OAKLAND ATHLETICS (49-40) VS. CLEVELAND INDIANS (49-38)

SUNDAY, JULY 8, 2018 — PROGRESSIVE FIELD — 1:10 P.M. EDT

ABOUT THE A'S: After last night's extra-innings win, the A's have won nine of the last 11 and 15 of the last 19 games to improve to a season-high nine games over .500 at 49-40 (.551)...that is the third best record in the American League West, the sixth best record in the AL and the 11th best record in the majors...are 5-0-1 over the last six series and the six series unbeaten streak is the longest by an A's team since winning six straight series from Aug. 26-Sept. 15, 2013...remain in sole possession of third place in the AL West for the 12th consecutive day...are 10 games behind first place Houston and 6½ games behind the second Wild Card team, Seattle...spent every day alone in fourth in the West from April 25 to June 24...have spent one day tied for first, one day tied for second, 12 days in third, three days tied for third, 78 days in fourth and seven days tied for fourth...had their season-high six-game winning streak snapped last Sunday.

THE LATE INNINGS: The A's scored three times in the eighth inning yesterday to tie the game at three...have scored the winning run in the eighth inning or later in nine of their last 19 wins (eighth inning four times, ninth inning twice, 10th inning once, 11th inning twice)...tied for the Major League lead with 64 runs in the eighth inning (Houston), rank second with 44 runs in the ninth (Atlanta, 47) and are fourth with 158 runs in the seventh inning or later...are batting .265 (274-for-1034) in the seventh inning or later, which ranks second in the American League (Houston, .272), compared to .236 (476-for-2017) in innings 1-6, which is third lowest...have compiled a 3.42 ERA (103 er in 270.2 ip) in the seventh inning or later, which is third lowest in the AL, compared to a 4.45 ERA (264 er in 534.0 ip) over the first six innings...are 33-0 when leading after seven innings and are the only team in the majors that has not lost a game when leading after seven...are 40-0 when leading after eight innings.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's have won six straight and 10 of their last 11 games that were decided by two runs or fewer...are 25-13 (.658) in games decided by two runs or fewer for the season...are 14-7 (.667) in one-run games, which is fifth best in the majors...are 6-3 (.667) in extra inning games...the six extra inning wins are two more than the season total from last year...are 12-5 in games decided in the last at bat and the wins are third most in the majors.

AGAINST THE CENTRAL: The A's are 17-6 (.739) against American League Central teams...of the last 12 series between the A's and Central division teams dating back to June 23 of last year, the A's have won 10 series, lost one and split one...are 31-10 (.756) over that stretch...are batting .278 (226-for-813) with 138 runs scored (6.00 per game) against the Central compared to .234 with an average of 4.14 runs per game against all other teams...are now 37-15 (.712) in interdivision games compared to 12-25 (.324) against the AL West.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are batting .264 (413-for-1563) with 243 runs scored and 77 home runs in 44 games on the road compared to .226 with 168 runs and 42 home runs in 45 games at home...lead the majors in home runs on the road...rank second in the American League in runs per game on the road (5.52) and second in batting...have a 4.54 ERA (193 er in 382.2 ip) on the road compared to 3.71 at home...have allowed 59 home runs on the road, which is fourth most in the majors

HOMESTANDS AND ROAD TRIPS: The A's continue a 10-game road trip to Cleveland (three games, 1-1), Houston (four games) and San Francisco (three games) today...it will be the A's third and final 10-game road trip of the season and it will conclude a stretch where Oakland plays 20 of 25 games on the road...are 13-4 over the first 17 games of this stretch...before this Cleveland series, the A's had a four-game road winning streak, which was one short of the season high of five (May 17-June 1)...went 8-2 on the last road trip to San Diego (2-0), Chicago-AL (2-2) and Detroit (4-0) for their most wins on a trip since Aug. 19-28, 2002 when they went 10-0 against Cleveland (4-0), Detroit (3-0) and Kansas City (3-0)...are 17-7 (.708) over the last 24 road games dating back to May 14...are 25-19 (.568) on the road compared to 24-21 (.533) at home...have the fourth best road record in the American League...went 4-1 on the last homestand against Cleveland (2-1) and San Diego (2-0) and have won six the last seven home games.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .278 (154-for-553) with 91 runs scored over their last 16 games (5.69 per runs per game)...are hitting .246 for the season, but have a .260 average with runners in scoring position, which is fourth best in the American League...are tied for third in the AL in home runs (119)...

are tied for the second fewest sacrifice hits in the AL (3) after collecting their third of the season yesterday...tied for fourth in most grounded into double plays (72)...tied for the fourth fewest infield hits in the American League.

PITCHING: The A's have allowed two runs or fewer in six of the last nine games but have a 3.95 ERA (36 er in 82.0 ip) over that span as they allowed 28 runs in the other games, all against Cleveland...before Blackburn's five ER outing on Friday, starting pitchers were 4-1 with a 2.34 ERA (11 er in 42.1 ip) and .211 (32-for-152) opponents batting average over the previous seven games...have employed 12 starting pitchers, which is tied with the Angels for second most in the majors to Tampa Bay (13)...are tied for the fourth fewest walks issued in the American League (257) and also have the fourth fewest strikeouts (663)...lead the AL and rank second in the majors with 53 wild pitches (Pittsburgh, 59).

ON THE BASES: A's opponents have been caught stealing 26 times, which is tied for the most in the American League (Toronto)...however, they have stolen 60 bases, which is third most in the AL...opponents are 60-for-86 (72.1%) in steal attempts, which is third lowest in the AL...on offense, the A's are 17-for-32 (53.1%) in stolen base attempts...have the lowest stolen base percentage in the majors, the fewest stolen bases and the fewest attempts.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed just three errors in the last 10 games but have 58 for the season, which is third most in the American League...tied for the third most unearned runs (33)...lead the AL with 896 assists...A's outfielders have seven assists, which is second fewest in the majors (Washington, 5).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have eight players on the disabled list (Blackburn, Cahill, Cotton, Gossett, Joyce, Mengden, Powell, Triggs)...Cotton and Powell are on the 60-day DL and Blackburn just joined today...have used the DL 21 times this year after using it 23 times last year...seven starting pitchers have spent time on the DL and Sean Manaea is the only A's pitcher that has not missed a start.

A'S IN JUNE: The A's went 17-10 (.630) in June, which tied for the fourth best record in the American League...went 13-12 in April and May 15-14 in May this year...this is the eighth season in Oakland history in which the A's have posted a winning record in April, May and June (1971, 1972, 1975, 1990, 2003, 2013, 2014)...the bullpen had 11 saves, which tied for second in the AL and matched the Oakland record for saves in June (1991 and 2006)...the offense scored 144 runs, which tied Houston for the most in the AL and tied for fourth in the majors...hit 43 home runs, which ranked second in the AL and in Oakland history in June (55 in 1996).

A'S vs. INDIANS: The A's lead the season series 3-2 after last night's win...Oakland took two of three at home last weekend...have won seven of the last eight games in Oakland but have lost seven of the last nine in Cleveland...have won three of the previous four season series and are 16-13 over that stretch...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 277-241 against the Indians...that breaks down to 148-105 in Oakland and 129-136 in Cleveland...including 44-67 at Progressive Field...all-time, the A's are 912-1034 against the Indians.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Jed Lowrie leads the American League in RBI in the seventh inning or later (26), ranks second in game-winning RBI (12), tied for fifth in RBI (61) and tied for fourth in go-ahead RBI (17)... **Matt Olson** leads the American League and is second in the Majors in home runs by a first baseman with 19 (Goldschmidt, ARI 20)...**Blake Treinen** has converted each of his last 19 save opportunities dating back to May 4 and has a 0.59 ERA (2 er in 30.2 ip) in 27 games total over that span...leads AL relievers in ERA (0.81) and ranks fourth in saves (22)...**Khris Davis** has a nine-game hitting streak during which he is 13-for-36 (.361)...snapped an 18-game homerless streak yesterday, the second longest such streak of his career.

OAKLAND A'S 50th ANNIVERSARY MOMENTS

In **1993** Troy Neel homers twice and drives in seven runs but the A's still lose 11-9 to Boston...in **2013** Grant Balfour records his 41st consecutive save in the A's 2-1 win at Pittsburgh to break Dennis Eckersley's club record for consecutive saves.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Brett Anderson (0-2, 7.63 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was reinstated from the 10-day disabled list today and is scheduled to make his fifth start of the season...was signed by the A's to a minor league contract March 19 and began the season at Triple-A Nashville...went 1-1 with a 1.89 ERA in four starts with the Sounds before he was selected by Oakland May 2...allowed two runs in 6.1 innings in his first start that day at Seattle...then went 0-2 with an 11.00 ERA and .465 opponents batting average over his next three starts before going on the DL May 19 with a strained left shoulder...began a rehab assignment with Nashville June 23 and went 1-0 with a 4.05 ERA in three starts.

FIRST START: He had a no decision in the A's 3-2 win at Seattle May 2...allowed his only two runs in the third inning on a leadoff home run by Healy and a RBI single by Segura...retired 11 straight before allowing back-to-back singles to Haniger and Seager with one out in the seventh...was relieved by Dull with Oakland trailing 2-0 but the A's scored twice in the eighth to get him off the hook and once in the ninth for the win.

SECOND START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 16-2 loss to Houston on May 7 in Oakland...allowed nine runs on 10 hits in 3.0 innings...yielded a two-run single to Gonzalez in the first and a three-run home run to Springer in the second...then allowed a RBI double to Stassi and a RBI single to Altuve in the fourth and was relieved by Hatcher with runners on first and second and no outs...Hatcher allowed both runs to score plus two more of his own.

THIRD START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-2 loss at New York (AL) May 13...allowed three runs in the first inning on a two-run single by Stanton and a RBI single by Hicks...Oakland scored a run in the fifth, but he allowed a run in the bottom of the fifth on a Stanton home run...left after five innings trailing 4-1.

LAST MAJOR LEAGUE START: He had a no decision in the A's 3-1 win at Toronto on May 18...tossed just one inning and did not allow a run, despite surrendering two hits...left the game early with a strained left shoulder.

ANDERSON vs. CLEVELAND: Is 2-0 with a 0.96 ERA (28.0 ip, 16 h, 3 r, 3 er, 4 bb, 25 so, 0 hr) in four career starts...is 1-0 with a 1.29 ERA (3 er in 21.0 ip) in three starts in Oakland and 1-0 with a 0.00 ERA (0 er in 7.0 ip) in one start in Cleveland...last faced the Indians on Aug. 27, 2012 when combined with Ryan Cook and Grant Balfour on a two-hit shutout in the A's 3-0 win at Progressive Field...allowed both of the hits and tossed 7.0 innings...yielded a one-out single to Brantley in the fifth and a leadoff double to Lillibridge in the sixth.

2017 RECAP: Was signed by the Chicago Cubs Jan. 30 and went 2-2 with an 8.18 ERA in six starts before going on the disabled list May 7 with a strained lower back...missed nearly three months of the season and would not pitch for the Cubs again as he was released July 31...signed a minor league deal with Toronto Aug. 15 and returned to the majors Aug. 29...went 2-2 with a 5.13 ERA in seven starts for the Blue Jays and combined with both clubs for a 404 record and a 6.34 ERA in 13 starts...allowed a .322 opponents batting average, including .298 (56-for-188) against right-handed hitters compared to .436 (17-for-39) against left-handers...surrendered all five of his home runs to righties...yielded a .371 batting average with runners in scoring position...opponents hit .345 when leading off an inning, but he issued just one walk...went 1-2 with a 15.68 ERA in four starts at Wrigley Field and 1-2 with a 7.62 ERA in three starts in Rogers Centre for an 11.19 ERA in seven starts in his home ballparks...was 2-0 with a 2.81 ERA in six starts on the road...was 2-0 with a 2.05 ERA in four starts during the day, 2-4 with a 9.18 ERA in nine starts at night...was 1-1 with an 8.84 ERA in five starts on four days rest, 3-3 with a 5.00 ERA in eight starts on five days rest or more...had a 7.04 ERA over the first two innings of his starts, 3.06 after that...opponents were successful in 6-of-7 (85.7%) stolen base attempts...allowed five runs in 0.1 innings for the loss in his only interleague start and is now 1-6 with a 5.76 ERA (29 er in 45.1 ip) in nine career interleague starts...went 1-for-7 (.143) with a RBI, walk and three strikeouts in eight plate appearances with the Cubs.

MORE 2017: Was in the Cubs starting rotation to open the season and allowed just one run over his first two starts...struck out a season-high five batters and allowed six runs on a season-high eight hits in 3.2 innings on April 18 against Milwaukee, but had a no decision in a 9-7 win...walked a career-high six batters April 24 at Pittsburgh, but allowed three runs in a season-high 6.0 innings for the win...finished April 2-0 with a 3.54 ERA in four starts...then allowed seven runs on seven hits in 1.1 innings May 1 against Philadelphia and five runs in 0.1 innings on May 6 against New York (AL), both losses...was placed on the 10-day disabled list May 7 with a strained lower back...it was his 10th career stint on the DL...was transferred to the 60-day DL June 8...went 2-2 with a 4.61 ERA in six games, including five starts, on a rehab assignment with Double-A Tennessee from June 25 to July 23...was reinstated from the DL and designated for assignment July 26...was released July 31 and signed a minor league deal with Toronto Aug. 15...went 1-1 with a 0.93 ERA in two starts with Triple-A Buffalo before he was selected by the Blue Jays Aug. 29...started and lost that day to Boston, despite allowing just one run in 5.2 innings...tossed a season-high tying 6.0 innings in his next two starts on Sept. 3 at Baltimore and Sept. 9 against Detroit...picked up his first win as a Blue Jay and matched his season-best with five strikeouts in the start against the Tigers...yielded a season-high eight runs on seven hits and two walks in 1.1 innings in a 15-5 loss to Kansas City on Sept. 25...then had a win and a 2.70 ERA over his final two starts.

RHP Frankie Montas (4-2, 3.83 ERA):	Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville May 27 for his first stint with the A's this year...went 3-0 with a 1.25 ERA and .208 opponents batting average in his first three starts but is 1-2 with a 7.20 ERA and .367 opponents average in four starts since then...walked three batters in 21.2 innings over his first three starts but has issued 10 free passes in 20.2 innings since then...the A's are 5-2 in his starting assignments...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 15-3 A's loss to Cleveland last Sunday in Oakland (5.2 ip, 9 h, 3 r, 3 er, 6 so)...is 0-1 with a 12.27 ERA (7.1 ip, 16 h, 12 r, 10 er, 5 bb, 3 so, 2 hr) in three career appearances, including one start, against Houston...went 1-5 with a 4.39 ERA in nine starts, including one complete game, with Nashville...was 0-3 with a 6.19 ERA in five starts in April and tossed four innings or fewer four times...then went 1-2 with a 3.24 ERA in four starts in May and tossed at least five innings in each start.
