# OAKLAND ATHLETICS (87-57) VS. BALTIMORE ORIOLES (41-102)

TUESDAY, SEPTEMBER 11, 2018 — ORIOLE PARK AT CAMDEN YARDS — 7:05 P.M. EDT RHP MIKE FIERS (11-6, 3.36) VS. RHP ALEX COBB (5-15, 4.97) NBCSCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME)

ABOUT THE A'S: Swept a three-game series from Texas to close out the last homestand... are now 9-1-2 over the last 12 series and 19-2-3 over the last 24...have won four straight and six of the last seven games...are 32-15 (.681) since the All-Star Break, which is the best record in the majors...are 53-21 (.716) over their last 74 games dating back to June 16, which is the best record in the majors over that span...

the only other seasons in Oakland history in which the A's won 53 or more games over a 74-game span are 2001 and 2002...are 87-57 (.604) overall, which is the fourth best record in the American League and the majors...are 30 games over .500 for the first time since finishing the 2013 season 30 over (96-66)...have not been 31 over since Sept. 23, 2013 (94-63)...have clinched a winning record for the first time since 2014 (88-74) and the 87 wins are an 12-win improvement over last year...are 99-64 over their last 162 games (would remain 99-63 with a win today).

THE STANDINGS: The A's are in second place in the American League West and trail first place Houston by three games...are a season-high tying 7½ games ahead of Seattle and Tampa Bay for the second AL Wild Card spot... were a season-high 11 games back of the second Wild Card at the conclusion of play June 15...are three games behind the first Wild Card team, New York.

AGAINST THE EAST: The A's conclude their schedule against American League East teams on this six-game road trip to Baltimore and Tampa Bay...are 18-8 (.692) against the AL East, which is the second best record by any team against the East (Boston, 45-19, .703)...the A's best mark ever against the East is 31-14 (.689) in 2001.

OFFENSE: The A's have 199 home runs and need one ATHLETICS MOST more to reach 200 for the sixth time in Athletics history...have scored at least seven runs in each of the last four games and six or more in eight of the last nine (60 runs, 6.7 per game)...rank second in the majors in doubles (295) and extra base hits (512), third in home runs (199) and slugging percentage (.438), fourth in OPS (.762) and fifth in runs scored (699)...the 512 extra base hits are tied for 10th in Athletics history (9th is 517 in 2003, 8th is 518 in 1930, 7th is 527 in 1932) and the 295 doubles are tied for 14th (13th is 297 in 1933, 12th is 298 in 1925, 11th is 301 in 2013)...have five players with 20 or more home runs, which ties the Athletics record...have scored 106 runs in the eighth inning, which leads the majors, is an Oakland record and is the most by an A's team since the 1933 Philadelphia A's had 128....also lead the majors with 30 home runs in the eighth inning, which is one short of the Oakland record (31 in 2000)

PITCHING: The A's have a 3.32 ERA (158 er in 428.1 ip) since the All-Star Break, which is the lowest mark in the majors...overall, rank fourth in the America League in opponents OPS (.695) and fifth in ERA (3.79), batting average (.238), on-base percentage (.303) and slugging percentage (.393)...are tied for third in shutouts (12) and rank fifth in fewest walks (423) and fewest home runs (164)...are tied for second with 77 wild pitches, which is seven short of the Athletics record (84 in 2017)...have used an average of 6.75 pitchers per game in September (54 in eight games), including nine once and eight three times...used eight pitchers in a nine-inning game a total of two times over the first 50 years in Oakland.

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers are 5-5 with a 5.55 ERA (44 er in 71.1 ip) and .283 (79-for-279) opponents batting average over the last 18 games...have tossed six innings or fewer in all 18 contests, which is the second longest such streak in Athletics history...the record is a 29-game streak from June 29-July 31, 1997...starters have tossed three innings or fewer in four of the last five games, including twice by an "opener".

HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin their penultimate road trip of the regular season tonight, a six-game trip to Baltimore (three games) and Tampa Bay (three games)...went 4-3 on the last trip to Minnesota (3-1) and Houston (1-2) and are 33-16 (.673) on the road dating back to May 14 after starting the year 8-12...are 41-28 (.594) on the road for the season, which is the third best road record in the majors, compared to 46-29 (.613) at home ...

have clinched their first winning record on the road since 2013 (44-37) and have clinched a winning record at home for the second consecutive season (46-35 last year)...went 7-3 on the last homestand against Seattle (2-2), New York-AL (2-1) and Texas (3-0) and are 28-9 (.757) over the last 37 home games after starting the year 18-20 in the Coliseum.

HOME AND AWAY SPLITS: The A's are batting .265 (651-for-2456) with 117 home runs and an average of 5.49 runs per game on the road (379 runs in 69 games) compared to .237 with 82 home runs and an average of 4.27 runs per game at home...lead the majors in home runs and runs per game on the road and rank second in batting...have the fourth lowest home batting average in the majors and the 11th fewest runs per game...the 117 home runs are third most in Athletics history on the road and the 379 runs scored are already the most since 2013 (414).

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 27-12 (.692) in onerun games, which is the best record in the majors...are tied for second in fewest losses and rank third in wins...the Athletics record for winning percentage in one-run games is .698 in 1928 (30-13)...are 11-5 (.688) in extra inning games...rank second in the majors in extra inning wins, have the third best record and are tied for fourth in games (16)...the wins are tied for fourth most in Oakland history...are 22-8 (.724) in games decided in the last at bat... the record is the best in the majors, the losses are tied for the fewest (SEA, BOS) and the wins rank second (TOR, 23).

LEADING LATE: The A's are 63-0 when leading after seven innings and are the only team in the majors that has not lost when leading after seven...have an Athletics record 78-game winning streak when leading after seven and have not lost since Sept. 2, 2017 at Texas...the last team to go undefeated when leading after seven is the 2012 Orioles (74-0)...the A's (72-0) and Mariners (68-0) are the only teams that have not lost when leading after eight innings...have a 99-game winning streak in those games and have not lost when leading after eight since July 27, 2017 at Toronto.

**ROSTER NOTES:** With the addition of Montas today, the A's now have 37 players on the active roster...have used 52 players for the season...Aaron Brooks would become number 53, which would fall one short of the Oakland record of 54 set in 2007 and matched last year...have already set an Athletics record with 33 pitchers (previous: 30 in 2015), which is tied for sixth most in the majors...have used 14 starters, which is tied for fourth in the majors and tied for second in Oakland history (16 in 1983)...have used 23 relievers, which is second most in Oakland history (24 in 2015).

A's vs. ORIOLES: The A's lead the season series 3-0 after sweeping a threegame series in Oakland May 4-6...over the previous six seasons, the A's have won the season series in even numbered years and the Orioles in odd number years...have a 22-24 record against Baltimore over the last seven years.. have lost eight of the last 10 games at Camden Yards...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 266-265 against the Orioles...that breaks down to 136-135 in Oakland and 130-130 in Baltimore...are 63-56 at Camden Yards... are 1002-945 against the Orioles/Browns/Brewers...the only other of the other seven original American League franchises that the A's have 1000 wins and a winning record against is the Twins/Senators (1007-1006).

### TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Chapman leads the majors in doubles (20) and extra base hits (35) since the All-Star Break, ranks third in runs (40) and tied for third in hits (62)...Khris Davis leads the majors in home runs (41) and ranks second in RBI (108)...the home runs rank 10th in Oakland history...Blake Treinen leads Major League relievers in ERA (0.87)...has 37 saves, which ranks fourth in the majors and tied for eighth in Oakland history.

#### OAKLAND A'S 50th ANNIVERSARY MOMENTS

In 1970 Vida Blue tosses his first career complete game, a 3-0, one-hit shutout at Kansas City...he would go on to compile 105 complete games and 28 shutouts in an A's uniform, both Oakland career records...in 1976 Mike Torrez tosses his club record third consecutive shutout, a six-hit, 1-0 win at Texas...the streak is part of a string of 38 1/3 consecutive scoreless innings...in **1999** Doug Jones records the final out of the A's 5-4 victory at Tampa Bay to become the 11<sup>th</sup> pitcher in major league history to record 300 saves...in 2006 Frank Thomas homers in his sixth consecutive game to set an Athletics record for consecutive games with a home run.

# TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Mike Fiers (11-6, 3.36 ERA)

WITH THE A'S: Is 4-0 with a 2.94 ERA (11 er in 33.2 ip) and .211 (26-for-123) opponents batting average in six starts since he was acquired from the Detroit Tigers on Aug. 6 for two players to be named later (one was Nolan Blackwood on Aug. 18) or cash considerations...the longest winning streak to start an Oakland career by an in-season acquisition is five by Omar Olivares in 1999...the A's have won in each of his six starting assignments and his teams are 19-8

(.704) in his starting assignment this year...went 7-6 with a 3.48 ERA and .258 opponents average in 21 starts with the Tigers.

BRIEFLY: Picked up his 11th win of the season in his last start, which matches his career high from 2016 with Houston...is now 7-3 with a 2.69 ERA (31 er in 103.2 ip) over his last 18 starts dating back to May 30 after going 4-3 with a 4.78 ERA over his first nine starts...his ERA dating back to May 30 is second lowest in the American League and eighth lowest in the majors.

FIVE-GAME WINNING STREAK SINCE THE BREAK: Is 5-0 with a 2.63 ERA (14 er in 48.0 ip) and .223 (40-for-179) opponents batting average in nine starts since the All-Star Break...lost his final start before the break and the fivegame winning streak is a career high and tied for the fifth longest active streak in the American League...ranks sixth in the AL in ERA since the All-Star Break and tied for seventh in wins...was 6-6 with a 3.70 ERA and .259 opponents batting average in 18 starts before the break.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks third in the American League in opponents batting average with runners in scoring position (.159), eighth in fewest walks per nine innings (1.89) and ninth in ERA (3.36)...also ranks tied for fifth in most home runs (27) and ninth in fewest pitches per inning (15.6).

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has walked just five batters to lead off an inning...has issued 22 of his 32 walks to left-handed hitters...19 of the 28 home runs he has allowed have been solo shots...has held the opponents three hitter in the batting order to a .182 (12-for-66) average.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 3-0 with a 3.21 ERA (10 er in 28.0 ip) in five starts in the Coliseum and 5-2 with a 2.77 ERA in 12 starts at Comerica Park...is a combined 8-2 with a 2.90 ERA (31 er in 96.1 ip) in 17 starts at home compared to 3-4 with a 4.15 ERA (26 er in 56.1 ip) in 10 starts on the road...is tied for sixth in the American League in home wins and ranks seventh in ERA

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 5-3 with a 2.74 ERA (21 er in 69.0 ip) in 12 starts on four days rest compared to 6-3 with a 3.87 ERA (36 er in 83.2 ip) in 15 starts on five days rest or more.

THIS AND THAT: Has allowed one run or fewer in 12 of his 27 starts and walked one batter or fewer 20 times...has a 3.05 ERA (44 er in 129.2 ip) over the first five innings of a game compared to 5.09 (13 er in 23.0 ip) from the sixth inning on...has allowed more home runs (7) than walks (6) in his six starts with the A's.

2018 HIGHLIGHTS: Began the season on the 10-day disabled list with a right lumbar strain...was reinstated April 8 and made his Tigers debut that day at Chicago (AL)...combined with four relievers on a three-hit shutout in the Detroit's 1-0 win...tossed 6.0 innings and allowed all three of the hits...also struck out six to become the third pitcher in club history to throw six or more innings, allow no runs and strike out six or more in his Tigers debut, joining Alex Main and Joe Niekro...yielded a career-high tying 10 hits in 5.1 innings April 21 against Kansas City but picked up the win in a 12-4 Tigers victory... finished April with a 2-2 record and a 3.91 ERA in four starts...then went 2-1 with a 4.83 ERA in six starts in May...put together consecutive wins for the only time as a Tiger on May 8 at Texas and May 14 against Cleveland...was named Detroit's Pitcher of the Month for June after posting a 1-2 record and a 3.30 ERA and .239 opponents batting average in five starts...allowed one run in three consecutive starts on June 27 against Oakland (7.0 ip), July 2 at Toronto (8.0 ip) and July 7 against Texas (6.0 ip)...had a loss, a no decision and a win respectively in those three starts...combined with Wilson and Greene on an eight-hit shutout in a 5-0 win over Boston on July 21 for his final win as a Tiger...tossed 6.1 innings and allowed seven of the hits...went 2-1 with a 2.23 ERA in five starts in July...the ERA was the seventh lowest in the American League in the month and his .232 on-base percentage was 10th best... was traded to Oakland Aug. 6 and had a no decision in his first start on Aug. 8 against Los Angeles (NL)...struck out a season-high tying eight batters in 5.1 innings...left with a 2-1 lead but the bullpen blew the save...it was the third time this year the bullpen blew a save in one of his starts (June 9 vs. Cleveland and July 2 at Toronto)...picked up his first win as an Athletic in the A's 3-2 win over Seattle on Aug. 20 in Oakland...combined with Buchter and Kelley on a three-hit shutout in the A's 9-0 win over Seattle on Texas on Aug. 20 in Oakland...tossed seven of the innings and allowed one of the hits...it was his longest scoreless outing since his Aug. 21, 2015 no-hitter against the Dodgers...went 3-0 with a 2.73 ERA and .227 opponents batting average

#### 38-12, 3.24 ERA (195 er in 541.2 ip) Saves/Opportunities: 42-for-55 (76.4%)

- The A's bullpen was credited with its 38th win of the season on Sunday, adding to their new single season record for most wins by relievers...rank second in the majors in wins (Tampa Bay, 47)...are 38-12 (.760), which is the best winning percentage in the Majors.
- The A's bullpen has compiled a 2.64 ERA (70 er in 238.1 ip) over the last 59 games dating back to July 3.
- Has converted 42-of-55 (76.4%) save opportunities, which is second in the Majors (Texas, 76.9%)...ranks fourth in the American League in saves.
- Ranks third in the AL in opponents on-base percentage (.297), batting average (.223), ERA (3.24), strikeouts (547), OPS (.662), and innings pitched (541.2) and fourth in slugging percentage (.365).
- Has allowed 74-of-212 (34.9%) inherited runners to score, which is the fourth highest percentage in the Majors.

### 40 RHP CHRIS BASSITT

#### Last Outing: 9/7 vs. Texas (ND, 3.0 ip, 3 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 3 so) Saves/Opportunities: 0-0 Inherited Runners/Scored: 0/0 First Hitters: 0-0, bb

- Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville last Friday for his seventh stint with the A's this year...pitched in relief that day against Texas (3.0 ip, 3 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 3 so)...it was his first relief appearance since May 9, 2015 Seattle.
- Is 2-0 with a 3.09 ERA (8 er in 23.1 ip) in five games, four starts, over his last three stints after going 0-3 with a 3.86 ERA in three starts over his first four.
- Did not pitch in his first two stints (April 20-25 and May 26), made one start in his third (June 9), two in his fourth (June 14-22), three in his fifth (June 27-July 11) and one in his sixth (Aug. 26).
- Went 5-5 with a 4.30 ERA in 18 games, including 14 starts, with Nash-ville...struck out 83 batters in 81.2 innings (9.15 per nine innings)...allowed a .271 batting average, including .215 against left-handed hitters compared to .313 against right-handers...went 2-1 with a 1.85 ERA in five games, four starts, in August.

#### **35 RHP AARON BROOKS**

- Was acquired from the Milwaukee Brewers on Sept. 3 for cash considerations
- Spent the entire season with Triple-A Colorado Springs where he was 9-4 with a 3.35 ERA in 26 games, including 15 starts...went 2-1 with a 2.00 ERA in four starts in August.
- Was selected by Milwaukee on Aug. 30 but was designated for assignment Sept. 1 without appearing in a game for the Brewers.
- Was originally drafted by Kansas City in 2011 and was traded to Oakland with Sean Manaea for Ben Zobrist on July 28, 2015...last pitched in the majors with the A's in 2015, going 3-4 with a 6.71 ERA in 11 games, including nine starts.

#### **52 LHP RYAN BUCHTER**
