OAKLAND ATHLETICS (54-42) VS. SAN FRANCISCO GIANTS (50-47)

SUNDAY, JULY 15, 2018 — AT&T PARK — 1:05 P.M. PDT

ABOUT THE A'S: Have split the first two games of the Bay Bridge Series after winning 4-3 last night...won three of four at American League West-leading Houston after winning two of three at AL Central leading Cleveland to start the road trip...have won 14 of the last 18 games and are a season-high-tying 12 games over .500 at 54-42 (.563)...have the third best record in the AL West, the fifth best record in the AL and the eighth best record in the majors...are 7-0-1 over the last eight series and the eight series unbeaten streak is the longest by an A's team since a nine-series streak from May 17-June 13, 2013...are nine games behind first place Houston in the AL West and four games behind the second Wild Card team, Seattle...have spent one day tied for first, one day tied for second, 19 days in third, three days tied for third, 78 days in fourth and seven days tied for fourth.

THE LAST 26 GAMES: The A's are 20-6 (.769) over their last 26 games dating back to June 16, which is the best record in the majors over that span...have come from behind in 12 of the 20 wins (six runs once, five runs once, four runs once, three runs three times, two runs four times and one run twice)...have scored the winning run in the eighth inning or later in eight of the wins (eighth inning three times, ninth inning twice, 10th inning once, 11th inning twice)...are batting .259 (235-for-906) over the last 26 games with 139 runs (5.35 per game) and 39 home runs...the pitching staff has a 4.00 ERA (105 er in 236.1 ip)...starters are 10-5 with a 4.28 ERA (65 er in 136.2 ip) and the bullpen is 10-1 with 13 saves, two blown saves and a 3.61 ERA (40 er in 99.2 ip).

THE LATE INNINGS: The A's scored three times in the eighth inning on Thursday and lead the majors in runs scored in the eighth inning (69)...are tied for the lead in runs scored in the ninth (49, Atlanta), tied for second in runs in the seventh inning or later (173) and tied for fifth in runs in extra innings (11)...are 37-0 when leading after seven innings and are the only team in the majors that has not lost a game when leading after seven...are 45-0 when leading after eight innings...are third in the Major Leagues by batting .267 (302-for-1131) in the seventh inning or later compared to .234 (509-for-2171) in innings 1-6, which is fifth lowest...have compiled a 3.39 ERA (110 er in 292.0 ip) in the seventh inning or later, which is third lowest in the AL, compared to a 4.36 ERA (279 er in 576.0 ip) over the first six innings.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 28-14 (.667) in games decided by two runs or fewer, which is the third best record in the majors...are 15-8 (.652) in one-run games, which is second best in the American League and third in the Majors...have the fourth fewest one-run games in the AL...are 6-4 (.600) in extra inning games, which is the fourth best record in the AL...the 10 extra inning games are tied for second most.

THE ALL-STAR BREAK: With a 54-42 record, the A's will go into the All-Star Break with a winning record for the first time since 2014 (59-36) and just the third time in the last 10 years...are scheduled to play 97 games before the break, which will be second most in Athletics history (98 in 1973)...have 319 extra base hits, which is an Athletics record for extra base hits at the break (previous, 317 in 1996)...have 126 home runs, which is third most in Athletics history before the break (137 in 1996, 131 in 2000).

WHERE WE'RE GOING: The Athletics have two prospects participating in today's Futures Game...LHP Jesus Luzardo will play for the World Team and C Sean Murphy will play for Team USA...Luzardo is 8-4 with a 2.53 ERA in 16 starts this season split between Single-A Advanced and Double-A...Murphy is hitting .291 with eight homers and 42 RBI in 65 games with Double-A Midland this season...Luzardo has raised more than \$10,000 for the Chris Hixon Foundation...named after Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School's former Athletic Director, the fundraiser aims to help Hixon's family in the wake of the fatal shooting in February...to donate, visit youcaring.com/luzardo.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's are 8-3 (.727) in interleague play, which is the fourth best record in the majors (Bos, 7-1; Pit, 10-2; Cin, 10-3)...had just seven interleague wins all last year...rank seventh in ERA (3.31)...are seventh in slugging percentage (.447), and tied for sixth in home runs (19)...have a 38-16 (.704) record in interdivision play compared to 15-26 (.366) against the American League West...in addition to this three-game series with San Francisco, the A's also travel to Colorado (July 27-29) and host San Francisco

(July 20-22) and the Dodgers (Aug. 7-8)...are 213-182 (.539) all-time in interleague play, which is fourth best in Major League history.

THE LONG BALL: The A's have hit a Major League leading 84 home runs on the road...are on pace to hit 133 home runs on the road and the ML record is 138 set by San Francisco in 2001...have hit just 42 home runs at home and the A's 126 home runs rank tied for fifth in the American League...Friday night's home run from Chad Pinder gave the A's seven players with 10 or more home runs, tied with the Yankees for most in the American League.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 6-3 on this 10-game road trip to Cleveland (2-1), Houston (3-1) and San Francisco (1-1)...it is the A's third and final 10-game road trip of the season and it will conclude a stretch where Oakland plays 20 of 25 games on the road...are 18-6 over the first 24 games of this stretch...have won 10 of their last 13 road games and are 22-9 (.710) away from home dating back to May 14...are 30-21 (.588) on the road compared to 24-21 (.533) at home...have the fourth best road record in the Major Leagues...following the All-Star Break, the A's have a brief three-game homestand against San Francisco...went 4-1 on the last homestand against Cleveland (2-1) and San Diego (2-0) and have won six the last seven home games.

RANKINGS: The A's ranks tied for fourth in the American League in extra base hits (319), fifth in runs (443) and slugging percentage (.422), and tied for fifth in home runs (126), and sixth in doubles (181)...are tied for the second fewest sacrifice hits (3)...rank last in the majors in stolen bases (21), stolen base attempts (37) and stolen base percentage (.56.8)...opponents have been caught stealing 28 times, which is the most in the AL, but they have 64 stolen bases, which is third most...the pitching staff leads the AL in wild pitches (57), has the fourth fewest strikeouts (708) and fifth fewest walks (280)...rank fourth in the AL in most errors (61) and tied for fourth in unearned runs (34).

ALL-STAR: Jed Lowrie and Blake Treinen have been named to the AL All-Star team, the first All-Star selection for both...Lowrie joins Phil Garner (1976) as the only second basemen in Athletics history to be named to the AL All-Star squad (includes Philadelphia and Kansas City)...Treinen is the first A's reliever named to the Midsummer Classic since Sean Doolittle in 2014...the A's have two All-Star representatives for the first time since 2015 (Gray and Vogt).

A's vs. GIANTS: Today is the third of six consecutive games between the A's and Giants...this marks the fourth time in Oakland history the A's have played six straight regular season games against the same team in one season (July 20-23, 1972 at Boston; July 10-14, 1980 at California and Aug. 28-31, 1986 vs. Baltimore)...the two clubs split the season series last year, 2-2...it marked the 10th time in 21 seasons of interleague play the two clubs have split the season series...the A's have won seven season series and lost four...went 1-1 in San Francisco and 1-1 in Oakland last year...have won 14 of the last 20 games in Oakland but have lost 18 of the last 25 in San Francisco...are 60-56 all-time against the Giants during interleague play...that breaks down to 34-23 in Oakland and 26-33 in San Francisco...are 22-30 at AT&T Park.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Mark Canha hit a pinch-hit, go-ahead home run in the seventh inning last night...was his first career pinch-hit home run...was also his 10th home run this season off of a left-handed pitcher, tied with Giancarlo Stanton for the most in the American League...**Jed Lowrie** has matched his career high with 16 home runs (also 2012)...leads the American League in RBI in the seventh inning or later (27), is third in game-winning RBI (12), tied for fifth in go-ahead RBI (17) and tied for ninth in RBI (62)...**Matt Olson** leads AL first basemen in home runs (19)...**Blake Treinen** lead Major League relievers in ERA (0.96) and is fourth in the American League with 24 saves.

OAKLAND A'S 50th ANNIVERSARY MOMENTS

In **1969** Blue Moon Odom homers, drives in four runs and tosses a complete game to improve his record to 13-3 in the A's 6-2 win at Seattle... in **2002** Ted Lilly combines with the A's bullpen on a four-hit shutout in his Oakland debut at Tampa Bay, the A's third shutout in their last four games...in **2014** six A's players appear in the All-Star Game at Minnesota, matching the Athletics record for most players to play in an All-Star Game...the A's also had six players in 1973 and 1975.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Manaea (8-6, 3.44 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is 3-0 with a 3.16 ERA (15 er in 42.2 ip) and .217 (35-for-161) opponents batting average in seven starts since the beginning of June...began the season by going 4-2 with a 1.03 ERA and .134 opponents batting average over his first six starts through the end of April but then went 1-4 with a 7.18 ERA and .295 opponents batting average in six starts in May.

DON'T WALK: Has walked five batters in his last six starts (37.1 ip) and has issued two free passes or fewer in 17 of his 19 starts this year...has walked 23 batters in 117.2 innings, an average of 1.76 per nine innings...that ranks fifth lowest in the American League.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Has the sixth lowest opponents on-base percentage in the American League (.264), the 11th lowest batting average (.213) and the ninth lowest OPS (.637)...has the fifth fewest strikeouts per nine innings (6.27), is tied for seventh in wild pitches (8), tied for ninth in hit batters (8) and tied for 12th in home runs (17)...is averaging the second fewest pitches per inning in the majors (14.7).

10-GAME DAY WINNING STREAK: Is 4-0 with a 2.98 ERA (15 er in 45.1 ip) in seven starts during the day compared to 4-6 with a 3.73 ERA (30 er in 72.1 ip) in 12 starts at night...now has a 10-game winning streak in day games dating back to May 20, 2017 and has a 3.12 ERA (34 er in 98.0 ip) in 16 day starts total over that stretch...has not lost during the day since April 7, 2017 at Texas...is now 12-3 with a 3.36 ERA (56 er in 150.0 ip) in 25 career day games, 15-22 with a 4.25 ERA (128 er in 271.0 ip) in 48 starts at night.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: Is 0-2 with a 5.74 ERA (15.2 ip, 19 h, 10 r, 10 er, 5 bb, 8 so, 4 hr) in three interleague starts compared to 8-4 with a 3.09 ERA against the American League...is now 2-5 with a 4.23 ERA (26 er in 55.1 ip) in 10 career starts against the National League.

WITH THE BAT: Is 0-for-1 this year as he grounded out in his only plate appearance at Los Angeles (NL) on April 10...is now 0-for-6 with a walk, three strikeouts and a sacrifice hit in his career...never batted as a minor leaguer.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received two runs of support or fewer in 11 of his 19 starts, including no runs five times...has received two runs of support or fewer in each of his six losses this year (4 rs in 33.0 ip, 1.09 RSA) and 24 of his 25 career losses (24 rs in 126.1 ip, 1.71 RSA)...is 18-0 in 25 career starts with run support of four or more and 24-1 in 33 starts with three runs of support or more.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents are 16-for-113 (.142) with six walks and three hit by pitches (.205 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning...the on-base percentage is the lowest in the majors and the batting average is second lowest (Foltynewicz, ATL .128)...has a .173 (27-for-156) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .266 (42-for-158) the second time and .195 (25-for-128) after that...has surrendered 15 of his 17 home runs to right-handed hitters.

MONTH BY MONTH: Has no decisions and a 4.09 ERA (5 er in 11.0 ip) over his first two starts of July...went 3-0 with a 2.84 ERA and .202 opponents batting average in five starts in the month of June...compiled a 1-4 record and a 7.18 ERA and .295 opponents batting average in six starts in May...tied for the American League lead in May losses and had the second highest ERA (Giolito, CWS 7.36)...it was the second time he lost four games in a month in his career (Aug. 2016)...was 4-1 with a 1.00 ERA and .130 opponents batting average in five starts in April...led the AL in ERA and opponents batting in April and tied for the lead in wins...was named AL Pitcher of the Month in April, his first Pitcher of the Month honor...it was the first time in his career he won four games in a month...his ERA tied for the fourth lowest in any month in Oakland history among pitchers with 30 or more innings pitched...it was the lowest since Cory Lidle had a 0.20 ERA in Aug., 2002...had a .395 OPS and is the fourth pitcher in Oakland history with an OPS under .400 in a month with a minimum of 100 batters faced.

2018 HIGHLIGHTS: Allowed one run in 7.2 innings in his first start on March 30 against Los Angeles (AL) and one run in 8.0 innings in his second start on April 4 against Texas to become the first A's pitcher on an Opening Day roster to start the season with back-to-back outings of seven innings or more and one run or fewer since Steve Karsay in 1994...won three consecutive starts from April 15 to 27 and allowed just two runs (one earned) on six hits over that stretch (0.39 ERA, .078 opponents batting average)...tossed the seventh no-hitter in Oakland history and the 12th in Athletics history in a 3-0 win over Boston in Oakland on April 21...walked two and matched his career high with 10 strikeouts...walked Betts to start the game but then retired 14 straight before Leon reached on a Semien error...set down the next 12 before walking Benintendi with two outs in the ninth...then got Ramirez to hit into a game-ending force out...the no-hitter was his first career complete game...it came in his 59th game and 58th start and his streak of 57 consecutive starts without a complete game was fourth longest in Oakland history...the shutout came in the A's 21st game of the season and it was the earliest shut-

out by an Athletic since Barry Zito on April 18, 2003 vs. Texas, the A's 17th game of the season...it was the earliest no-hitter by date in Athletics history (Catfish Hunter, May 8, 1968 vs. Minnesota) and second earliest by game number (Chief Bender, May 12, 1910 vs. Cleveland, game 18)...it was the 10th no-hitter in Coliseum history (six by A's, four by opponents)...it was the first since Dallas Braden's perfect game on May 9, 2010 vs. Tampa Bay...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, the Red Sox .895 winning percentage entering the game was the highest in Major League history by a team that was no-hit at least five games into the season...the last pitcher to no hit a team that led the majors in runs per game entering the game was the A's Dave Stewart, who did it against Toronto on June 29, 1990 (also Elias)...was named American League Co-Player of the Week for the week of April 16-22, his first Player of the Week award...allowed a fourth-inning single to Correa in his first start after the no-hitter on April 27 at Houston, snapping his streak of consecutive hitless innings at an Oakland record 14.0 innings...broke the previous mark of 13.0 held by John "Blue Moon" Odom from June 1-7, 1968...opponents went 0-for-47 off him during the hitless streak...yielded four runs on six hits in a 4-1 loss at Seattle May 3 to snap a season-opening streak where he allowed two runs or fewer and tossed five innings or more in each of his first six starts...that tied for the third longest such season-opening streak in Oakland history...it was the longest since Dave Stewart had a seven-game streak in 1990.

LAST START: He had his second consecutive no decision in the A's 6-5 loss in 11 innings on Tuesday at Houston...allowed a solo home run to Bregman in the first and RBI singles to Springer in the second and fourth...yielded a lead-off single to Altuve in the fifth and was relieved by Dull with the A's trailing 3-0.

- Has converted 29-of-36 (80.6%) save opportunities, which is the best save percentage in the majors...are tied for third in the American League in saves but fifth in fewest save chances.
- Has the fifth lowest ERA in the AL (3.53)...ranks first in winning percentage (24-8, .750), tied for first in wins (24) and third in innings (349.1).
- Has a 3.10 ERA (66 er in 191.2 ip) and .200 (139-for-695) opponents batting average over its last 51 games dating back to May 18...posted a 4.05 ERA and .273 opponents average over its first 43 contests.
