OAKLAND ATHLETICS (58-43) VS. TEXAS RANGERS (42-59)

TUESDAY, JULY 23, 2018 — GLOBE LIFE PARK — 7:05 P.M. CDT

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won three straight after losing their first game following the All-Star Break and are now 15 games over .500 for the first time since Sept. 23, 2014 when they were 86-71...have not been 16 over since Sept. 22, 2014 when they were 86-70...are 58-43 (.574), which is the third best record in the American League West, the fifth best record in the AL and the sixth best record in the majors...are 7½ games behind Houston in the West, which is the closest they have been to first since June 10 when they were also 7½ back...are 2½ games behind the second Wild Card team, Seattle, which is the closest they have been since May 21 when they were also 2½ games back.

THE LAST 31 GAMES: The A's are 24-7 (.774) dating back to June 16, which is the best record in the majors over that span...it matches the best 31-game stretch in the majors this year and is Oakland's best record over a 31-game stretch since July 31-Sept. 3, 2006 when they were also 24-7...have come from behind in 15 of the 23 wins (six runs once, five runs once, four runs once, three runs three times, two runs four times and one run five times)...have scored the winning run in the eighth inning or later in 10 of the victories (eighth inning three times, ninth inning twice, 10th inning twice, 11th inning three times)...have not lost back-to-back games during this stretch.

MONTH BY MONTH: The A's are 12-5 (.706) in July, which is the second best record in the American League (Boston, 15-3)...the 12 wins match the A's July total from each of the previous two years...need one more win to clinch a winning record this month after going 13-12 in April, 15-14 in May and 17-10 in June...there have been just seven seasons in Oakland history in which the A's have posted a winning record in April, May, June and July (1971, 1972, 1975, 1990, 2003, 2013, 2014).

THE LONG BALL: The A's hit four home runs last night: a Lucroy grand slam, a Piscotty two-run homer, a Chapman three-run homer and a Davis solo shot...it was the fifth time in Athletics (since 1901) history the A's hit for the home run cycle (last: July 19, 2015 vs. Minnesota)...also had four home runs on Sunday and have back-to-back four homer games for the 10th time in Athletics history (last: Aug. 30-31, 2012)...have never had three straight four-homer games...have a Major League leading 89 home runs on the road and are on pace for 136...the ML record is 138 by San Francisco in 2001...have 135 home runs overall, which is tied for fourth in the American League.

THE LATE INNINGS: The A's scored eight of their 15 runs last night over the final three innings...lead the majors in runs scored in the eighth inning (72), rank second in runs in the seventh inning or later (185), third in runs in the ninth (50) and tied for third in runs in extra innings (13)...have a Major League leading eight wins when trailing after seven innings and are tied for third in the American League with two wins when trailing after eight innings...are 40-0 when leading after seven innings and are the only team in the majors that has not lost a game when leading after seven...have won each of their last 55 games when leading after seven innings, which is their longest such streak since a 61-game streak from June 1-Sept. 22, 2002...last lost when leading after seven innings on Sept. 2, 2017 at Texas...are 48-0 when leading after eight innings and are one of four teams without a loss in those games (New York, Seattle, Texas)...have won each of their last 75 games when leading after eight with the last loss coming on July 27, 2017 at Toronto...are batting an AL leading .270 (324-for-1200) in the seventh inning or later compared to .234 (534-for-2278) in innings 1-6, which is third lowest...have compiled a 3.48 ERA (120 er in 310.0 ip) in the seventh inning or later, which is third lowest in the AL.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 15-6 (.714) in games decided in the last at bat, which is the best mark in the majors...only Toronto has more last at bat wins (19)...are 8-4 (.667) in extra inning games...are tied for second in the majors in extra inning games (12) and are tied for the third best record...have the third best record in one-run games (17-8, .680) and games decided by two runs or fewer (30-14, .682)...have 27 comeback wins, which ranks fourth in the majors...are tied for fifth in the majors in walk-off wins (6) and are tied for the fewest walk-off losses (2).

THE WEST AND THE REST: The A's have won six of their last seven games against American League West teams...however, are 16-26 (.381) against AL West competition compared to 42-17 (.712) against all other teams...are batting .236 (335-for-1420) and are averaging 4.07 runs per game (171

runs in 42 games) against the AL West, .254 with an average of 5.15 runs per game against everyone else...the pitching staff has a 4.77 ERA (198 er in 373.1 ip) against the AL West, 3.47 against all other teams.

THE PREVIOUS 10 SERIES: The A's are 9-0-1 over their previous 10 series and their 10-series unbeaten streak is their longest since July 28-Sept. 3, 2006 when they went 10-0-1 over an 11 series stretch...have not lost a series since being swept by Houston in a three-game series in Oakland, June 12-14.

HOMESTANDS AND ROAD TRIPS: The A's are 1-0 on his seven-game road trip to Texas (1-0) and Colorado (three games)...this trip concludes a stretch where the A's will play 27 of 35 games on the road from June 19 to July 29...are 16-5 in road games over that stretch and have won five series and split one...the last time the A's had a six series unbeaten streak on the road was July 31-Sept. 10, 2006 when they also went 5-0-1...have not gone unbeaten in seven consecutive road series since winning seven straight from July 8-Aug. 29, 2005...have not lost a road series since they were swept in a two-game series at Texas, June 5-6...after this trip, the A's will play 17 of their next 20 games at home with all 20 coming in California (three games at Los Angeles-AL)...are 24-9 (.727) on the road dating back to May 14 and are 32-21 (.604) overall, which is the third best road record in the majors...are 26-22 (.542) at home.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are batting .265 (502-for-1892) and are averaging 5.58 runs per game on the road (296 runs in 53 games), .224 and 3.73 runs per game at home...rank second in the American League in batting average and runs per game on the road to Houston (.273, 5.67)...have the lowest home batting average and the third fewest runs per game.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are scheduled to face a left-handed starting pitcher for the second consecutive game and fifth time in the last eight games tonight...have won nine of their last 11 games in which the opponent starts a southpaw and are 17-17 (.500) when the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher for the season...the 34 games against left-handed starters are fourth most in the American League...are 41-26 (.612) in games started by a right-hander.

RANKINGS: The A's rank fourth in the American League in doubles (193) and extra base hits (340), tied for fourth in home runs (135) and fifth in runs (475) and slugging (.426)...pitchers lead the league in wild pitches (60), have the fourth fewest strikeouts (754) and the fifth fewest walks (292)...opponents have been caught stealing 29 times, which is the most in the AL and third most in the majors...opponents have the third lowest stolen base percentage in the AL (69.8) but the third most steals (67)...the offense ranks last in the majors in steals (23), attempts (40) and stolen base percentage (57.5)...rank fourth in the AL in most errors (61)...have the second fewest outfield assists in the majors (9).

A's vs. RANGERS: The A's are 5-5 against the Rangers...are 2-2 in Oakland and 3-3 in Arlington...have lost 14 of the last 22 games on the road but have won 11 of the last 16 in Oakland...over the previous five seasons, the A's have won the season series in odd numbered years and the Rangers in even numbered years...are 54-51 against Texas dating back to the start of the 2013 season...are 357-366 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 189-172 in Oakland and 169-194 in Texas...are 102-106 at Globe Life Park...have an all-time record of 454-448 against the Rangers/Senators franchise.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Khri Davis has homered in four straight games against the Rangers and is now a .305 career hitter against Texas with 22 home runs and 49 RBI in 47 games...the home runs and RBI are his most against any team...**Jonathan Lucroy** has a 12-game hitting streak against the Rangers dating back to June 12, 2010 (16-for-43, .372)...**Stephen Piscotty** homered for the sixth time in the month of July last night, which is tied for second most in the American League (Calhoun, LAA 7)...is tied for fifth in RBI (16)...**Blake Treinen** ranks second among Major League relievers in ERA (1.08) and **Lou Trivino** ranks fourth (1.36).

OAKLAND A'S 50th ANNIVERSARY MOMENTS

In 1990 Dave Henderson, Mark McGwire and Mike Gallego each homered in the sixth inning of the A's 5-3 win against California...it is the third time in 1990 that the A's hit three homers in one inning...in 1999 Jason Giambi hits a pair of three-run home runs in a game at Kansas City and has six RBI...he hit a grand slam against the Royals the night before.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Frankie Montas (5-2, 3.35 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville today for his second stint with the A's this year...went 5-2 with a 3.35 ERA in eight starts during his first stint from May 27 to July 9...began the year with the Sounds and went 1-5 with a 4.39 ERA in nine starts before the A's called for the first time May 27...picked up the win in his lone start following his July 10 option when he tossed 5.0 scoreless innings a week ago today against Omaha...is 2-5 with a 3.91 ERA in 10 starts overall at Triple-A.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 3-0 with a 2.66 ERA (7 er in 23.2 ip) in four starts on the road compared to 2-2 with a 4.01 ERA (11 er in 24.2 ip) in four starts at home...has not allowed a home run in 23.2 innings on the road.

40 INNING LEADERS: Has allowed just two home runs in 48.1 innings, an average of 0.37 per nine innings...that is the 10th lowest mark in the American League among pitchers with 40 or more innings...has eight grounded into double plays and his average of 1.49 GDP per nine innings is fifth best among AL pitchers with at least 40 innings.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents are 8-for-47 (.170) with three walks (.220 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning...has surrendered two home runs, both to left-handed hitters...has yielded 10 of his 13 career home runs to lefties...both of his home runs have come with runners on base as have 10 of his 13 career home runs.

THIS AND THAT: Has allowed two runs or fewer in five of his eight starts...has not allowed a run in the second inning (8.0 ip)...the A's are 6-2 (.750) in his starting assignments.

FIRST STINT: Went 3-0 with a 1.25 ERA and .208 opponents batting average in his first three starts from May 27 to June 8 but was 2-2 with a 5.06 ERA and .330 opponents average over his final five starts before his option...walked three batters in 21.2 innings over his first three starts but has issued 12 free passes in 26.2 innings over his final five.

2018 START-BY-START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 2-1 win over Arizona **May 27** in Oakland...matched his career best with seven strikeouts...retired each of the first 10 batters he faced and no-hit the Diamondbacks over the first five innings...combined with Pagán on an eight-hit shutout in the A's 16-0 win at Kansas City **June 1**...tossed a career-high eight innings...won his third consecutive start in the A's 7-2 win over Kansas City **June 8** in Oakland...blanked the Royals on four hits and a walk over the first seven innings before surrendering a two-run home run to Moustakas in the eighth, snapping his scoreless streak at a career-high 15.0 innings...was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-3 loss to Houston **June 14** in Oakland...allowed a career-high seven runs on a career-high 11 hits and a career-high tying four walks...was the winning pitcher in the A's 12-4 win at San Diego **June 20**...tossed a career-high 105 pitches allowed just one run in 6.2 innings of work...had a no decision in the A's 9-7 win at Detroit on **June 26**...allowed four runs in the first inning and a two-run triple to Machado in the third...was the losing pitcher in the A's 15-3 loss to Cleveland on **July 1** in Oakland...allowed a RBI single to Encarnacion in the first and RBI doubles to Ramirez in the fifth and Kipnis in the sixth.

LAST MAJOR LEAGUE START: He combined with Trivino and Treinen on a five-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win at Houston on July 9...tossed 6.0 innings and yielded three of the hits while walking two...allowed just two base runners to advance into scoring position...Oakland scored a run in the seventh to take a 1-0 lead and he was relieved by Trivino to start the bottom of the seventh.

WITH NASHVILLE: Went 2-5 with a 3.91 ERA in 10 starts, including one complete game, with Nashville...had a .259 opponents batting average, including .193 (11-for-57) against left-handed hitters compared to .291 (34-for-117) against right-handers...surrendered five home runs, four to righties...four were solo shots...walked just three batters to lead off an inning...went 0-3 with a 6.19 ERA in five starts in April and tossed four innings or fewer four times...then went 1-2 with a 3.24 ERA in four starts in May and tossed at least five innings in each start...was 2-1 with a 2.33 ERA in six starts at home, 0-4 with a 6.16 ERA in four starts on the road.

2018 NASHVILLE HIGHLIGHTS: Tossed just 37 pitches in his first start and allowed four runs on four hits in 0.2 innings for the loss on April 6 at New Orleans...also issued a season-high two walks...tossed 3.0 scoreless innings in his second start April 11 against Iowa when he combined with Ryan Dull (1.0 ip), Chris Bassitt (4.0 ip) and Lou Trivino (1.0 ip) on a five-hit shutout in a 6-0 win...allowed a season-high five runs on a season-high seven hits in 4.0 innings in an 8-6 loss to New Orleans April 28...went 1-0 with a 1.80 ERA over a three-start stretch from May 4 to 14...was credited with his first win of the season May 4 against Memphis when he allowed one run in 6.0 innings of work...struck out a season-high 10 batters in 6.0 innings May 9 against Colorado Springs...had a season-high 93 pitches, which he matched in his next start on May 14...tossed a complete game at Memphis on the 14th but was the losing pitcher in a 2-1 loss...allowed two runs on six hits in a season-high eight innings...matched his season high with five runs on seven hits in an 11-2 loss at Oklahoma City May 20.

LAST MINOR LEAGUE START: He was the winning pitcher in the Sounds 11-1 win over Omaha a week ago today at Nashville...logged 5.0 scoreless innings and allowed just three hits while walking two...tossed 79 pitches...allowed runners into scoring position just once when he put runners on second and third with no outs in the second before retiring the final three batters in the inning.

2017 RECAP: Was on the A's Opening Day roster and compiled a 7.03 ERA and .302 opponents batting average in 23 games over two stints with Oakland...also went 0-2 with a 5.22 ERA in nine games, eight starts, with Triple-A Nashville before an oblique injury ended his season in mid-August...issued 20 walks in 32.0 innings (5.63 per nine innings) with the A's for a .408 opponents on-base percentage...had a .566 opponents slugging percentage and .974 OPS...the OPS was the highest in Oakland history by a reliever, the slugging percentage was second highest and the on-base percentage was third highest...had the highest OPS and on-base percentage among Major League relievers in 2017...had the second highest opponents slugging percentage among AL relievers and the sixth highest opponents batting average...struck out 36 for an average of 10.13 strikeouts per nine innings...allowed 10 home runs, an average of 2.81 home runs per nine innings...that was the second highest mark in Oakland history among pitchers with 30 or more innings pitched (Curt Young, 2.93 in 1985)...tied for seventh among AL relievers in home runs allowed...his opponents batting average included a .257 mark against right-handed hitters compared to .364 against left-handers...yielded seven of his 10 home runs and issued 12 of his 20 walks to lefties...had a .751 OPS against righties, 1.267 against lefties.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
RHP Edwin Jackson (1-2, 2.93 ERA): Was selected by Oakland June 25 and is scheduled to make his sixth start of the season...signed a minor league contract with the Washington Nationals on Jan. 11 and began the season at Triple-A Syracuse...was released June 1, signed a minor league deal with the A's June 6 and was assigned to Triple-A Nashville...combined for a 4-3 record and a 3.53 ERA in 13 minor league starts overall...has 99 career wins...has a 0.60 ERA and .080 opponents batting average over the first three innings of a game...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 5-1 A's loss to San Francisco last Friday in Oakland (6.1 ip, 4 h, 3 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 6 so)...is 2-3 with a 4.02 ERA (47.0 ip, 43 h, 21 r, 21 er, 22 bb, 41 so, 5 hr) in seven career appearances, all starts, against Texas...last faced the Rangers on May 16, 2011 and was the losing pitcher for the White Sox in a 4-0 loss at Chicago (5.1 ip, 11 h, 4 r, 4 er, 3 bb, 6 so).
