## OAKLAND ATHLETICS (42-38) VS. DETROIT TIGERS (36-44)

WEDNESDAY, JUNE 27, 2018 — COMERICA PARK — 7:10 P.M. EDT

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Have won eight of the last 10 games to improve to a season-high four games over .500 at 42-38...it marks the first time the A's have been more than three games over .500 since finishing the 2014 season 88-74...moved into sole possession of third place in the American League West with the win last night, which is the highest place the A's have been in the standings since the second game of the season, when they were tied for second...spent every day alone in fourth from April 25 to June 24...have spent one day tied for first, one day tied for second, one day in third, three days tied for third, 78 days in fourth and seven days tied for fourth...are 37-28 (.569) dating back to April 15 after starting the year 5-10 (.333).

**COME BACKS:** The A's trailed 6-0 last night but came back to win 9-7...it was their largest deficit overcome to win since Sept. 26, 2009 when they trailed Los Angeles (AL) 9-2 after four innings before winning 15-10...it marks the second time in the last four games the A's overcame a deficit of five or more runs to win (Saturday at Chicago-AL)...the only other time in Oakland history the A's overcame two deficits of five or more runs to win over a four-game stretch or fewer was in 2013 when they did it in back-to-back games on April 28 and 29...now have three wins this year when trailing by five or more (April 18 vs. Chicago-AL).

**WINNING LATE:** The A's have won 13 games in June and have scored the winning run in the eighth inning or later in seven of those games (eighth inning three times, ninth inning twice, 10th inning once, 11th inning once)...are tied for first in the majors with 54 runs in the eighth inning, rank second with 42 runs in the ninth inning and are tied for third with 139 runs in the seventh inning or later...are 28-0 when leading after seven innings and are the only team in the majors that has not lost a game when leading after seven...are 34-0 when leading after eight innings and are one of five teams without a loss in those games (Cincinnati, New York, Seattle, Texas)...are tied for second in the American League with six wins when trailing after seven innings and two wins when trailing after eight...have compiled a 3.19 ERA (86 er in 242.2 ip) in the seventh inning or later, which is third lowest in the AL, compared to a 4.61 ERA (246 er in 480.0 ip) over the first six innings...are batting .259 (242-for-933) in the seventh inning or later, which ranks second in the AL (Houston, .272), compared to .235 (427-for-1818) in innings 1-6, which is third lowest.

**THE HALFWAY POINT:** The A's are scheduled to play their 81st game today, which marks the halfway point of the season...have 48 wild pitches and are on pace to break the franchise record of 84 set last year...pitchers have struck out 599 and are on pace for 1213, which would be second most in Athletics history (1244 in 2013)...hitters have fanned 699 times and are on pace for 1415, which would also be second most in Athletics history (1491 last year)...have just two sacrifice hits...the Athletics record for fewest in a season is 13 in 2016 and 2017 and the Major League record is eight by Boston in 2016...are on pace to set Oakland records for fewest stolen bases (have 15, fewest is 31 in 2005), lowest stolen base percentage (51.7%, 55.2% in 1978) and fewest intentional walks (7, 15 in 2017)...are also on pace for the fewest intentional walks by pitchers (8, 17 in 2017)...are on pace to hit 200 home runs for the sixth time in franchise history and allow 200 home runs for the fourth time...with 327 at bats, Marcus Semien is on pace to challenge Miguel Tejada's Oakland record of 662 in 2002...Matt Olson has appeared in all 80 games and the A's have not had a player play every game since Miguel Tejada in 2003.

**THE LONG BALL:** The A's hit two home runs yesterday to extended their modern Major League record streak of consecutive games with a home run on the road to 27 (previous: 24 by Baltimore, Aug. 3-Sept. 15, 1996)...now have a ML leading 72 home runs in 40 games on the road compared to 36 home runs in 40 games at home...are on pace for 146 home runs on the road...the ML record for home runs on the road is 138 by San Francisco in 2001...have homered in 10 straight games overall (21 home runs total) and have 108 home runs for the season, which is tied for fourth in the American League...the pitching staff is tied with Miami for the Major League lead with 58 home runs allowed on the road...has yielded 43 home runs at home, which is fourth fewest in the AL...have surrendered 101 overall, which is tied for fifth most in the AL.

**IN JUNE:** The A's are 13-10 in June with four games remaining and need one more win to clinch a winning record in the month...have also posted a winning record in April (13-12) and May (15-14)...there have been seven seasons

in Oakland history in which the A's have posted a winning record in April, May and June (1971, 1972, 1975, 1990, 2003, 2013, 2014)...rank second in the American League runs (127) and home runs (39) in June, third in batting (.259) and slugging (.458) and fourth in on-base percentage (.328)...the 39 home runs are the sixth best June total in Oakland history (55 in 1996, 42 in 1987, 41 in 1999, 40 in 2000, 40 in 1995)...are hitting .337 (55-for-163) with runners in scoring position this month.

**AGAINST THE CENTRAL:** The A's are 12-4 against American League Central teams...are batting .280 (159-for-568) with 108 runs scored (6.75 per game) against the Central and the pitching staff has a 3.76 ERA (61 er in 146.0 ip)...are now 30-13 (.698) in interdivision games compared to 12-25 (.324) against the AL West.

**ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS:** The A's are 14-7 (.667) in one-run games, which is the third best record in the American League...are tied for the second most wins...are 5-3 (.625) in extra inning games, which is fourth best in the AL...the eight extra inning games are tied for third in the AL...the five extra inning wins are one more than the season total from last year...are 11-5 in games decided in the last at bat and the wins are tied for second most in the AL (Toronto, 15).

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are batting .263 (371-for-1412) and are averaging 5.65 runs per game on the road (226 runs in 40 games) compared to .223 with an average of 3.63 runs per game at home...rank second in the American League in runs per game and batting on the road (Houston, 6.15 and .286)...however, are last in batting at home and second to last in runs per game...have a 4.69 ERA (180 er in 345.2 ip) on the road compared to 3.63 at home.

**HOMESTANDS AND ROAD TRIPS:** The A's are 6-2 on this 10-game road trip to San Diego (2-0), Chicago-AL (2-2) and Detroit (2-0)...Oakland is now 14-6 over its last 20 road games dating back to May 14 after starting the year 8-12...are 22-18 on the road overall, compared to 20-20 at home...this trip is the A's second of three 10-game road trips and it begins a stretch where Oakland will play 20 of 25 games and 27 of 35 on the road...return home following the game tomorrow for a brief five-game homestand against Cleveland (three games) and San Diego (two games)...went 5-5 on the last homestand against Kansas City (3-1), Houston (0-3) and Los Angeles-AL (2-1).

**A's vs. TIGERS:** The A's have won the first two games of 2018 and now have a seven-game winning streak against the Tigers...that matches the A's longest winning streak against Detroit since moving to Oakland in 1968 (Sept. 6, 1986-May 9, 1987)...have not won more than seven straight against the Tigers since the Philadelphia A's won eight straight from July 30-Sept. 13, 1952...won the season series last year 5-1 and have now won nine of the last 10 games and 13 of the last 18...have a five-game winning streak at Comerica Park, which is second longest in Oakland history (8, Aug. 3, 2001-May 13, 2003)...have won nine of the last 12 games in Detroit...over the previous 10 years, the A's have won four season series, lost four and split two...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 259-247 against the Tigers...that includes 142-111 in Oakland, 115-134 in Detroit and 2-2 in Las Vegas...are 39-28 (.582) at Comerica Park, which is the best winning percentage by any team in this ballpark...all-time, the A's are 927-1000 against the Tigers.

### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Jed Lowrie** is tied for fourth in the American League in RBI (53) and go-ahead RBI (15)...**Stephen Piscotty** has reached base safely in 23 consecutive games and is batting .316 with a .411 on-base percentage over that span...**Blake Treinen** has converted each of his last 16 save opportunities dating back to May 4 and has a 0.73 ERA (2 er in 24.2 ip) in 22 games total over that span.

### OAKLAND A'S 50th ANNIVERSARY MOMENTS

In 1987 Mark McGwire ties a pair of Oakland records by hitting three home runs and scoring five runs in the A's 13-3 win at Cleveland...in 1996 the A's hit a franchise record eight home runs in a 18-2 win at California...the A's also collect an Oakland record 44 total bases and 11 extra base hits and score in eight different innings, tying an American League record...in 2002 Miguel Tejada plays in his 348<sup>th</sup> consecutive game, breaking Alfredo Griffin's Oakland record for consecutive games played.

## TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Chris Bassitt (0-3, 3.86 ERA)

**FOR STARTERS:** Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville today for his fifth stint with the A's this year...did not pitch in his first two stints (April 20-25 and May 26)...made one start during his third stint (June 9) and two during his most recent stay (June 14-22)...is 0-3 with a 3.86 ERA in three starts with Oakland and 2-3 with a 6.10 ERA in 10 games, seven starts, with Nashville...has not pitched for the Sounds since June 2.

**NINE-GAME LOSING STREAK:** Has taken the loss in each of his first three starts and is now 0-9 with a 5.56 ERA (42 er in 68.0 ip) and .290 (83-for-286) opponents batting average over his last 13 starts dating back to Aug. 21, 2015...the nine-game losing streak is a career high and is the longest by an A's pitcher since Bob Welch lost nine straight from Sept. 5, 1993-May 11, 1994...only two pitchers in Oakland history have lost more than nine consecutive games...Mike Norris had a 12-game losing streak from June 19, 1977 to April 8, 1979 and Matt Keough holds the record with an 18-game losing streak from Sept. 1 1978 to Aug. 8, 1979...Bassitt's last Major League win came on Aug. 4, 2015 against Baltimore when he tossed 7.0 scoreless innings (5 h, 2 bb, 7 so)...is now 1-13 in 26 games (21 starts) in three seasons with Oakland.

**RUN SUPPORT:** Received no run support in his first two starts and two runs of support in his last start...has received two runs of support or fewer in 22 of his 26 career starts and his career RSA as a starter is 2.36 (39 rs in 148.1 ip).

**FIRST START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 2-0 loss to Kansas City on June 9 in Oakland...it was his first Major League appearance since April 28, 2016 at Detroit as he had UCL reconstruction surgery on May 6, 2016...allowed a RBI single to Orlando in the second inning but that was the only run he would allow in seven innings of work...retired each of the final nine batters he faced...Duffy, McCarthy and Herrera combined to shut out the A's on four hits.

**SECOND START:** He lost his second consecutive start in the A's 8-4 loss to Los Angeles (AL) June 15 in Oakland...allowed six runs in 4.0 innings but four were unearned...his own error in the first inning led directly to two unearned runs and a Pinder error led to three runs, one earned run, in the third...surrendered a solo home run to Kinsler in the fourth.

**LAST START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-4 loss in the second game of the double header last Friday at Chicago (AL)...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed three runs in the bottom of the second on a Narvaez two-run single and a Tilson RBI single...Oakland scored once in the sixth to narrow the gap to 3-2 but he was charged with two runs in the bottom of the sixth...put runners on first and second with one out and was relieved by Coulombe who allowed both runners to score.

**BASSITT vs. DETROIT:** Is 1-2 with a 6.11 ERA (17.2 ip, 23 h, 12 r, 12 er, 8 bb, 12 so) in three career starts...his last start on April 28, 2016 at Detroit was his final start before undergoing "Tommy John" surgery...took the loss in a 7-3 decision...allowed a career-high seven runs on a career-high 10 hits in 3.2 innings, which was his second shortest outing as a starter...the A's scored a run in the third but he allowed four in the bottom of the third on a Kinsler RBI double, a Cabrera RBI single, a Martinez sacrifice fly and a Castellanos RBI double...then allowed three more runs in the fourth on a two-run home run by Gose and a RBI single by Upton...the other two starts came while pitching for the White Sox in 2014...the loss came in an 8-4 decision at Chicago on Aug. 30...allowed RBI singles to Davis and Kinser in the third and three more runs in the fourth on a Kinsler two-run single and a Cabrera RBI ground out...left after 6.1 innings trailing 5-0...then combined with Jake Petricka on a six-hit shutout for his first Major League win, a 2-0 victory at Detroit Sept. 22...surrendered all six of the hits and walked one in 7.2 innings.

nings...struck out 40, an average of 9.39 per nine innings...hit six batters, which was tied for fourth most in the Pacific Coast League at the time of his June 9 promotion to Oakland...allowed a .314 opponents batting average, including .270 (17-for-63) against left-handed hitters compared to .344 (32-for-93) against right-handers...has a .689 OPS against lefties, .904 against righties...held the opposition to a .208 batting average with runners in scoring position and two outs...opponents hit .353 with a .436 on-base percentage when leading off an inning...was 2-0 with a 2.88 ERA in six games at home, 0-3 with a 12.15 ERA in four games on the road...went 1-0 with a 0.69 ERA in three relief appearances, 1-3 with an 8.88 ERA in seven starts...had two starts where he allowed seven runs (5.1 ip, 23.63 ERA)...had a 3.27 ERA (12 er in 33.0 ip) in his other eight appearances.

**2018 NASHVILLE HIGHLIGHTS:** Began the season in the bullpen and was 1-0 with a 0.69 ERA in three appearances when he was recalled by Oakland April 20...tossed at least 4.0 innings in each appearances and did not allow a run over his first 9.0 innings...was optioned back to Nashville April 26 and started each of his final seven appearances...allowed a season-high seven runs on seven hits in 2.0 innings in his first start April 30 at Colorado Springs and took the loss...pitched 2.0 innings in his next start and 3.0 after that...then allowed a season-high tying seven runs on seven hits and three walks in 3.1 innings May 17 at Oklahoma City for the loss...picked up his first win as a starter May 22 against Colorado Springs when he allowed just one run in 5.0 innings...then had a no decision May 28 against Oklahoma City when he struck out a season-high eight batters in a season-high 6.0 innings.

**2017 RECAP:** Began the season on Oakland's disabled list as he continued his recovery from May 6, 2016 UCL reconstruction surgery and spent the entire season in the minors...went 0-1 with a 2.77 ERA in seven games, all starts, with Single-A Stockton and 4-2 with a 6.21 ERA in 17 games, two starts, with Triple-A Nashville...combined for a 5-3 record and a 5.33 ERA in 24 games, nine starts, overall...allowed a .260 opponents batting average, including .243 (26-for-107) against right-handed hitters compared to .282 (24-for-85) against left-handers...surrendered three home runs in 50.2 innings, an average of 0.53 per nine innings...all three of his home runs came with runners on base...yielded a .341 average with runners in scoring position, but that dropped to .167 with RISP and two outs...opponents hit .174 with a .269 on-base percentage when leading off an inning...was 1-2 with a 4.37 ERA in his nine starting assignments, 3-1 with a 6.11 ERA in 15 relief appearances...tossed at least two innings in 10 of his 15 relief outings...allowed 2-of-9 (22.2%) inherited runners to score...began his rehab assignment with Stockton April 29 and did not allow a run in two starts with the Ports (7.0 ip) before he was moved up to Nashville May 8...allowed four runs on five hits and season-high four walks in 4.0 innings of relief the next day against El Paso but struck out a season-high six...then tossed a season-high 5.0 shutout innings for the win in a start at Fresno May 15...yielded a season-high seven runs on a season-high seven hits in his next start May 20 at Sacramento and was 1-1 with a 4.79 ERA in five games overall when his rehab assignment was halted May 24...resumed pitching June 28 back at Stockton and had four scoreless outings (4.2 ip) before allowing four runs on six hits in 1.1 innings in a loss to Inland Empire July 12...was moved up to Nashville July 16 and pitched in relief...made three more rehab appearances before he was reinstated from the DL and optioned to Nashville July 25...spent the remainder of the season pitching in relief, posting a 5.12 ERA in 11 appearances following his option...did not allow a run in five of his last seven outings (1.93 ERA).

<b>LHP Sean Manaea (7-6, 3.40 ERA):</b>	Is 2-0 with a 2.81 ERA and .198 opponent average in four starts in the month of June...began the season by going 4-2 with a 1.03 ERA and .134 opponents batting average over his first six starts through the end of April but then went 1-4 with a 7.18 ERA and .295 opponents batting average in six starts in May...has walked one batter in his last three starts (20.1 ip) and is averaging 1.70 walks per nine innings for the season, which ranks third lowest in the American League...is 3-0 with a 3.06 ERA in five starts during the day and now has a nine-game winning streak in starts in a day game dating back to May 20, 2017...was the winning pitcher in his last start, an 11-2 A's win at Chicago (AL) in the first game of the doubleheader last Friday (7.0 ip, 5 h, 1 r, 1 er, 7 so)...was the losing pitcher in his only career appearance against Detroit, a start in the A's 4-1 loss in Oakland on May 27, 2016 (6.0 ip, 9 h, 3 r, 3 er, 2 bb, 4 so).
