OAKLAND ATHLETICS (53-42) VS. SAN FRANCISCO GIANTS (50-46)

SATURDAY, JULY 14, 2018 — AT&T PARK — 7:05 P.M. PDT

ABOUT THE A'S: Dropped yesterday's series opener to the Giants, 7-1...won three of four at American League West-leading Houston after winning two of three at AL Central leading Cleveland to start the road trip...have won 13 of the last 17 games and were a season-high 12 games over .500 at 53-41 (.563) prior to last night's loss...are 53-42, which is the third best record in the AL West, the fifth best record in the AL and the eighth best record in the majors...are 7-0-1 over the last eight series and the eight series unbeaten streak is the longest by an A's team since a nine-series streak from May 17-June 13, 2013...are nine games behind first place Houston in the AL West and five games behind the second Wild Card team, Seattle...have spent one day tied for first, one day tied for second, 18 days in third, three days tied for third, 78 days in fourth and seven days tied for fourth.

THE LAST 25 GAMES: The A's are 19-6 (.760) over their last 25 games dating back to June 16, which is tied for the best record in the majors over that span...before last night's loss, was the A's best record over a 24-game stretch since Aug. 30-Sept. 23, 2013 when they also went 19-5...have come from behind in 11 of the 19 wins (six runs once, five runs once, four runs once, three runs three times, two runs four times and one run once)...have scored the winning run in the eighth inning or later in eight of the wins (eighth inning three times, ninth inning twice, 10th inning once, 11th inning twice)...are batting .259 (226-for-872) over the last 25 games with 135 runs (5.4 per game) and 38 home runs...the pitching staff has a 4.04 ERA (102 er in 227.1 ip)...starters are 10-5 with a 4.19 ERA (62 er in 133.1 ip) and the bullpen is 9-1 with 12 saves, two blown saves and a 3.83 ERA (40 er in 94.0 ip).

THE LATE INNINGS: The A's scored three times in the eighth inning on Thursday and lead the majors in runs scored in the eighth inning (69)...are tied for the lead in runs scored in the ninth (49, Atlanta), tied for second in runs in the seventh inning or later (171) and tied for fourth in runs in extra innings (11)...have a Major League leading eight wins when trailing after seven innings and are tied for third in the AL with two wins when trailing after eighth innings...are 36-0 when leading after seven innings and are the only team in the majors that has not lost a game when leading after seven...are 44-0 when leading after eight innings and are one of four teams without a loss in those games (New York, Seattle, Texas)...are fourth in the Major Leagues by batting .266 (297-for-1117) in the seventh inning or later compared to .235 (505-for-2151) in innings 1-6, which is fifth lowest...have compiled a 3.43 ERA (110 er in 289.0 ip) in the seventh inning or later, which is third lowest in the AL, compared to a 4.36 ERA (276 er in 570.0 ip) over the first six innings.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 27-14 (.659) in games decided by two runs or fewer, which is the third best record in the majors...are 14-8 (.636) in one-run games, which is third best in the American League...are tied for the third fewest one-run games in the AL...are 6-4 (.600) in extra inning games, which is the fourth best record in the AL...the 10 extra inning games are tied for second most...are 13-6 (.684) in games decided in the last at bat, which is second best in the majors to Seattle (13-5, .722).

THE ALL-STAR BREAK: With a 53-42 record, the A's will go into the All-Star Break with a winning record for the first time since 2014 (59-36) and just the third time in the last 10 years...are scheduled to play 97 games before the break, which will be second most in Athletics history (98 in 1973)...have 316 extra base hits, which is one short of the Athletics record for extra base hits at the break (317 in 1996)...have 125 home runs, which is tied for third most in Athletics history before the break (137 in 1996, 131 in 2000, 125 in 2017).

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's are 7-3 (.700) in interleague play, which is the fourth best record in the majors (Bos, 7-1; Pit, 10-2; Cin, 10-3)...had just seven interleague wins all last year...rank seventh in ERA (3.34)...are eighth in slugging percentage (.450), and tied for eighth in home runs (18)...have a 38-16 (.704) record in interdivision play compared to 15-26 (.366) against the American League West...in addition to this three-game series with San Francisco, the A's also travel to Colorado (July 27-29) and host San Francisco (July 20-22) and the Dodgers (Aug. 7-8)...are 212-182 (.538) all-time in interleague play, which is fourth best in Major League history.

PITCHERS HITTING: A's pitchers are 1-for-11 (.091) with a run, RBI and four strikeouts this year...they are batting .080 (32-for-398) with four doubles, 12 RBI, 12 walks and 189 strikeouts since interleague play began in 1997...the batting average is the lowest in the majors over that span (New York-AL,

.082)...the last home run by an A's pitcher was by Blue Moon Odom on Sept. 4, 1972 against California...Odom also had the last triple on Aug. 22, 1971 against Boston...the last extra base hit was by Joe Kennedy, a double on June 12, 2007 at Houston.

THE LONG BALL: The A's have hit a Major League leading 83 home runs on the road...are on pace to hit 134 home runs on the road and the ML record is 138 set by San Francisco in 2001...have hit just 42 home runs at home and the A's 125 home runs rank tied for fifth in the American League...last night's home run from Chad Pinder gave the A's seven players with 10 or more home runs, tied with the Yankees for most in the American League.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 5-3 on this 10-game road trip to Cleveland (2-1), Houston (3-1) and San Francisco (0-1)...it is the A's third and final 10-game road trip of the season and it will conclude a stretch where Oakland plays 20 of 25 games on the road...are 17-6 over the first 23 games of this stretch...have won nine of their last 12 road games and are 21-9 (.700) away from home dating back to May 14...are 29-21 (.580) on the road compared to 24-21 (.533) at home...have the fourth best road record in the Major Leagues...following the All-Star Break, the A's have a brief three-game homestand against San Francisco...went 4-1 on the last homestand against Cleveland (2-1) and San Diego (2-0) and have won six the last seven home games.

RANKINGS: The A's ranks tied for fourth in the American League in extra base hits (316), fourth in batting with runners in scoring position (.261), fifth in runs (439) and slugging percentage (.424), and tied for fifth in home runs (125), and doubles (179)...are tied for the second fewest sacrifice hits (3)...rank last in the majors in stolen bases (18), stolen base attempts (34) and stolen base percentage (52.9)...opponents have been caught stealing 27 times, which is the most in the AL, but they have 63 stolen bases, which is third most...the pitching staff leads the AL in wild pitches (57), has the fourth fewest strikeouts (699) and fifth fewest walks (276)...rank third in the AL in most errors (61) and tied for fourth in unearned runs (34).

ALL-STARS: Jed Lowrie and Blake Treinen have been named to the AL All-Star team, the first All-Star selection for both...Lowrie joins Phil Garner (1976) as the only second basemen in Athletics history to be named to the AL All-Star squad (includes Philadelphia and Kansas City)...Treinen is the first A's reliever named to the Midsummer Classic since Sean Doolittle in 2014...the A's have two All-Star representatives for the first time since 2015 (Gray and Vogt).

A's vs. GIANTS: Tonight is the second of six consecutive games between the A's and Giants...this marks the fourth time in Oakland history the A's have played six straight regular season games against the same team in one season (July 20-23, 1972 at Boston; July 10-14, 1980 at California and Aug. 28-31, 1986 vs. Baltimore)...the two clubs split the season series last year, 2-2...it marked the 10th time in 21 seasons of interleague play the two clubs have split the season series...the A's have won seven season series and lost four...went 1-1 in San Francisco and 1-1 in Oakland last year...have won 14 of the last 20 games in Oakland but have lost 18 of the last 24 in San Francisco...are 59-56 all-time against the Giants during interleague play...that breaks down to 34-23 in Oakland and 25-33 in San Francisco...are 21-30 at AT&T Park.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Khris Davis entered last night's game as a defensive replacement and went 0-for-2, snapping his 14-game hitting streak (21-for-58, .362), which was a career-high, an A's season-high and the longest active hitting streak in the majors...**Jed Lowrie** has matched his career high with 16 home runs (also 2012)...leads the American League in RBI in the seventh inning or later (27), is third in game-winning RBI (12), tied for fourth in go-ahead RBI (17) and tied for eighth in RBI (62)...**Matt Olson** leads AL first basemen in home runs (19)...**Blake Treinen** lead Major League relievers in ERA (0.98) and is tied for fourth in the American League with 23 saves.

OAKLAND A'S 50th ANNIVERSARY MOMENTS

In **1987** Oakland hosts its only All-Star game, a game the National League wins 2-0 on Tim Lincecum's two-run triple off A's reliever Jay Howell in the top of the 13th inning...A's rookie Mark McGwire is 0 for 3 in his first All-Star game...in **1991** the A's defeat the Baltimore Orioles 3-2 in 11 innings as Tony La Russa becomes the 40th manager in Major League history win 1000 games...Baltimore scores a run in the top of the 11th but the A's win in the bottom of the inning on Jose Canseco's two-run single.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Brett Anderson (1-2, 5.75 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was reinstated from the 10-day disabled list last Sunday and started and won that day at Cleveland with 5.0 shutout innings...it was his first win as an Athletic since April 7, 2013...was 0-2 with a 7.63 ERA in four starts when he was placed on the DL May 19 with a strained right shoulder...was signed by the A's to a minor league contract March 19 and began the season at Triple-A Nashville...went 1-1 with a 1.89 ERA in four starts with the Sounds before he was selected by Oakland May 2...went 1-0 with a 4.05 ERA on a three-start rehab assignment with the Sounds from June 23 to July 7.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed nine extra base hits (six doubles, three home runs), all to right-handed hitters...opponents are 8-for-20 (.400) with runners in scoring position.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: Is scheduled to make his first interleague appearance of the season...took the loss in his only interleague start with the Cubs last year on May 6 against New York (0.1 ip, 6 h, 5 r, 5 er 1 so)...is 1-6 with a 5.76 ERA (29 er in 45.1 ip) and .328 (61-for-186) opponents batting average in nine career interleague starts.

WITH THE BAT: Went 1-for-7 (.143) with a walk, RBI and three strikeouts for the Cubs last year...is a .093 (7-for-75) career hitter with a run, three doubles, five RBI, six walks, 46 strikeouts and 10 sacrifice hits...went 0-for-4 with two strikeouts as an Athletic.

FIRST START: He had a no decision in the A's 3-2 win at Seattle May 2...allowed his only two runs in the third inning on a leadoff home run by Healy and a RBI single by Segura...retired 11 straight before allowing back-to-back singles to Haniger and Seager with one out in the seventh...was relieved by Dull with Oakland trailing 2-0 but the A's scored twice in the eighth to get him off the hook and once in the ninth for the win.

SECOND START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 16-2 loss to Houston on May 7 in Oakland...allowed nine runs on 10 hits in 3.0 innings...yielded a two-run single to Gonzalez in the first and a three-run home run to Springer in the second...then allowed a RBI double to Stassi and a RBI single to Altuve in the fourth and was relieved by Hatcher with runners on first and second and no outs...Hatcher allowed both runs to score plus two more of his own.

THIRD START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-2 loss at New York (AL) May 13...allowed three runs in the first inning on a two-run single by Stanton and a RBI single by Hicks...Oakland scored a run in the fifth, but he allowed a run in the bottom of the fifth on a Stanton home run...left after five innings trailing 4-1.

FOURTH START: He had a no decision in the A's 3-1 win at Toronto on May 18...tossed just one inning and did not allow a run, despite surrendering two hits...left the game early with a strained left shoulder.

LAST START: He combined with Petit, Buchter and Pagán on a five-hit shutout in the A's 6-0 win at Cleveland last Sunday...tossed five of the innings and allowed three of the hits...retired the side in order in the first, third and fifth and allowed runners into scoring position in the other two innings.

ANDERSON vs. SAN FRANCISCO: Is 2-4 with a 4.53 ERA (45.2 ip, 50 h, 23 r, 23 er, 11 bb, 29 so, 2 hr) in nine career appearances, all starts...is 1-4 with a 4.80 ERA (16 er in 30.0 ip) in six starts at AT&T Park and 1-0 with a 4.02 ERA (7 er in 15.2 ip) in three starts in his home ballparks (all at Dodger Stadium)...last faced the Giants on Oct. 1, 2015 when he was the winning pitcher in the Dodgers 3-2 win at San Francisco...shutout the Giants on two hits over the first seven innings and had a 3-0 lead when he allowed a Pagán RBI single in the eighth...was relieved by Chris Hatcher with two outs in the eighth and a runner on second and Hatcher allowed that run to score.

WITH NASHVILLE: Is 2-1 with a 2.78 ERA and .248 opponents batting average in seven starts with Triple-A Nashville...has not allowed a home run in 32.1 innings...has 36 strikeouts (10.02 per nine innings) and has walked just six (1.67 per nine innings) for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 6.0...his opponents batting average includes a .223 (21-for-94) mark against right-handed hitters compared to .314 (11-for-35) against left-handers...has yielded a .156 batting average and just one walk to batters leading off an inning (.182 on-base percentage)...opponents are hitting .182 with the bases empty, .346 with runners on...including .333 with runners in scoring position...tossed 4.0 innings in his first start on April 9 at New Orleans and allowed five runs, all unearned, for the loss...struck out a season-high eight batters in each of his next two starts on April 14 against Omaha (4.0 ip) and April 19 at Iowa (5.0 ip), but no decisions...tossed a season-high 6.0 innings and picked up his first win April 25 against New Orleans...that was his final start before he was selected by Oakland May 2...was 1-1 with a 1.89 ERA in four starts at the time of his promotion...returned on June 23 for a three-start rehab assignment and went 1-0 with a 4.05 ERA before returning to Oakland...tossed 4.0 scoreless innings in his first rehab start June 23 against Round Rock...then allowed a season-high six runs on a season-high seven hits in 3.2 innings in a no decision at Oklahoma City June 28.

2017 RECAP: Was signed by the Chicago Cubs Jan. 30 and went 2-2 with an 8.18 ERA in six starts before going on the disabled list May 7 with a strained lower back...missed nearly three months of the season and would not pitch for the Cubs again as he was released July 31...signed a minor league deal with Toronto Aug. 15 and returned to the majors Aug. 29...went 2-2 with a 5.13 ERA in seven starts for the Blue Jays and combined with both clubs for a 4.04 record and a 6.34 ERA in 13 starts...allowed a .322 opponents batting average, including .298 (56-for-188) against right-handed hitters compared to .436 (17-for-39) against left-handers...surrendered all five of his home runs to righties...yielded a .371 batting average with runners in scoring position...opponents hit .345 when leading off an inning, but he issued just one walk...went 1-2 with a 15.68 ERA in four starts at Wrigley Field and 1-2 with a 7.62 ERA in three starts in Rogers Centre for an 11.19 ERA in seven starts in his home ballparks...was 2-0 with a 2.81 ERA in six starts on the road...was 2-0 with a 2.05 ERA in four starts during the day, 2-4 with a 9.18 ERA in nine starts at night...was 1-1 with an 8.84 ERA in five starts on four days rest, 3-3 with a 5.00 ERA in eight starts on five days rest or more...had a 7.04 ERA over the first two innings of his starts, 3.06 after that...opponents were successful in 6-of-7 (85.7%) stolen base attempts...allowed five runs in 0.1 innings for the loss in his only interleague start and is now 1-6 with a 5.76 ERA (29 er in 45.1 ip) in nine career interleague starts...went 1-for-7 (.143) with a RBI, walk and three strikeouts in eight plate appearances with the Cubs.

- The A's bullpen had their 15.1 scoreless innings streak snapped on Tuesday night, which started on 7/7, it was the longest scoreless streak of the season...Have not allowed a run in six of their last 10 games (12 er in 40.1 ip, 2.68 ERA).
- Has converted 28-of-35 (80.0%) save opportunities, which is the second best save percentage in the majors...are tied for third in the American League in saves but fifth in fewest save chances.
- Has the sixth lowest ERA in the AL (3.59)...ranks first in winning percentage (23-8, .742), tied for first in wins (23) and third in innings (343.2).
- Has a 3.19 ERA (66 er in 186.0 ip) and .203 (137-for-676) opponents batting average over its last 50 games dating back to May 18...posted a 4.05 ERA and .273 opponents average over its first 43 contests.
