNING STREAK:** Had a career-high and A's season-high four game winning streak from May 15 to 31...compiled a 1.20 ERA and .171 opponents batting average during the streak, which spanned four starts from May 15 to 31.

**SCORELESS STREAK:** Allowed three runs in the ninth inning on May 31 to snap his scoreless streak at a career-high and A's season-high 25.0 innings...his previous high was 19.0 innings from Sept. 15-26, 2017...did not allow a run in the final inning of his May 15 start at Boston...then tossed 7.0 scoreless innings of two-hit ball May 20 at Toronto followed by a two-hit shutout May 26 against Arizona...is just the second A's pitcher since at least 1908 with back-to-back scoreless outings of seven innings or more and two hits or fewer...the other is Bobby Witt from June 23-28, 1994.

**IN MAY:** Went 4-1 with a 1.51 ERA and .181 opponents batting average in six starts in May...was one of four American League pitchers to win four games in May, had the second lowest ERA to the Astros Justin Verlander (0.86) and ranked fifth in opponents batting...had never won more than two games in a month in his career...the ERA was the lowest in a single month in his career and it was the second lowest May ERA by an Oakland pitcher over the last

30 years (Barry Zito, 1.32 in 2006)...allowed six runs, four of which scored on solo home runs...opponents went 4-for-25 (.160) with runners in scoring position.

**LAST 20 STARTS/FIRST 16 STARTS:** Is 9-7 with a 3.35 ERA (46 er in 123.2 ip) and two complete games over his last 20 starts dating back to Sept. 9, 2017...went 2-10 with a 6.86 ERA over the first 16 starts of his career.

**LAST START:** He had a no decision in the A's 6-5, 11-inning win over Los Angeles (AL) last Sunday in Oakland...the A's scored twice in the second inning but he gave both of those runs back in the third on a Young home run and a Pujols RBI single...yielded two more runs in the sixth on a Pujols home run and a wild pitch and left trailing 4-2.

**MENGDEN vs. CHICAGO:** Was the winning pitcher in his only career appearance and start, an 8-1 A's win in Oakland earlier this year on April 16...allowed one hit in each of the first four innings but retired 11 straight from the last out in the fourth through the first out in the eighth...had an 8-0 lead when he allowed a leadoff home run to Abreu in the ninth...was relieved by Petit, who retired the final three batters to preserve the win.

**2017 RECAP:** Combined to make just 18 starts between the majors and minors due to two stints on the disabled list...went 3-2 with a 3.14 ERA and .229 opponents batting average in seven starts over two stints with Oakland...was also 2-4 with a 4.17 ERA in nine starts with Triple-A Nashville and 0-0 with a 0.00 ERA in two starts with the A's affiliate in the Arizona Rookie League...walked just nine batters in 43.0 innings (1.88 per nine innings) with the A's for a .268 on-base percentage...went 0-1 with a 10.13 ERA and .371 opponents batting average in two starts during his first stint from May 29 to June 3...then went 3-1 with a 1.54 ERA and .189 opponents batting average in five starts after returning to Oakland Sept. 5 when the Sounds season concluded.

### TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

**RHP Paul Blackburn (1-1, 8.03 ERA):** Was reinstated from the 60-day disabled list June 7 and is scheduled to make his fourth start of 2018...was 0-3 with a 6.75 ERA in six games, including three starts, this spring before being placed on the 10-day DL March 28, retroactive to March 26 with a strained right forearm...was transferred to the 60-day DL April 5 and was sent to Single-A Stockton on a rehab assignment May 31...made one start on May 31 vs. Modesto...struck out a career-high tying four batters in his last start and has a streak of 13 consecutive games with 1.1 inning or more and four strikeouts or fewer...that is the longest career-opening streak by an Athletics pitcher since Tom Ferrick also had a 13-game streak from April 19-June 1, 1941...had a no decision in his last start, a 4-2 A's win in 10 inning at San Diego on Tuesday (5.0 ip, 4 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 4 so)...has never faced the White Sox in his career.

- The A's bullpen has a 2.56 ERA (32 er in 112.1 ip) and .194 (78-for-402) opponents batting average over its last 31 games dating back to May 18... posted a 4.05 ERA and .273 opponents average over its first 43 contests.
- Has converted 18-of-23 (78.3%) save opportunities, which is the second best save percentage in the American League...has the second fewest save opportunities (Baltimore, 21).
- Has the fourth lowest ERA in the AL (3.43)...ranks first in winning percentage (16-7, .696), and tied for fourth in wins (16).
- Has a 4.34 ERA (60 er in 124.1 ip) on road, a 2.66 (43 er in 145.2 ip) at home.
