OAKLAND ATHLETICS (88-57) VS. BALTIMORE ORIOLES (41-103)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won each of the last five games, which is one short of the longest winning streak of the season (6, three times, last: July 30 to Aug. 5)...have also won seven of the last eight games and are a Major League best 33-15 (.688) since the All-Star Break...are 54-21 (.720) over their last 75 games dating back to June 16, which is the best record in the majors over that span...this is the third season in

jors over that span...this is the third season in Oakland history (2001-02) and 10th in Athletics history (1910-11, 1913-14, 1928-29, 1931) in which the A's have won 54 or more games over a 75-game span...are 88-57 (.607) overall, which is the fourth best record in the American League and the majors...are 31 games over .500 for the first time since Sept. 23, 2013 (94-63)...have not been more than 31 games over .500 since Sept. 26, 2003 when they were 96-64...the 88 wins are the A's most since 2014 (88-74) and are a 13-win improvement over last year...have not won more than 88 games since going 96-66 in 2013...are 99-63 over their last 162 games...with a win tonight, the A's would be 100-62 over the last 162 games...are 9-1-2 over the previous 12 series and 19-2-3 over the previous 24.

THE STANDINGS: The A's are in second place in the American League West and trail first place Houston by three games...trail New York by two games for the first AL Wild Card spot, which is the closest they have been outside the first week of the season...are a season-high 8½ games ahead of Seattle and Tampa Bay for the second Wild Card and have a magic number of 10 to clinch a playoff spot...were a season-high 11 games back of the second Wild Card at the conclusion of play June 15.

AGAINST THE EAST: The A's conclude their schedule against American League East teams on this six-game road trip to Baltimore and Tampa Bay...are 19-8 (.704) against the AL East, which is the second best record by any team against the East (Boston, 46-19, .708)...the A's best mark ever against the East is 31-14 (.689) in 2001.

OFFENSE: The A's have 199 home runs and need one more to reach 200 for the sixth time in Athletics history...rank second in the majors in doubles (297) and extra base hits (514), third in home runs (199) and slugging percentage (.437) and fifth in OPS (.760) and runs scored (702)...the 514 extra base hits rank 10th in Athletics history (9th is 517 in 2003, 8th is 518 in 1930, 7th is 527 in 1932) and the 297 doubles are tied for 13th (12th is 298 in 1925, 11th is 301 in 2013, 10th is 303 in 1932, 9th is 305 in 2017)...have five players with 20 or more home runs, which ties the Athletics record... have scored 106 runs in the eighth inning, which leads the majors, is an Oakland record and is the most by an A's team since the 1933 Philadelphia A's had 128....also lead the majors with 30 home runs in the eighth inning, which is one short of the Oakland record (31 in 2000).

PITCHING: The A's have a 3.29 ERA (160 er in 437.1 ip)

since the All-Star Break, which is the lowest mark in the majors...overall, rank fourth in the America League in opponents on-base percentage (.302) and OPS (.694) and fifth in ERA (3.77), batting average (.238) and slugging percentage (.392)...are tied for third in shutouts (12), tied for fourth in fewest walks (424) and rank fifth in fewest home runs (165)...are tied for second with 77 wild pitches, which is seven short of the Athletics record (84 in 2017)...have 1115 strikeouts, which is fifth fewest in the AL but 10th most in Athletics history (9th in 1117 in 2001, 8th is 1124 in 2009, 7th is 1136 in 2012)...have used an average of 6.44 pitchers per game in September (58 in nine games), including nine once and eight three times...used eight pitchers in a nine-inning game a total of two times over the first 50 years in Oakland.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 6-5 with a 5.24 ERA (45 er in 77.1 ip) and .277 (83-for-300) opponents batting average over the last 19 games...have tossed six innings or fewer in all 19 contests, which is the second longest such streak in Athletics history...the record is a 29-game streak from June 29-July 31, 1997...starters have tossed three innings or fewer in four of the last six games, including twice by an "opener".

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-0 on their penultimate road trip of the regular season, a six-game trip to Baltimore (1-0) and Tampa Bay (three games)... went 4-3 on the last trip to Minnesota (3-1) and Houston (1-2) and are 34-16

(.680) on the road dating back to May 14 after starting the year 8-12...are 42-28 (.600) on the road for the season, which is the third best road record in the majors, compared to 46-29 (.613) at home...have clinched their first winning record on the road since 2013 (44-37) and have clinched a winning record at home for the second consecutive season (46-35 last year)...went 7-3 on the last homestand against Seattle (2-2), New York-AL (2-1) and Texas (3-0) and are 28-9 (.757) over the last 37 home games after starting the year 18-20 in the Coliseum.

HOME AND AWAY SPLITS: The A's are batting .264 (658-for-2490) with 117 home runs and an average of 5.46 runs per game on the road (382 runs in 70 games) compared to .237 with 82 home runs and an average of 4.27 runs per game at home...lead the majors in home runs and runs per game on the road and rank second in batting...have the fourth lowest home batting average in the majors and the 10th fewest runs per game...the 117 home runs are third most in Athletics history on the road and the 382 runs scored are already the most since 2013 (414).

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 28-12 (.700) in onerun games, which is the best record in the majors...are tied for second in fewest losses and rank third in wins...the Athletics record for winning percentage in one-run games is .698 in 1928 (30-13)...are 11-5 (.688) in extra inning games...rank second in the majors in extra inning wins, have the third best record and are tied for fourth in games (16)...the wins are tied for fourth most in Oakland history...are 22-8 (.724) in games decided in the last at bat... the record is the best in the majors, the losses are tied for the fewest (BOS) and the wins rank second (TOR, 23).

LEADING LATE: The A's are 64-0 when leading after seven innings and are the only team in the majors that has not lost when leading after seven...have an Athletics record 79-game winning streak when leading after seven and have not lost since Sept. 2, 2017 at Texas...the last team to go undefeated when leading after seven is the 2012 Orioles (74-0)...the A's (73-0) and Mariners (68-0) are the only teams that have not lost when leading after eight innings...have a 100-game winning streak in those games and have not lost when leading after eight since July 27, 2017 at Toronto.

ROSTER NOTES: The A's have 37 players on the active roster and have used 52 players for the season...Aaron Brooks would become number 53, which would fall one short of the Oakland record of 54 set in 2007 and matched last year...have already set an Athletics record with 33 pitchers (previous: 30 in 2015), which is sixth most in the majors...have used 14 starters, which is tied for fourth in the majors and tied for second in Oakland history (16 in 1983)...have used 23 relievers, which is second most in Oakland history (24 in 2015).

A's vs. ORIOLES: The A's have won the season series as they lead 4-0 with two games remaining...won the first game in Baltimore last night after sweeping a three-game series in Oakland May 4-6...over the last seven seasons, the A's have won the season series in even numbered years and the Orioles in odd numbered years...have a 23-24 record against Baltimore over that span... have lost eight of the last 11 games at Camden Yards...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 267-265 against the Orioles...that breaks down to 136-135 in Oakland and 131-130 in Baltimore...are 64-56 at Camden Yards... are 1003-945 against the Orioles/Browns/Brewers...the only other of the other seven original American League franchises that the A's have 1000 wins and a winning record against is the Twins/Senators (1007-1006).

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Chapman leads the majors in doubles (21) and extra base hits (36) since the All-Star Break, is tied for second in runs (41) and ranks fourth in hits (63)...*Khris Davis* leads the majors in home runs (41) and ranks second in RBI (109)...the home runs rank 10th in Oakland history...*Stephen Piscotty* has a 12-game hitting streak (17-for-43, .395), which matches his career high and is the second longest active streak in the majors...*Blake Treinen* leads Major League relievers in ERA (0.87)...has 37 saves, which ranks fourth in the majors and tied for eighth in Oakland history.

OAKLAND A'S 50th ANNIVERSARY MOMENTS

In **1980** Rick Langford pitches his club record 22nd consecutive complete game in the A's 9-5 win against Kansas City...he would go on to pitch an Oakland record 28 complete games...in **1986** Terry Steinbach homers in his first major league at bat off the Indians Greg Swindell at Cleveland Stadium...he would also homer in his last at bat as an Oakland Athletic.

38-12, 3.24 ERA (196 er in 544.2 ip) Saves/Opportunities: 43-for-56 (76.8%)

- The A's bullpen was credited with its 38th win of the season on Sunday, adding to their new single season record for most wins by relievers...rank second in the majors in wins (Tampa Bay, 47)...are 38-12 (.760), which is the best winning percentage in the Majors.
- The A's bullpen has compiled a 2.65 ERA (71 er in 241.1 ip) over the last 60 games dating back to July 3.
- Has converted 42-of-55 (76.8%) save opportunities, which is second in the Majors (Texas, 76.9%)...tied for third in the American League in saves.
- Ranks third in the AL in opponents on-base percentage (.296), batting average (.223), strikeouts (551), OPS (.660), slugging percentage (.358), and innings pitched (544.2) and is second in ERA (3.24)
- Has allowed 74-of-212 (34.9%) inherited runners to score, which is the fourth highest percentage in the Majors.

40 RHP CHRIS BASSITT

Last Outing: 9/7 vs. Texas (ND, 3.0 ip, 3 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 3 so) Saves/Opportunities: 0-0 Inherited Runners/Scored: 0/0 First Hitters: 0-0, bb

- Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville last Friday for his seventh stint with the A's this year...pitched in relief that day against Texas (3.0 ip, 3 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 3 so)...it was his first relief appearance since May 9, 2015 Seattle.
- Is 2-0 with a 3.09 ERA (8 er in 23.1 ip) in five games, four starts, over his last three stints after going 0-3 with a 3.86 ERA in three starts over his first four.
- Did not pitch in his first two stints (April 20-25 and May 26), made one start in his third (June 9), two in his fourth (June 14-22), three in his fifth (June 27-July 11) and one in his sixth (Aug. 26).
- Went 5-5 with a 4.30 ERA in 18 games, including 14 starts, with Nash-ville...struck out 83 batters in 81.2 innings (9.15 per nine innings)...allowed a .271 batting average, including .215 against left-handed hitters compared to .313 against right-handers...went 2-1 with a 1.85 ERA in five games, four starts, in August.

- Was selected by Milwaukee on Aug. 30 but was designated for assignment Sept. 1 without appearing in a game for the Brewers.
- Was originally drafted by Kansas City in 2011 and was traded to Oakland with Sean Manaea for Ben Zobrist on July 28, 2015...last pitched in the majors with the A's in 2015, going 3-4 with a 6.71 ERA in 11 games, including nine starts.

- average in 32 games since he was reinstated from the 10-day DL June 25. the team is 27-6 in games in which he pitches during that stretch. Has a .179 (12-for-67) opponents batting average against left-handed hit-
- ters, .298 (17-for-57) against right-handers.

- Has allowed two runs in his last 14 outings (2 er in 14.2 ip, 1.23 ERA)...did not allow an earned over his first eight games with the A's (10.0 ip) and then allowed five runs in back-to-back outings on Aug. 12 and 13.
- His opponents batting average includes a .188 (25-for-133) mark against right-handed hitters compared to .252 (29-for-115) against left-handers.
- Has a 7.71 ERA (10 er in 11.2 ip) in 15 outings on no days rest, a 1.64 ERA (10 er in 54.2 ip) in his other 49 appearances.
- Is 3-for-3 in save chances against Baltimore with a 4.15 ERA in five games.

- Compiled a 1.59 ERA in 12 appearances in August.
- First batters faced are hitting .232 (13-for-56) with just two walks (1 hbp, .271 on-base percentage).
- Combined for a 2-1 record, one save and a 3.51 ERA in 56 relief appearances with Texas and San Francisco...was traded to the Rangers July 8 along with Jason Bahr and Austin Jackson for a player to be named later or cash.

- Was on the A's Opening Day roster and logged a 4.24 ERA and .283 opponents batting average in 30 relief appearances before he was designated for assignment Aug. 9 when the A's acquired Fernando Rodney from Minnesota.
- Has held right-handed hitters to a .198 (16-for-81) batting average while left-handers are hitting .377 (23-for-61) with four of his five home runs.

- strikeouts in 5.1 innings

- Was on the A's Opening Day roster and had a 7.36 ERA and .362 opponents batting average in 13 relief appearances when he was designated for assignment June 25 when the A's added Edwin Jackson to the 40-man roster
- Has a .190 (4-for-21) average against left-handed hitters, .357 (15-for-42) against right-handers.
- Has a 6.10 ERA (14 ER in 20.2 ip) in 16 games, one start against Baltimore. Has a 2.61 ERA (3 er in 10.1 ip) in eight games in Oakland, a 13.50 ERA (8
- er in 5.1 ip) in eight games on the road. Missed nearly two months of the season when he was on the disabled list from April 14 to June 4 with a strained right groin.

• Made 35 appearances this season for Washington, going 1-0 with a 3.34 ERA and a .215 opponents average in 32.1 innings of work.

- Began the season at Double-A Pensacola in the Cincinnati organization and was released on April 26...signed a minor league deal with the A's May 1 and was assigned to Double-A Midland before moving up to Triple-A Nashville May 19.
- Combined for an 8-1 record, a 3.39 ERA and three saves in 45 minor league appearances...walked just eight batters in 58.1 innings, an average of 1.23 per nine innings...allowed a .279 batting average, including .186 (18-for-98) by left-handed hitters and .348 (47-for-135) by right-handers.

33 RHP DANIEL MENGDEN

- Recalled from Triple-A Nashville Aug. 27 for his second stint with the A's and has pitched three times since his return, all in relief (10.2 ip, 10 h, 4 r, 3 er, 3 bb, 6 so, 2.53 ERA)...the relief appearances are the first of his career.
- Was in the A's starting rotation to begin the season and was 6-6 with a 4.47 ERA in 16 starts when he was placed on the disabled list June 27 retroactive to June 24 with a sprained right foot...was reinstated from the DL and optioned to Nashville July 14.
- Has six wins in 19 games this year after combining for five wins in 21 starts over the first two seasons of his career...also has career highs in games (19), games started (16), innings (101.2), hits (97) and home runs allowed (15) and has matched his high in runs (54).
- Was 4-1 with a 2.98 ERA in nine games, including eight starts, with Nashville...surrendered just two home runs in 45.1 innings...walked one batter or fewer in each of his nine appearances and issued seven free passes total, an average of 1.39 per nine innings.

- Was 4-5 with a 4.65 ERA in 15 starts, including one complete game, with Nashville...had a .255 opponents batting average, including .189 against left-handed hitters compared to .290 against right-handers...did not pitch following his Aug. 31 option.

- Has surrendered 12 home runs, which is fifth most in the majors by a reliever...leads the majors in home runs allowed to the first batter faced (6).
- Has yielded a .204 (30-for-147) batting average against right-handed hitters compared to .304 (21-for-69) against left-handers...has a .649 OPS against righties, 1.025 against lefties.
- Is 0-1 with a 2.70 ERA (2 er in 6.2 ip) and eight strikeouts in four career games against Baltimore.

- Ranks second among American League relievers in innings pitched (86.0), fourth in games pitched (67), and is eighth in fewest walks per nine innings (1.88)...is tied for second in MLB for most home runs allowed (13).
