OAKLAND ATHLETICS (51-40) VS. HOUSTON ASTROS (61-32)

TUESDAY, JULY 10, 2018 — MINUTE MAID PARK — 7:10 P.M. CDT LHP SEAN MANAEA (8-6, 3.33) VS. RHP JUSTIN VERLANDER (9-4, 2.15) NBCSCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won three straight, five of the last six and 11 of the last 13...are 17-4 (.810) dating back to June 16, which is the best record in the majors by two games (Boston, 15-6)...are a season-high 11 games over .500 at 51-40 (.560)...that is the third best record in the American League West, the fifth best record in the AL and the ninth best record in the majors...are 6-0-1 over the previous seven series and the seven series unbeaten streak is the longest by an A's team since a nine-series streak from May 17-June 13, 2013...are nine games behind first place Houston and six games behind the second Wild Card team, Seattle...remain in sole possession of third place in the AL West for the 14th consecutive day...spent every day alone in fourth in the West from April 25 to June 24...have spent one day tied for first, one day tied for second, 14 days in third, three days tied for third, 78 days in fourth and seven days tied for fourth.

BACK-TO-BACK SHUTOUTS: The A's shutout the Astros on five hits last night after blanking the Indians on five hits on Sunday...it is the first time Oakland has tossed back-to-back shutouts since the final game of the 2014 season and the first game of 2015...it is the first time they have done it in back-to-back games in the same season since May 7-9, 2014...now have a 23.0-inning scoreless streak...have seven shutouts for the season, which is fifth most in the American League and one more than the season total from last year.

THE LONG BALL: Stephen Piscotty hit his 10th home run of the season last night, giving the A's six players with 10 or more home runs...only the Dodgers (8) and the Yankees (7) have more...the A's now have 122 home runs for the season, which is third most in the American League and fourth most in the majors...it is tied for fourth most in Athletics history before the All-Star Break (137 in 1996, 131 in 2000, 125 in 2017, 122 in 1987)...have hit 80 home runs on the road compared to 42 at home...have 13 more road home runs than any other team (Boston, 67).

THE LATE INNINGS: The A's lead the majors with 66 runs in the eighth inning (Houston is second with 64), are tied for second with 44 runs in the ninth inning and rank fourth with 162 runs in the seventh inning or later... have scored the winning run in the eighth inning or later in nine of their last 21 wins dating back to June 3 (eighth inning four times, ninth inning twice, 10th inning once, 11th inning twice)...are 35-0 when leading after seven innings and are the only team in the majors that has not lost a game when leading after seven...are 42-0 when leading after eight innings and are one of four teams without a loss in those games (New York, Seattle, Texas)...have seven wins when trailing after seven innings, which is tied for the most in the majors (New York-NL, Seattle)...are tied for third in the American League with two wins when trailing after eight innings...are batting .265 (281-for-1059) in the seventh inning or later, which ranks second in the AL (Houston, .272), compared to .236 (487-for-2063) in innings 1-6, which is third lowest... have compiled a 3.35 ERA (103 er in 276.2 ip) in the seventh inning or later, which is third lowest in the AL, compared to a 4.35 ERA (264 er in 546.0 ip) over the first six innings.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's have won seven straight and 11 of their last 12 games that were decided by two runs or fewer...are 26-13 (.668) in games decided by two runs or fewer for the season, which is the third best record in the in the majors...are 14-7 (.667) in one-run games, which is tied for third best... are 6-3 (.667) in extra inning games, which is tied for fourth best...are 13-5 (.722) in games decided in the last at bat, which is tied with Seattle for the best in the majors.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-1 on this 10-game road trip to Cleveland (2-1), Houston (1-0) and San Francisco (three games)...it is the A's third and final 10-game road trip of the season and it will conclude a stretch where Oakland plays 20 of 25 games on the road...are 15-4 over the first 19 games of this stretch...have now won seven of their last eight road games and are 19-7 (.731) away from home dating back to May 14...are 27-19 (.587) on the road compared to 24-21 (.533) at home...have the fifth best road record in the American League...are batting .264 (431-for-1644) with 251 runs scored in 46 games on the road compared to .226 with 168 runs in 45 games at home...rank second in the AL in batting average and runs per game (5.46) on the road to Houston (.276, 5.72)...went 4-1 on the last homestand against Cleveland (2-1) and San Diego (2-0) and have won six the last seven home games.

THE WEST AND THE REST: The A's have won each of their last three games against American League West teams, which marks just the second time this year Oakland has put together consecutive wins against the West (3, April 15-24)...are 13-25 (.342) against AL West competition compared to 38-15

(.717) against all other teams...are tied for the second worst intradivision record in the AL...are batting .227 (286-for-1260) and are averaging 3.61 runs per game (137 runs in 38 games) against the AL West, .259 with an average of 5.32 runs per game against everyone else...the pitching staff has a 4.90 ERA (183 er in 336.0 ip) against the AL West, 3.40 against all other teams.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .276 (172-for-624) with 99 runs scored (5.50 per game) and 29 home runs over their last 18 games dating back to June 20...are tied for fourth in the AL in extra base hits (302) and rank fifth in runs (419) and slugging percentage (.424)...are tied for the second fewest sacrifice hits (3).

PITCHING: The A's have gone four consecutive games without allowing a home run, which is their longest streak over the last two years...have allowed three runs or fewer in nine of the last 11 games and have a 3.15 ERA (35 er in 100.0 ip) and .224 (82-for-366) opponents batting average over that span...starting pitchers are 6-2 with a 2.57 ERA (18 er in 63.0 ip) and .216 (50-for-231) opponents batting average over that stretch...have employed 12 starting pitchers, which is tied with the Angels for second most in the majors to Tampa Bay (13)...lead the American League and rank second in the majors with 54 wild pitches (Pittsburgh, 59).

ON THE BASES: A's opponents have been caught stealing 26 times, which is tied with Toronto for the most in the American League...however, they have stolen 60 bases, which is third most in the AL...opponents are 60-for-86 (69.8%) in steal attempts, which is third lowest in the AL...on offense, the A's are 17-for-32 (53.1%) in stolen base attempts...have the lowest stolen base percentage in the majors, the fewest stolen bases and the fewest attempts.

MONTH BY MONTH: The A's are 5-2 in July, which is the third best record in the American League...went 13-12 in April, 15-14 in May and 17-10 in June... this is the eighth season in Oakland history in which the A's have posted a winning record in April, May and June (1971, 1972, 1975, 1990, 2003, 2013, 2014).

ALL-STAR: Blake Treinen was named an All-Star on Sunday...Jed Lowrie was named an All-Star today...these are the first career All-Star selectios for both players...Treinen is the first A's reliever named to the Midsummer Classic since Sean Doolittle in 2014...Lowrie is the first A's infielder to make the All-Star team since Miguel Tejada in 2002.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have eight players on the disabled list (Blackburn, Cahill, Cotton, Gossett, Joyce, Mengden, Powell, Triggs)...Cotton and Powell are on the 60-day DL and Cahill and Mengden are on rehab assignments... have used the DL 21 times this year, including nine times for starting pitchers...this marks the fourth consecutive season the A's have used the DL 20 or more times (had 23 last year).

A's vs. ASTROS: The A's snapped their eight-game losing streak to the Astros with a 2-0 win last night...are 2-8 for the season, which includes 2-2 in Houston and 0-6 at home...defeated the Astros 8-1 in the first game this year but have been out-scored 69-22 over the last nine contests (7.6 to 2.4)...have lost 27 of the last 36 games to the Astros...have dropped 16 of the last 20 in Oakland and 18 of the last 25 in Houston...have lost each of the previous three season series and are 24-43 (.358) against the Astros over the last four years after winning each of their first four season series against Houston (31-13, .705)...are 55-56 all-time, including 29-28 in Oakland and 26-28 in Houston.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Khris Davis has a career-high tying 11-game hitting streak (17-for-44, .386)...Jed Lowrie has matched his career high with 16 home runs (also 2012 with Houston)...leads the American League in RBI in the seventh inning or later (27), ranks second in game-winning RBI (12), tied for second in RBI (62) and tied for fourth in go-ahead RBI (17)...Matt Olson leads the AL in home runs by a first baseman (19)...Blake Treinen lead Major League relievers in ERA (0.79) and ranks fourth among AL relievers in saves (23)... has converted each of his last 20 save opportunities dating back to May 4.

OAKLAND A'S 50th ANNIVERSARY MOMENTS

In 1971, after 19 scoreless innings, Angel Mangual delivers a RBI single in the bottom of the 20th inning as the A's defeat the Angels 1-0...Vida Blue strikes out a club record (extra innings) 17 batters in 11 innings of work, Rollie Fingers adds seven in seven innings of relief and the A's pitching staff finishes with a club record 26 strikeouts in the five hour and five minute game that finishes at 1:08 a.m.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Manaea (8-6, 3.33 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is 3-0 with a 2.79 ERA (12 er in 382 ip) and .197 (28-for-142) opponents batting average in six starts since the beginning of June...began the season by going 4-2 with a 1.03 ERA and .134 opponents batting average over his first six starts through the end of April but then went 1-4 with a 7.18 ERA and .295 opponents batting average in six starts in May.

DON'T WALK: Has walked four batters in his last five starts (33.1 ip) and has issued two free passes or fewer in 16 of his 18 starts this year...has walked 22 batters in 113.2 innings, an average of 1.74 per nine innings...that ranks fourth lowest in the American League.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Has the fifth lowest opponents on-base percentage in the American League (.256), the seventh lowest batting average (.206) and the eighth lowest OPS (.620)...has the fifth fewest strikeouts per nine innings (6.18), is tied for fifth in wild pitches (8) and tied for 10th in hit batters (7)... is averaging the fewest pitches per inning in the majors (14.5)...opponents have reached base on an error eight times, which is tied for the most in the majors (Hamels, TEX)

RUN SUPPORT: Has received two runs of support or fewer in 10 of his 18 starts, including no runs four times...has received two runs of support or fewer in each of his six losses this year (4 rs in 33.0 ip, 1.09 RSA) and 24 of his 25 career losses (24 rs in 126.1 ip, 1.71 RSA)...is 18-0 in 25 career starts with run support of four or more and 24-1 in 33 starts with three runs of support or more.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents are 15-for-108 (.139) with six walks and three hit by pitches (.205 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning... the on-base percentage is the lowest in the majors and the batting average is second lowest (Foltynewicz, ATL .125)...opponents are hitting .200 (15-for-75) with runners in scoring position...has a .156 (23-for-147) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .272 (41-for-151) the second time and .184 (23-for-125) after that...has surrendered 14 of his 16 home runs to right-handed hitters.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 4-0 with a 2.98 ERA (15 er in 45.1 ip) in seven starts during the day compared to 4-6 with a 3.56 ERA (27 er in 68.1 ip) in 11 starts at night...now has a 10-game winning streak in day games dating back to May 20, 2017 and has a 3.12 ERA (34 er in 98.0 ip) in 16 starts total over that stretch...has not lost during the day since April 7, 2017 at Texas...is now 12-3 with a 3.36 ERA (56 er in 150.0 ip) in 25 career day games, 15-22 with a 4.21 ERA (125 er in 267.0 ip) in 47 starts at night.

MONTH BY MONTH: Went 3-0 with a 2.84 ERA and .202 opponents batting average in five starts in the month of June...compiled a 1-4 record and a 7.18 ERA and .295 opponents batting average in six starts in May...tied for the American League lead in May losses and had the second highest ERA (Giolito, CWS 7.36)...it was the second time he lost four games in a month in his career (Aug. 2016)...was 4-1 with a 1.00 ERA and .130 opponents batting average in five starts in April...led the AL in ERA and opponents batting in April and tied for the lead in wins...was named AL Pitcher of the Month in April, his first Pitcher of the Month honor...it was the first time in his career he won four games in a month...his ERA tied for the fourth lowest in any month in Oakland history among pitchers with 30 or more innings pitched...it was the lowest since Cory Lidle had a 0.20 ERA in Aug., 2002...had a .395 OPS and is the fourth pitcher in Oakland history with an OPS under .400 in a month with a minimum of 100 batters faced.

2018 HIGHLIGHTS: Allowed one run in 7.2 innings in his first start on March 30 against Los Angeles (AL) and one run in 8.0 innings in his second start on April 4 against Texas to become the first A's pitcher on an Opening Day roster to start the season with back-to-back outings of seven innings or more and one run or fewer since Steve Karsay in 1994...won three consecutive starts from April 15 to 27 and allowed just two runs (one earned) on six hits over that stretch (0.39 ERA, .078 opponents batting average)...tossed the seventh no-hitter in Oakland history and the 12th in Athletics history in a 3-0 win over Boston in Oakland on April 21...walked two and matched his career high with 10 strikeouts...walked Betts to start the game but then retired 14 straight before Leon reached on a Semien error...set down the next 12 before walking Benintendi with two outs in the ninth...then got Ramirez to hit into a game-ending force out...the no-hitter was his first career complete game... it came in his 59th game and 58th start and his streak of 57 consecutive starts without a complete game was fourth longest in Oakland history...the shutout came in the A's 21st game of the season and it was the earliest shutout by an Athletic since Barry Zito on April 18, 2003 vs. Texas, the A's 17th game of the season...it was the earliest no-hitter by date in Athletics history (Catfish Hunter, May 8, 1968 vs. Minnesota) and second earliest by game number (Chief Bender, May 12, 1910 vs. Cleveland, game 18)...it was the 10th no-hitter in Coliseum history (six by A's, four by opponents)...it was the first since Dallas Braden's perfect game on May 9, 2010 vs. Tampa Bay...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, the Red Sox .895 winning percentage en-

tering the game was the highest in Major League history by a team that was no-hit at least five games into the season...the last pitcher to no hit a team that led the majors in runs per game entering the game was the A's Dave Stewart, who did it against Toronto on June 29, 1990 (also Elias)...was named American League Co-Player of the Week for the week of April 16-22, his first Player of the Week award...allowed a fourth-inning single to Correa in his first start after the no-hitter on April 27 at Houston, snapping his streak of consecutive hitless innings at an Oakland record 14.0 innings...broke the previous mark of 13.0 held by John "Blue Moon" Odom from June 1-7, 1968...opponents went 0-for-47 off him during the hitless streak...yielded four runs on six hits in a 4-1 loss at Seattle May 3 to snap a season-opening streak where he allowed two runs or fewer and tossed five innings or more in each of his first six starts...that tied for the third longest such season-opening streak in Oakland history...it was the longest since Dave Stewart had a seven-game

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 4-2 win over San Diego last Wednesday in Oakland...surrendered a two-run home run to Villanueva in the second inning but those were the only runs he would allow in seven innings of work...retired 16 of the final 18 batters he faced and was relieved by Buchter to start the eighth inning with the scored tied 2-2.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Chris Bassitt (1-3, 3.00 ERA): Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville June 27 for his fifth stint with the A's this year and is 1-0 with a 1.69 ERA in two starts since his return...went 0-3 with a 3.86 ERA in three starts over his first four stints...received no run support in his last start and has received two runs of support or fewer in all five of his starts this year (1.00 RSA)...has now received two runs of support or fewer in 24 of his 28 career starts and his career RSA as a starter is 2.26...had a no decision in his last start, a 6-2 A's win over San Diego on July 3 in Oakland (4.2 ip, 7 h, 2 r, 2 er, 3 bb, 6 so)...is 0-0 with a 1.64 ERA (11.0 ip, 5 h, 4 r, 2 er, 5 bb, 13 so, 1 hr) in two career appearances, including one start, against Houston, both in 2015 in Oakland...was 2-3 with a 6.10 ERA in 10 games, including seven starts, with Triple-A Nashville...sur-rendered just two home runs in 38.1 innings...struck out 40, an average of 9.39 per nine innings.

- Has converted 27-of-33 (81.8%) save opportunities, which is the best save percentage in the majors...are tied for third in the American League in saves but are tied for fourth in fewest save chances.
- Has the fifth lowest ERA in the AL (3.56)...ranks first in winning percentage (22-7, .759), first in wins (22) and third in innings (326.0)
- Has a 3.10 ERA (58 er in 168.1 ip) and .206 (126-for-612) opponents batting average over its last 46 games dating back to May 18...posted a 4.05 ERA and .273 opponents average over its first 43 contests.
