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OAKLAND ATHLETICS (68-48) VS. LOS ANGELES ANGELS (59-58)

ABOUT THE A'S: Lost last night after winning seven of eight on the last homestand and are now 13-6 (.684) since the All-Star Break, the 2nd-best record in Majors (Boston, 14-5)...are 20 games over .500 at 68-48 (.586), which is the fourth best record in the American League and the majors...are 12-1-2 over the last 15 series dating back to June 15...had their season-high tying six-game winning streak snapped on Tuesday.

THE STANDINGS: The A's have sole possession of the second American League Wild Card spot for the 9th consecutive day...are 1½ games ahead of the third place team (Seattle) and 4½ games behind the first Wild Card team (New York)...were a season-high 11 games back of the second Wild Card spot at the conclusion of play June 15 but have gone 34-12 (.739) since then...are in second place in the AL West for the ninth consecutive day and trail first place Houston by 4½ games...spent 61 consecutive days alone in fourth from April 25 to June 24 and 32 consecutive days alone in third from June 26 to July 31.

NO LONGER UNKNOWN: You already know that Matt Chapman leads the Majors in Defensive Runs Saved, but his 5.1 WAR this season is the best in the Majors behind just Boston's Mookie Betts (7.7), Los Angeles-Al's Mike Trout (7.6), Cleveland's Jose Ramirez (7.5) and Francisco Lindor (6.9)...his 5.1 WAR is the highest by an A's player since Josh Donaldson (5.7) in 2014.

THE LAST 46 GAMES: The A's are 34-12 (.739) dating back to June 16, which is tied for the best record in the majors...it matches the best 46-game stretch in the majors this year...have come from behind in 19 of the 34 wins (eight runs once, six runs once, five runs once, four runs twice, three runs three times, two runs four times and one run seven times)...have scored the winning run in the eighth inning or later in 14 of the victories (eighth inning four times, ninth inning three times, 10th inning three times, 11th inning three times, 13th inning once).

AGAINST THE WEST: Tonight's game continues a stretch where the A's will play each of their next 12 games and 19 of their next 23 against American League West teams...have won six straight and nine of the last 10 games against the AL West after going 10-25 in their first 35 games against divisional foes...are now 19-26 (.422) against AL West teams compared to 49-21 (.700) against all other teams.

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's have won eight of their last 10 one-run games and are a Major League best 22-10 (.688) for the season...are tied for third in one-run wins and only Atlanta has fewer losses (8)...the Athletics record for winning percentage in one-run games is .698 in 1928 (30-13)...are 35-18 (.660) in games decided by two runs or fewer...the record and wins rank third in the majors...are 10-4 (.714) in extra inning games...the wins are the most in the majors, the 14 games are tied for second most and the record is third best...are 19-6 (.760) in games decided in the last at bat...the record is the best in the majors, the losses are the fewest and the wins rank second (TOR, 20)...have 31 come from behind wins.

THE LATE INNINGS: The A's scored the winning run in the eighth inning on Wednesday and are now batting .285 (132-for-463) with 87 runs scored and 26 home runs in the eighth inning...all three figures lead the majors...also lead the majors in runs scored in the seventh inning or later (217), are tied for third in runs in extra innings (17) and rank fifth in runs in the ninth (53)...are batting .268 (367-for-1369) in the seventh inning or later, which is the best in the majors, compared to .236 (619-for-2621) in innings 1-6, which is third lowest...have compiled a 3.19 ERA (126 er in 356.0 ip) in the seventh inning or later, which is third lowest in the majors...lead the majors with 10 wins when trailing after seven innings and are tied for fourth with four wins when trailing after eight innings (HOU, MIL and NYY, 5).

LEADING LATE: The A's are the only team in the majors that has not lost a game when leading after seven innings (46-0)...have a 61-game winning streak in those games, which matches the Oakland record (June 1-Sept. 22, 2002)...last lost when leading after seven innings on Sept. 2, 2017 at Texas...the A's (55-0) and Mariners (59-0) are the only teams that have not lost when leading after eight innings...have an 82-game winning streak in those games and have not lost when leading after eight since July 27, 2017 at Toronto.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's continue a brief three-game road trip to Los Angeles tonight...these are Oakland's only three road games over a 20-game

stretch from July 30 to Aug. 22 and the A's do not leave California over that span...went 4-3 on the last road trip to Texas (4-0) and Colorado (0-3)...are 27-13 (.675) on the road dating back to May 14 after starting the year 8-12...are 35-25 (.583) on the road for the season, which is the third best road record in the majors, compared to 33-23 (.589) at home...the 35 road wins already match the A's best total over the previous three seasons (35-46 in 2016)...went 7-1 on the last homestand against Toronto (3-0), Detroit (3-0) and Los Angeles-NL (1-1), which was the A's best record on a homestand of seven or more games since going 8-1 against Texas, Tampa Bay and Seattle, Aug. 7-16, 2016...are now 15-3 at home dating back to June 16 after starting the year 18-20 in the Coliseum.

HOME AND AWAY SPLITS: The A's have hit a Major League leading 100 home runs on the road, which is already the ninth highest single season total in Athletics history (8th is 102 in 2016, 6th is 103 in 2012 and 2013, 5th is 105 in 2017)...are batting .263 (561-for-2135) and are averaging 5.48 runs per game on the road (329 runs in 60 games) compared to .229 and 3.88 runs per game at home...have already scored more runs on the road this year than all last year (322)...2nd in the majors in runs per game on the road and rank 5th in batting...have the second lowest home batting average in the majors and the fifth fewest runs per game.

COUNTDOWN TO 8,000: Khris Davis hit the 7,997th home run in Oakland history last night, leaving the A's three short of 8,000 since moving to Oakland...only five teams have hit 8000 home runs dating back to 1968 (NYY, BAL, DET, BOS, TEX)...have 12,979 home runs in franchise history and are 231 short of 13,000.

THIS AND THAT: The A's have compiled a 2.89 ERA (83 er in 258.1 ip) over the last 28 games and now have a 3.83 ERA for the season, which is fourth lowest in the American League...rank fifth in opponents batting (.240), slugging (.396) and OPS (.700)...starting pitchers went 5-1 with a 1.40 ERA (7 er in 45.0 ip) on the homestand...the offense ranks T4th in the AL in doubles (221) and 4th in extra base hits (394) and 5th in OPS (.747).

ROSTER NOTES: Fernando Rodney made his Oakland debut last night, becoming the 31st player to pitch for the A's this year, which bested the franchise record of 30 set in 2015...the current total of 31 is tied with the Rays and Braves for second most in the majors (Cubs, 32)...have used 13 different starting pitchers, which is second to the Rays (15)...have 11 pitchers with at least five starts, which is the most in the majors...only one member of the current starting rotation was with the A's organization at the start of spring training (Manaea) and two were with another organization at the end of May (Jackson and Fiers).

A's vs. ANGELS: The A's are 4-7 against the Angels...are 3-4 in Oakland and 1-3 in Anaheim...have lost 16 of the last 20 games and 29 of the last 41 at Angel Stadium...have dropped four consecutive season series and are 35-52 (.402) against Los Angeles over the last five years...this marks the first time the Athletics franchise (Kansas City and Oakland) has lost four straight season series to the Angels...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 432-373 against the Angels...that includes 226-176 in Oakland and 206-197 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 481-450 against the Angels.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Chapman has reached base safely in a career-high and A's season-high 24 consecutive games, which is the second longest active streak in the majors (28, Carpenter, STL)...**Khris Davis** leads majors in RBI since the All-Star Break (26) and ranks second in home runs (12)...**Blake Treinen** leads Major League relievers in ERA (0.93).

In **1978** Rick Langford tosses a three-hit shutout in the first game of a doubleheader at Minnesota in a 2-0 A's victory...in **2003** Tim Hudson tosses a complete game two-hit shutout and needs just 93 pitches to defeat Boston, 4-0.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Edwin Jackson (3-2, 2.87 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is 3-2 with a 2.87 ERA in eight starts since he was selected by the A's June 25...his ERA is **sixth** lowest in the American League over that stretch...began the season at Triple-A Syracuse in the Washington organization and was 4-2 with a 3.40 ERA and .238 opponents batting average in 10 starts with the Chiefs when he was released June 1 (contract opt-out)...signed a minor league deal with the A's June 6 and was assigned to Triple-A Nashville...went 0-1 with a 4.02 ERA and .207 opponents average in three starts with the Sounds and was 4-3 with a 3.53 ERA in 13 minor league starts overall.

TWO-GAME WINNING STREAK: Has picked up the win in each of his last two starts and has not allowed an earned run (12.0 ip, 8 h, 1 r, 4 bb, 8 so)...has not put together more than two consecutive wins since a three-game winning streak from June 30-July 11, 2013...went 1-0 with a 2.45 ERA over his first three starts this year and 0-2 with a 5.40 ERA over his next three starts from July 13 to 25.

INNING BY INNING: Has a 1.50 ERA (4 er in 24.0 ip) and .143 (12-for-84) opponents batting average over the first three innings of a game and a 4.30 ERA (11 er in 23.0 ip) and .273 (24-for-88) opponents batting average from the fourth inning on...has not allowed a run in the third inning (8.0 ip).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has held the opposition to a .171 (7-for-41) batting average with runners in scoring position...has a .152 (10-for-66) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .245 (26-for-106) after that...opponents are 8-for-76 (.105) with two strikes...has surrendered four of his five home runs to left-handed hitters...four have been solo shots.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 3-1 with a 1.80 ERA (5 er in 25.0 ip) and .159 (14-for-88) opponents batting average in four starts at home compared to 0-1 with a 4.09 ERA (10 er in 22.0 ip) and .262 (22-for-84) opponents average in four starts on the road...however, has surrendered four of his five home runs in Oakland...is now 4-1 with a 2.13 ERA (9 er in 38.0 ip) in six career starts in the Coliseum.

THIS AND THAT: Has received one run of support or fewer in five of his eight starts and has a season run support average of 2.49 (13 rs in 47.0 ip)...is scheduled to start on six days rest today...is 3-0 with a 2.74 ERA (7 er in 23.0 ip) in four starts on four days rest, 0-2 with a 3.00 ERA (8 er in 24.0 ip) in four starts on five days rest or more...the A's have won in each of his three no decisions and are 6-2 (.750) in his starting assignments.

100 WINS: Defeated Toronto July 30 for the 100th win of his career...became the first pitcher to record his 100th career victory in an A's uniform since Brett Tomko on Sept. 14, 2009 at Texas...has now won at least one game with 11 different teams.

16 SEASONS AND 13 TEAMS: Is in his 16th season in the majors with his 13th team (Los Angeles-NL, Tampa Bay, Detroit, Arizona, Chicago-AL, St. Louis, Washington, Chicago-NL, Atlanta, Miami, San Diego, Baltimore)...has tied Octavio Dotel's Major League record for teams played for in a career.

2018 START-BY-START: He had a no decision in the A's 5-4 win at Detroit on **June 25**...allowed a RBI single to Hicks in the fourth, which was the only run he would allow in six innings of work...was the winning pitcher in the A's 7-2 win over Cleveland **July 7** in Oakland...retired each of the first nine batters he faced before allowing a lead off home run to Lindor in the fourth...one out later, Ramirez added a solo shot but he then retired each of the final 10 batters he faced...had a no decision in the A's 6-3, 11-inning win at Cleveland **July 7**...allowed single runs in each of the first two innings on an Encarnacion RBI ground out and an Allen RBI double...was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-1 loss at San Francisco **July 13**...retired each of the first nine batters before Duggar doubled to start the fourth and later scored on a balk...allowed a RBI single to Posey in the sixth for the loss...lost his second consecutive start to San Francisco in a 5-1 A's loss in Oakland **July 20**...retired 10 of the first 11 batters he faced and had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a RBI single to Posey in the fourth...then allowed solo home runs to Jones in the fifth and Sandoval in the seventh...had a no decision in the A's 6-5 win at Texas **July 25**...allowed a three-run home run to Chirinos in the second inning and a RBI single to Odor in the fifth...earned the 100th win of his career in the A's 10-1 win over Toronto **July 30** in Oakland...tossed 5.2 scoreless innings, which was his first scoreless outing since Sept. 5, 2016 vs. Boston (7.0 ip).

LAST START: He won his second consecutive start in the A's 2-1 win over Detroit a week ago today in Oakland...allowed an unearned run in the first inning when Jones led off the game by reaching on a Martini error...he scored on a Candelario single but Jackson did not allow a run over his final 5.1 innings...retired 11 of the final 13 batters he faced.

2018 IN THE MINORS: Combined for a 4-3 record and a 3.53 ERA in 13 games, all starts, with Triple-A Syracuse in the Washington organization and Triple-A Nashville in the Oakland farm system...the starts were his most as a minor leaguer since 2006 when he made 13 starts with Triple-A Durham in the Tampa Bay farm system...had no decisions and a 5.09 ERA in four starts in April...then went 4-3 with a 3.02 ERA over his final nine starts...surrendered five home runs in 71.1 innings...allowed a .232 opponents batting average, including .221 (32-for-145) by right-handed hitters compared to .244 (31-for-127) by left-handed hitters...surrendered four of his five home runs to lefties...had a .266 (41-for-154) opponents average with the bases empty compared to .186 (22-for-118) with runners on...three of the five home runs he allowed were solo shots...yielded a .174 (12-for-69) average with runners in scoring position...opponents were 11-for-64 (.172) with eight walks (.264 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning...went 1-for-5 with a double, walk and two strikeouts as a hitter, including 1-for-2 with a double and a walk in three pinch hitting appearances...allowed one run or fewer in seven of his 13 starts.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Trevor Cahill (4-2, 3.12 ERA): Is 3-0 with a 3.76 ERA and .213 opponents batting average in five starts since he was reinstated from the disabled list July 12...has pitched just 75.0 innings after signing late during the spring and two stints on the disabled list...based on a minimum of 70 innings pitched, he ranks eighth in the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.348) and OPS (.632) and 10th in ERA (3.12) and opponents batting average (.213)...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 6-0 A's win over Detroit last Sunday in Oakland (6.0 ip, 3 h, 1 bb, 10 so)...is 5-3 with a 2.07 ERA (65.1 ip, 51 h, 18 r, 15 er, 32 bb, 37 so, 5 hr) in 11 career appearances, including 10 starts, against Los Angeles...last faced the Angels in relief on April 5, 2016 at Los Angeles while pitching for the Cubs (0.2 ip, 1 so)...his last start came on June 15, 2012 with the Diamondbacks when he combined with Ziegler and Hernandez on a three-hit shutout in a 5-0 win (7.0 ip, 3 h, 2 bb, 8 so).
