OAKLAND ATHLETICS (53-41) VS. SAN FRANCISCO GIANTS (49-46)

FRIDAY, JULY 13, 2018 — AT&T PARK — 7:15 P.M. PDT

ABOUT THE A'S: Won three of four at American League West leading Houston after winning two of three at AL Central leading Cleveland to start the road trip...have won 13 of the last 16 games and are a season-high 12 games over .500 at 53-41 (.563)...that is the third best record in the AL West, the fifth best record in the AL and the eighth best record in the majors...are 7-0-1 over the last eight series and the eight series unbeaten streak is the longest by an A's team since a nine-series streak from May 17-June 13, 2013...are eight games behind first place Houston in the AL West and five games behind the second Wild Card team, Seattle...have spent one day tied for first, one day tied for second, 17 days in third, three days tied for third, 78 days in fourth and seven days tied for fourth.

THE LAST 24 GAMES: The A's are 19-5 (.792) over their last 24 games dating back to June 16, which is the best record in the majors over that span...it is the A's best record over a 24-game stretch since Aug. 30-Sept. 23, 2013 when they also went 19-5...have come from behind in 11 of the 19 wins (six runs once, five runs once, four runs once, three runs three times, two runs four times and one run once)...have scored the winning run in the eighth inning or later in eight of the wins (eighth inning three times, ninth inning twice, 10th inning once, 11th inning twice)...are batting .265 (223-for-842) over the last 24 games with 134 runs (5.6 per game) and 37 home runs...the pitching staff has a 3.90 ERA (95 er in 219.1 ip)...starters are 10-4 with a 4.24 ERA (60 er in 127.1 ip) and the bullpen is 9-1 with 12 saves, two blown saves and a 3.42 ERA (35 er in 92.0 ip).

THE LATE INNINGS: The A's scored three times in the eighth inning yesterday and lead the majors in runs scored in the eighth inning (69)...are tied for the lead in runs scored in the ninth (49), tied for second in runs in the seventh inning or later (171) and tied for fourth in runs in extra innings (11)...have a Major League leading eight wins when trailing after seven innings and are tied for third in the American League with two wins when trailing after eighth innings...are 36-0 when leading after seven innings and are the only team in the majors that has not lost a game when leading after seven...are 44-0 when leading after eight innings and are one of four teams without a loss in those games (New York, Seattle, Texas)...are batting a ML leading .267 (296-for-1107) in the seventh inning or later compared to .236 (503-for-2131) in innings 1-6, which is sixth lowest...have compiled a 3.29 ERA (105 er in 287.0 ip) in the seventh inning or later, which is third lowest in the AL, compared to a 4.37 ERA (274 er in 564.0 ip) over the first six innings.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 27-14 (.659) in games decided by two runs or fewer, which is the third best record in the majors...are 14-8 (.636) in one-run games, which is tied for third best in the American League...are tied for the third fewest one-run games in the AL...are 6-4 (.600) in extra inning games, which is the fourth best record in the AL...the 10 extra inning games are tied for second most...are 13-6 (.684) in games decided in the last at bat, which is second best in the majors to Seattle (13-5, .722).

THE ALL-STAR BREAK: With a 53-41 record, the A's will go into the All-Star Break with a winning record for the first time since 2014 (59-36) and just the third time in the last 10 years...are scheduled to play 97 games before the break, which will be second most in Athletics history (98 in 1973)...have 315 extra base hits, which is two short of the Athletics record for extra base hits at the break (317 in 1996)...have 124 home runs, which is fourth most in Athletics history before the break (137 in 1996, 131 in 2000, 125 in 2017).

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's are 7-2 (.778) in interleague play, which is the third best record in the majors (Bos, 7-1; Pit, 10-2)...had just seven interleague wins all last year...rank fourth in ERA (2.89)...are third in slugging percentage (.475), ninth in batting average (.261) and tied for ninth in home runs (17)...have a 38-15 (.717) record in interdivision play compared to 15-26 (.366) against the American League West...in addition to this three-game series with San Francisco, the A's also travel to Colorado (July 27-29) and host San Francisco (July 20-22) and the Dodgers (Aug. 7-8)...are 212-181 (.539) all-time in interleague play, which is fourth best in Major League history.

PITCHERS HITTING: A's pitchers are 1-for-9 (.111) with a run, RBI and four strikeouts this year...they are batting .081 (32-for-396) with four doubles, 12 RBI, 12 walks and 189 strikeouts since interleague play began in 1997...the batting average is the lowest in the majors over that span (New York-AL,

.082)...the last home run by an A's pitcher was by Blue Moon Odom on Sept. 4, 1972 against California...Odom also had the last triple on Aug. 22, 1971 against Boston...the last extra base hit was by Joe Kennedy, a double on June 12, 2007 at Houston.

THE LONG BALL: The A's have hit a Major League leading 82 home runs on the road...are on pace to hit 136 home runs on the road and the ML record is 138 set by San Francisco in 2001...have hit just 42 home runs at home and the A's 124 home runs rank fifth in the American League.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 5-2 on this 10-game road trip to Cleveland (2-1), Houston (3-1) and San Francisco (three games)...it is the A's third and final 10-game road trip of the season and it will conclude a stretch where Oakland plays 20 of 25 games on the road...are 17-5 over the first 22 games of this stretch...have won nine of their last 11 road games and are 21-8 (.724) away from home dating back to May 14...are 29-20 (.592) on the road compared to 24-21 (.533) at home...have the fourth best road record in the American League...are batting .264 (462-for-1750) with 270 runs scored in 49 games on the road compared to .226 with 168 runs in 45 games at home...rank second in the AL in batting average and runs per game (5.51) on the road...following the All-Star Break, the A's have a brief three-game homestand against San Francisco...went 4-1 on the last homestand against Cleveland (2-1) and San Diego (2-0) and have won six the last seven home games.

RANKINGS: The A's ranks fourth in the American League in extra base hits (322) and batting with runners in scoring position (.263) and fifth in runs (438), home runs (124), doubles (179) and slugging percentage (.424)...are tied for the second fewest sacrifice hits (3)...rank last in the majors in stolen bases (18), stolen base attempts (34) and stolen base percentage (52.9)...opponents have been caught stealing 26 times, which is tied with Toronto for the most in the AL, but they have 63 stolen bases, which is third most...have the third lowest stolen base percentage (70.8)...the pitching staff leads the AL in wild pitches (56), has the fourth fewest strikeouts (697) and fifth fewest walks (271)...rank third in the AL in most errors (60) and tied for fourth in unearned runs (34)...A's outfielders have nine assists, which is the fewest in the AL.

ALL-STARS: Jed Lowrie and Blake Treinen have been named to the American League All-Star team, the first All-Star selection for both players...Lowrie joins Phil Garner (1976) as the only second basemen in Athletics history to be named to the AL All-Star squad (includes Philadelphia and Kansas City)...Treinen is the first A's reliever named to the Midsummer Classic since Sean Doolittle in 2014...the A's have two All-Star representatives for the first time since 2015 (Gray and Vogt).

A's vs. GIANTS: Tonight is the first of six consecutive games between the A's and Giants...this marks the fourth time in Oakland history the A's have played six straight regular season games against the same team in one season (July 20-23, 1972 at Boston; July 10-14, 1980 at California and Aug. 28-31, 1986 vs. Baltimore)...the two clubs split the season series last year, 2-2...it marked the 10th time in 21 seasons of interleague play the two clubs have split the season series...the A's have won seven season series and lost four...went 1-1 in San Francisco and 1-1 in Oakland last year...have won 14 of the last 20 games in Oakland but have lost 17 of the last 23 in San Francisco...are 59-55 all-time against the Giants during interleague play...that breaks down to 34-23 in Oakland and 25-32 in San Francisco...are 21-29 at AT&T Park.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Khri Davis has a 14-game hitting streak (21-for-58, .362), which is a career-high, an A's season-high and the longest active hitting streak in the majors...**Jed Lowrie** has matched his career high with 16 home runs (also 2012)...leads the American League in RBI in the seventh inning or later (27), is tied for second in game-winning RBI (12), tied for fourth in go-ahead RBI (17) and tied for seventh in RBI (62)...**Matt Olson** leads AL first basemen in home runs (19)...**Blake Treinen** lead Major League relievers in ERA (0.98) and ranks fourth among AL relievers in saves (23).

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Edwin Jackson (1-0, 2.45 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was selected by Oakland June 25 and is scheduled to make his fourth start of the season...signed a minor league contract with the Washington Nationals on Jan. 11 and began the season at Triple-A Syracuse...was 4-2 with a 3.40 ERA and .238 opponents batting average in 10 starts with the Chiefs when he was released June 1 (contract opt-out)...signed a minor league deal with the A's June 6 and was assigned to Triple-A Nashville...went 0-1 with a 4.02 ERA and .207 opponents average in three starts with the Sounds...was 4-3 with a 3.53 ERA in 13 minor league starts overall.

99 WINS: Defeated Cleveland June 30 for the 99th win of his career...the last pitcher to record his 100th career victory in an A's uniform is Brett Tomko on Sept. 14, 2009 at Texas...has now won at least one game with 11 different teams.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents are 2-for-17 (.118) with runners in scoring position...they are 1-or-32 (.031) with two strikes and the one hit is a home run...has surrendered two home runs, both to left-handed hitters.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: Is scheduled to make his first interleague appearance of the season...went 1-1 with a 3.45 ERA in three interleague games, including two starts, last year...is 11-9 with a 3.80 ERA (89 er in 211.0 ip) in 47 career interleague appearances, including 31 starts.

WITH THE BAT: Went 2-for-21 (.095) with Washington last year...is a .168 (49-for-292) career hitter with four doubles, two home runs, 13 RBI, 14 walks, 126 strikeouts and 23 sacrifice hits in his career.

16 SEASONS AND 13 TEAMS: Is in his 16th season in the majors with his 13th team (Los Angeles-NL, Tampa Bay, Detroit, Arizona, Chicago-AL, St. Louis, Washington, Chicago-NL, Atlanta, Miami, San Diego, Baltimore)...has tied Octavio Dotel's Major League record for teams played for in a career.

FIRST START: He had a no decision in the A's 5-4 win at Detroit on June 25...blanked the Tigers on one hit over the first three innings before allowing a RBI single to Hicks in the fourth...that was the only run he would allow in six innings of work...the A's tied the game with a run in the seventh and he was relieved by Petit to start the bottom of the seventh.

SECOND START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 7-2 win over Cleveland July 7 in Oakland...retired each of the first nine batters he faced before allowing a lead off home run to Lindor in the fourth...one out later, Ramirez added a solo shot but he then retired each of the final 10 batters he faced...was relieved by Buchter with two outs in the seventh inning and the A's leading 3-2.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 6-3, 11-inning win at Cleveland last Saturday...allowed single runs in each of the first two innings on an Encarnacion RBI ground out and an Allen RBI double...was relieved by Buchter with two outs in the sixth inning, runners on first and second and the A's trailing 2-0...Buchter allowed one of the runners to score but the A's tied the game with a three-run eighth inning.

JACKSON vs. SAN FRANCISCO: Is 5-4 with a 4.71 ERA (65.0 ip, 56 h, 38 r, 34 er, 39 bb, 64 so, 7 hr) in 12 career appearances, including 11 starts...is 4-2 with a 6.08 ERA (27 er in 40.0 ip) in eight games in his home ballpark and 1-2 with a 2.52 ERA (7 er in 25.0 ip) in four starts at AT&T Park...has a three-game winning streak against San Francisco (5 er in 18.1 ip, 2.45 ERA), including a win in his only start last year on Aug. 12 at Washington, a 3-1 Nationals win...allowed his only run in six innings of work on a one-out home run by Panik in the top of the first...blanked the Giants on three hits and two walks over his final five innings.

2018 IN THE MINORS: Combined for a 4-3 record and a 3.53 ERA in 13 games, all starts, with Triple-A Syracuse in the Washington organization and Triple-A Nashville in the Oakland farm system...the starts were his most as a minor leaguer since 2006 when he made 13 starts with Triple-A Durham in the Tampa Bay farm system...had no decisions and a 5.09 ERA in four starts in April...then went 4-3 with a 3.02 ERA over his final nine starts...surrendered five home runs in 71.1 innings...allowed a .232 opponents batting average, including .221 (32-for-145) by right-handed hitters compared to .244 (31-for-127) by left-handed hitters...surrendered four of his five home runs to lefties...had a .266 (41-for-154) opponents average with the bases empty compared to .186 (22-for-118) with runners on...three of the five home runs he allowed were solo shots...yielded a .174 (12-for-69) average with runners in scoring position...opponents were 11-for-64 (.172) with eight walks (.264 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning...went 1-for-5 with a double, walk and two strikeouts as a hitter, including 1-for-2 with a double and a walk in three pinch hitting appearances...allowed one run or fewer in seven of his 13 starts.

WITH SYRACUSE: Issued a season-high six walks in his first start April 9 at Rochester...allowed a season-high five runs in a season-low 2.2 innings April 21 at Louisville but had a no decision...finished April with no decisions and a 5.09 ERA in four starts...then went 4-2 with a 2.61 ERA in six starts in May...struck out a season-high nine batters in 6.0 innings May 3 at Buffalo but took the loss...was credited with his first win of the season May 8 against Scranton/Wilkes-Barre when he allowed a run in 6.0 innings in a 4-1 win...won again in his next start on May 13 against Pawtucket...tossed a season-high 7.0 innings in back-to-back starts on the 13th and May 19 against Lehigh Valley...took the loss on the 19th when he surrendered a season-high eight hits, but then won each of his final two starts in May on the 24 at Buffalo and the 29 against Toledo...finished May with a 4-2 record and a 2.61 ERA in six starts.

WITH NASHVILLE: Allowed just one run in 6.0 innings in his first start with the Sounds, but took the loss in a 1-0 decision to Tacoma June 9...matched his season-high by allowing five runs in 4.0 innings at El Paso on June 14.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
LHP Brett Anderson (1-2, 5.45 ERA): Was reinstated from the 10-day disabled list last Sunday and started and won that day at Cleveland...combined with Petit, Buchter and Pagan on a five-hit shutout in the A's 6-0 win (5.0 ip, 3 h, 2 bb, 3 so)...it was his first win as an Athletic since April 7, 2013...was 0-2 with a 7.63 ERA in four starts when he was placed on the DL May 19 with a strained right shoulder...is 2-4 with a 4.53 ERA (45.2 ip, 50 h, 23 r, 23 er, 11 bb, 29 so, 2 hr) in nine career appearances, all starts, against San Francisco...last faced the Giants on Oct. 1, 2015 when he was the winning pitcher in the Dodgers 3-2 win at San Francisco (7.2 ip, 4 h, 2 r, 2 er, 3 so)...is 1-6 with a 5.76 ERA and .328 opponents batting average in nine career interleague starts...is a .093 (7-for-75) career hitter with a run, three doubles, five RBI, six walks, 46 strikeouts and 10 sacrifice hits...was 2-1 with a 2.78 ERA and .248 opponents batting average in seven starts with Triple-A Nashville.

- Has converted 28-of-35 (80.0%) save opportunities, which is the second best save percentage in the majors...are tied for third in the American League in saves but are tied for fifth in fewest save chances.
- Has the fifth lowest ERA in the AL (3.48)...ranks first in winning percentage (23-8, .742), tied for first in wins (23) and third in innings (341.2).
