OAKLAND ATHLETICS (41-38) VS. DETROIT TIGERS (36-43)

TUESDAY, JUNE 26, 2018 — COMERICA PARK — 7:10 P.M. EDT

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won seven of the last nine games to improve to a season-high tying three games over .500 at 41-38 (fifth time, last: 40-37 on June 23) ...have not been more than three games over .500 since finishing the 2014 season 88-74...the win yesterday coupled with an Angels loss moved the A's into a tie for third place in the American League West for the first time since April 24...had spent every day since then alone in fourth...Oakland has not been better than tied for third since the second game of the season when it was tied for second...have spent one day tied for first, one day tied for second, three days tied for third, 78 days in fourth and seven days tied for fourth...trail first place Houston by 10½ games in the West and are seven games behind Seattle for the second Wild Card spot...are 36-28 (.563) dating back to April 15 after starting the year 5-10 (.333)

THE LONG BALL: The A's hit two home runs yesterday to extended their modern Major League record streak of consecutive games with a home run on the road to 26 (previous: 24 by Baltimore, Aug. 3-Sept. 15, 1996)...now have a ML leading 70 home runs in 39 games on the road compared to 36 home runs in 40 games at home...are on pace for 145 home runs on the road...the ML record for home runs on the road is 138 by San Francisco in 2001...have homered in nine straight games overall (19 home runs total) and have 106 home runs for the season, which is tied for fifth in the American League...the pitching staff is tied with Miami for the Major League lead with 58 home runs allowed on the road...has yielded 43 home runs at home, which is fourth fewest in the AL...have surrendered 101 overall, which is tied for third most in the AL.

WINNING LATE: The A's have won 12 games in June and have scored the winning run in the eighth inning or later in six of those games (eighth inning three times, ninth inning once, 10th inning once, 11th inning once)...scored all five runs yesterday in the seventh inning or later...lead the majors with 54 runs in the eighth inning, rank third with 40 runs in the ninth and are fourth with 136 runs in the seventh inning or later...are 28-0 when leading after seven innings and are the only team in the majors that has not lost a game when leading after seven...are 34-0 when leading after eight innings and are one of five teams without a loss in those games (Cincinnati, New York, Seattle, Texas)...are tied for the American League lead with six wins when trailing after seven innings and are tied for second with two wins when trailing after eight...have compiled a 3.23 ERA (86 er in 2396.2 ip) in the seventh inning or later, which is third lowest in the AL, compared to a 4.54 ERA (239 er in 474.0 ip) over the first six innings...are batting .258 (237-for-919) in the seventh inning or later, which ranks second in the AL (Houston, .269), compared to .235 (421-for-1794) in innings 1-6.

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 14-7 (.667) in one-run games, which is the third best record in the American League...are tied for the second most wins...are 5-3 (.625) in extra inning games, which is fourth best in the AL...the eight extra inning games are tied for third in the AL...the five extra inning wins are one more than the season total from last year...are 10-5 in games decided in the last at bat and the wins are tied for fourth most in the AL.

AGAINST THE CENTRAL: The A's are 11-4 against American League Central teams...are batting .279 (148-for-530) with 99 runs scored (6.60 per game) against the Central and the pitching staff has a 3.55 ERA (54 er in 137.0 ip)...are now 29-13 (.690) in interdivision games compared to 12-25 (.324) against the AL West.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .258 (196-for-761) with 118 runs scored and 37 home runs in June...rank second in the American League in runs in June, tied for second in home runs, third in slugging (.455) and fourth in batting...the 37 home runs are the seventh best June total in Oakland history...are hitting .321 (51-for-159) with runners in scoring position...overall, the A's rank fifth in the AL in runs (362) and hit by pitches (34), but are tied for third in most strikeouts (692).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are batting .262 (360-for-1374) with an average of 5.56 runs per game on the road (217 runs in 39 games) compared to .223 with an average of 3.63 runs per game at home...rank second in the American League in runs per game and batting on the road (Houston, 6.15 and .286)...however, are last in batting at home and second to last in runs per game...have a 4.62 ERA (173 er in 336.2 ip) on the road compared to 3.63 at home.

HOMESTANDS AND ROAD TRIPS: The A's are 5-2 on this 10-game road trip to San Diego (2-0), Chicago-AL (2-2) and Detroit (1-0)...Oakland is now 13-6

over its last 19 road games dating back to May 14 after starting the year 8-12...are 21-18 on the road overall, compared to 20-20 at home...this trip is the A's second of three 10-game road trips and it begins a stretch where Oakland will play 20 of 25 games and 27 of 35 on the road...return home following the game Thursday for a brief five-game homestand against Cleveland (three games) and San Diego (two games)...went 5-5 on the last homestand against Kansas City (3-1), Houston (0-3) and Los Angeles-AL (2-1).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 5.26 ERA (69 er in 118.0 ip) over the last 13 games dating back to June 12...rank fourth in the American League in fewest walks per nine innings (2.79) but are third in fewest strikeouts per nine innings (7.48)...are tied for the Major League lead in wild pitches (48).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 5-8 with a 5.43 ERA (67 er in 111.0 ip) over the last 21 games...yesterday, Edwin Jackson became the 12th different pitcher to start a game for the A's this year, which is second most in the majors to Tampa Bay (13)...it matches Oakland's season total from last year...starters are averaging 2.38 walks per nine innings, which is second fewest in the majors (Cleveland, 2.18).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed at least one error in a season-high six consecutive games (eight errors total)...now have 55 errors for the season, which is third most in the American League...also have the third most unearned runs (31)...lead the majors with 818 assists...A's outfielders have seven assists, which is tied with Philadelphia for second fewest in the majors (Washington, 5).

ON THE BASES: The A's are 15-for-29 (51.7%) in stolen base attempts...have the lowest stolen base percentage in the majors, the fewest stolen bases and the second fewest attempts (Miami, 28)...opponents have been caught stealing 22 times, which is the most in the American League and third most in the majors...however, they have stolen 52 bases, which is third most in the AL.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have seven players on the disabled list (Anderson, Cahill, Chapman, Cotton, Gossett, Powell, Triggs)...Cotton and Powell are on the 60-day DL...Anderson is on a rehab assignment...have used the DL 18 times this year after using it 23 times last year...have had at least four players on the DL every day since Aug. 24, 2015, at least three every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on DL since end of 2006 season (1).

A's vs. TIGERS: The A's won the first meeting of 2018 yesterday after winning the season series last year, 5-1...now have a six-game winning streak against the Tigers, which is one short of the A's longest winning streak against Detroit since moving to Oakland in 1968 (7, Sept. 6, 1986-May 9, 1987)...have now won eight of the last nine games and 12 of the last 17...have a four-game winning streak at Comerica Park, which is tied for second longest in Oakland history (8, Aug. 3, 2001-May 13, 2003)...have won eight of the last 11 games in Detroit...over the previous 10 years, the A's have won four season series, lost four and split two...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 258-247 against the Tigers...that includes 142-111 in Oakland, 114-134 in Detroit and 2-2 in Las Vegas...are 38-28 (.576) at Comerica Park, which is the best winning percentage by any team in this ballpark (LAA, 41-35/.539)...all-time, the A's are 926-1000 against the Tigers.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Jed Lowrie is tied for fifth in the American League in go-ahead RBI (14) and tied for eighth in RBI (51)...**Matt Olson** has 17 home runs, which are tied for the most among Major League first basemen (Goldschmidt, ARI)...**Stephen Piscotty** has reached base safely in 22 consecutive games and is batting .329 (24-for-73) with a .412 on-base percentage over that span...**Blake Treinen** has converted each of his last 15 save opportunities dating back to May 4 and has a 0.76 ERA (2 er in 23.2 ip) in 21 games total over that span.

OAKLAND A'S 50th ANNIVERSARY MOMENTS

In **1974** Campy Campaneris has two hits in the A's 5-0 win over California, giving him 1000 in his Oakland career...in **1997** Mark McGwire hits his ninth career grand slam in a 6-3 win over Texas, tying the franchise record held by Jimmie Foxx, Sam Chapman and Gus Zernial...in **2005** the A's set an Oakland record for margin of victory in a shutout with a 16-0 win over San Francisco...switch-hitter Nick Swisher becomes just the second player in Oakland history to homer from both side of the plate in the same game.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Frankie Montas (4-1, 2.41 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville May 27 for his first stint with the A's this year and has won four of his first five starts...has allowed two runs or fewer in four of those starts.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .208 (5-for-24) average with runners in scoring position, including .100 (1-for-10) with two outs...opponents are 5-for-33 (.152) with two walks (.200 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning...has a .220 (13-for-59) opponents average over his first 45 pitches in a game, .284 (19-for-67) after that.

FIRST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 2-1 win over Arizona May 27 in Oakland...matched his career best with seven strikeouts...retired each of the first 10 batters he faced and no-hit the Diamondbacks over the first five innings...had a 1-0 lead when Mathis singled to lead off the sixth...allowed his only run later in the inning on a Lamb sacrifice fly and the A's came back with a run in the bottom of the sixth for the win.

SECOND START: He combined with Pagán on an eight-hit shutout in the A's 16-0 win at Kansas City June 1...tossed a career-high eight innings...retired the side in order just twice (2nd and 7th) but did not allow a runner past second base.

THIRD START: He won his third consecutive start in the A's 7-2 win over Kansas City June 8 in Oakland...blanked the Royals on four hits and a walk over the first seven innings and had a 6-0 lead entering the eighth...surrendered a two-run home run to Moustakas, snapping his scoreless streak at a career-high 15.0 innings.

FOURTH START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-3 loss to Houston June 14 in Oakland...allowed a career-high seven runs on a career-high 11 hits and a career-high tying four walks...allowed a RBI double to Gurriel and a RBI single to Reddick in the first but the A's got one of those runs back in the second...then yielded a RBI single to Correa in the third, a two-run home run to McCann in the fourth, and two unearned runs in the sixth.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 12-4 win at San Diego last Wednesday...tossed a career-high 105 pitches allowed just one run in 6.2 innings of work...had a 7-0 lead when he allowed his only run in the third inning on a Spangenberg RBI single.

MONTAS vs. DETROIT: Is 1-2 with a 7.88 ERA (8.0 ip, 8 h, 7 r, 7 er, 6 bb, 11 so, 1 hr) in three career appearances, including two starts...his last appearance came in relief last year in Oakland on May 6 when he picked up the win in a 6-5 A's victory (1.0 ip, 1 bb, 1 so)...entered the game to start the ninth inning with the A's trailing 5-4 and retired three of the four batters he faced (Adduci walk)...Oakland scored twice in the bottom of the ninth for the win...his other two appearances came with Chicago in 2015 and they were the first two starts of his career...the first start came in a 7-4 loss at Comerica Park on Sept. 23...allowed a two-run home run to Martinez in the first and four more runs in the third...also started in a 6-0 loss in Chicago on Oct. 4...allowed a Castellanos RBI double in the first but that was the only run he allowed in four innings

May and tossed at least five innings in each start...was 1-1 with a 2.86 ERA in five starts at home, 0-4 with a 6.16 ERA in four starts on the road.

2018 NASHVILLE HIGHLIGHTS: Tossed just 37 pitches in his first start and allowed four runs on four hits in 0.2 innings for the loss on April 6 at New Orleans...also issued a season-high two walks...tossed 3.0 scoreless innings in his second start April 11 against Iowa when he combined with Ryan Dull (1.0 ip), Chris Bassitt (4.0 ip) and Lou Trivino (1.0 ip) on a five-hit shutout in a 6-0 win...allowed a season-high five runs on a season-high seven hits in 4.0 innings in an 8-6 loss to New Orleans April 28...went 1-0 with a 1.80 ERA over a three-start stretch from May 4 to 14...was credited with his only win of the season May 4 against Memphis when he allowed one run in 6.0 innings of work...struck out a season-high 10 batters in 6.0 innings May 9 against Colorado Springs...had a season-high 93 pitches, which he matched in his next start on May 14...tossed a complete game at Memphis on the 14th but was the losing pitcher in a 2-1 loss...allowed two runs on six hits in a season-high eight innings...matched his season high with five runs on seven hits in an 11-2 loss at Oklahoma City in his final start May 20.

2017 RECAP: Was on the A's Opening Day roster and compiled a 7.03 ERA and .302 opponents batting average in 23 games over two stints with Oakland...also went 0-2 with a 5.22 ERA in nine games, eight starts, with Triple-A Nashville before an oblique injury ended his season in mid-August...issued 20 walks in 32.0 innings (5.63 per nine innings) with the A's for a .408 opponents on-base percentage...had a .566 opponents slugging percentage and .974 OPS...the OPS was the highest in Oakland history by a reliever, the slugging percentage was second highest and the on-base percentage was third highest...had the highest OPS and on-base percentage among Major League relievers in 2017...had the second highest opponents slugging percentage among AL relievers and the sixth highest opponents batting average...struck out 36 for an average of 10.13 strikeouts per nine innings...allowed 10 home runs, an average of 2.81 home runs per nine innings...that was the second highest mark in Oakland history among pitchers with 30 or more innings pitched (Curt Young, 2.93 in 1985)...tied for seventh among AL relievers in home runs allowed...his opponents batting average included a .257 (19-for-74) mark against right-handed hitters compared to .364 (20-for-55) against left-handers...yielded seven of his 10 home runs and issued 12 of his 20 walks to lefties...had a .751 OPS against righties, 1.267 against lefties...seven of his 10 home runs came with runners on base...18 of his 23 outings were at least one inning, including seven outings of two innings or more...with Nashville, he struck out 37 batters in 29.1 innings with Nashville, an average of 11.35 per nine innings...walked just seven for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 5.29...allowed a .223 opponents batting average, including .188 (9-for-48) against right-handed hitters compared to .250 (16-for-64) against left-handers...surrendered three of his four home runs to righties.

LHP Sean Manaea (7-6, 3.40 ERA): Is 2-0 with a 2.81 ERA and .198 opponent average in four starts in the month of June...began the season by going 4-2 with a 1.03 ERA and .134 opponents batting average over his first six starts through the end of April but then went 1-4 with a 7.18 ERA and .295 opponents batting average in six starts in May...has walked one batter in his last three starts (20.1 ip) and has issued two free passes or fewer in 14 of his 16 starts this year...is averaging 1.70 walks per nine innings, which ranks third lowest in the American League...has the seventh lowest opponents on-base percentage (.257) and the ninth lowest OPS (.623)...was the winning pitcher in his last start, an 11-2 A's win at Chicago (AL) in the first game of the doubleheader last Friday (7.0 ip, 5 h, 1 r, 1 er, 7 so)...was the losing pitcher in his only career appearance against Detroit, a start in the A's 4-1 loss in Oakland on May 27, 2016 (6.0 ip, 9 h, 3 r, 3 er, 2 bb, 4 so).
