OAKLAND ATHLETICS (79-53) VS. HOUSTON ASTROS (81-50)

TUESDAY, AUGUST 28, 2018 — MINUTE MAID PARK — 7:10 P.M. CDT

ABOUT THE A'S: Are 3-3 over the last six games but have won 18 of their last 25 contests since being swept at Colorado July 27-29...are 24-11 (.686) since the All-Star Break, which is the best record in the majors...are 79-53 (.598) overall, which is fourth best record in the American League and the majors...it is tied for the sixth best record in Oakland history after 132 games and is the best since the 2002 club was 81-51 (would improve to 88-51 in 2002 before loss #52)...the 26 games over .500 are one short of the season high of 27 (79-52 on Aug. 26)...the A's 79 wins are four more than their season total from last year...have won each of the previous five series, are 7-0-1 over the previous eight and 17-1-2 over the previous 20 dating back to June 15.

THE STANDINGS: The A's are in second place in the American League West and trail first place Houston by 2½ games...were tied for first with the Astros on Aug. 18, 20 and 21...trailed Houston by a season-high 12 games entering play on June 19 but have gone 43-17 over that stretch while the Astros have gone 32-25...have the second AL Wild Card spot and are 4½ games ahead of third place Seattle, which is ½ game short of the season high of five on Aug. 26...were a season-high 11 games back of the second Wild Card spot at the conclusion of play June 15 but have gone 45-17 since then while Seattle has gone 29-32...are 4½ games behind the first Wild Card team, New York.

THE LAST 62 GAMES: The A's are 45-17 (.726) dating back to June 16, which is the best record in the majors over that span...have come from behind in 21 of the 45 wins and have scored the winning run in the eighth inning or later in 15 of the victories.

IN AUGUST: The A's are 16-7 (.696) in the month of August, which is the second best record in the majors (STL, 19-5)...the wins are the A's most in August since 2012 (18-10)...went 13-12 in April, 15-14 in May, 17-10 in June, 17-8 in July and have clinched a winning record in August...this is the sixth season in Oakland history in which the A's have posted a winning record in April, May, June, July and August (1971, 1972, 1990, 2003, 2013)...each of the previous five teams have gone on to post a winning record in September...have a 2.89 ERA (68 er in 212.0 ip), which is second lowest in the American League to Tampa Bay (2.49)...the offense leads the AL in extra base hits (92) and slugging (.472) and ranks second in doubles (54), home runs (36), batting (.263) and OPS (.796).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 40-27 (.597) on the road and need one more win to clinch a winning record on the road for the first time since 2013 (44-37)...have the third best road record in the majors...are 3-2 on this seven-game road trip to Minnesota (3-1) and Houston (0-1)...went 2-1 on the last road trip to Los Angeles (AL) and are 32-15 (.681) on the road dating back to May 14 after starting the year 8-12...went 6-3 on the last homestand against Seattle (2-1), Houston (2-1) and Texas (2-1)...return home following the game tomorrow for a 10-game homestand against Seattle (four games), New York-AL (three games) and Texas (three games)...are 21-6 (.778) at home dating back to June 16 after starting the year 18-20 in the Coliseum...are 39-26 (.600) at home for the season.

HOME AND AWAY SPLITS: The A's lead the majors with 116 home runs and an average of 5.54 runs per game on the road and rank second with a .267 (637-for-2388) batting average...the home runs are the A's most on the road since 1999 and the 371 runs scored are their most since 2013 (414)...have the third lowest home batting average in the majors (.234) and the sixth fewest runs per game (3.98)...have hit just 67 home runs at home.

PITCHING: The A's allowed 11 runs last night after allowing 11 runs total in the four game series at Minnesota...have a 3.14 ERA (112 er in 321.0 ip) since the All-Star Break, which is the lowest mark in the majors...had a 4.01 ERA before the All-Star Break and now have a 3.78 ERA overall, which ranks fifth in the American League...also rank fifth in the AL in opponents batting average (.239), slugging percentage (.395) and OPS (.697) and sixth in on-base percentage (.302)...are third in shutouts (12), have issued the fourth fewest walks (379) and have surrendered the fifth fewest home runs (151)...A's starting pitchers have allowed one run or fewer in 14

of the last 25 games and are 13-5 with a 2.62 ERA (41 er in 140.2 ip) and .223 (115-for-515) opponents batting average over that span.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .280 (158-for-565) with 73 extra base hits (45 doubles, 1 triple, 27 home runs) and 84 runs scored over the last 16 games (5.3 runs and 4.6 extra base hits per game)...now have 467 extra base hits for the season, which is second most in the majors (BOS, 492)...are on pace for 573, which would break the Athletics record of 555 set in 2001...also rank second in the majors in doubles (266) and home runs (183), fourth in slugging (.438) and sixth in runs (630) and OPS (.760).

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 26-10 (.722) in one-run games, which is the best record in the majors...only Seattle (32) has more wins and only Atlanta (9) has fewer losses...the Athletics record for winning percentage in one-run games is .698 in 1928 (30-13)...are 39-21 (.650) in games decided by two runs or fewer...the wins are tied for third in the majors and the record ranks fourth...are 11-5 (.688) in extra inning games...rank second in the majors in extra inning wins and games (16) and have the third best record...the wins are tied for fourth most in Oakland history...are 20-7 (.741) in games decided in the last at bat...the record is the best in the majors, the losses are the fewest and the wins are tied for second...have two walk-off losses, which are tied for the fewest in the majors (ATL, BOS, TEX)...have 33 come from behind wins, which is tied for seventh most in the majors

LEADING LATE: The A's are 56-0 when leading after seven innings and are the only team in the majors that has not lost when leading after seven...have not lost when leading after seven since Sept. 2, 2017 at Texas and now have a 71-game winning streak in those games, which is an on-going Athletics record...the last team to go undefeated when leading after seven innings is the 2012 Orioles (74-0)...the A's (65-0) and Mariners (63-0) are the only teams that have not lost when leading after eight innings...have a 92-game winning streak in those games and have not lost when leading after eight since July 27, 2017 at Toronto.

THE LATE INNINGS: The A's lead the majors in runs scored in the seventh inning or later (237) and the eighth inning (96), rank third in runs in extra innings (18) and fifth in runs in the ninth (57)...are batting .262 (404-for-1543) in the seventh inning or later, which is third best in the majors, and have a 3.26 ERA (147 er in 406.0 ip) in the seventh inning or later, which is fourth lowest.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's placed Brett Anderson on the disabled list today and A's starting pitchers have now combined for 11 stints on the DL...Oakland has used the disabled list 25 times this year, which is tied for second most in Oakland history (27 in 2016, 25 in 2008)...however, players have missed just 881 games for an average of 35.2 per stint, which is the lowest since 2008 (35.1).

A's vs. ASTROS: The A's have lost the season series for the fourth consecutive year as they are 6-11 with two games remaining...went 2-7 in Oakland, which was their worst home mark ever against the Astros...are 4-4 in Houston...have won five of the last eight games after losing eight in a row...are 28-46 (.378) against the Astros over the last four years after winning each of their first four season series against Houston (31-13, .705)...are 59-59 all-time, including 31-29 in Oakland and 28-30 in Houston.

Matt Chapman leads the majors in doubles (15) and extra base hits (29) since the All-Star Break and is tied for the lead in runs scored (33) and hits (50)...**Khris Davis** leads the majors in home runs (39) and ranks second in RBI (103)...has 10 home runs in August, which matches the Oakland record for August (Brosius in 1995, Chavez in 2002)...**Blake Treinen** leads Major League relievers in ERA (0.97) and is tied for fourth in saves (32).

OAKLAND A'S 50th ANNIVERSARY MOMENTS

In 1974 the A's win at Milwaukee 3-1 as Catfish Hunter wins his 20th game of the season, his fourth consecutive 20-win season...he would go on to win 25 games, an Oakland record which stood until 1990 when Bob Welch won 27...in 2002 the A's defeat Kansas City 7-1 to extend their winning streak to an Oakland record 15, breaking the mark of 14 set in 1988...the streak would reach an AL record 20 before coming to an end

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Edwin Jackson (4-3, 2.97 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is 4-3 with a 2.97 ERA in 11 starts since he was selected by the A's June 25...his ERA is fourth lowest in the American League over that stretch...the A's have won in each of his no decisions and are 8-3 in his starting assignments...began the season at Triple-A Syracuse in the Washington organization and was 4-2 with a 3.40 ERA and .238 opponents batting average in 10 starts with the Chiefs when he was released June 1 (contract opt-out)...signed a minor league deal with the A's June 6 and was assigned to Triple-A Nashville...went 0-1 with a 4.02 ERA and .207 opponents average in three starts with the Sounds and was 4-3 with a 3.53 ERA in 13 minor league starts overall.

WINNING STREAK SNAPPED: Allowed four runs in 4.1 innings for the loss in his last start last Wednesday against Texas to snap his three-game winning streak...it was his longest winning streak since June 30-July 11, 2013 when he also won three in a row, and it fell one short of his career high...is now 3-1 with a 1.88 ERA (6 er in 28.2 ip) over his last five starts...went 1-0 with a 2.45 ERA over his first three starts and 0-2 with a 5.40 ERA over his next three starts from July 13 to 25.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has held the opposition to a .173 (9-for-52) batting average with runners in scoring position...eight of the nine home runs he has allowed have been solo shots...eight have come at home and six have been hit by left-handed hitters...opponents are hitting .104 (11-for-106) with two strikes...has a .156 (14-for-90) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .255 (37-for-145) after that...has allowed a .300 (6-for-20) batting average to the opponents nine hitter, which is his highest average against any spot in the batting order...the two through four hitters are batting a combined .184 (16-for-87).

INNING BY INNING: Has a 1.64 ERA (6 er in 33.0 ip) and .149 (17-for-114) opponents batting average over the first three innings of a game and a 4.40 ERA (15 er in 30.2 ip) and .281 (34-for-121) opponents batting average from the fourth inning on.

RUN SUPPORT: Received no run support in his last start and has one run of support or fewer in six of his 11 starts...his season run support average is 3.11 (22 rs in 63.2 ip).

100 WINS: Defeated Toronto July 30 for the 100th win of his career...became the first pitcher to record his 100th career victory in an A's uniform since Brett Tomko on Sept. 14, 2009 at Texas...has now won at least one game with 11 different teams.

16 SEASONS AND 13 TEAMS: Is in his 16th season in the majors with his 13th team (Los Angeles-NL, Tampa Bay, Detroit, Arizona, Chicago-AL, St. Louis, Washington, Chicago-NL, Atlanta, Miami, San Diego, Baltimore)...has tied Octavio Dotel's Major League record for teams played for in a career.

2018 START-BY-START: He had a no decision in the A's 5-4 win at Detroit on **June 25**...allowed a RBI single to Hicks in the fourth, which was the only run he would allow in six innings of work...was the winning pitcher in the A's 7-2 win over Cleveland **July 7** in Oakland...allowed solo home runs to Lindor and Ramirez in the fourth...had a no decision in the A's 6-3, 11-inning win at Cleveland **July 7**...allowed single runs in each of the first two innings on an Encarnacion RBI ground out and an Allen RBI double...was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-1 loss at San Francisco **July 13**...balked in a run in the fourth and allowed a RBI single to Posey in the sixth...lost his second consecutive start to San Francisco in a 5-1 A's loss in Oakland **July 20**...allowed a RBI single to Posey in the fourth and solo home runs to Jones in the fifth and Sandoval in the seventh...had a no decision in the A's 6-5 win at Texas **July 25**...allowed a three-run home run to Chirinos in the second inning and a RBI single to Odor in the fifth...earned the 100th win of his career in the A's 10-1 win over Toronto **July 30** in Oakland...tossed 5.2 scoreless innings, which was his first scoreless outing since Sept. 5, 2016 vs. Boston (7.0 ip)...won his second consecutive start in the A's 2-1 win over Detroit **Aug. 4** in Oakland...allowed an unearned run in the first but that was his only run in 6.1 innings...combined with Buchter and Pagán on a five-hit shout in the A's 7-0 win at Los Angeles (AL) **Aug. 11**...tossed 7.1 innings and allowed three of the hits...it was his longest outing since Aug. 3, 2016 vs. Milwaukee (8.0 ip) and his longest scoreless outing since July 16, 2011 at Detroit (9.0 ip)...had a no decision in the A's 4-3, 10-inning win over Houston on **Aug. 17** in Oakland...retired each of the first seven batters and nine of the first 10.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-2 loss to Texas last Wednesday in Oakland...allowed a leadoff home run to Choo in the first, a RBI single to Beltre in the third, a solo home run to Gallo in the fourth and a RBI single to Beltre in the fifth...was relieved by Petit with one out in the fifth and the A's training 4-0.

JACKSON vs. HOUSTON: Is 2-2 with a 4.11 ERA (46.0 ip, 43 h, 21 r, 21 er, 12 bb, 32 so, 7 hr) in nine career appearances, including eight starts...is 0-1 with a 3.26 ERA (7 er in 19.1 ip) in four games at Minute Maid Park and 2-1 with a 4.73 ERA (14 er in 26.2 ip) in five starts at his home ballparks...had a no decision in his only start this year, a 4-3 A's win in Oakland on Aug. 17...retired each of the first seven batters and nine of the first 10 before Bregman homered with one out in the fourth...also allowed a solo home run to Maldonado in the fifth and was relieved by Trivino to start the sixth with the scored tied 2-2.

2018 IN THE MINORS: Combined for a 4-3 record and a 3.53 ERA in 13 games, all starts, with Triple-A Syracuse in the Washington organization and Triple-A Nashville in the Oakland farm system...the starts were his most as a minor leaguer since 2006 when he made 13 starts with Triple-A Durham in the Tampa Bay farm system...had no decisions and a 5.09 ERA in four starts in April...then went 4-3 with a 3.02 ERA over his final nine starts...surrendered five home runs in 71.1 innings...allowed a .232 opponents batting average, including .221 (32-for-145) by right-handed hitters compared to .244 (31-for-127) by left-handed hitters...surrendered four of his five home runs to lefties...had a .266 (41-for-154) opponents average with the bases empty compared to .186 (22-for-118) with runners on...three of the five home runs he allowed were solo shots...yielded a .174 (12-for-69) average with runners in scoring position...opponents were 11-for-64 (.172) with eight walks (.264 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning...went 1-for-5 with a double, walk and two strikeouts as a hitter, including 1-for-2 with a double and a walk in three pinch hitting appearances...allowed one run or fewer in seven of his 13 starts.

RHP Trevor Cahill (5-2, 3.44 ERA): Is scheduled to make the 300th appearance of his career...has 994 career strikeouts and needs six more for 1,000 career...is 4-0 with a 0.85 ERA and .157 opponents batting average in eight starts at home compared to 1-3 with a 6.92 ERA and .294 opponents average in eight starts on the road...is 4-1 with a 4.19 ERA, .228 opponents batting average and 16 walks (3.35 per nine innings) in eight starts since he was reinstated from the disabled list July 12...went 1-2 with a 2.77 ERA, .214 opponents batting average and 11 walks (2.03 per nine innings) over his first eight starts...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 6-4 A's loss at Minnesota last Thursday (5.0 ip, 8 h, 5 r, 5 er, 2 bb, 2 so)...is 2-1 with a 4.13 ERA (24.0 ip, 20 h, 13 r, 11 er, 7 bb, 19 so, 3 hr) in five career appearances, including four starts, against Houston...is 1-1 with a 3.24 ERA (16.2 ip, 8 h, 7 r, 6 er, 5 bb, 15 so, 1 hr) in three starts this year.
