OAKLAND ATHLETICS (59-43) VS. TEXAS RANGERS (42-60)

WEDNESDAY, JULY 25, 2018 — GLOBE LIFE PARK — 7:05 P.M. CDT

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won four straight after losing their first game following the All-Star Break and are now 16 games over .500 for the first time since Sept. 22, 2014 when they were 86-70...have not been 17 over since Sept. 14, 2014 when they were 83-66...are 59-43 (.578), which is the third best record in the American League West, the fifth best record in the AL and the sixth best record in the majors...are 7½ games behind Houston in the West and are 1½ games behind the second Wild Card team, Seattle, which is the closest they have been to a playoff spot outside the first 10 games of the season.

COMEBACKS: The A's overcame an eight-run deficit last night to win 13-10 in 10 innings...it was the fourth time in Oakland history the A's overcame a deficit of eight or more runs and won, the first time since July 20, 2009 when they trailed Minnesota 12-2 and won 14-13...it was the first time they trailed by eight or more after six innings and came back to win since Aug. 30, 1939 at St. Louis...it is the fourth time this year the A's have overcome a deficit of five or more runs to win (6, June 26 at Chicago-AL; 5, June 23 at Chicago-AL; 5, April 18 vs. Chicago-AL)...the only other times in Oakland history the A's had four games where they came back from deficits of five or more to win was in 1992 and 1993...have 28 come from behind wins for the season, which is tied with Boston for the most in the American League and tied for third most in the majors.

THE LAST 32 GAMES: The A's are 25-7 (.781) dating back to June 16, which is the best record in the majors over that span by two games...it matches the best 32-game stretch in the majors this year and is Oakland's best record over a 32-game stretch since July 30-Sept. 3, 2006 when they were also 25-7...have come from behind in 16 of the 23 wins (eight runs once, six runs once, five runs once, four runs once, three runs three times, two runs four times and one run five times)...have scored the winning run in the eighth inning or later in 11 of the victories (eighth inning three times, ninth inning twice, 10th inning three, 11th inning three times)...have not lost back-to-back games during this stretch.

THE LATE INNINGS: The A's have scored 28 runs this series, 19 in the seventh inning or later...lead the majors in runs scored in the eighth inning (76) and in the seventh inning or later (196), are tied for the lead in runs in the ninth (51) and rank second in runs in extra innings (16)...have a Major League leading nine wins when trailing after seven innings and are third in the American League with three wins when trailing after eight innings...are 40-0 when leading after seven innings and are the only team in the majors that has not lost a game when leading after seven...have won each of their last 55 games when leading after seven innings, which is their longest such streak since a 61-game streak from June 1-Sept. 22, 2002...last lost when leading after seven innings on Sept. 2, 2017 at Texas...are 48-0 when leading after eight innings and are one of three teams without a loss in those games (New York, Seattle)...have won each of their last 75 games when leading after eight with the last loss coming on July 27, 2017 at Toronto...are batting an AL leading .271 (331-for-1220) in the seventh inning or later compared to .234 (538-for-2300) in innings 1-6, which is third lowest...have compiled a 3.44 ERA (120 er in 314.0 ip) in the seventh inning or later, which is third lowest in the AL.

THE LONG BALL: The A's have homered four times in each of the last three games, which ties the modern Major League record for consecutive games with four or more home runs...it is the first time the Athletics have done it and the second time a team has done it this year (Yankees, May 19-21)...have a Major League leading 93 home runs on the road and are on pace for 139...the ML record is 138 by San Francisco in 2001...have 139 home runs overall, which is tied for third in the American League.

EXTRA INNING GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's played extra innings for the third time in the last four games last night and have won all three games...are now 9-4 (.692) in extra inning games...are tied with Toronto for the most extra inning games in the majors and are tied for the third best record...are 16-6 (.727) in games decided in the last at bat, which is the best mark in the majors...only Toronto has more last at bat wins (19)...have the second best record in one-run games (17-8, .680) and the third best record in games decided by two runs or fewer (30-14, .682)...are tied for sixth in the majors in walk-off wins (6) and are tied for the fewest walk-off losses (2).

THE LAST 11 SERIES: By winning the first two games of this series, the A's have clinched at least a split in this series...now have an 11-series unbeaten streak as they are 9-0-1 over their previous 10 series...it is their longest unbeaten streak since July 28-Sept. 3, 2006 when they went 10-0-1 over an 11 series stretch...have not lost a series since being swept by Houston in a three-game series in Oakland, June 12-14.

MONTH BY MONTH: The A's have clinched a winning record in the month of July as they are 13-5 (.722) with seven games remaining...went 13-12 in April, 15-14 in May and 17-10 in June...this is the eighth season in Oakland history in which the A's have posted a winning record in April, May, June and July (1971, 1972, 1975, 1990, 2003, 2013, 2014)...have the second best record in the majors this month (Boston, 15-4) and the 13 wins are the A's most in July since 2014 when they had 15.

HOMESTANDS AND ROAD TRIPS: The A's are 2-0 on this seven-game road trip to Texas (2-0) and Colorado (three games)...this trip concludes a stretch where the A's will play 27 of 35 games on the road from June 19 to July 29...are 17-5 in road games over that stretch and have won five series and split one...by winning the first two games of this series, the A's now have a seven series unbeaten streak on the road for the first time since July 8-Aug. 29, 2005 when they won seven straight...have not lost a road series since they were swept in a two-game series at Texas, June 5-6...after this trip, the A's will play 17 of their next 20 games at home with all 20 coming in California (three games at Los Angeles-AL)...are 25-9 (.735) on the road dating back to May 14 and are 33-21 (.611) overall, which is the third best road record in the majors...are 26-22 (.542) at home.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are batting .265 (513-for-1934) and are averaging 5.72 runs per game on the road (309 runs in 54 games), .224 and 3.73 runs per game at home...lead the American League in runs per game on the road and rank second in batting to Houston (.273)...have the lowest home batting average and the second fewest runs per game.

THIS AND THAT: The A's scored 13 runs last night after tallying 15 runs on Monday...it marks the fifth time in Oakland history the A's have scored 13 or more runs in back-to-back games (last: June 18-19, 2000)...have scored 488 runs for the season, which ranks fifth in the American League...also rank tied for third in home runs (139), fourth in doubles (195) and extra base hits (346) and fifth in slugging (.428)...have won seven of their last eight games against AL West teams...however, are 17-26 (.395) against AL West competition compared to 42-17 (.712) against all other teams...are scheduled to face a left-handed starting pitcher for the third consecutive game and sixth time in the last nine games tonight...have won 10 of their last 12 games in which the opponent starts a southpaw.

A's vs. RANGERS: The A's lead the season series, 6-5...are 2-2 in Oakland and 4-3 in Arlington...have won 14 of the last 21 games dating back to Aug. 25 of last year...over the previous five seasons, the A's have won the season series in odd numbered years and the Rangers in even numbered years...are 55-51 against Texas dating back to the start of the 2013 season...are 358-366 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 189-172 in Oakland and 170-194 in Texas...are 103-106 at Globe Life Park...have an all-time record of 455-448 against the Rangers/Senators franchise.

Khris Davis has homered in five straight games against Texas, which matches the second longest streak against the Rangers (7, Ken Griffey Jr., May 20-Aug. 8, 1994)...is a .301 career hitter against Texas with 23 home runs and 52 RBI in 48 games...**Jonathan Lucroy** has a 13-game hitting streak against the Rangers dating back to June 12, 2010 (17-for-46, .370)...**Stephen Piscotty** homered for the seventh time in the month of July last night, which is tied for the most in the American League (Calhoun, LAA 7)...is tied for fifth in RBI (17)...**Blake Treinen** ranks second among Major League relievers in ERA (1.06) and **Lou Trivino** ranks fourth (1.36).

OAKLAND A'S 50th ANNIVERSARY MOMENTS

In 1996 Mark McGwire hits a 488 foot home run into the fifth deck at SkyDome...at the time it was the longest home run in the majors since all home runs have been measured starting in 1992...in 2001 the A's acquire Jermaine Dye from Kansas City in a three-team trade.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Edwin Jackson (1-2, 2.93 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was selected by Oakland June 25 and is scheduled to make his sixth start of the season...signed a minor league contract with the Washington Nationals on Jan. 11 and began the season at Triple-A Syracuse...was 4-2 with a 3.40 ERA and .238 opponents batting average in 10 starts with the Chiefs when he was released June 1 (contract opt-out)...signed a minor league deal with the A's June 6 and was assigned to Triple-A Nashville...went 0-1 with a 4.02 ERA and .207 opponents average in three starts with the Sounds...was 4-3 with a 3.53 ERA in 13 minor league starts overall.

99 WINS: Defeated Cleveland June 30 for the 99th win of his career and needs one more victory for 100 career...the last pitcher to record his 100th career victory in an A's uniform is Brett Tomko on Sept. 14, 2009 at Texas...has now won at least one game with 11 different teams.

INNING BY INNING: Has a 0.60 ERA (1 er in 15.0 ip) and .080 opponents batting average (4-for-50) over the first three innings of a game...has allowed five of his 11 runs in the fourth inning (9.00 ERA) and has a 5.17 ERA (9 er in 15.2 ip) and .279 (17-for-61) opponents batting average from the fourth inning on.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents are 4-for-25 (.160) with runners in scoring position...they are 2-for-50 (.040) with two strikes...has a .093 (4-for-43) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .250 (17-for-68) after that...has surrendered four home runs, all solo shots to left-handed hitters...has issued six of his eight walks to lefties.

THIS AND THAT: Has received one run of support or fewer in four of his five starts and has a season run support average of 1.76 (6 rs in 30.2 ip)...the A's have won in each of his two no decisions and are 3-2 (.600) in his starting assignments...has walked eight batters over his last three starts (18.0 ip) after issuing no free passes over his first two (12.2 ip).

16 SEASONS AND 13 TEAMS: Is in his 16th season in the majors with his 13th team (Los Angeles-NL, Tampa Bay, Detroit, Arizona, Chicago-AL, St. Louis, Washington, Chicago-NL, Atlanta, Miami, San Diego, Baltimore)...has tied Octavio Dotel's Major League record for teams played for in a career.

2018 START-BY-START: He had a no decision in the A's 5-4 win at Detroit on **June 25**...blanked the Tigers on one hit over the first three innings before allowing a RBI single to Hicks in the fourth...that was the only run he would allow in six innings of work...the A's tied the game with a run in the seventh and he was relieved by Petit to start the bottom of the seventh...was the winning pitcher in the A's 7-2 win over Cleveland **July 7** in Oakland...retired each of the first nine batters he faced before allowing a lead off home run to Lindor in the fourth...one out later, Ramirez added a solo shot but he then retired each of the final 10 batters he faced...was relieved by Buchter with two outs in the seventh inning and the A's leading 3-2...had a no decision in the A's 6-3, 11-inning win at Cleveland **July 7**...allowed single runs in each of the first two innings on an Encarnacion RBI ground out and an Allen RBI double...was relieved by Buchter with two outs in the sixth inning, runners on first and second and the A's trailing 2-0...Buchter allowed one of the runners to score but the A's tied the game with a three-run eighth inning...was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-1 loss at San Francisco **July 13**...retired each of the first nine batters before Duggar doubled to start the fourth and later scored on a balk...the A's tied the game with a run in the fifth but he allowed a RBI single to Posey in the sixth for the loss.

LAST START: He lost his second consecutive start to San Francisco in a 5-1 A's loss in Oakland last Friday...retired 10 of the first 11 batters he faced and had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a RBI single to Posey in the fourth...then allowed solo home runs to Jones in the fifth and Sandoval in the seventh.

2018 IN THE MINORS: Combined for a 4-3 record and a 3.53 ERA in 13 games, all starts, with Triple-A Syracuse in the Washington organization and Triple-A Nashville in the Oakland farm system...the starts were his most as a minor leaguer since 2006 when he made 13 starts with Triple-A Durham in the Tampa Bay farm system...had no decisions and a 5.09 ERA in four starts in April...then went 4-3 with a 3.02 ERA over his final nine starts...surrendered five home runs in 71.1 innings...allowed a .232 opponents batting average, including .221 (32-for-145) by right-handed hitters compared to .244 (31-for-127) by left-handed hitters...surrendered four of his five home runs to lefties...had a .266 (41-for-154) opponents average with the bases empty compared to .186 (22-for-118) with runners on...three of the five home runs he allowed were solo shots...yielded a .174 (12-for-69) average with runners in scoring position...opponents were 11-for-64 (.172) with eight walks (.264 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning...went 1-for-5 with a double, walk and two strikeouts as a hitter, including 1-for-2 with a double and a walk in three pinch hitting appearances...allowed one run or fewer in seven of his 13 starts.

WITH SYRACUSE: Issued a season-high six walks in his first start April 9 at Rochester...allowed a season-high five runs in a season-low 2.2 innings April 21 at Louisville but had a no decision...finished April with no decisions and a 5.09 ERA in four starts...then went 4-2 with a 2.61 ERA in six starts in May...struck out a season-high nine batters in 6.0 innings May 3 at Buffalo but took the loss...was credited with his first win of the season May 8 against Scranton/Wilkes-Barre when he allowed a run in 6.0 innings in a 4-1 win...won again in his next start on May 13 against Pawtucket...tossed a season-high 7.0 innings in back-to-back starts on the 13th and May 19 against Lehigh Valley...took the loss on the 19th when he surrendered a season-high eight hits, but then won each of his final two starts in May on the 24 at Buffalo and the 29 against Toledo...finished May with a 4-2 record and a 2.61 ERA in six starts.

WITH NASHVILLE: Allowed just one run in 6.0 innings in his first start with the Sounds, but took the loss in a 1-0 decision to Tacoma June 9...matched his season-high by allowing five runs in 4.0 innings at El Paso on June 14.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Trevor Cahill (1-2, 2.95 ERA): Was reinstated from the 10-day disabled list July 12 and is 0-0 with a 3.86 ERA and .156 opponents batting average in two starts since his return...was placed on the DL June 14 retroactive to June 11 with a strained right achilles and had a one-start rehab assignment with Triple-A Nashville July 7 against Iowa (ND, 4.0 ip, 3 h, 1 bb, 7 so)...it was his second stint on the DL this year and he was also out from May 6 to 15 with a right elbow impingement...had a no decision in his last start, a 4-3 A's win in 11 innings last Saturday in Oakland (5.2 ip, 2 h, 1 r, 1 er, 3 bb, 5 so)...it was the fourth time in his 10 starts the game has gone extra inning...is 10-4 with a 2.81 ERA (115.1 ip, 102 h, 41 r, 36 er, 34 bb, 72 so, 10 hr) in 18 career appearances, all starts, against Texas...the 10 wins are his most against any team...had a no decision in his only start this year, a 9-4 A's win at Texas on April 23 (5.0 ip, 4 h, 3 r, 3 er, 2 bb, 6 so).
