OAKLAND ATHLETICS (50-40) VS. HOUSTON ASTROS (61-31)

MONDAY, JULY 9, 2018 — MINUTE MAID PARK — 7:10 P.M. CDT

ABOUT THE A'S: After yesterday's 6-0 win in Cleveland, the A's have won 10 of the last 12 and 16 of the last 20 games to improve to a season-high 10 games over .500 at 50-40 (.556)...that is the third best record in the American League West, the sixth best record in the AL and the 11th best record in the majors...are 6-0-1 over the last six series and the seven series unbeaten streak is the longest by an A's team since winning nine series from 5/17-6/13, 2013...remain in sole possession of third place in the AL West for the 13th consecutive day...are 10 games behind first place Houston and 6½ games behind the second Wild Card team, Seattle...spent every day alone in fourth in the West from April 25 to June 24...have spent one day tied for first, one day tied for second, 13 days in third, three days tied for third, 78 days in fourth and seven days tied for fourth.

HEY NOW: RHP Blake Treinen is an All-Star for the first time in his career...he will represent the Oakland Athletics at the exhibition on July 17 in Washington, D.C....he has converted each of his last 19 save opportunities dating back to May 4 and has a 0.59 ERA (2 er in 30.2 ip) in 27 games total over that span...leads Major League relievers in ERA (0.81) and ranks tied for fourth in the American League in saves (22)...was named AL Reliever of the Month for May, the first monthly award of his career.

THE LATE INNINGS: The A's scored three times in the eighth inning on Saturday to tie the game at three...have scored the winning run in the eighth inning or later in nine of their last 20 wins (eighth inning four times, ninth inning twice, 10th inning once, 11th inning twice)...lead the Major Leagues with 65 runs in the eighth inning, rank second with 44 runs in the ninth (Atlanta, 49) and are second with 160 runs in the seventh inning or later (Houston, 168)...are batting .266 (278-for-1047) in the seventh inning or later, which ranks second in the American League (Houston, .272), compared to .237 (484-for-2043) in innings 1-6, which is third lowest...have compiled a 3.39 ERA (103 er in 273.2 ip) in the seventh inning or later, which is third lowest in the AL, compared to a 4.40 ERA (264 er in 540.0 ip) over the first six innings...are 34-0 when leading after seven innings and are the only team in the majors that has not lost a game when leading after seven...are 41-0 when leading after eight innings.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's have won six straight and 10 of their last 11 games that were decided by two runs or fewer...are 25-13 (.658) in games decided by two runs or fewer for the season...are 14-7 (.667) in one-run games, which is fourth best in the majors...are 6-3 (.667) in extra inning games...the six extra inning wins are two more than the season total from last year...are 12-5 in games decided in the last at bat.

THE WEST AND THE REST: The A's have won two consecutive games against the AL West after losing six straight...are 12-25 (.324) against the West compared to 38-15 (.717) against all other teams...are batting .228 (280-for-1228) and are averaging 3.65 runs per game (135 runs in 37 games) against the AL West, .259 (482-for-1862) with an average of 5.32 runs per game (282 runs in 53 games) against everyone else...the pitching staff has a 5.04 ERA (183 er in 327.0 ip) against the AL West, 3.40 (184 er in 486.2 ip) against all other teams.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are batting .265 (425-for-1602) with 249 runs scored and 79 home runs in 45 games on the road compared to .226 with 168 runs and 42 home runs in 45 games at home...lead the majors in home runs on the road...rank second in the American League in runs per game on the road (5.53) and second in batting...have a 4.43 ERA (193 er in 391.2 ip) on the road compared to 3.71 at home...have allowed 59 home runs on the road, which is fifth most in the majors

HOMESTANDS AND ROAD TRIPS: The A's continue a 10-game road trip to Cleveland (three games, 2-1), Houston (four games) and San Francisco (three games) today...it will be the A's third and final 10-game road trip of the season and it will conclude a stretch where Oakland plays 20 of 25 games on the road...are 14-4 over the first 18 games of this stretch...the A's had a four-game road winning streak before losing to Cleveland on Friday, which was one short of the season high of five (May 17-June 1)...have won both road games since then...went 8-2 on the last road trip to San Diego (2-0), Chicago-AL (2-2) and Detroit (4-0) for their most wins on a trip since Aug. 19-28, 2002 when they went 10-0 against Cleveland (4-0), Detroit (3-0) and Kansas City (3-0)...are 18-7 (.720) over the last 25 road games dating back to May 14...are 26-19 (.578) on the road compared to 24-21 (.533) at home...have the fifth

best road record in the American League...went 4-1 on the last homestand against Cleveland (2-1) and San Diego (2-0) and have won six the last seven home games.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .280 (166-for-592) with 97 runs scored over their last 17 games (5.71 per runs per game) dating back to June 20...are hitting .247 for the season, but have a .261 average with runners in scoring position, which is fourth best in the American League...are third in the AL in home runs (121)...are tied for the second fewest sacrifice hits in the AL (3) after collecting their third of the season on Saturday...have the fifth most grounded into double plays (72)...have the fifth fewest infield hits in the American League.

PITCHING: The A's have allowed two runs or fewer in seven of the last 10 games but have a 3.56 ERA (36 er in 91.0 ip) over that span as they allowed 28 runs in the other games, all against Cleveland...before Blackburn's five ER outing on Friday, starting pitchers were 4-1 with a 2.34 ERA (11 er in 42.1 ip) and .211 (32-for-152) opponents batting average over the previous seven games...have employed 12 starting pitchers...are tied for the fourth fewest walks issued in the American League (260) and also have the fourth fewest strikeouts (671)...lead the AL and rank second in the majors with 53 wild pitches (Pittsburgh, 59).

ON THE BASES: A's opponents have been caught stealing 26 times, which is tied for the most in the American League (Toronto)...however, they have stolen 60 bases, which is third most in the AL...opponents are 60-for-86 (72.1%) in steal attempts, which is third lowest in the AL...on offense, the A's are 17-for-32 (53.1%) in stolen base attempts...have the lowest stolen base percentage in the majors, the fewest stolen bases and the fewest attempts.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed just four errors in the last 11 games but have 59 for the season, which is third most in the American League...tied for the third most unearned runs (33)...lead the AL with 905 assists...A's outfielders have seven assists, which is second fewest in the majors (Washington, 5).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have eight players on the disabled list (Blackburn, Cahill, Cotton, Gossett, Joyce, Mengden, Powell, Triggs)...Cotton and Powell are on the 60-day DL and Blackburn joined yesterday...have used the DL 21 times this year after using it 23 times last year...seven starting pitchers have spent time on the DL and Sean Manaea is the only A's pitcher that has not missed a start.

A's vs. ASTROS: The A's are 1-8 against the Astros...are 1-2 in Houston and 0-6 in Oakland...defeated the Astros 8-1 in the first game this year but have been out-scored 69-20 over the last eight contests (8.63 to 2.5)...the eight-game losing streak is second longest in Oakland history against Houston (10, July 20, 2016-April 28, 2017)...have lost 27 of the last 35 games to the Astros...have dropped 16 of the last 20 in Oakland and 18 of the last 24 in Houston...have lost each of the previous three season series and are 23-43 (.348) against the Astros over the last four years after winning each of their first four season series against Houston (31-13, .705)...are 54-56 all-time, which marks the first time the A's have been under .500 against the Astros...are 29-28 in Oakland and 25-28 in Houston.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Jed Lowrie leads the American League in RBI in the seventh inning or later (27), ranks second in game-winning RBI (12), tied for second in RBI (62) and tied for fourth in go-ahead RBI (17)... **Matt Olson** leads the American League and is third in the Majors in home runs by a first baseman with 19... **Khris Davis** has a 10-game hitting streak during which he is 16-for-41 (.390)...snapped an 18-game homerless streak on Saturday, the second longest such streak of his career.

OAKLAND A'S 50th ANNIVERSARY MOMENTS

In **1971**, after 19 scoreless innings, Angel Mangual delivers a RBI single in the bottom of the 20th inning as the A's defeat the Angels 1-0...Vida Blue strikes out a club record (extra innings) 17 batters in 11 innings of work, Rollie Fingers adds seven in seven innings of relief and the A's pitching staff finishes with a club record 26 strikeouts in the five hour and five minute game that finishes at 1:08 a.m.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Frankie Montas (4-2, 3.83 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville May 27 for his first stint with the A's this year...went 3-0 with a 1.25 ERA and .208 opponents batting average in his first three starts but is 1-2 with a 7.20 ERA (15 er in 20.2 ip) and .367 (33-for-90) opponents average in four starts since then...walked three batters in 21.2 innings over his first three starts but has issued 10 free passes in 20.2 innings since then...has allowed two runs or fewer in four of his six starts...the A's are 5-2 (.714) in his starting assignments.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents are 8-for-41 (.195) with three walks (.250 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning...has surrendered two home runs, both to left-handed hitters...has yielded 10 of his 13 career home runs to lefties...both of his home runs have come with runners on base as have 10 of his 13 career home runs.

FIRST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 2-1 win over Arizona May 27 in Oakland...matched his career best with seven strikeouts...retired each of the first 10 batters he faced and no-hit the Diamondbacks over the first five innings...had a 1-0 lead when Mathis singled to lead off the sixth...allowed his only run later in the inning on a Lamb sacrifice fly and the A's came back with a run in the bottom of the sixth for the win.

SECOND START: He combined with Pagán on an eight-hit shutout in the A's 16-0 win at Kansas City June 1...tossed a career-high eight innings...retired the side in order just twice (2nd and 7th) but did not allow a runner past second base.

THIRD START: He won his third consecutive start in the A's 7-2 win over Kansas City June 8 in Oakland...blanked the Royals on four hits and a walk over the first seven innings and had a 6-0 lead entering the eighth...surrendered a two-run home run to Moustakas, snapping his scoreless streak at a career-high 15.0 innings.

FOURTH START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-3 loss to Houston June 14 in Oakland...allowed a career-high seven runs on a career-high 11 hits and a career-high tying four walks...allowed a RBI double to Gurriel and a RBI single to Reddick in the first but the A's got one of those runs back in the second...then yielded a RBI single to Correa in the third, a two-run home run to McCann in the fourth, and two unearned runs in the sixth.

FIFTH START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 12-4 win at San Diego June 20...tossed a career-high 105 pitches allowed just one run in 6.2 innings of work...had a 7-0 lead when he allowed his only run in the third inning on a Spangenberg RBI single.

SIXTH START: He had a no decision in the A's 9-7 win at Detroit on June 26...allowed four runs in the first inning on a Castellanos RBI double, a Goodrum two-run double and a McCann RBI single...yielded a two-run triple to Machado in the third and was relieved by Hatcher to start the fourth inning with the A's trailing 6-2.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 15-3 loss to Cleveland on July 1 in Oakland...allowed a RBI single to Encarnacion in the first and RBI doubles to Ramirez in the fifth and Kipnis in the sixth...was relieved by Petit with two outs in the sixth and the A's trailing 3-1...the Indians then scored 12 runs off the bullpen over the final three innings.

MONTAS vs. HOUSTON: Is 0-1 with a 12.27 ERA (7.1 ip, 16 h, 12 r, 10 er, 5 bb, 3 so, 2 hr) in three career appearances, including one start...the start came in his only outing this year (see fourth start above)...the other two appearances came in relief last year...the first outing came on April 15 in Oakland (1.0 ip, 3 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 so) when he allowed RBI singles to McCann and Aoki in the ninth inning with the A's trailing 8-6...also pitched at Houston on April 30 (1.0 ip, 2 h, 3 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 1 so, 1 hr) and allowed a three-run home run to Gonzalez in the bottom of the eighth in a 7-2 A's loss.

WITH NASHVILLE: Went 1-5 with a 4.39 ERA in nine starts, including one complete game, with Nashville...was tied for second in the Pacific Coast League in losses at the time of his May 27 promotion Oakland...had a .269 opponents batting average, including .200 (9-for-45) against left-handed hitters compared to .297 (33-for-111) against right-handers...surrendered five home runs, four to righties...four were solo shots...yielded a .300 batting average with runners in scoring position...walked just two batters to lead off an inning...went 0-3 with a 6.19 ERA in five starts in April and tossed four innings or fewer four times...then went 1-2 with a 3.24 ERA in four starts in May and tossed at least five innings in each start...was 1-1 with a 2.86 ERA in five starts at home, 0-4 with a 6.16 ERA in four starts on the road.

2018 NASHVILLE HIGHLIGHTS: Tossed just 37 pitches in his first start and allowed four runs on four hits in 0.2 innings for the loss on April 6 at New Orleans...also issued a season-high two walks...tossed 3.0 scoreless innings in his second start April 11 against Iowa when he combined with Ryan Dull (1.0 ip), Chris Bassitt (4.0 ip) and Lou Trivino (1.0 ip) on a five-hit shutout in a 6-0 win...allowed a season-high five runs on a season-high seven hits in 4.0 innings in an 8-6 loss to New Orleans April 28...went 1-0 with a 1.80 ERA over a three-start stretch from May 4 to 14...was credited with his only win of the season May 4 against Memphis when he allowed one run in 6.0 innings of work...struck out a season-high 10 batters in 6.0 innings May 9 against Colorado Springs...had a season-high 93 pitches, which he matched in his next start on May 14...tossed a complete game at Memphis on the 14th but was the losing pitcher in a 2-1 loss...allowed two runs on six hits in a season-high eight innings...matched his season high with five runs on seven hits in an 11-2 loss at Oklahoma City in his final start May 20.

2017 RECAP: Was on the A's Opening Day roster and compiled a 7.03 ERA and .302 opponents batting average in 23 games over two stints with Oakland...also went 0-2 with a 5.22 ERA in nine games, eight starts, with Triple-A Nashville before an oblique injury ended his season in mid-August...issued 20 walks in 32.0 innings (5.63 per nine innings) with the A's for a .408 opponents on-base percentage...had a .566 opponents slugging percentage and .974 OPS...the OPS was the highest in Oakland history by a reliever, the slugging percentage was second highest and the on-base percentage was third highest...had the highest OPS and on-base percentage among Major League relievers in 2017...had the second highest opponents slugging percentage among AL relievers and the sixth highest opponents batting average...struck out 36 for an average of 10.13 strikeouts per nine innings...allowed 10 home runs, an average of 2.81 home runs per nine innings...that was the second highest mark in Oakland history among pitchers with 30 or more innings pitched (Curt Young, 2.93 in 1985)...tied for seventh among AL relievers in home runs allowed...his opponents batting average included a .257 mark against right-handed hitters compared to .364 against left-handers...yielded seven of his 10 home runs and issued 12 of his 20 walks to lefties...had a .751 OPS against righties, 1.267 against lefties...18 of his 23 outings were at least one inning, including seven outings of two innings or more...with Nashville, he struck out 37 batters in 29.1 innings, an average of 11.35 per nine innings...walked just seven for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 5.29...allowed a .223 opponents batting average, including .188 against right-handed hitters compared to .250 against left-handers.

LHP Sean Manaea (8-6, 3.33 ERA):	Is 3-0 with a 2.79 ERA and .197 opponents batting average in six starts since the beginning of June...began the season by going 4-2 with a 1.03 ERA and .134 opponents batting average over his first six starts through the end of April but then went 1-4 with a 7.18 ERA and .295 opponents batting average in six starts in May...has walked 22 batters in 113.2 innings, an average of 1.74 per nine innings...that ranks fourth lowest in the American League...has the fifth lowest opponents on-base percentage (.256), the seventh lowest batting average (.206) and the eighth lowest OPS (.620)...had a no decision in his last start, a 4-2 A's win over San Diego last Wednesday in Oakland (7.0 ip, 4 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 1 so)...is 2-4 with a 2.54 ERA (56.2 ip, 46 h, 20 r, 16 er, 20 bb, 49 so, 4 hr) in 10 career starts against Houston...is 1-1 with a 2.84 ERA (12.2 ip, 11 h, 5 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 10 so, 1 hr) in two starts this year.

- Had 11 saves in June, which tied for second in the American League and matched the Oakland record (1991 and 2006).
- Has converted 26-of-32 (81.3%) save opportunities, which is the best save percentage in the majors...are tied for third in the American League in saves but are tied for fourth in fewest save chances.
- Has a 3.16 ERA (58 er in 165.1 ip) and .206 (124-for-601) opponents batting average over its last 45 games dating back to May 18...posted a 4.05 ERA and .273 opponents average over its first 43 contests.
- Has the sixth lowest ERA in the AL (3.59)...ranks first in winning percentage (22-7, .759), first in wins (22) and third in innings (323.0).
