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OAKLAND ATHLETICS (69-48) VS. LOS ANGELES ANGELS (59-59)

ABOUT THE A'S: Won last night and are now 8-2 in the last 10 games and are now 14-6 (.700) since the All-Star Break, the 2nd-best record in Majors (Boston, 15-5)...are 21 games over .500 at 69-48 (.590), which is the fourth best record in the American League and the Majors...are 12-1-2 over the last 15 series dating back to June 15...had their season-high tying six-game winning streak snapped on Tuesday.

THE STANDINGS: The A's have sole possession of the second American League Wild Card spot for 10th consecutive day...are 1½ games ahead of the third place team (Seattle) and 4½ games behind the first Wild Card team (New York)...were a season-high 11 games back of the second Wild Card spot at the conclusion of play June 15 but have gone 35-12 (.745) since then...are in second place in the AL West for the 10th consecutive day and trail first place Houston by 3½ games...spent 61 consecutive days alone in fourth from April 25 to June 24 and 32 consecutive days alone in third from June 26 to July 31.

LET'S GET IT STARTED: Oakland starters are 6-1 with a 1.41 ERA (9 er, 57.1 ip) with 50 strikeouts over the last 10 starts (since July 30)...in those 10 starts, have allowed zero earned runs five times, one run two times, two runs, two times and three runs once...since June 27th, Oakland starters have a 3.29 ERA (74 er, 202.2) with 148 strikeouts in 37 games.

SECOND HALF SURGE, FULL SEASON STAR: Khris Davis is hitting .296 (24-for-81) with 17 runs, 2 doubles, 13 home runs, 28 RBI, a .359 on-base percentage, .802 slugging mark and a 1.161 OPS in 20 games in the second half...among Major Leaguers post All-Star Break ranks 1st in RBI (28), T1st in HR (13), 3rd in slugging (.802), and 4th in total bases (65).

NO LONGER UNKNOWN: You already know that Matt Chapman leads the Majors in Defensive Runs Saved, but his 5.1 WAR this season is the best in the Majors behind just Boston's Mookie Betts (7.8), Cleveland's Jose Ramirez (7.7), Los Angeles-Al's Mike Trout (7.6) and Cleveland's Francisco Lindor (6.8)...his 5.1 WAR is the highest by an A's player since Josh Donaldson (5.7) in 2014.

THE LAST 46 GAMES: The A's are 35-12 (.745) dating back to June 16, which is the 2nd-best record in Majors...have come from behind in 19 of 35 wins (eight runs once, six runs once, five runs once, four runs twice, three runs three times, two runs four times and one run seven times)...have scored the winning run in the eighth inning or later in 14 of the victories (eighth inning four times, ninth inning three times, 10th inning three times, 11th inning three times, 13th inning once).

AGAINST THE WEST: Today's game continues a stretch where A's will play 12 straight games and 19 of 23 against American League West teams...have won seven of eight and 10 of last 12 games against the AL West after going 10-25 in their first 35 games against divisional foes...are now 20-27 (.426) against AL West teams compared to 49-21 (.700) against all other teams.

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's have won eight of their last 10 one-run games and are a Major League best 22-10 (.688) for season...are T3rd in one-run wins and only Atlanta has fewer losses (8)...the A's record for winning percentage in one-run games is .698 in 1928 (30-13)...are 35-18 (.660) in games decided by two runs or fewer...the record and wins rank 3rd in majors...are 10-4 (.714) in extra inning games...the wins are most in majors, the 14 games are tied for 2nd most and record is 3rd best...are 19-6 (.760) in games decided in last at bat...record is best in majors, the losses are fewest and the wins rank second (TOR, 20)...have 31 come from behind wins.

THE LATE INNINGS: The A's scored the winning run in the eighth inning on Wednesday and are now batting .283 (132-for-466) with 87 runs scored and 26 home runs in the eighth inning...all three figures lead the majors...also lead the majors in runs scored in the seventh inning or later (217), are tied for third in runs in extra innings (17) and rank fifth in runs in the ninth (53)...are batting .267 (368-for-1379) in the seventh inning or later, which is the best in the majors, compared to .238 (632-for-2651) in innings 1-6, which is third lowest...have compiled a 3.16 ERA (126 er in 359.0 ip) in the seventh inning or later, which is third lowest in the majors...lead the majors with 10 wins when trailing after seven innings and are tied for fourth with four wins when trailing after eight innings (HOU, MIL and NYY, 5).

LEADING LATE: The A's are the only team in the majors that has not lost a game when leading after seven innings (47-0)...have a 62-game winning

streak in those games, which sets the Oakland record (besting June 1-Sept. 22, 2002)...last lost when leading after seven innings on Sept. 2, 2017 at Texas...the A's (56-0) and Mariners (60-0) are the only teams that have not lost when leading after eight innings...have an 83-game winning streak in those games and have not lost when leading after eight since July 27, 2017 at Toronto.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's conclude a brief three-game road trip to Anaheim today...these are Oakland's only three road games over a 20-game stretch from July 30 to Aug. 22 and the A's do not leave California over that span...went 4-3 on the last road trip to Texas (4-0) and Colorado (0-3)...are 28-13 (.683) on the road dating back to May 14 after starting the year 8-12...are 36-25 (.590) on the road for the season, which is the third best road record in the majors, compared to 33-23 (.589) at home...the 36 road wins already more than the A's best total over the previous three seasons (35-46 in 2016)...went 7-1 on the last homestand against Toronto (3-0), Detroit (3-0) and Los Angeles-NL (1-1)...are now 15-3 at home dating back to June 16 after starting the year 18-20 in the Coliseum.

HOME AND AWAY SPLITS: The A's have hit MLB leading 103 home runs on the road, which is already T6th highest single season total in Athletics history (T6th is 103 in 2012 and 2013, 5th is 105 in 2017)...are batting .264 (575-for-2175) and are averaging 5.51 runs per game on the road (336 runs in 61 games) compared to .229 and 3.88 runs per game at home...have already scored more runs on the road this year than all last year (322)...1st in the majors in runs per game on the road and rank T2nd in batting.

COUNTDOWN TO 8,000: Marcus Semien hit two home runs last night, including the 8,000th home run in Oakland history...only five teams have hit 8000 home runs dating back to 1968 (NYY, BAL, DET, BOS, TEX)...have 12,982 home runs in franchise history and are 18 short of 13,000.

THIS AND THAT: The A's have compiled a 2.79 ERA (83 er in 267.1 ip) over the last 29 games and now have a 3.80 ERA for the season, which is fourth lowest in the American League...rank fifth in opponents batting (.239), slugging (.395) and OPS (.698)...the offense ranks 5th in the AL in doubles (222) and 4th in extra base hits (399) and 5th in OPS (.750).

ROSTER NOTES: A's have used a club-record 31 pitchers this year, (30 in 2015)...the current total is tied with the Rays, Angels and Braves for second most in the majors (Cubs, 33)...have used 13 different starting pitchers, which is second to the Rays (15)...have 11 pitchers with at least five starts, which is the most in the majors...only one member of the current starting rotation was with the A's organization at the start of spring training (Manaea) and two were with another organization at the end of May (Jackson and Fiers).

A's vs. ANGELS: The A's are 5-7 against the Angels...are 3-4 in Oakland and 2-3 in Anaheim...have lost 16 of the last 21 games and 29 of the last 42 at Angel Stadium...have dropped four consecutive season series and are 36-52 (.409) against Los Angeles over the last five years...this marks the first time the Athletics franchise (Kansas City and Oakland) has lost four straight season series to the Angels...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 433-373 against the Angels...that includes 226-176 in Oakland and 207-197 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 482-450 against the Angels.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Chapman has reached base safely in a career-high and A's season-high 25 consecutive games, which is the second longest active streak in the majors (29, Carpenter, STL)...**Blake Treinen** leads Major League relievers in ERA (0.93).

OAKLAND A'S 50th ANNIVERSARY MOMENTS

In **1996** Geronimo Berroa has his second three-homer game of the season in the A's 11-1 win over Minnesota...the two three-homer games tie a Major League record...Mark McGwire adds two home runs, giving him 40 for the season in just 294 at bats, the fewest at bats ever to 40 home runs...in **2001** Jason Giambi hits his first career "walk-off" home run for his 1000th career hit as the A's defeat the Yankees, 4-2, for their 11th consecutive win.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Trevor Cahill (4-2, 3.12 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is 3-0 with a 3.76 ERA (11 er in 26.1 ip), .213 (20-for-94) opponents batting average and 12 walks (4.10 per nine innings) in five starts since he was reinstated from the disabled list July 12...went 1-2 with a 2.77 ERA, .214 opponents batting average and 11 walks (2.03 per nine innings) over his first eight starts...has two stints on the disabled this year as he was out from May 6 to 15 with a right elbow impingement and June 11 to July 11 with a strained right achilles.

THREE-GAME WINNING STREAK: Has won each of his last three starts and has a 3.71 ERA (7 er in 17.0 ip) and .242 (15-for-62) opponents batting average over that stretch...has struck out 20 in 17.0 innings...it marks the first time he has won three consecutive starts since Sept. 5-19, 2012...the three-game winning streak matches his longest over the last five years.

QUALIFICATIONS: Has pitched just 75.0 innings after signing late during the spring and two stints on the disabled list...based on a minimum of 70 innings pitched, he ranks seventh in the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.348), 8th in OPS (.632) and 10th in ERA (3.12) and 8th in opponents batting average (.213)...has surrendered just five home runs and his average of 0.72 home runs per nine innings is 4th lowest.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has held the opposition to a .093 (13-for-140) batting average with two strikes...has allowed a .192 (20-for-104) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .250 (27-for-108) the second time and .182 (10-for-55) after that...has allowed a .197 (14-for-71) opponents batting average and five walks (.260 on-base percentage) to hitters leading off an inning...opponents are batting .120 (3-for-25) with runners in scoring position and two outs.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 3-0 with a 0.99 ERA (5 er in 45.2 ip) and .172 (27-for-157) opponents batting average in seven starts at home compared to 1-2 with a 6.44 ERA (21 er in 29.1 ip) and .273 (30-for-110) opponents average in six starts on the road...has not allowed a run in four of his seven starts in Oakland...now has a nine-game home winning streak and has not lost at home since July 6, 2016 against Cincinnati...picked up the win July 26 at Texas to snap a six-game road losing streak...it was his first win on the road since Aug. 20 2016 at Colorado.

SPLITS: Is scheduled to start on six days rest today...is 3-0 with a 4.57 ERA (11 er in 21.2 ip) in four starts on four days rest, 1-2 with a 2.53 ERA (15 er in 53.1 ip) in nine starts on five days rest or more...is 1-1 with a 5.40 ERA (16 er in 26.2 ip) in five starts against American League West teams compared to 3-1 with a 1.86 ERA (10 er in 48.1 ip) in eight starts against everyone else.

COUNTDOWN TO 1,000 STRIKEOUTS: Has 75 strikeouts in 75.0 innings this year and now has 982 strikeouts in his career...needs 18 more for 1000...struck out 732 batters in 1066.2 innings with his first three teams (Oakland, Arizona and Atlanta), an average of 6.18 strikeouts per nine innings...was released by the Braves on June 19, 2015 and signed by the Dodgers to a minor league contract July 2, 2015...has 250 strikeouts in 241.2 innings since then (9.31 per nine innings).

THIS AND THAT: Is T3rd in the American League lead with three wins since the All-Star Break...has allowed eight of his 27 runs in the first inning for a 5.54 ERA (8 er in 13.0 ip)...has a 2.61 ERA (18 er in 62.0 ip) from the second inning on...opponents have been caught stealing five times with him on the mound, which is tied for second most in the AL...the game has gone into extra innings in four of his 13 starts...has a 1.01 ERA (3 er in 26.2 ip) in those four starts but has just five runs of support...has three starts where he has not allowed a run but has received zero runs of support in two of those starts.

2018 HIGHLIGHTS: Was signed by the A's as a free agent March 19 and made two spring training appearances before he was optioned to Nashville March 28...was recalled from Triple-A Nashville April 17 and started and won that day in a 10-2 victory over Chicago (AL)...tossed 7.0 shutout innings and allowed five hits and two walks in his first start as an Athletic since Sept. 27, 2011 at Seattle...struck out a career-high 12 batters in just 6.0 innings May 5 against Baltimore...it was his third career game of 10 or more strikeouts, his first since June 14, 2013 at San Diego...became the third A's pitcher since at least 1908 to strikeout 12 or more batters in six innings or fewer, the first since Steve Karsay on April 26, 1997 vs. Kansas City (12 so in 6.0 ip)...the other is Vida Blue on April 9, 1971 vs. Kansas City (13 so in 6.0 ip)...ended up with a no decision in the A's 2-0, 12-inning win...was 1-1 with a 2.25 ERA in four starts when he was placed on the disabled list May 9 retroactive to May 6 with a right elbow impingement...did not make a rehab appearance before he was reinstated May 16...lost to Boston that day and then had back-to-back no decisions in extra innings on May 22 against Seattle and May 28 against Tampa Bay...tossed 8.0 scoreless innings and allowed just four hits while not walking a batter in the latter contest...was 0-1 with a 3.28 ERA and .225 opponents batting average in four starts after returning from the DL and was 1-2 with a 2.77 ERA and .214 opponents batting average in eight

starts before returning to the DL a second time...was placed on the 10-day DL June 14 retroactive to June 11 with a right achilles strain...was the winning pitcher in his 200th career start, a 6-2 A's win over Toronto on July 31.

LAST START: He combined with Petit, Trivino and Buchter on a five-hit shutout in the A's 6-0 win over Detroit a week ago today in Oakland...tossed 6.0 innings and allowed three of the hits...struck out 10, which was his second game of 10 or more strikeouts this year and the fourth of his career.

CAHILL vs. LOS ANGELES: Is 5-3 with a 2.07 ERA (65.1 ip, 51 h, 18 r, 15 er, 32 bb, 37 so, 5 hr) in 11 career appearances, including 10 starts...is 2-2 with a 2.20 ERA (8 er in 32.2 ip) in six games at Angel Stadium and 3-1 with a 1.93 ERA (7 er in 32.2 ip) in five starts in his home ballparks, all in the Coliseum...

last faced the Angels in relief on April 5, 2016 at Los Angeles while pitching for the Cubs (0.2 ip, 1 so)...relieved Lester to start the eighth inning and struck out Perez before getting Giovotella to ground out...his last start came on June 15, 2012 with the Diamondbacks when he combined with Ziegler and Hernandez on a three-hit shutout in a 5-0 win...tossed 7.0 innings and allowed all three of the hits.

WITH NASHVILLE: Is 0-1 with a 2.63 ERA and .146 opponents batting average in three starts with Triple-A Nashville...struck out 17 batters in 13.2 innings but also walked eight...right-handed hitters are 4-for-31 (.129) and lefties were 3-for-17 (.176)...opponents are 0-for-5 with runners in scoring position...went 0-1 with a 3.72 ERA in two starts before he was recalled by Oakland April 17...made one rehab start during his second stint on the DL, a no decision against Iowa on July 7 when he tossed 4.0 scoreless innings.

LHP Sean Manaea (10-8, 3.50 ERA): Is 5-2 with a 3.39 ERA and .240 opponents batting average in 12 starts since the beginning of June...began the season by going 4-2 with a 1.03 ERA and .134 opponents batting average over his first six starts through the end of April but then went 1-4 with a 7.18 ERA and .295 opponents batting average in six starts in May...has walked just 29 batters in 144.0 innings and has walked two batters or fewer in 21 of his 24 starts...his average of 1.81 walks per nine innings is fifth lowest in the American League...is 6th in opponents on-base percentage (.273)...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 4-2 A's loss to Los Angeles (NL) last Tuesday in Oakland (2.2 ip, 5 h, 3 r, 3 er, 3 bb, 1 so)...is 4-4 with a 4.12 ERA (54.2 ip, 45 h, 25 r, 25 er, 19 bb, 43 so, 6 hr) in nine career starts against Seattle...including 1-1 with a 3.46 ERA (13.0 ip, 8 h, 5 r, 5 er, 2 bb, 9 so, 2 hr) in two starts this year.

- The A's bullpen has compiled a 2.15 ERA (29 er in 121.1 ip) over the last 32 games dating back to July 3.
- Has converted 34-of-45 (75.6%) save opportunities, which is tied for the best percentage in the Majors...are T3rd in the American League in saves.
- Ranks third in the AL in opponents on-base percentage (.301), ERA (3.26), opponents OPS (.668), and opponents batting average (.227), and fourth in innings pitched (424.2), and 3rd in slugging percentage (.367).
