OAKLAND ATHLETICS (78-52) VS. MINNESOTA TWINS (61-68)

SUNDAY, AUGUST 26 2018 — TARGET FIELD — 1:10 P.M. CDT

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's have won two of three in each of their last four series and are now 16-1-2 over the last 19 series dating back to June 15...lost back-to-back games Thursday night for just the second time since June 15 (last, July 27-29 at Colorado when they lost three in a row)...are 15-6 (.714) in the month of August, which is the second best record in the majors...are 23-10 (.697) since the All-Star Break, which is tied for the best record in the majors...are 78-52 (.600) overall, which is the fourth best record in the majors...the 78 wins are three more than their season total from last year...the 26 games over .500 match the season high (76-50 on Aug. 21).

THE STANDINGS: The A's are in second place in the American League West and trail first place Houston by 1.5 games...have spent three of the last eight days tied for first...trailed the Astros by a season-high 12 games entering play on June 19 but have gone 42-16 over that stretch while Houston has gone 30-25...have the second AL Wild Card spot...are four games ahead of third place Seattle and four games behind the first Wild Card team, New York...were a season-high 11 games back of the second Wild Card spot at the conclusion of play June 15 but have gone 44-16 since then while Seattle has gone 29-31.

THE LAST 60 GAMES: The A's are 44-16 (.733) dating back to June 16, which is the best record in the majors over that span...have come from behind in 21 of the 44 wins and have scored the winning run in the eighth inning or later in 15 of the victories.

PITCHING: The A's lead the majors with a 2.93 ERA (99 er in 304.0 ip) since the All-Star Break and lead with a 2.54 ERA (55 er in 195.0 ip) in August...have a 3.73 ERA overall, which ranks fifth in the American League...also rank fifth in the AL in opponents batting average (.238), slugging percentage (.392) and OPS (.693), and ranks fourth in on-base percentage (.301)...have five shutouts in the last 20 games and 12 for the season, which is third most in the AL...have issued the fourth fewest walks (370) and are tied for the fifth fewest home runs allowed (147).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have not allowed an earned run in five of the last 10 games (18 er in 57.2 ip, 2.81 ERA) and nine of the last 23...have yielded two runs or fewer 18 times over the last 23 games and are 13-4 with a 2.36 ERA (35 er in 133.1 ip) over that span...have tossed seven shutout innings and allowed one hit and one walk in three of the last eight games started.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .282 (139-for-493) with 63 extra base hits (41 doubles, 1 triple, 21 home runs) and 74 runs scored over the last 14 games dating back to August 11...now have 457 extra base hits for the season, which is second most in the majors (BOS, 491)...are on pace for 569, which would break the Athletics record of 555 set in 2001...rank second in the American League in doubles (262), fourth in slugging (.436), tied for second in home runs (177) and fifth in OPS (.758)...also rank second in grounded into double plays (109), tied for third in hit by pitches (63) and tied for fourth in sacrifice flies (35).

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 26-10 (.722) in one-run games, which is the best record in the majors...only Seattle (32) has more wins and only Atlanta has fewer losses (9)...the Athletics record for winning percentage in one-run games is .698 in 1928 (30-13)...are 39-21 (.650) in games decided by two runs or fewer...the wins are third in the majors and the record is fourth...are 11-5 (.688) in extra inning games...rank second in the majors in extra inning wins and games (16) and have the third best record...the wins are tied for fourth most in Oakland history...are 20-7 (.741) in games decided in the last at bat...the record is the best in the majors, the losses are the fewest and the wins are tied for the most (TOR)...have two walk-off losses, which are tied for the fewest in the majors (ATL, BOS, TEX).

LEADING LATE: The A's are 55-0 when leading after seven innings and are the only team in the majors that has not lost when leading after seven...have not lost when leading after seven since Sept. 2, 2017 at Texas and now have a 70-game winning streak in those games, which is an on-going Athletics record...the last team to go undefeated when leading after seven innings is the 2012 Orioles (74-0)...the A's (64-0) and Mariners (63-0) are the only teams that have not lost when leading after eight innings...have a 91-game

winning streak in those games and have not lost when leading after eight since July 27, 2017 at Toronto.

THE LATE INNINGS: The A's lead the majors in runs scored in the eighth inning (96) and in the seventh inning or later (235), rank third in runs in extra innings (18) and are fifth in runs in the ninth (57)...are batting .263 (399-for-1520) in the seventh inning or later, which is third best in the majors, compared to .245 (726-for-2963) in innings 1-6, which is seventh lowest...have compiled a 3.16 ERA (141 er in 401.0 ip) in the seventh inning or later, which is fourth lowest in the majors...have a Major League leading 11 wins when trailing after seven innings, which are third most in Oakland history (13 in 2014, 12 in 1969)...are tied for the lead with five wins when trailing after eight innings.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's continue a seven-game road trip to Minnesota (four games, 2-1) and Houston (three games) tonight...went 2-1 on the last road trip to Los Angeles (AL) and are 31-14 (.689) on the road dating back to May 14 after starting the year 8-12...are 39-26 (.600) for the season, which is the third best road record in the majors...have identical 39-26 records at home and on the road...have already surpassed the road win total from each of the previous three seasons...went 6-3 on the last homestand against Seattle (2-1), Houston (2-1) and Texas (2-1)...it concluded a stretch where the A's played 17 of 20 games at home without leaving California...are now 21-6 (.778) at home dating back to June 16 after starting the year 18-20 in the Coliseum...are 39-26 (.600) at home for the season.

HOME AND AWAY SPLITS: The A's lead the majors with 110 home runs and an average of 5.55 runs per game on the road and rank second with a .267 (618-for-2316) batting average...have scored 361 runs on the road, which is 39 more than all last year...have the third lowest home batting average in the majors (.234)...have hit just 67 home runs at home.

13,000 DINGERS: Jonathan Lucroy hit the 13,000th home run in franchise history last night...dates back to the first by Lave Cross on April 30, 1901...other players with milestone homers include Mickey Cochrane (1,000), Jimmie Foxx (2,000), Sam Chapman (3,000), Hector Lopez (4,000), Jim Nash (5,000), Gene Tenace (6,000), Carney Lansford (7,000), Jose Canseco (8,000), Mark McGwire (9,000), Miguel Tejada (10,000), Bobby Kielty (11,000) and Brandon Moss (12,000).

A's vs. TWINS: The A's and Twins are meeting for the first time in over a year as the two clubs had last met on July 30, 2017 in Oakland (had played 184 games since then)...had not been to Target Field since May 4, 2017...have finished the season series with the other four American League Central teams plus Boston and Toronto...the two clubs split the season series last year, 3-3...the A's won two of three in Oakland but lost two of three in Minnesota...have won seven of the last eight and 16 of the last 19 at the Coliseum but have lost five of the last eight at Target Field...have won four season series, split one and lost one over the previous six seasons and are 29-16 against Minnesota dating back to the 2012 season...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 302-301 against Minnesota...that includes 168-129 in Oakland and 134-172 in Minnesota...are 17-17 at Target Field...are 359-370 all-time against the Twins and have a 1006-1006 record against the Twins/Senators...the 1006 wins are the A's most against any franchise.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Chris Bassitt (2-3, 3.38 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville today for his sixth stint with the A's this year...went 2-0 with a 2.87 ERA and .237 opponents batting average in three starts during his last stint from June 27 to July 11 after going 0-2 with a 3.86 ERA and .235 opponents average in three starts over his first four stints...did not pitch in his first two stints (April 20-25 and May 26), made one start in his third (June 9) and two in his fourth (June 14-22)... his current two-game winning streak marks the first winning streak of his career...went 2-14 over his first 32 career games (26 starts).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents are hitting .179 (5-for-28) when leading off an inning but he has issued four walks and hit a batter for a .303 on-base percentage...opponents are 10-for-66 (.152) with two strikes...has held the three, four and five hitters to a combined .133 (6-for-45) batting average.

RUN SUPPORT: Received seven runs of support in his last start after getting just three runs of support over his first five starts...has a season RSA of 2.81 (10 rs in 32.0 ip)...has received two runs of support or fewer in 24 of his 29 career starts and his career RSA as a starter is 2.58 (47 rs in 164.0 ip).

NINE-GAME LOSING STREAK SNAPPED: Picked up the win June 27 at Detroit for his first Major League victory since Aug. 4, 2015 against Baltimore... it snapped a career-high nine-game losing streak, which tied for third longest in Oakland history and was the longest since Bob Welch also lost nine straight from Sept. 5, 1993-May 11, 1994...compiled a 5.56 ERA and .290 opponents batting average during the losing streak, which spanned 13 starts dating back to Aug. 21, 2015.

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 2-0 loss to Kansas City on June 9 in Oakland...it was his first Major League appearance since April 28, 2016 at Detroit as he had UCL reconstruction surgery on May 6, 2016...allowed a RBI single to Orlando in the second inning but that was the only run he would allow in seven innings of work...retired each of the final nine batters he faced...Duffy, McCarthy and Herrera combined to shut out the A's on four hits.

SECOND START: He lost his second consecutive start in the A's 8-4 loss to Los Angeles (AL) June 15 in Oakland...allowed six runs in 4.0 innings but four were unearned...his own error in the first inning led directly to two unearned runs and a Pinder error led to three runs, one earned run, in the third...surrendered a solo home run to Kinsler in the fourth.

THIRD START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-4 loss in the second game of the double header June 22 at Chicago (AL)...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed three runs in the bottom of the second on a Narvaez two-run single and a Tilson RBI single...Oakland scored once in the sixth to narrow the gap to 3-2 but he was charged with two runs in the bottom of the sixth...put runners on first and second with one out and was relieved by Coulombe who allowed both runners to score.

FOURTH START: He combined with Petit and Trevino on a three-hit shutout in the A's 3-0 win at Detroit June 27...tossed six innings and allowed two of the hits but walked a career-high tying five...retired the side in just one inning, the fourth.

FIFTH START: He had a no decision in the A's 6-2 win over San Diego July 3 in Oakland...blanked the Padres on four hits and three walks over the first four innings before allowing two runs in the fifth...Jankowski scored on a fielders choice and Myers had a RBI double...was relieved by Pagán with two outs in the fifth and the A's trailing 2-0 but Oakland scored five times in the sixth for the win.

LAST MAJOR LEAGUE START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 8-3 win at Houston on July 11...retired each of the first eight batters before walking White with two outs in the third...had a 6-0 lead when he allowed a two-run single to Gurriel in the fourth and a solo home run to White in the fifth.

WITH NASHVILLE: Went 5-5 with a 4.35 ERA in 17 games, including 13 starts, with Triple-A Nashville...was 2-3 with a 6.10 ERA and .314 opponents batting average over his first 10 games (seven starts) through June 2...then went 3-2 with a 2.76 ERA and .229 opponents batting average over his final seven games (six starts) following his July 12 option from Oakland...surrendered six home runs in 80.2 innings, an average of 0.67 per nine innings...struck out 81, an average of 9.04 per nine innings, and walked 25 for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 3.24...allowed a .272 opponents batting average, including .216 (29-for-134) against left-handed hitters compared to .313 (56-for-179) against right-handers...had a .577 OPS against lefties, .819 against righties... was 3-1 with a 2.23 ERA in nine games at home, 2-4 with a 6.94 ERA in eight games on the road...surrendered five of his six home runs on the road...went 1-1 with a 1.59 ERA in four relief appearances, 4-4 with a 5.09 ERA in 13 starts...tossed at least four innings in all four of his relief appearances

2018 NASHVILLE HIGHLIGHTS: Began the season in the bullpen and was 1-0 with a 0.69 ERA in three appearances when he was recalled by Oakland April 20...tossed at least 4.0 innings in each appearances and did not allow a run over his first 9.0 innings...was optioned back to Nashville April 26 and allowed a season-high seven runs on seven hits in 2.0 innings in his first start April 30 at Colorado Springs and took the loss...pitched 2.0 innings in his next start and 3.0 after that...then allowed a season-high tying seven runs on seven hits and three walks in 3.1 innings May 17 at Oklahoma City for the loss...picked up his first win as a starter May 22 against Colorado Springs when he allowed just one run in 5.0 innings...then had a no decision May 28 against Oklahoma City when he struck out a season-high eight batters...took the loss in his first start following his July 12 option from Oakland but then went 3-0 with a 3.00 ERA over his next four starts from July 24 to Aug. 10... allowed a season-high tying eight hits July 24 at Las Vegas...tossed a season-high 8.0 innings and allowed just one run on three hits in a 3-1 win over Sacramento Aug. 4...allowed one run in three consecutive starts from Aug. 4-15 (3 er in 19.1 ip, 1.40 ERA).

LAST MINOR LEAGUE APPEARANCE: Tossed 4.0 innings in relief of Daniel Mengden last Tuesday at Round Rock and was the losing pitcher in the Sounds 2-0 loss...Mengden tossed four scoreless innings and Bassitt pitched a scoreless fifth and sixth inning before allowing two a two-run single to Nick Torres in the seventh.

LHP Brett Anderson (3-3, 3.47 ERA):	Was reinstated from the 10-day disabled list July 8 and is 3-1 with a 2.11 ERA and .218 opponents batting average in eight starts since his return...the ERA is fifth lowest in the American League over that span...has not allowed a run in three of his four starts in August and is 1-0 with a 0.68 ERA and .135 opponents batting average...has walked just two batters in 26.2 innings (.154 on-base percentage)...has walked just 12 batters in 62.1 innings overall and his average of 1.73 walks per nine innings is the lowest of his career (1.76 in 2010)...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 6-0 A's win over Texas last Tuesday in Oakland (7.0 ip, 1 h, 1 bb, 6 so)...is 1-2 with a save and a 5.50 ERA (18.0 ip, 25 h, 15 r, 11 er, 7 bb, 18 so, 3 hr) in four career appearances, including three starts, against Houston... has a loss in his only start this year, a 16-2 A's loss in Oakland on May 7 (3.0 ip, 10 h, 9 r, 7 er, 3 bb, 0 so).
