OAKLAND ATHLETICS (52-41) VS. HOUSTON ASTROS (62-33)

THURSDAY, JULY 12, 2018 — MINUTE MAID PARK — 1:10 P.M. CDT RHP TREVOR CAHILL (1-2, 2.77) VS. RHP CHARLIE MORTON (11-2, 2.83) MLB NETWORK — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME)

ABOUT THE A'S: Are 18-5 (.783) over their last 23 games dating back to June 16, which is the best record in the majors over that span (Boston 17-6, .739)... are 52-41 (.559) overall, which is the third best record in the American League West, the fifth best record in the AL and tied for the ninth best record in the majors...the 11 games over .500 match the season high (51-40 on July 9)...are 6-0-1 over the previous seven series and the seven series unbeaten streak is the longest by an A's team since a nine-series streak from May 17-June 13, 2013...are nine games behind first place Houston and six games behind the second Wild Card team, Seattle...remain in sole possession of third place in the AL West for the 16th consecutive day...spent every day alone in fourth in the West from April 25 to June 24...have spent one day tied for first, one day tied for second, 16 days in third, three days tied for third, 78 days in fourth and seven days tied for fourth.

THE LATE INNINGS: The A's lead the majors with 66 runs in the eighth inning (Houston is second with 64), rank tied for first with 49 runs in the ninth inning (Atlanta), third with 168 runs in the seventh inning or later and tied for fourth with 11 runs in extra innings...have scored the winning run in the eighth inning or later in nine of their last 22 wins dating back to June 3 (eighth inning four times, ninth inning twice, 10th inning once, 11th inning twice)...are 36-0 when leading after seven innings and are the only team in the majors that has not lost a game when leading after seven...are 43-0 when leading after eight innings and are one of four teams without a loss in those games (New York, Seattle, Texas)...have seven wins when trailing after seven innings, which is tied for the most in the majors (New York-NL, Seattle)...are tied for third in the American League with two wins when trailing after eight innings...are batting .266 (291-for-1093) in the seventh inning or later, which ranks second in the AL (Houston, .268), compared to .236 (497-for-2107) in innings 1-6, which is third lowest...have compiled a 3.33 ERA (105 er in 284.0 ip) in the seventh inning or later, which is third lowest in the AL, compared to a 4.35 ERA (270 er in 558.0 ip) over the first six innings.

cLOSE CALLS: The A's erased a 4-0 deficit entering the ninth inning Tuesday night but went on to lose 6-5 in 11 innings...it was the A's second walk-off loss of the season, which is tied for the fewest in the majors...it was their 10th extra inning game of the season, which is tied for second most in the American League...are 6-4 (.600) in extra innings, which is the fourth best record in the AL...dropped to 26-14 (.650) in games decided by two runs or fewer, which is third best in the AL, and 14-8 (.636) in one-run games, which is fifth in the AL...are now 13-6 (.684) in games decided in the last at bat, which is second best in the majors to Seattle (13-5, .722).

THE LONG BALL: The A's have homered in each of the first six games of the road trip (10 home runs total) and now have 82 home runs on the road, which is 12 more than any other team (New York-AL, 70)...are on pace to hit 138 home runs on the road, which would match the Major League record of 138 set by San Francisco in 2001...have hit just 42 home runs at home and the A's 124 home runs are fourth in the American League and rank fourth in Athletics history before the All-Star Break (137 in 1996, 131 in 2000, 125 in 2017).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 4-2 on this 10-game road trip to Cleveland (2-1), Houston (2-1) and San Francisco (three games)...it is the A's third and final 10-game road trip of the season and it will conclude a stretch where Oakland plays 20 of 25 games on the road...are 16-5 over the first 21 games of this stretch...have won eight of their last 10 road games and are 20-8 (.714) away from home dating back to May 14...are 28-20 (.583) on the road compared to 24-21 (.533) at home...have the fifth best road record in the American League...are batting .263 (451-for-1712) with 264 runs scored in 48 games on the road compared to .226 with 168 runs in 45 games at home...rank second in the AL in batting average and runs per game (5.50) on the road to Houston (.276, 5.72)...went 4-1 on the last homestand against Cleveland (2-1) and San Diego (2-0) and have won six of the last seven home games.

THE WEST AND THE REST: The A's are 14-26 (.350) against American League West competition compared to 38-15 (.717) against all other teams...are batting .229 (306-for-1338) and are averaging 3.75 runs per game (150 runs in 40 games) against the AL West, .259 with an average of 5.32 runs per game against everyone else...the pitching staff has a 4.84 ERA (191 er in 355.1 ip) against the AL West, 3.40 against all other teams...are 4-1 over their last five games against the AL West after starting the year 10-25 against intradivision competition.

STARTING PITCHING: Trevor Cahill is scheduled to become the A's seventh different starting pitcher in the A's last seven games today...also used seven different starters earlier this year from May 17-24...have 10 different pitchers with five or more starts, which is the most in the majors...have employed 12 different starting pitchers overall, which is tied with the Angels and Mets for second most in the majors (Rays, 13)...A's starting pitchers have combined for nine stints on the disabled list, including two each by Paul Blackburn and Trevor Cahill.

RANKINGS: The A's offense is fourth in the American League in home runs (124), ranks fourth in extra base hits (311) and batting with runners in scoring position (.263) and fifth in runs (432) and slugging percentage (.425)...are tied for the second fewest sacrifice hits (3)...rank last in the majors in stolen bases (17), stolen base attempts (33) and stolen base percentage (51.5)... opponents have been caught stealing 26 times, which is tied with Toronto for the most in the AL, but they have 62 stolen bases, which is third most... have the third lowest stolen base percentage (72.1)...the pitching staff leads the AL in wild pitches (55), has the fourth fewest strikeouts (691) and walks (266) and ranks tied for fifth in shutouts (7)...rank third in the AL in most errors (60) and tied for third in unearned runs (34)...Athletics outfielders have eight assists, which is the second fewest in the Major Leagues (Washington, 5)

MONTH BY MONTH: The A's are 6-3 (.667) in July, which is the fourth best record in the American League...went 13-12 in April, 15-14 in May and 17-10 in June...this is the eighth season in Oakland history in which the A's have posted a winning record in April, May and June (1971, 1972, 1975, 1990, 2003, 2013, 2014).

ALL-STARS: Jed Lowrie and Blake Treinen have been named to the American League All-Star team, the first All-Star selection for both players...Lowrie joins Phil Garner (1976) as the only second basemen in Athletics history to be named to the AL All-Star squad (includes Philadelphia and Kansas City)...is also the first middle infielder to be named an All-Star since Miguel Tejada in 2012, and the first infielder since Josh Donaldson in 2014...Treinen is the first A's reliever named to the Midsummer Classic since Sean Doolittle in 2014... the A's have two All-Star representatives for the first time since 2015 (Gray and Vogt).

THE DISABLED LIST: After reinstating Trevor Cahill today, the A's have seven players on the disabled list (Blackburn, Cotton, Gossett, Joyce, Mengden, Powell, Triggs)...Cotton and Powell are on the 60-day DL and Mengden is on a rehab assignment...have used the DL 21 times this year, which marks the fourth consecutive season the A's have used the DL 20 or more times (had 23 last year).

A's vs. ASTROS: The A's are 3-9 against the Astros, which includes 3-3 in Houston and 0-6 in Oakland...with one more loss the A's will lose the season series for the fourth consecutive season...are 25-44 (.362) against the Astros over the last four years after winning each of their first four season series against Houston (31-13, .705)...have lost 28 of the last 38 games to the Astros, but are 8-9 over the last 17...have dropped 16 of the last 20 in Oakland and 19 of the last 27 in Houston...are 56-57 all-time, including 29-28 in Oakland and 27-29 in Houston.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Khris Davis extended his hitting streak to a career-high and A's season-high 13 games last night...is 20-for-54 (.370) during the streak, which is the longest active hitting streak in the American League...Jed Lowrie has matched his career high with 16 home runs (also 2012 with Houston)... leads the AL in RBI in the seventh inning or later (27), ranks tied for second in game-winning RBI (12), tied for fourth in go-ahead RBI (17), and tied for sixth in RBI (62)...Blake Treinen lead Major League relievers in ERA (0.98) and ranks fourth among AL relievers in saves (23).

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Trevor Cahill (1-2, 2.77 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was reinstated from the 10-day disabled list today after missing 27 games with a strained right achilles...made one rehab start with Triple-A Nashville, throwing four scoreless innings with one walk and seven strikeouts...will be making his first start since June 2...was reinstated from the 10-day disabled list May 16 and is 0-1 with a 3.28 ERA (9 er in 24.2 ip) and .225 (20-for-89) opponents batting average in four starts since his return... was recalled from Triple-A Nashville April 17 and went 1-1 with a 2.25 ERA and .202 opponents average in four starts before he was placed on the DL May 9 retroactive to May 6 with a right elbow impingement...did not make a rehab appearance...has a 2.77 ERA overall...was signed by the A's as a free agent March 19 and made two spring training appearances before he was optioned to Nashville March 28.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 1-0 with a 0.64 ERA (2 er in 28.0 ip) and .175 (17-for-97) opponents batting average in four starts at home compared to 0-2 with a 5.66 ERA (13 er in 20.2 ip) and .263 (20-for-76) opponents average in four starts on the road...has not allowed a run in three of his four starts in Oakland...last year, he combined for a 4-0 record, a 1.83 ERA and .203 opponents batting average in seven games in his home ballparks...was 0-3 with a 7.07 ERA and .320 opponents batting average in 14 games on the road...now has a seven-game home winning streak and a six-game road losing streak...has not lost at home since July 6, 2016 against Cincinnati and has not won on the road since Aug. 20 2016 at Colorado.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents are 1-for-16 (.053) with runners in scoring position and two outs...has allowed all four of his home runs and all 13 of his 14 RBI to right-handed hitters...three of his home runs have come with runners on base...has walked two batters to lead off an inning and opponents are batting .191 (9-for-47) with a .240 on-base percentage (1 hbp) in that situation...opponents are 9-for-89 (.101) with two strikes.

RUN SUPPORT: Received 10 runs of support in his first start, but has just 12 runs of support in his seven starts since then (41.2 ip, 2.59 RSA)...has three starts where he has not allowed a run but has received zero runs of support in two of those starts...the game has gone into extra innings in three of his starts this year...has a 0.86 ERA (2 er in 21.0 ip) in those three starts but has just two runs of support.

THIS AND THAT: Has five wild pitches, which was tied for ninth in the American League before his second DL stint...now has 21 wild pitches over the last two years, which are tied for second in the majors, despite just 29 games and 132.2 innings over that stretch...has allowed five runs in the first inning for a 5.63 ERA (5 er in 8.0 ip)...has a 1.72 ERA (7 er in 36.2 ip) in innings two through six and a 6.75 ERA (3 er in 4.0 ip) from the seventh inning on

2018 START-BY-START: Was the winning pitcher in the A's 10-2 win over Chicago (AL) April 17 in Oakland...it was his first start as an Athletic since Sept. 27, 2011 at Seattle when he combined with Craig Breslow and Jerry Blevins on a four-hit shutout (7.0 ip, 4 h, 1 bb, 7 so)...tossed 7.0 shutout innings and allowed five hits and two walks...had a no decision in the A's 9-4 win at Texas on April 23...left after four inning with the score tied 3-3 and Oakland scored six times in the ninth for the win...was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-4 loss at Houston April 29...Oakland scored a run in the third but he allowed two in the bottom of the third on a Springer RBI single and an Altuve sacrifice bunt...surrendered a solo home run to Springer in the fifth but the A's came back to tie the game, 3-3...walked Bregman to start the seventh and was relieved by Petit, who allowed that run to score plus two of his own...had a no decision in the A's 2-0, 12-inning win over Baltimore *May 5* in Oakland... struck out a career-high 12 batters in just 6.0 innings...it was his third career game of 10 or more strikeouts, his first since June 14, 2013 at San Diego... became the third A's pitcher since at least 1908 to strikeout 12 or more batters in six innings or fewer, the first since Steve Karsay on April 26, 1997 vs. Kansas City (12 so in 6.0 ip)...the other is Vida Blue on April 9, 1971 vs. Kansas City (13 so in 6.0 ip)...fanned each of the first four batters and retired each of the first eight before Peterson singled with two outs in the third...allowed only one base runner past first base...Gausman shut out the A's on two hits over the first nine innings and Khris Davis hit a walk-off two-run home run in the 12th for the win...was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-4 loss at Boston May 16...allowed three runs in the first inning on a Ramirez RBI ground out and a Martinez two-run home run...those were the only runs he would allow in five innings of work as he blanked the Red Sox on two hits over his final four innings...left trailing 3-2...had a no decision in the A's 3-2, 10-inning loss to Seattle on *May 22* in Oakland...the A's scored single runs in the fourth and fifth innings and he blanked the Mariners on three hits over the first six innings...walked Vogelbach with one out in the seventh and then surrendered a game-tying two-run home run to Zunino...had his second consecutive no decision in an extra inning game, a 1-0 A's loss to Tampa Bay in 13 innings May 28 in Oakland...tossed 8.0 scoreless innings and allowed just four hits while not walking a batter...it was his longest scoreless outing since June 2, 2012 at San Diego when he tossed a six-hit shutout for Arizona...Archer and five Rays relievers combined to shutout the A's on seven hits.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 5-4 loss at Kansas City on June 2... allowed a two-run double to Perez in the first inning...surrendered two more runs in the second inning on an Escobar RBI triple and a Jay RBI double... was relieved by Pagán with two outs and a runner on first in the fifth and the A's trailing 4-2...Oakland came back to tie the game with single runs in the seventh and eighth before the Royals scored once in the bottom of the eighth for the win.

2017 RECAP: Was used exclusively as a starter with San Diego but then pitched primarily in relief for Kansas City following a July 24 trade...went 4-3 with a 3.69 ERA in 11 starts with the Padres and 0-0 with an 8.22 ERA in 10 games, three starts, with the Royals...combined for a 4-3 record and a 4.93 ERA in a career-low 21 appearances overall...missed 12 weeks of the season due to three stints on the disabled list...surrendered 16 home runs in 84.1 innings, including 10 in 23.0 innings with the Royals...his average of 1.71 home runs per nine innings was the highest mark of his career...also had career highs in walks per nine innings (4.82), strikeouts per nine innings (9.32), opponents slugging percentage (.483) and opponents OPS (.850)...had a Major League leading 16 wild pitches, including 14 with San Diego...tied for the National League in wild pitches (Arrieta, CHC) despite making just 11 starts... allowed a .275 opponents batting average, including .241 (35-for-145) by left-handed hitters compared to .301 (56-for-186) by right-handers...went 4-3 with a 4.38 ERA in his 14 starting assignments...compiled an 8.25 ERA in seven relief appearances.

RHP Edwin Jackson (1-0, 2.45): Was selected by Oakland June 25 and is scheduled to make his fourth start of the season tomorrow...signed a minor league contract with the Washington Nationals on Jan. 11 and began the season at Triple-A Syracuse...was 4-2 with a 3.40 ERA and .238 opponents batting average in 10 starts with the Chiefs when he was released June 1 (contract opt-out)...signed a minor league deal with the A's June 6 and was assigned to Triple-A Nashville...went 0-1 with a 4.02 ERA and .207 opponents average in three starts with the Sounds...was 4-3 with a 3.53 ERA in 13 minor league starts overall...needs one more victory for 100 in his career... continues his 16th season in the majors with his 13th team (Los Angeles-NL, Tampa Bay, Detroit, Arizona, Chicago-AL, St. Louis, Washington, Chicago-NL, Atlanta, Miami, San Diego, Baltimore)...has tied Octavio Dotel's Major League record for teams played for in a career.

- Has converted 27-of-34 (79.4%) save opportunities, which is the second best save percentage in the majors...are tied for fourth in the American League in saves but are tied for fifth in fewest save chances.
- Has the fifth lowest ERA in the AL (3.51)...ranks first in winning percentage (22-8, .733), second in wins (22) and third in innings (336.1).
