## OAKLAND ATHLETICS (48-40) VS. CLEVELAND INDIANS (49-37)

SATURDAY, JULY 7, 2018 — PROGRESSIVE FIELD — 4:10 P.M. EDT RHP EDWIN JACKSON (1-0, 2.13) VS. RHP COREY KLUBER (12-4, 2.64) NBCSCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won eight of the last 10 and 14 of the last 18 games to improve to a season-high eight games over .500 at 48-40 (.545)...that is the third best record in the American League West, the sixth best record in the AL and the 11th best record in the majors...are 5-0-1 over the last six series and the six series unbeaten streak is the longest by an A's team since winning six straight series from Aug. 26-Sept. 15, 2013...remain in sole possession of third place in the AL West for the 11th consecutive day...are 10 games behind first place Houston and 7½ games behind the second Wild Card team, Seattle...spent every day alone in fourth in the West from April 25 to June 24...have spent one day tied for first, one day tied for second, 11 days in third, three days tied for third, 78 days in fourth and seven days tied for fourth... had their season-high six-game winning streak snapped on Sunday.

THE LATE INNINGS: The A's scored twice in the eighth inning on Wednesday to break a 2-2 tie in a 4-2 win over San Diego...have scored the winning run in the eighth inning or later in eight of their last 18 wins (eighth inning four times, ninth inning twice, 10th inning once, 11th inning once)...tied for the Major League lead with 61 runs in the eighth inning (Houston), rank second with 44 runs in the ninth (Atlanta, 47) and are fourth with 152 runs in the seventh inning or later...are batting .263 (266-for-112) in the seventh inning or later, which ranks second in the American League (Houston, .269), compared to .236 (472-for-1996) in innings 1-6, which is third lowest...have compiled a 3.49 ERA (103 er in 265.2 ip) in the seventh inning or later, which is fourth lowest in the AL, compared to a 4.47 ERA (262 er in 528.0 ip) over the first six innings...are 33-0 when leading after seven innings and are the only team in the majors that has not lost a game when leading after seven... are 40-0 when leading after eight innings and are one of four teams without a loss in those games (New York, Seattle, Texas)...are tied for second in the AL with six wins when trailing after seven innings and tied for third with two wins when trailing after eight.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's have won six straight and 10 of their last 11 games that were decided by two runs or fewer...are 25-13 (.658) in games decided by two runs or fewer for the season, which is tied for the third best record in the in the majors...are 14-7 (.667) in one-run games, which is fifth best in the majors...are 5-3 (.625) in extra inning games, which is tied for sixth best in the majors...the five extra inning wins are one more than the season total from last year...are 12-5 in games decided in the last at bat and the wins are third most in the majors.

AGAINST THE CENTRAL: The A's are 16-6 (.727) against American League Central teams...of the last 12 series between the A's and Central division teams dating back to June 23 of last year, the A's have won 10 series, lost one and split one...are 30-10 (.750) over that stretch...are batting .278 (214-for-770) with 132 runs scored (6.00 per games) against the Central compared to .234 with an average of 4.14 runs per game against all other teams...are now 36-15 (.706) in interdivision games compared to 12-25 (.324) against the AL

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are batting .263 (401-for-1520) with 237 runs scored and 74 home runs in 43 games on the road compared to .226 with 168 runs and 42 home runs in 45 games at home...lead the majors in home runs on the road...rank second in the American League in runs per game on the road (5.51) and second in batting...have a 4.63 ERA (191 er in 371.2 ip) on the road compared to 3.71 at home...have allowed 59 home runs on the road, which is fourth most in the majors

HOMESTANDS AND ROAD TRIPS: The A's continue a 10-game road trip to Cleveland (three games, 0-1), Houston (four games) and San Francisco (three games) tonight...it will be the A's third and final 10-game road trip of the season and it will conclude a stretch where Oakland plays 20 of 25 games on the road...are 12-4 over the first 16 games of this stretch...before last night's loss, had a four-game road winning streak, which was one short of the season high of five (May 17-June 1)...went 8-2 on the last road trip to San Diego (2-0), Chicago-AL (2-2) and Detroit (4-0) for their most wins on a trip since Aug. 19-28, 2002 when they went 10-0 against Cleveland (4-0), Detroit (3-0) and Kansas City (3-0)...are 16-7 (.696) over the last 23 road games dating back to May 14, which is the best record in the majors (Los Angeles-NL, 13-6, .684)...are 24-19 (.558) on the road compared to 24-21 (.533) at home... have the fifth best road record in the American League...went 4-1 on the last homestand against Cleveland (2-1) and San Diego (2-0) and have won six the last seven home games.

*OFFENSE:* The A's are batting .276 (142-for-510) with 85 runs scored over their last 15 games (5.67 per runs per game)...are hitting .245 for the season, but have a .263 average with runners in scoring position, which is third best in the American League...are tied for fourth in the AL in home runs (116)...are tied with Toronto for the fewest sacrifice hits in the AL (2) and tied for fourth in most grounded into double plays (70).

*PITCHING:* The A's have allowed two runs or fewer in six of the last eight games but have a 4.18 ERA (33 er in 71.0 ip) over that span as they allowed 25 runs in the other games, both against Cleveland...before Blackburn's five ER outing last night, starting pitchers were 4-1 with a 2.34 ERA (11 er in 42.1 ip) and .211 (32-for-152) opponents batting average over the previous seven games...have employed 12 starting pitchers, which is tied with the Angels for second most in the majors to Tampa Bay (13)...have issued the fifth fewest walks in the American League (253) and also have the fourth fewest strikeouts (655)...lead the AL and rank second in the majors with 53 wild pitches (Pittsburgh, 59).

**ON THE BASES:** A's opponents have been caught stealing 25 times, which is second most in the American League (Toronto, 26)...however, they have stolen 58 bases, which is third most in the AL...opponents are 58-for-83 (69.9%) in steal attempts, which is fourth lowest in the AL...on offense, the A's are 16-for-30 (53.3%) in stolen base attempts...have the lowest stolen base percentage in the majors, the fewest stolen bases and the fewest attempts.

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed just two errors in the last nine games but have 57 for the season, which is third most in the American League...tied for the third most unearned runs (32)...lead the AL with 883 assists...A's outfielders have seven assists, which is second fewest in the majors (Washington, 5).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have eight players on the disabled list (Anderson, Cahill, Cotton, Gossett, Joyce, Mengden, Powell, Triggs)...Cotton and Powell are on the 60-day DL and Anderson is on a rehab assignment...have used the DL 20 times this year after using it 23 times last year...seven starting pitchers have spent time on the DL and Sean Manaea is the only A's pitcher that has not missed a start.

A's IN JUNE: The A's went 17-10 (.630) in June, which tied for the fourth best record in the American League...went 13-12 in April and May 15-14 in May this year...this is the eighth season in Oakland history in which the A's have posted a winning record in April, May and June (1971, 1972, 1975, 1990, 2003, 2013, 2014)...the bullpen had 11 saves, which tied for second in the AL and matched the Oakland record for saves in June (1991 and 2006)...the offense scored 144 runs, which tied Houston for the most in the AL and tied for fourth in the majors...hit 43 home runs, which ranked second in the AL and in Oakland history in June (55 in 1996).

**A's vs. INDIANS:** The season series is tied 2-2 after last night's A's loss...Oakland took two of three at home last weekend...have won seven of the last eight games in Oakland but have lost seven of the last eight in Cleveland... have won three of the previous four season series and are 16-13 over that stretch...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 276-241 against the Indians...that breaks down to 148-105 in Oakland and 128-136 in Cleveland... including 43-67 at Progressive Field...all-time, the A's are 911-1034 against the Indians.

## TODAY'S TIDBITS

Jed Lowrie is second in the American League in RBI in the seventh inning or later (24), ranks second in game-winning RBI (12), tied for fifth in RBI (59) and fourth in go-ahead RBI (17)... Matt Olson ranks tied for first in the majors in home runs by a first baseman with 19...Blake Treinen has converted each of his last 19 save opportunities dating back to May 4 and has a 0.63 ERA (2 er in 28.2 ip) in 26 games total over that span...leads AL relievers in ERA (0.84) and ranks fourth in saves (22).

#### OAKLAND A'S 50th ANNIVERSARY MOMENTS

In 1986 the A's defeat Boston 6-4 in Tony La Russa's first game as A's manager...Dave Stewart picks up his first of 116 wins as an Oakland Athletic and Jose Canseco hits his 20th homer...in 1994 the A's use a club record eight pitchers in a 6-4, nine inning win at Baltimore...four of them face one hitter each and Bob Welch, Dave Leiper, Bill Taylor and Ed Vosberg all pitch in the seventh inning...in 2002 the A's defeat Kansas City 3-2, their Oakland record setting seventh consecutive one-run game.

## TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Edwin Jackson (1-0, 2.13 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was selected by Oakland June 25 and is scheduled to make his third start of the season... signed a minor league contract with the Washington Nationals on Jan. 11 and began the season at Triple-A Syracuse...was 4-2 with a 3.40 ERA and .238 opponents batting average in 10 starts with the Chiefs when he was released June 1 (contract opt-out)..

signed a minor league deal with the A's June 6 and was assigned to Triple-A Nashville...went 0-1 with a 4.02 ERA and .207 opponents average in three starts with the Sounds...was 4-3 with a 3.53 ERA in 13 minor league starts

99 WINS: Defeated Cleveland in his last start a week ago today for the 99th win of his career and needs one more victory for 100 career...the last pitcher to record his 100th career victory in an A's uniform is Brett Tomko on Sept. 14, 2009 at Texas...has now won at least one game with 11 different teams.

16 SEASONS AND 13 TEAMS: Begins his 16th season in the majors with his 13th team (Los Angeles-NL, Tampa Bay, Detroit, Arizona, Chicago-AL, St. Louis, Washington, Chicago-NL, Atlanta, Miami, San Diego, Baltimore)...has tied Octavio Dotel's Major League record for teams played for in a career.

FIRST START: He had a no decision in the A's 5-4 win at Detroit on June 25... blanked the Tigers on one hit over the first three innings before allowing a RBI single to Hicks in the fourth...that was the only run he would allow in six innings of work...the A's tied the game with a run in the seventh and he was relieved by Petit to start the bottom of the seventh.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 7-2 win over Cleveland a week ago today in Oakland...retired each of the first nine batters he faced before allowing a lead off home run to Lindor in the fourth...one out later, Ramirez added a solo shot but he then retired each of the final 10 batters he faced...was relieved by Buchter with two outs in the seventh inning and the A's leading 3-2.

JACKSON vs. CLEVELAND: Is 10-1 with a 2.76 ERA (91.1 ip, 86 h, 31 r, 28 er, 35 bb, 79 so, 9 hr) in 16 career appearances, including 14 starts...the 10 wins match his most against any team (Pittsburgh)...has a 10-game winning streak against the Indians, which is the longest by any pitcher since Charlie Hough won 13 straight from June 30, 1984-April 4, 1988...is 5-0 with a 1.90 ERA (10 er in 47.1 ip) in eight games at Progressive Field, 5-1 with a 3.68 ERA (18 er in 44.0 ip) in seven games in his home ballparks...is 10-1 with a 2.49 ERA (27 er in 86.2 ip) in his 14 starts...was the winning pitcher in

JACKSON'S CAREER HIGHS

Tampa Bay farm system...had no decisions and a 5.09 ERA in four starts in April...then went 4-3 with a 3.02 ERA over his final nine starts...surrendered five home runs in 71.1 innings...allowed a .232 opponents batting average, including .221 (32-for-145) by right-handed hitters compared to .244 (31-for-127) by left-handed hitters...surrendered four of his five home runs to lefties...had a .266 (41-for-154) opponents average with the bases empty compared to .186 (22-for-118) with runners on...three of the five home runs he allowed were solo shots...yielded a .174 (12-for-69) average with runners in scoring position...opponents were 11-for-64 (.172) with eight walks (.264 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning...went 1-for-5 with a double, walk and two strikeouts as a hitter, including 1-for-2 with a double and a walk in three pinch hitting appearances...allowed one run or fewer in seven of his 13 starts.

WITH SYRACUSE: Issued a season-high six walks in his first start April 9 at Rochester...allowed a season-high five runs in a season-low 2.2 innings April 21 at Louisville but had a no decision...finished April with no decisions and a 5.09 ERA in four starts...then went 4-2 with a 2.61 ERA in six starts in May. struck out a season-high nine batters in 6.0 innings May 3 at Buffalo but took the loss...was credited with his first win of the season May 8 against Scranton/Wilkes-Barre when he allowed a run in 6.0 innings in a 4-1 win... won again in his next start on May 13 against Pawtucket...tossed a seasonhigh 7.0 innings in back-to-back starts on the 13th and May 19 against Lehigh Valley...took the loss on the 19th when he surrendered a season-high eight hits, but then won each of his final two starts in May on the 24 at Buffalo and the 29 against Toledo...finished May with a 4-2 record and a 2.61 ERA in six starts.

WITH NASHVILLE: Allowed just one run in 6.0 innings in his first start with the Sounds, but took the loss in a 1-0 decision to Tacoma June 9...matched his season-high by allowing five runs in 4.0 innings at El Paso on June 14.

2017 RECAP: Pitched for Baltimore and Washington and combined for a 5-6 record and a 5.21 ERA in 16 games, including 13 starts...allowed a .284 opponents batting average ...39 of his 86 hits allowed were for extra bases and opponents slugged .548, which was the second highest mark of his career (.574 in 2004)...had a .891 OPS, which was also second highest in his career (.949 in 2004)...his opponents batting average included a .274 (40-for-146) mark against left-handed hitters compared to .293 (46-for-157) against right-handers...surrendered 14 of his 20 home runs to righties for a .631 slugging percentage (.459 vs. righties)...13 of the 20 home runs were solo shots...11 came in the first two innings of the game...held the opposition to a .146 batting average with two strikes...was 5-6 with a 5.07 ERA in his 13 starting assignments, 0-0 with a 7.20 ERA in three relief appearances... stranded his only inherited runner and first batters faced were 1-for-3...went 2-for-21 (.095) with 15 strikeouts and three runs scored as a batter...signed a minor league contract with Baltimore April 7...was assigned to Triple-A Norfolk May 7 and had two saves and a 3.10 ERA in 12 games, including one start, with the Tides when he was selected by Baltimore June 7...made three relief appearances with the Orioles and had a 7.20 ERA and .458 opponents batting average when he was designated for assignment June 11...refused an outright assignment June 13 to become a free agent and signed a minor league deal with Washington June 15...was assigned to Triple-A Syracuse and went 2-0 with a 0.44 ERA and .130 opponents batting average in five games, four starts, before he was selected by the Nationals July 18...spent the remainder of the season with Washington and went 5-6 with a 5.07 ERA in 13 starts...combined for a 5-3 record and a 2.94 ERA in eight starts in July and August but then went 0-3 with a 9.82 ERA in five starts in September.

#### TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Frankie Montas (4-2, 3.83 ERA): Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville May 27 for his first stint with the A's this year...went 3-0 with a 1.25 ERA and .208 opponents batting average in his first three starts but is 1-2 with a 7.20 ERA and .367 opponents average in four starts since then...walked three batters in 21.2 innings over his first three starts but has issued 10 free passes in 20.2 innings since then...the A's are 5-2 in his starting assignments...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 15-3 A's loss to Cleveland last Sunday in Oakland (5.2 ip, 9 h, 3 r, 3 er, 6 so)...is 0-1 with a 4.35 ERA (10.1 ip, 13 h, 5 r, 5 er, 2 bb, 9 so, 1 hr) in four career appearances, including one start against Cleveland...went 1-5 with a 4.39 ERA in nine starts, including one complete game, with Nashville...was 0-3 with a 6.19 ERA in five starts in April and tossed four innings or fewer four times...then went 1-2 with a 3.24 ERA in four starts in May and tossed at least five innings in each start.

## ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

21-7, 3.70 ERA (129 er in 313.2 ip) Saves/Opportunities: 26-for-32 (81.3%)

- Prior to Sunday's loss, the A's bullpen had recorded the save in each of the previous six games, which matched the longest such streak in Oakland history (third time, last: April 16-22, 2016).
- Had 11 saves in June, which tied for second in the American League and matched the Oakland record (1991 and 2006).
- Has converted 26-of-32 (81.3%) save opportunities, which is the best save percentage in the majors...is third in the American League in saves butare
- tied for fourth in fewest save chances.

  Has a 3.35 ERA (58 er in 156.0 ip) and .207 (118-for-569) opponents batting average over its last 42 games dating back to May 18...posted a 4.05 ERA and .273 opponents average over its first 43 contests.
