OAKLAND ATHLETICS (40-38) AT DETROIT TIGERS (36-42)

MONDAY, JUNE 25, 2018 — COMERICA PARK — 12:10 P.M. PDT

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won six of the last eight games...the win in game one of the doubleheader on Friday gave them a season-high five-game winning streak...are now 40-38 for the season...a win today would put them three games over .500 which matches the season high of three (three, last: 40-37 on June 23)...had not been more than three games over .500 since finishing the 2014 season 88-74...went 5-10 (.333) over the first 15 games, 20-12 (.625) over a 32-game stretch from April 15-May 20, and are 15-16 (.484) in 31 games since then...are in fourth place in the American League West and trail first place Houston by 11.5 games...have been alone in fourth every day dating back to April 25 and have spent 77 of 88 days this year in fourth...have one day tied for first, one day tied for second, two days tied for third and seven days tied for fourth.

ELEPHANT IN THE ROOM: Oakland has won each of its last 5 games against Detroit and 7 of the last 8...since June 2, 2015, the A's are 11-5 against the Tigers, including 7-3 at Comerica Park.

CROSS-COUNTRY TOUR: Oakland starter Edwin Jackson begins his 16th season in the Majors today with his 13th team (Los Angeles-NL, Tampa Bay, Detroit, Arizona, Chicago-AL, St. Louis, Washington, Chicago-NL, Atlanta, Miami, San Diego, Baltimore)...with his first pitch today, will tie Octavio Dotel's Major League record for teams played for in a career.

MAKING THEMSELVES AT HOME: Matt Olson and Jed Lowrie are among the top-12 in road OPS in the American League this season...Olson (10th) is hitting .296 (40-for-135) with 27 runs, 5 doubles, 10 home runs, 25 RBI, a .391 on-base percentage, .556 slugging and .947 OPS away from home...Jed Lowrie (12th) is hitting .304 (45-for-148) with 22 runs, 9 doubles, 1 triple, 9 home runs, 31 RBI and a .927 OPS in 38 road games this season.

TIGER TAMERS: Jed Lowrie is hitting .333 (43-for-129) with 19 runs, 15 doubles, 1 triple, 2 home runs, 26 RBI and a .909 OPS in 37 career games against Detroit...his .333 average is tied for 8th-best among active players (min. 130 PA)...in his last 18 games against Detroit, he's hitting .358 (24-for-67)...Jonathan Lucroy is hitting .387 (12-for-31) with 5 runs, 1 double, 4 home runs and 11 RBI with a 1.213 OPS in nine career games against Detroit.

STRONG STRETCH: Oakland is 35-28 (.556) in last 63 games since April 15th...the .556 mark is 6th-best in AL behind New York (43-18, .705), Houston (42-22, .656), Boston (40-25, .615), Seattle (39-27, .591) & Cleveland (35-27, .565).

HEATING UP: Stephen Piscotty is hitting .309 (21-for-68) with 13 runs, 6 doubles, 3 home runs, 15 RBI, a .400 on-base percentage, a .529 slugging mark and a .929 OPS in his last 21 games since May 31...Dustin Fowler is hitting .291 (16-for-55) with 6 runs, 1 home run and 3 RBI in his last 18 games; began the season hitting .204 (11-for-54) in his first 19 games of the year.

ROAD WARRIORS: Oakland is 12-6 over the last 18 road games since May 14, averaging 6.33 runs per game...began the season 8-12 in the first 20 road games of the season...are 4-2 during this current 10-game road trip.

QUIET CRUSHER: Matt Olson is among the leaders in various hitting categories among American League first basemen...he ranks first in WAR (1.5), games (78), runs (42), home runs (17), 2nd in hits (68), T2nd in RBI (40), 2nd in walks (28) and 3rd in slugging percentage (.468)...he has 13 home runs and a .579 slugging mark in his last 38 games since May 14.

BULLPEN BULLIES: Oakland's bullpen has posted a 3.02 ERA (60 er, 178.2 ip) with 184 strikeouts in the last 48 games since May 2...began the season with a 4.26 ERA (48 er, 101.1 ip) with 86 strikeouts in the first 28 games of the season...overall this season, Oakland's bullpen ranks 4th in the American League with a 3.47 ERA behind Houston (2.64) New York-AL (2.72) and Boston (3.14)...since May 2nd, rank 7th in the Majors with a 3.02 ERA.

AGAINST THE CENTRAL: The A's are 10-4 against American League Central teams (5-2 vs. Chicago, 5-2 vs. Kansas City)...are batting .276 (136-for-493) with 94 runs scored (6.71 per game) against the Central and the pitching staff has a 3.52 ERA (50 er in 128.0 ip)...are now 28-13 (.683) in interdivision games compared to 12-25 (.324) against the AL West.

MAY AND JUNE: The A's are batting .254 (184-for-724) with 113 runs and 35 home runs in 21 games in June...hit .211 with 104 runs and 34 home runs in 29 games in May...rank second in American League in runs in June, sixth in batting and second in home runs...are hitting .327 (50-for-153) with runners in scoring position in June after batting .194 with RISP in May.

THE LONG BALL: The A's extended their streak of consecutive road games with a home run to a Major League record 25...beat the modern Major League record of 24 by the Baltimore Orioles (Aug. 3-Sept. 15, 1996)...now have a ML leading 68 home runs in 38 games on the road compared to 36 home runs in 40 games at home...are on pace to break the Oakland record for road home runs (130 in 1996)...have 104 home runs for the season, which is fifth most in the Majors...36 have put the A's ahead, which is second most (New York, 41).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are batting .260 (348-for-1337) with an average of 5.58 runs per game on the road (212 runs in 38 games) compared to .223 with an average of 3.63 runs per game at home...rank second in the Majors in runs per game on the road and sixth in batting...have a 4.64 ERA (169 er in 327.2 ip) on the road compared to 3.63 at home.

CLOSE AND LATE: The A's are 28-0 when leading after seven innings and are the only team in the majors that has not lost a game when leading after seven...are 34-0 when leading after eight innings and are one of five teams without a loss in those games (Cincinnati, New York, Seattle, Texas)...have two wins when trailing after eight innings (back-to-back games on Sunday and Tuesday)...have compiled a 3.16 ERA (83 er in 236.2 ip) in the seventh inning or later, which is third lowest in the AL...have a 4.58 ERA (238 er in 468.0 ip) over the first six innings...are batting .254 (230-for-904) with 131 runs scored in the seventh inning or later...the runs rank second in the AL (Houston, 141) and the average is second...are batting .235 (416-for-1772) in innings 1-6...have scored 39 runs in the ninth inning, which is third most in the majors to Atlanta (45) and San Diego (41)...improved to 5-3 with the extra inning win on Tuesday and the five wins are one more than the season total from last year...the eight extra inning games are tied for the third most in the AL...are 13-7 (.650) in one-run games, which is the third best record in the AL.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 3.76 ERA (129 er in 309.0 ip) over the last 34 games since May 18 after posting a 4.37 ERA over the first 44 contests...rank fourth in the American League in fewest walks per nine innings (2.82) but are third in fewest strikeouts per nine innings (7.45)...are tied with Los Angeles for the most wild pitches (46)...A's starting pitchers are 5-8 with a 5.66 ERA (66 er in 105.0 ip) over the last 20 games...the A's have used 11 different starting pitchers, which is tied with the Angels and Dodgers for second most in the majors (Tampa Bay, 13)...this marks the fifth consecutive season the A's have used 11 or more starters.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have seven players on the disabled list (Anderson, Cahill, Chapman, Cotton, Gossett, Powell, Triggs)...Cotton and Powell are on the 60-day DL...have used the DL 18 times this year after using it 23 times last year...have had at least four players on the DL every day since Aug. 24, 2015, at least three every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on DL since end of 2006 season (1).

A's vs. TIGERS: The A's will play these four games in Detroit and will host the Tigers in Oakland from Aug. 3-5...won the season series last year, 5-1...won two of three in Oakland and won all three in Detroit...over the previous 10 years, the A's have won four season series, lost four and split two...are now 45-39 against the Tigers dating back to the start of the 2007 season...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 257-247 against the Tigers...that includes 142-111 in Oakland, 113-134 in Detroit and 2-2 in Las Vegas...are 37-28 (.569) at Comerica Park, which is tied for the best winning percentage by any team in this ballpark (LAA, 41-35/.539)...all-time, the A's are 925-1000 against the Tigers.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Khris Davis ranks tied for fourth in the American League in home runs (20) and fifth in RBI (52)...**Jed Lowrie** is tied for seventh in the AL in go-ahead RBI (13), tied for seventh in multiple hit games (27) and 10th in hits (85) and T9th in doubles (21)...**Blake Treinen** has converted each of his last 14 save opportunities dating back to May 4 and has a 0.79 ERA (2 er in 22.2 ip) in 20 games total over that span...leads AL relievers in ERA (0.98) and is tied for sixth in saves (17).

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Edwin Jackson (2018 debut)

FOR STARTERS: Signed a minor league contract with the Washington Nationals on Jan. 11 and began the season at Triple-A Syracuse...was 4-2 with a 3.40 ERA and .238 opponents batting average in 10 starts with the Chiefs when he was released June 1 (contract opt-out)...signed a minor league deal with the A's June 6 and was assigned to Triple-A Nashville...went 0-1 with a 4.02 ERA and .207 opponents average in three starts with the Sounds...was 4-3 with a 3.53 ERA in 13 minor league starts overall before being selected by Oakland today.

16 SEASONS AND 13 TEAMS: Begins his 16th season in the majors with his 13th team (Los Angeles-NL, Tampa Bay, Detroit, Arizona, Chicago-AL, St. Louis, Washington, Chicago-NL, Atlanta, Miami, San Diego, Baltimore)...will tie Octavio Dotel's Major League record for teams played for in a career.

LAST MAJOR LEAGUE APPEARANCE: He started and had a no decision for the Nationals last year on Sept. 28 in a 5-4 win over Pittsburgh in Washington...tossed six innings and allowed just two runs on a Bostick RBI double and a Marte RBI single in the third inning...left after six innings with the score tied 2-2.

JACKSON vs. DETROIT: Is 4-2 with a 3.36 ERA (77.2 ip, 90 h, 32 r, 29 er, 30 bb, 61 so, 5 hr) in 15 career appearances, including 10 starts...is 4-1 with a 3.72 ERA (20 er in 48.1 ip) in eight games at Comerica Park, 0-1 with a 2.76 ERA (9 er in 29.1 ip) in seven games in his home ballparks...is 3-2 with a 3.44 ERA (26 er in 68.0 ip) in his 10 starts...last faced the Tigers in 2016 when he pitched in relief in consecutive days on April 5 (1.0 ip, 1 so) and April 6 (1.0 ip, 1 h, 1 bb, 1 so) at Miami...his last start came on July 16, 2011 at Detroit with Chicago (AL)...tossed a nine-hit shut-out in the White Sox 5-0 win...walked two and struck out two.

2018 IN THE MINORS: Combined for a 4-3 record and a 3.53 ERA in 13 games, all starts, with Triple-A Syracuse in the Washington organization and Triple-A Nashville in the Oakland farm system...the starts were his most as a minor leaguer since 2006 when he made 13 starts with Triple-A Durham in the Tampa Bay farm system...had no decisions and a 5.09 ERA in four starts in April...then went 4-3 with a 3.02 ERA over his final nine starts...surrendered five home runs in 71.1 innings...allowed a .232 opponents batting average, including .221 (32-for-145) by right-handed hitters compared to .244 (31-for-127) by left-handed hitters...surrendered four of his five home runs to lefties...had a .266 (41-for-154) opponents average with the bases empty compared to .186 (22-for-118) with runners on...three of the five home runs he allowed were solo shots...yielded a .174 (12-for-69) average with runners in scoring position...opponents were 11-for-64 (.172) with eight walks (.264 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning...went 1-for-5 with a double, walk and two strikeouts as a hitter, including 1-for-2 with a double and a walk in three pinch hitting appearances...allowed one run or fewer in seven of his 13 starts.

WITH SYRACUSE: Issued a season-high six walks in his first start April 9 at Rochester...allowed a season-high five runs in a season-low 2.2 innings April 21 at Louisville but had a no decision...finished April with no decisions and a 5.09 ERA in four starts...then went 4-2 with a 2.61 ERA in six starts in May...struck out a season-high nine batters in 6.0 innings May 3 at Buffalo but took the loss...was credited with his first win of the season May 8 against Scranton/Wilkes-Barre when he allowed a run in 6.0 innings in a 4-1 win...won again in his next start on May 13 against Pawtucket...tossed a season-high 7.0 innings in back-to-back starts on the 13th and May 19 against Lehigh Valley...took the loss on the 19th when he surrendered a season-high eight hits, but then won each of his final two starts in May on the 24 at Buffalo and the 29 against Toledo...finished May with a 4-2 record and a 2.61 ERA in six starts.

WITH NASHVILLE: Allowed just one run in 6.0 innings in his first start with the Sounds, but took the loss in a 1-0 decision to Tacoma June 9...matched his season-high by allowing five runs in 4.0 innings at El Paso on June 14.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
RHP Frankie Montas (4-1, 2.41 ERA): Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville May 27 for his first stint with the A's this year and has won four of his first five starts...has allowed two runs or fewer in four of those starts...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 12-4 A's win at San Diego last Wednesday (6.2 ip, 5 h, 1 r, 1 er, 3 bb, 6 so)...is 1-2 with a 7.88 ERA (8.0 ip, 8 h, 7 r, 7 er, 6 bb, 11 so, 1 hr) in three career appearances, including two starts, against Detroit...his last appearance came in relief last year in Oakland on May 6 when he picked up the win in a 6-5 A's victory (1.0 ip, 1 bb, 1 so)...the two starts were the first two of his career and they came in 2015 while pitching for the White Sox...went 1-5 with a 4.39 ERA in nine starts, including one complete game, with Nashville...was 0-3 with a 6.19 ERA in five starts in April and tossed four innings or fewer four times...then went 1-2 with a 3.24 ERA in four starts in May and tossed at least five innings in each start.
