## OAKLAND ATHLETICS (80-53) VS. HOUSTON ASTROS (81-51)

WEDNESDAY, AUGUST 29, 2018 — MINUTE MAID PARK — 1:10 P.M. CDT

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Are 4-3 over the last seven games but have won 19 of their last 26 contests since being swept at Colorado July 27-29...are 25-11 (.694) since the All-Star Break, which is the best record in the majors...are 80-53 (.602) overall, which is fourth best record in the American League and the majors...it is sixth best record in Oakland history after 133 games and is the best since the 2002 club was 82-51 (would improve to 88-51 in 2002 before loss #52)...the 27 games over .500 are tied for the season high(79-52 on Aug. 26)...the A's 80 wins are five more than their season total from last year...have won each of the previous five series, are 7-0-1 over the previous eight and 17-1-2 over the previous 20 dating back to June 15.

**THE STANDINGS:** The A's are in second place in the American League West and trail first place Houston by 1½ games...were tied for first with the Astros on Aug. 18, 20 and 21...trailed Houston by a season-high 12 games entering play on June 19 but have gone 44-17 over that stretch while the Astros have gone 32-26...have the second AL Wild Card spot and are 5½ games ahead of third place Seattle, which is a season high...were a season-high 11 games back of the second Wild Card spot at the conclusion of play June 15 but have gone 46-17 since then while Seattle has gone 29-33...are 4½ games behind the first Wild Card team, New York.

**THE LAST 63 GAMES:** The A's are 46-17 (.730) dating back to June 16, which is the best record in the majors over that span...have come from behind in 21 of the 46 wins and have scored the winning run in the eighth inning or later in 16 of the victories.

**IN AUGUST:** The A's are 17-7 (.708) in the month of August, which is the second best record in the majors (STL, 20-5)...the wins are the A's most in August since 2012 (18-10)...went 13-12 in April, 15-14 in May, 17-10 in June, 17-8 in July and have clinched a winning record in August...this is the sixth season in Oakland history in which the A's have posted a winning record in April, May, June, July and August (1971, 1972, 1990, 2003, 2013)...each of the previous five teams have gone on to post a winning record in September...have a 2.85 ERA (70 er in 221.0 ip), which is second lowest in the American League to Tampa Bay (2.65)...the offense is tied for the AL lead in extra base hits (94), ranks first in the AL in slugging (.464), while they rank second in doubles (55), home runs (37), OPS (.788), and tied for second in batting (.259).

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 41-27 (.603) on the road and have clinched a winning record on the road for the first time since 2013 (44-37)...have the third best road record in the majors...are 4-2 on this seven-game road trip to Minnesota (3-1) and Houston (1-1)...went 2-1 on the last road trip to Los Angeles (AL) and are 33-15 (.688) on the road dating back to May 14 after starting the year 8-12...went 6-3 on the last homestand against Seattle (2-1), Houston (2-1) and Texas (2-1)...return home following the game today for a 10-game homestand against Seattle (four games), New York-AL (three games) and Texas (three games)...are 21-6 (.778) at home dating back to June 16 after starting the year 18-20 in the Coliseum...are 39-26 (.600) at home for the season.

**HOME AND AWAY SPLITS:** The A's lead the majors with 117 home runs and an average of 5.5 runs per game on the road and rank second with a .265 (642-for-2420) batting average...the home runs are the A's most on the road since 1999 and the 375 runs scored are their most since 2013 (414)...have the third lowest home batting average in the majors (.234) and the sixth fewest runs per game (3.98)...have hit just 67 home runs at home.

**PITCHING:** The A's have allowed three runs or fewer in four of the six games this road trip (25 total)...have a 3.11 ERA (115 er in 330.0 ip) since the All-Star Break, which is the lowest mark in the majors...had a 4.01 ERA before the All-Star Break and now have a 3.77 ERA overall, which ranks fifth in the American League...also rank fifth in the AL in opponents batting average (.239), slugging percentage (.394) and OPS (.696) and on-base percentage (.302)...are third in shutouts (12), have issued the fourth fewest walks (381) and have surrendered the fifth fewest home runs (151)...A's starting pitchers have allowed one run or fewer in 14 of the last 26

games and are 13-5 with a 2.66 ERA (44 er in 145.1 ip) and .223 (119-for-533) opponents batting average over that span.

**OFFENSE:** The A's are batting .280 (163-for-597) with 75 extra base hits (46 doubles, 1 triple, 28 home runs) and 88 runs scored over the last 17 games (5.2 runs and 4.1 extra base hits per game)...now have 469 extra base hits for the season, which is second most in the majors (BOS, 492)...are on pace for 571, which would break the Athletics record of 555 set in 2001...also rank second in the majors in doubles (267) and home runs (184), fourth in slugging (.437), tied for fifth in runs (634) and seventh OPS (.758).

**ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS:** The A's are 27-10 (.730) in one-run games, which is the best record in the majors...only Seattle (32) has more wins and only Atlanta (9) has fewer losses...the Athletics record for winning percentage in one-run games is .698 in 1928 (30-13)...are 11-5 (.688) in extra inning games...rank second in the majors in extra inning wins and games (16) and have the third best record...the wins are tied for fourth most in Oakland history...are 21-7 (.750) in games decided in the last at bat...the record is the best in the majors, the losses are the fewest and the wins are tied for second...have two walk-off losses, which are tied for the fewest in the majors (ATL, BOS, TEX)...have 33 come from behind wins.

**LEADING LATE:** The A's are 56-0 when leading after seven innings and are the only team in the majors that has not lost when leading after seven...have not lost when leading after seven since Sept. 2, 2017 at Texas and now have a 71-game winning streak in those games, which is an on-going Athletics record...the last team to go undefeated when leading after seven innings is the 2012 Orioles (74-0)...the A's (65-0) and Mariners (63-0) are the only teams that have not lost when leading after eight innings...have a 92-game winning streak in those games and have not lost when leading after eight since July 27, 2017 at Toronto.

**THE LATE INNINGS:** The A's lead the majors in runs scored in the seventh inning or later (238) and the eighth inning (96), rank third in runs in extra innings (18) and tied for fourth in runs in the ninth (58)...are batting .261 (406-for-1554) in the seventh inning or later, which is third best in the majors, and have a 3.23 ERA (147 er in 409.0 ip) in the seventh inning or later, which is fourth lowest.

**THE DISABLED LIST:** The A's placed Brett Anderson on the disabled list Tuesday and A's starting pitchers have now combined for 11 stints on the DL...Oakland has used the disabled list 25 times this year, which is tied for second most in Oakland history (27 in 2016, 25 in 2008)...however, players have missed just 888 games for an average of 35.56 per stint, which is the lowest since 2008 (35.1).

**A's vs. ASTROS:** The A's have lost the season series for the fourth consecutive year as they are 7-11 with one game remaining...went 2-7 in Oakland, which was their worst home mark ever against the Astros... are 5-4 in Houston...have won six of the last nine games after losing eight in a row...are 29-46 (.387) against the Astros over the last four years after winning each of their first four season series against Houston (31-13, .705)...are 60-59 all-time, including 31-29 in Oakland and 29-30 in Houston.

**Matt Chapman** leads the majors in doubles (15) and extra base hits (29) since the All-Star Break and is second in runs scored (33) and third in hits (50)...**Khris Davis** leads the majors in home runs (39) and ranks second in RBI (103)...has 10 home runs in August, which matches the Oakland record for August (Brosius in 1995, Chavez in 2002)...**Blake Treinen** leads Major League relievers in ERA (0.95) and is fourth in saves (33).

in **1989** the A's score 10 times in the fifth inning of a 19-5 win at New York... Jose Canseco has two hits in the inning, including a three run homer, and is 4 for 5 with four runs, a pair of homers and five RBI in the game...in **1998** the A's set an Oakland record with eight doubles in an 11-6 win at Cleveland...Ben Grieve ties the Oakland individual record with three doubles and Scott Spiezio adds two.

## TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Trevor Cahill (5-3, 3.44 ERA)

**FOR STARTERS:** Is scheduled to make the 300th appearance of his career...is 5-3 with a 3.44 ERA in 16 starts...the wins are his most since 2013 when he won eight games for Arizona and the starts are his most since he made 17 for the Diamondbacks in 2014...his 91.2 innings pitched are also his most since 2014 (110.2)...currently has career lows in walks per nine innings (2.65), home runs per nine innings (0.59) and strikeout-to-walk ratio (3.22) and has matched his low in opponents on-base percentage (.287)...four of his five wins have come since the All-Star Break, which is tied for third in the American League.

**QUALIFICATIONS:** Has 91.2 innings pitched...based upon a minimum of 90 innings pitched, he ranks third in the American League in fewest home runs per nine innings (0.59), sixth in opponents slugging percentage (.341), seventh in OPS (.629) and 10th in batting average (.221).

**HOME AND AWAY:** Is 4-0 with a 0.85 ERA (5 er in 52.2 ip) and .157 (28-for-178) opponents batting average in eight starts at home compared to 1-3 with a 6.92 ERA (30 er in 39.0 ip) and .294 (45-for-153) opponents average in eight starts on the road...has not allowed a run in five of his eight starts in Oakland and his home ERA is the lowest in majors among pitchers with 50 or more innings pitched at home (Snell, TB 1.06)...his road ERA is fourth highest in the majors among pitchers with 30 or more innings on the road...now has a 10-game home winning streak and has not lost at home since July 6, 2016 against Cincinnati...picked up the win July 26 at Texas to snap a six-game road losing streak...it was his first win on the road since Aug. 20 2016 at Colorado.

**COUNTDOWN TO 1,000 STRIKEOUTS:** Struck out two batters in his last start and now has 994 strikeouts in his career...needs six more for 1000...struck out 732 batters in 1066.2 innings with his first three teams (Oakland, Arizona and Atlanta), an average of 6.18 strikeouts per nine innings...was released by the Braves on June 19, 2015 and signed by the Dodgers to a minor league contract July 2, 2015...has 262 strikeouts in 258.0 innings since then (9.14 per nine innings).

**DAYS REST:** Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 3-1 with a 5.40 ERA (16 er in 26.2 ip) in five starts on four days rest and 2-2 with a 2.63 ERA (19 er in 65.0 ip) in 11 starts on five days rest or more.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has held the opposition to a .095 (16-for-169) batting average with two strikes...has allowed a .176 (15-for-85) opponents batting average and seven walks (.255 on-base percentage) to hitters leading off an inning...the opponents number three hitter is batting .171 (7-for-41)

**AGAINST THE WEST:** Is 2-1 with a 4.70 ERA (20 er in 38.1 ip) in seven starts against American League West teams compared to 3-2 with a 2.53 ERA (15 er in 53.1 ip) in nine starts against everyone else.

**BRIEFLY:** Is 4-1 with a 4.19 ERA (20 er in 43.0 ip), .228 (36-for-158) opponents batting average and 16 walks (3.35 per nine innings) in eight starts since he was reinstated from the disabled list July 12...went 1-2 with a 2.77 ERA, .214 opponents batting average and 11 walks (2.03 per nine innings) over his first eight starts...has two stints on the disabled this year as he was out from May 6 to 15 with a right elbow impingement and June 11 to July 11 with a strained right achilles...was signed by the A's as a free agent March 19 and made two spring training appearances before he was optioned to Nashville March 28...was recalled from Triple-A Nashville April 17.

**2018 HIGHLIGHTS:** Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville April 17 and started and won that day in a 10-2 victory over Chicago (AL)...tossed 7.0 shutout innings and allowed five hits and two walks in his first start as an Athletic since Sept. 27, 2011 at Seattle...struck out a career-high 12 batters in just 6.0 innings May 5 against Baltimore...it was his third career game of 10 or more strikeouts, his first since June 14, 2013 at San Diego...became the third A's pitcher since at least 1908 to strikeout 12 or more batters in six innings or fewer, the first since Steve Karsay on April 26, 1997 vs. Kansas City (12 so in 6.0 ip)...the other is Vida Blue on April 9, 1971 vs. Kansas City (13 so in 6.0 ip)...ended up with a no decision in the A's 2-0, 12-inning win...was 1-1 with a 2.25 ERA in four starts when he was placed on the disabled list May 9 retroactive to May 6 with a right elbow impingement...did not make a rehab appearance before he was reinstated May 16...lost to Boston that day and then had back-to-back no decisions in extra innings on May 22 against Seattle and May 28 against Tampa Bay...tossed 8.0 scoreless innings and allowed just four hits while not walking a batter in the latter contest...was 0-1 with a 3.28 ERA and .225 opponents batting average in four starts after returning from the DL and was 1-2 with a 2.77 ERA and .214 opponents batting average in eight starts before returning to the DL a second time...was placed on the 10-day DL June 14 retroactive to June 11 with a right achilles strain...was reinstated July 12 and had a no decision in each of his first two starts...then went 4-0 with a 3.45 ERA over his next five starts from July 26 to Aug. 18...the winning streak was his longest since he won five in a row from Aug. 17-Sept. 21, 2013 while pitching for Arizona...was the winning pitcher in his 200th ca-

reer start, a 6-2 A's win over Toronto on July 31...combined with Petit, Trivino and Buchter on a five-hit shutout in the A's 6-0 win over Detroit on Aug. 5 in Oakland...struck out 10, which was his second game of 10 or more strikeouts this year and the fourth of his career.

**LAST START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-4 loss at Minnesota last Thursday...Oakland scored twice in the second and he allowed two runs in the third on RBI singles by Rosario and Polanco...then yielded three runs in the fourth inning on a two-run double by Garver and a RBI single by Mauer...left after five innings trailing 5-3.

starts on the road...is 1-1 with a 3.24 ERA (16.2 ip, 8 h, 7 r, 6 er, 5 bb, 15 so, 1 hr) in three starts this year...the loss came in an 8-4 decision at Houston on April 29...allowed two runs in the third on a Springer RBI single and an Altuve sacrifice bunt and a solo home run to Springer in the fifth...walked Bregman to start the seventh and was relieved by Petit, who allowed that run to score plus two of his own...then had a no decision in a 6-4 A's win at Houston on July 12...allowed a two-run double to Bregman in the third...was relieved by Hatcher with two outs in the fourth, a runner on first and the A's trailing 2-0...Hatcher surrendered a two-run home run to Kemp but Oakland scored three times in the fifth to get him off the hook and three times in the eighth for the win...the win came in a 7-1 victory in Oakland on Aug. 18...tossed seven scoreless innings and allowed just one hit, a one-out single by Gurriel in the second...retired the next 14 batters before walking Bregman to lead off the seventh...was relieved by Familia to start the eighth with the A's leading 5-0.

**WITH NASHVILLE:** Is 0-1 with a 2.63 ERA and .146 opponents batting average in three starts with Triple-A Nashville...struck out 17 batters in 13.2 innings but also walked eight...right-handed hitters are 4-for-31 (.129) and lefties were 3-for-17 (.176)...opponents are 0-for-5 with runners in scoring position... went 0-1 with a 3.72 ERA in two starts before he was recalled by Oakland April 17...made one rehab start during his second stint on the DL, a no decision against Iowa on July 7 when he tossed 4.0 scoreless innings.

### TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

**RHP Frankie Montas (5-3, 3.75 ERA):** Will be recalled from Triple-A Nashville tomorrow for his third stint with the A's this year and is scheduled to make his 11th start...went 5-2 with a 3.35 ERA in eight starts during his first stint from May 27 to July 9 and 0-1 with a 5.79 ERA in two starts during his second stint from July 24 to 29...his last Major League start was a loss in the A's 3-2 loss at Colorado on July 29 (4.1 ip, 8 h, 3 r, 3 er, 2 bb, 6 so)...is 0-0 with a 4.15 ERA (4.1 ip, 2 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 7 so, 1 hr) in three career appearances against Seattle, all in relief in 2017...was 4-5 with a 4.65 ERA in 15 starts, including one complete game, with Nashville...had a .255 opponents batting average, including .189 (18-for-95) against left-handed hitters compared to .290 (51-for-176) against right-handers...went 2-0 despite a 5.96 ERA in five starts following his July 30 option...had a no decision in his last start, a 4-3 Sounds loss to Memphis last Saturday (5.0 ip, 4 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 5 so).
