OAKLAND ATHLETICS (48-39) VS. CLEVELAND INDIANS (48-37)

FRIDAY, JULY 6, 2018 — PROGRESSIVE FIELD — 7:10 P.M. EDT

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won two straight, eight of the last nine and 14 of the last 17 games to improve to a season-high nine games over .500 at 48-39 (.552)...that is the third best record in the American League West, the sixth best record in the AL and the 10th best record in the majors...are 5-0-1 over the last six series and the six series unbeaten streak is the longest by an A's team since winning six straight series from Aug. 26-Sept. 15, 2013...remain in sole possession of third place in the AL West for the 10th consecutive day...are nine games behind first place Houston and 7½ games behind the second Wild Card team, Seattle...spent every day alone in fourth in the West from April 25 to June 24...have spent one day tied for first, one day tied for second, 10 days in third, three days tied for third, 78 days in fourth and seven days tied for fourth...had their season-high six-game winning streak snapped on Sunday.

THE LATE INNINGS: The A's scored twice in the eighth inning on Wednesday to break a 2-2 tie in a 4-2 win over San Diego...have scored the winning run in the eighth inning or later in eight of their last 18 wins (eighth inning four times, ninth inning twice, 10th inning once, 11th inning once)...lead the majors with 61 runs in the eighth inning, rank second with 44 runs in the ninth (Atlanta, 47) and are fourth with 151 runs in the seventh inning or later...are batting .263 (263-for-100) in the seventh inning or later, which ranks second in the American League (Houston, .265), compared to .235 (464-for-1993) in innings 1-6, which is third lowest...have compiled a 3.38 ERA (99 er in 263.2 ip) in the seventh inning or later, which is third lowest in the AL, compared to a 4.43 ERA (257 er in 522.0 ip) over the first six innings...are 33-0 when leading after seven innings and are the only team in the majors that has not lost a game when leading after seven...are 40-0 when leading after eight innings and are one of four teams without a loss in those games (New York, Seattle, Texas)...are tied for second in the AL with six wins when trailing after seven innings and tied for third with two wins when trailing after eight.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's have won six straight and 10 of their last 11 games that were decided by two runs or fewer...are 25-13 (.658) in games decided by two runs or fewer for the season, which is tied for the third best record in the in the majors...are 14-7 (.667) in one-run games, which is fifth best in the majors...are 5-3 (.625) in extra inning games, which is tied for sixth best in the majors...the five extra inning wins are one more than the season total from last year...are 12-5 in games decided in the last at bat and the wins are third most in the majors.

AGAINST THE CENTRAL: The A's are 16-5 (.762) against American League Central teams...of the last 12 series between the A's and Central division teams dating back to June 23 of last year, the A's have won 10 series, lost one and split one...are 30-9 (.769) over that stretch...are batting .276 (203-for-735) with 128 runs scored (6.10 per games) against the Central compared to .234 with an average of 4.14 runs per game against all other teams...are now 36-14 (.720) in interdivision games compared to 12-25 (.324) against the AL West.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are batting .263 (390-for-1485) with 233 runs scored and 72 home runs in 42 games on the road compared to .226 with 168 runs and 42 home runs in 45 games at home...lead the majors in home runs on the road...rank second in the American League in runs per game on the road (5.55) and third in batting...have a 4.50 ERA (182 er in 363.2 ip) on the road compared to 3.71 at home...have allowed 59 home runs on the road, which is fourth most in the majors (Kansas City, Miami and Minnesota, 60).

HOMESTANDS AND ROAD TRIPS: The A's begin a 10-game road trip to Cleveland (three games), Houston (four games) and San Francisco (three games) tonight...it will be the A's third and final 10-game road trip of the season and it will conclude a stretch where Oakland plays 20 of 25 games on the road...are 12-3 over the first 15 games of this stretch...have a four-game road winning streak, which is one short of the season high of five (May 17-June 1)...went 8-2 on the last road trip to San Diego (2-0), Chicago-AL (2-2) and Detroit (4-0) for their most wins on a trip since Aug. 19-28, 2002 when they went 10-0 against Cleveland (4-0), Detroit (3-0) and Kansas City (3-0)...are 16-6 (.727) over the last 22 road games dating back to May 14, which is the best record in the majors (Los Angeles-NL, 13-5, .722)...are 24-18 (.571) on the road compared to 24-21 (.533) at home...have the fifth best road record in the American League...went 4-1 on the last homestand against Cleveland (2-1) and San Diego (2-0) and have won six the last seven home games.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .276 (131-for-475) with 81 runs scored over their last 14 games (5.79 per runs per game)...are hitting .245 for the season,

but have a .264 average with runners in scoring position, which is third best in the American League...are tied for fifth in the AL in home runs (114)...are tied with Toronto for the fewest sacrifice hits in the AL (2) and tied for fourth in most grounded into double plays (69).

PITCHING: The A's have allowed two runs or fewer in six of the last seven games but have a 3.43 ERA (24 er in 63.0 ip) over that span as they allowed 15 runs in the other game (last Sunday vs. Cleveland)...starting pitchers are 4-1 with a 2.34 ERA (11 er in 42.1 ip) and .211 (32-for-152) opponents batting average over the last seven games...the A's have used 25 different pitchers, which is tied for fourth most in the majors...have employed 12 starting pitchers, which is tied with the Angels for second most in the majors to Tampa Bay (13)...have issued the fourth fewest walks in the American League (250) and also have the fourth fewest strikeouts (651)...lead the AL and rank second in the majors with 51 wild pitches (Pittsburgh, 56).

ON THE BASES: A's opponents have been caught stealing 25 times, which is second most in the American League (Toronto, 26)...however, they have stolen 54 bases, which is third most in the AL...opponents are 54-for-79 (68.4%) in steal attempts, which is second lowest in the AL (Los Angeles, 52.8%)...on offense, the A's are 16-for-30 (53.3%) in stolen base attempts...have the lowest stolen base percentage in the majors, the fewest stolen bases and the fewest attempts.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed just one error in the last eight games but have 56 for the season, which is third most in the American League...have the fourth most unearned runs (31)...lead the AL with 874 assists...A's outfielders have seven assists, which is second fewest in the majors (Washington, 5).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have seven players on the disabled list (Anderson, Cahill, Cotton, Gossett, Mengden, Powell, Triggs)...Cotton and Powell are on the 60-day DL and Anderson is on a rehab assignment...have used the DL 19 times this year after using it 23 times last year...seven starting pitchers have spent time on the DL and Sean Manaea is the only A's pitcher that has not missed a start.

A'S IN JUNE: The A's went 17-10 (.630) in June, which tied for the fourth best record in the American League...went 13-12 in April and May 15-14 in May this year...this is the eighth season in Oakland history in which the A's have posted a winning record in April, May and June (1971, 1972, 1975, 1990, 2003, 2013, 2014)...the bullpen had 11 saves, which tied for second in the AL and matched the Oakland record for saves in June (1991 and 2006)...the offense scored 144 runs, which tied Houston for the most in the AL and tied for fourth in the majors...hit 43 home runs, which ranked second in the AL and in Oakland history in June (55 in 1996).

A'S vs. INDIANS: The A's lead the season series 2-1 after taking two of three in Oakland last weekend...have won seven of the last eight games in Oakland but have lost six of the last seven in Cleveland...have won three of the previous four season series and are 16-13 over that stretch...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 276-240 against the Indians...that breaks down to 148-105 in Oakland and 128-135 in Cleveland...including 43-66 at Progressive Field...all-time, the A's are 911-1033 against the Indians.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Jed Lowrie leads the American League in RBI in the seventh inning or later (24), ranks second in game-winning RBI (12), tied for third in RBI (59) and fourth in go-ahead RBI (17)... **Matt Olson** ranks second in the majors in home runs by a first baseman with 19...**Blake Treinen** has converted each of his last 19 save opportunities dating back to May 4 and has a 0.63 ERA (2 er in 28.2 ip) in 26 games total over that span...leads AL relievers in ERA (0.84) and ranks fourth in saves (22).

In **1990** the A's hit seven home runs in the second game of a doubleheader to defeat the Cleveland Indians 12-1...**Mark McGwire** and **Rickey Henderson** hit two each and **Carney Lansford**, **Jose Canseco** and **Jamie Quirk** chip in one each...in **2001** **Mark Mulder** takes a perfect game into the eighth inning and finishes with a complete game one-hitter in the A's 3-0 win at Arizona...in **2009** **Brett Anderson** tosses a two-hit shutout at Fenway Park in a 6-0 A's win and **Nomar Garciaparra** drives in the go-ahead run in his return to Boston

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Paul Blackburn (2-2, 6.46 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was reinstated from the 60-day disabled list June 7 and is scheduled to make his sixth start of 2018...tossed 6.1 shutout innings for the win in his last start and allowed one run in 6.0 innings for the win in his first start but was 0-2 with a 12.71 ERA in three starts in between...the two-game losing streak was the first of his career...was placed on the 10-day DL March 28, retroactive to March 26 with a strained right forearm...was transferred to the 60-day DL April 5 and was sent to Single-A Stockton on a rehab assignment May 31...made one start on May 31 vs. Modesto and had a no decision in the Ports 6-3 win (3.2 ip, 8 h, 3 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 1 so, 62 pitches).

STRIKEOUTS: Struck out a career-high five batters in his last start...began his career with 14 consecutive starts of four strikeouts or fewer and more than one inning pitched, which was the longest such streak by an A's pitcher in 86 years (21, Tony Freitas, May 31-Sept. 18, 1932)...has 16 strikeouts in 23.2 innings this year (6.08 strikeouts per nine innings) and 38 in 82.1 innings in his career (4.15 per nine innings).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has not walked a batter to lead off an inning...both of the home runs he has allowed are solo shots...has a .206 (13-for-63) opponents batting average with the bases empty compared to .464 (13-for-28) with runners on...has a .350 (14-for-40) opponents average the first time through the line, .184 (7-for-38) the second time and .385 (5-for-13) after that.

FIRST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 4-1 victory over Kansas City June 7 in Oakland...allowed a lead-off home run to Escobar in the third inning but that was the only run he would allow in six innings of work...retired 11 of the final 12 batters he faced following the home run.

SECOND START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 13-5 loss to Houston June 13 in Oakland...allowed a career-high eight runs in a career-low 1.1 innings...yielded three runs in the first inning on a two-run single by Gurriel and a sacrifice fly by Gattis...then surrendered five of the Astros seven runs in the second...Correa had a two-run triple and Gurriel a RBI single and he was relieved by Pagán with runners on first and second and one out...Pagan surrendered back-to-back home run.

THIRD START: He had a no decision in the A's 4-2, 10-inning win at San Diego June 19...allowed a run to score on a fielders choice in the first but Oakland came back to tie the game with a run in the second...allowed a RBI double to Lopez in the bottom of the second but those were the only runs he would allow in five innings of work...the A's tied the game in the ninth before scoring twice in the 10th for the win.

FOURTH START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 10-3 loss at Chicago (AL) on June 24...blanked the White Sox on one hit over the first four innings and had a 2-0 lead when he allowed five runs in the fifth inning, all with two outs...Moncada had a three-run double and Garcia and Abreu followed with RBI singles...then allowed a leadoff home run to Palka in the sixth and was relieved by Hendriks.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 3-1 win over Cleveland a week ago tonight in Oakland...tossed 6.1 shutout innings and allowed just three hits while walking one and hitting a batter...retired each of the final eight batters he faced and 14 of the last 15...was relieved by Buchter with one out in the seventh inning and the A's leading 2-0.

BLACKBURN vs. CLEVELAND: Is 1-0 with a 2.19 ERA (12.1 ip, 8 h, 3 r, 3 er, 5 bb, 9 so, 1 hr) in two career starts...the win came in his only start this year (see last start above)...the no decision came last year in Oakland on July 15 in a 5-3 A's win...blanked the Indians on two hits and a walk over the first three innings and had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a two-run home run to Encarnacion in the fourth...the A's tied the game with a run in the fifth but he allowed another run to score on a ground out in the sixth...was relieved by Hendriks to start the seventh inning with the A's trailing 3-2.

2017 RECAP: Made both his Triple-A and Major League debuts in 2017...spent the first three months of the season at Nashville where he went 5-6 with a 3.05 ERA in 15 games, including 14 starts...was promoted to Oakland July 1 and compiled a 3-1 record and a 3.22 ERA in 10 starts before a right hand contusion ended his season Aug. 23...struck out just 22 batters in 58.2 innings with the A's, an average of 3.38 per nine innings...that was the lowest mark in the majors among pitchers with 50 or more innings pitched...it was second lowest by an A's pitcher over the last 27 years (Saarloos, 2.99 in 2005)...went 1-1 with a 2.25 ERA and .212 opponents batting average over his first five starts through July 26...then went 2-0 despite a 4.39 ERA and .315 opponents average over his final five starts...allowed a .262 opponents batting average, including .225 (23-for-102) against left-handed hitters compared to .294 (35-for-119) against right-handers...yielded four of his five home runs to righties but issued 11 of his 16 walks to lefties...had a .585 OPS against lefties, .773 against righties...was 2-1 with a 1.47 ERA and .222 opponents batting average in five starts on the road compared to 1-0 with a 5.14 ERA and .301 opponents average in five starts at home...logged a 1.50 ERA over the first three innings of a game, a 5.02 ERA from the fourth inning on...opponents hit .133 with runners in scoring position and two outs...had a .212 opponents average the first time through the lineup, .294 after that...was 3-0 with a 2.84 ERA in five starts on four days rest, 0-1 with a 3.67 ERA in five starts on five days rest or more...allowed one run or fewer in five of his 10 starts and four runs or more four times...the A's were 6-4 (.600) in his starting assignments.

2017 WITH OAKLAND: Made his Major League debut July 1 against Atlanta and had a no decision in the A's 4-3 loss...allowed just one unearned run in 6.0 innings of work and retired 14 of the final 16 batters he faced...tossed a career-high 7.2 innings and allowed one run in the A's 7-4 victory at Seattle July 6 to earn his first ML win...walked one batter in each outing to become the first Athletics pitcher since at least 1913 to toss six or more innings, allow one run or fewer and walk one batter or fewer in each of his first two games...is the eighth Major Leaguer to do it...was charged with his first loss in a 7-5 decision at New York (NL) July 21...tossed seven scoreless innings and allowed just two hits July 26 at Toronto but had a no decision in the A's 3-2 loss...left after seven innings with a 2-0 lead but Casilla allowed three runs in the ninth for the blown save and loss...combined with Dull, Casilla and Treinen on a six-hit shutout in the A's 5-0 win at Los Angeles (AL) Aug. 5...tossed 6.2 innings and yielded five of the hits...did not walk a batter for the first time in his career...tossed 4.0 innings Aug. 16 against Kansas City to snap a career-opening streak of eight consecutive games of more than five innings pitched...that was the second longest such streak in Oakland history to Willie Adams, who had a 10-game streak in 1996...tossed 4.0 scoreless innings in his final start Aug. 22 at Baltimore and left the game early with a right hand contusion...was placed on the 10-day disabled list Aug. 25 retroactive to Aug. 23 and missed the remainder of the season...was transferred to the 60-day DL Sept. 5.

2017 WITH NASHVILLE: Ranked second in the Pacific Coast League in ERA (3.05) and fourth in opponents batting average (.231) when he was promoted to Oakland July 1...was named to the PCL Midseason All-Star team...went 4-2 with a 1.84 ERA over his last eight starts after going 1-4 with a 4.54 ERA over his first seven games (six starts)...his opponents batting average included a .216 (33-for-153) mark against right-handed hitters compared to .247 (36-for-146) against left-handers...lefties had 24 of the 32 RBI against him...allowed a .321 batting average with runners in scoring position, including .400 with RISP and two outs...was 3-4 with a 3.80 ERA and .269 opponents batting average in nine games at home, 2-2 with a 2.08 ERA and .177 opponents average in six starts on the road...surrendered five of his six home runs at home...was 4-3 with a 2.54 ERA in 11 games at night, 1-3 with a 4.30 ERA in four starts during the day...compiled a 3.95 ERA over the first three innings of the game, a 2.09 ERA from the fourth inning on.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Edwin Jackson (1-0, 2.13 ERA): Was selected by Oakland June 25 and is scheduled to make his third start of the season...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 7-2 A's win over Cleveland last Saturday in Oakland (6.2 ip, 2 h, 2 r, 2 er, 6 so)...it was the 99th win of his career...has now won at least one game with 11 different teams...is 10-1 with a 2.76 ERA (91.1 ip, 86 h, 31 r, 28 er, 35 bb, 79 so, 9 hr) in 16 career appearances, including 14 starts, against Cleveland...the 10 wins match his most against any team (Pittsburgh)...has a 10-game winning streak against the Indians, which is the longest by any pitcher since Charlie Hough won 13 straight from June 30, 1984-April 4, 1988...is 5-0 with a 1.90 ERA in eight games at Progressive Field...signed a minor league contract with the Washington Nationals on Jan. 11 and began the season at Triple-A Syracuse...was released June 1 (contract opt-out) and signed a minor league deal with the A's June 6.

Saves/Opportunities: 26-for-32 (81.3%)

- Prior to Sunday's loss, the A's bullpen had recorded the save in each of the previous six games, which matched the longest such streak in Oakland history (third time, last: April 16-22, 2016).
- Had 11 saves in June, which tied for second in the American League and matched the Oakland record (1991 and 2006).
- Has converted 26-of-32 (81.3%) save opportunities, which is the best save percentage in the majors...is third in the American League in saves but has the fifth fewest save opportunities.
- Has a 3.20 ERA (54 er in 152.0 ip) and .206 (115-for-557) opponents batting average over its last 42 games dating back to May 18...posted a 4.05 ERA and .273 opponents average over its first 43 contests.
- Has the fifth lowest ERA in the AL (3.63)...ranks first in winning percentage (21-7, .750), first in wins (20) and third in innings (309.2).
- Has a 4.16 ERA (69 er in 149.1 ip) on road, 3.14 (56 er in 160.1 ip) at home.

- Placed on the 10-day DL April 27 with a strain left shoulder.
- Has an ERA of 1.13 (8.0 ip, 1 er) at home, while owning a 4.26 ERA (3 er in 6.1 ip) on the road.
