OAKLAND ATHLETICS (89-57) VS. BALTIMORE ORIOLES (41-104)

ABOUT THE A'S: Extended their winning streak to a season-high tying six games last night (fourth time, last: July 30-Aug. 5)...have won the first two games of this series and are now 10-1-2 over the last 13 series and 20-2-3 over the last 25...have swept 10 series this year... have also won eight of the last nine games and are a Major League best 34-15 (.694) since the All-Star Break...are 55-21 (.724) over their last

76 games dating back to June 16, which is the best record in the majors over that span...this is the third season in Oakland history (2001-02) and ninth in Athletics history (1910-11, 1913-14, 1929, 1931) in which the A's have won 55 or more games over a 76-game span...are 89-57 (.610) overall, which is the fourth best record in the American League and the majors...are 32 games over .500 for the first time since Sept. 26, 2003 (96-64)...have not been more than 32 games over .500 since Sept. 24, 2003 when they were 96-63...are 100-62 over the last 162 games dating back to Sept. 15 of last year (need a win tonight to remain 100-62).

THE STANDINGS: The A's are in second place in the American League West and trail first place Houston by three games...trail New York by one game for the first AL Wild Card spot (split the season series with the Yankees and trail in the second tiebreaker, which is intradivision record)...are a season-high tying 8½ games ahead of Tampa Bay for the second Wild Card and have a magic number of nine to clinch a playoff spot...were a season-high 11 games back of the second Wild Card at the conclusion of play June 15.

WINS: The A's won their 89th game of the season last night, which are their most wins since going 96-66 in 2013...the 89 wins are a 14-win improvement over last year...need one more win for their third 90-win season in the last seven years and their ninth dating back to 2000...only the Yankees (13 including this year), Red Sox (12 including this year) and Cardinals (10) have more 90-win seasons dating back to 2000.

TEAMWORK: Khris Davis (110 RBI) and Jed Lowrie (90 RBI) are the first Oakland teammates to drive in 200 runs since Frank Thomas (114) and Nick Swisher (95) in 2006...the A's have players with 20 or more home runs, which ties the Athletics record (1996, 1999, 2000, 2004, 2017)...have 15 pitchers with three or more wins, which are the most three-game winners on one club in Major League history.

THE THIRD INNING: The A's scored 10 runs on 10 hits in the third inning last night...the hits tied the Oakland record for hits in an inning (May 3, 2000 at KC and Sept. 11, 2013 at MIN)...the runs were their most in an inning since Sept. 15, 2015 at Chicago (AL) when they scored 10 in the fourth...sent 15 men to the plate, the second time they have done that over the last 22 years (15 on Sept. 15, 2015 at Chicago-AL).

OFFENSE: Matt Olson hit the A's 200th home run of the season last night, marking the sixth time in Athletics history the A's have reached the 200 plateau...the A's have scored six or more runs in nine of the last 11 games and are averaging 6.6 runs per game over that span (73 runs)...rank second in the majors in doubles (299) and extra base hits (518), third in home runs (200), slugging percentage (.438) and OPS (.762) and fifth in runs scored (712)...the 518 extra base hits are tied for eighth in Athletics history (7th is 527 in 1932) and the 299 doubles rank 12th (11th is 301 in 2013, 10th is 303 in 1932, 9th is 305 in 2017, 8th is 307 in

ATHLETICS MOST

PITCHING: The A's shutout the Orioles on one hit last night...it was just the second one-hit shutout of Baltimore in Oakland history (June 10, 1975)...it was the A's

third shutout of the season, which is third most in the American League... now have a 3.23 ERA (160 er in 446.1 ip) since the All-Star Break, which is the lowest mark in the majors...overall, rank fourth in the America League in ERA (3.75), opponents batting average (.236), on-base percentage (.301) and OPS (.691) and fifth in slugging percentage (.390)...have issued the fourth fewest walks (425) and surrendered the fifth fewest home runs (165)...are tied for third with 77 wild pitches, which is seven short of the Athletics record (84 in 2017)...have 1120 strikeouts, which is fifth fewest in the AL but ninth most in Athletics history (8th is 1124 in 2009, 7th is 1136 in 2012)...have used an

average of 6.30 pitchers per game in September (63 in 10 games), including nine once and eight three times...used eight pitchers in a nine-inning game a total of two times over the first 50 years in Oakland.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 6-5 with a 5.17 ERA (45 er in 78.1 ip) and .276 (84-for-304) opponents batting average over the last 20 games...have tossed six innings or fewer in all 20 contests, which is the second longest such streak in Athletics history...the record is a 29-game streak from June 29-July 31, 1997...have used an "opener" four times.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-0 on their penultimate road trip of the regular season, a six-game trip to Baltimore (2-0) and Tampa Bay (three games)... went 4-3 on the last trip to Minnesota (3-1) and Houston (1-2) and are 35-16 (.686) on the road dating back to May 14 after starting the year 8-12...are 43-28 (.606) on the road for the season, which is the third best road record in the majors, compared to 46-29 (.613) at home...have clinched their first winning record on the road since 2013 (44-37)...lead the majors with 118 home runs and an average of 5.52 runs per game on the road (392 runs in 71 games) and rank second with a .266 (673-for-2532) batting average...the home runs are third most in Athletics history on the road and the 392 runs scored are already the most since 2013 (414).

CLOSE AND LATE: The A's are 28-12 (.700) in one-run games, which is the best record in the majors...are tied for second in fewest losses and rank third in wins...are 11-5 (.688) in extra inning games and 22-8 (.724) in games decided in the last at bat...are 65-0 when leading after seven innings and are the only team in the majors that has not lost when leading after seven...the A's (74-0) and Mariners (68-0) are the only teams that have not lost when leading after eight innings.

ROSTER NOTES: After reinstating Brett Anderson from the disabled list today, the A's now have 38 players on the active roster...last night, Aaron Brooks became the 53rd player to appear in a game for Oakland this year, which is one short of the Oakland record of 54 set in 2007 and matched last year...he became the 34th pitcher, which is an on-going Athletics record (previous: 30 in 2015) and tied for fourth most in the majors...he became the 24th reliever, which ties the Oakland record (2015) and falls two short of the Athletics record (26 in 1955)

A's vs. ORIOLES: The A's have won the season series as they lead 5-0 entering the final game today...have already swept season series from Detroit (7-0) and Toronto (7-0)...the only team in Major League history to sweep three season series of six or more games is the 2009 Rockies (CIN, MIL, WAS)...have a 1.31 ERA (7 er in 48.0 ip) against the Orioles and the Oakland record for lowest ERA against Baltimore is 1.71 in 2004...have won the first two games in Baltimore after sweeping a three-game series in Oakland May 4-6...over the last seven seasons, the A's have won the season series in even numbered years and the Orioles in odd numbered years...have a 24-24 record against Baltimore over that span...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 268-265 against the Orioles...that breaks down to 136-135 in Oakland and 132-130 in Baltimore...are 65-56 at Camden Yards...are 1004-945 against the Orioles/Browns/Brewers...the only other of the other seven original American League franchises that the A's have 1000 wins and a winning record against is the Twins/Senators (1007-1006).

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Chapman leads the majors in doubles (22) and extra base hits (37) since the All-Star Break and is tied for second in runs (42) and hits (65)... Khris Davis leads the majors with 41 home runs and ranks second with a career high 110 RBI...the home runs rank 10th in Oakland history...Stephen Piscotty has a career-high 13-game hitting streak (18-for-47, .383), which is the second longest active streak in the majors...Blake Treinen leads Major League relievers in ERA (0.87)...has 37 saves, which ranks fourth in the majors and tied for eighth in Oakland history.

In **1970** Bert Campaneris singles in the first game of a double-header at Kansas City for the 1000th hit of his major league career...in **1971** Rick Monday's 11th inning RBI single scores Catfish Hunter to give the A's a 2-1 win at Kansas City...Hunter pitches 10 innings, allowing a run on four hits, to become the A's second 20-game winner...in **2010** Bobby Cramer defeats the Kansas City Royals 5-3 in his Major League debut at the age of 30 to become the oldest pitcher in Athletics history to start and win in his debut

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Brett Anderson (3-4, 4.02 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was reinstated from the 10-day disabled list today and is scheduled to make his 14th start of the season...those are his most starts since 2015 when he made 31 with the Dodgers...was placed on the DL Aug. 28 with a strained left forearm and did not have a rehab assignment...it was his second stint on the DL this year as he was also out from May 19 to July 7 with a strained left shoulder...was signed by the A's to a minor league contract March 19 and began the season at Triple-A Nashville...was selected by Oakland May 2 and went 0-2 with a 7.63 ERA and .379 opponents batting average in four starts before his first stint on the DL...went 3-2 with a 2.90 ERA and .239 opponents batting average in nine starts in between his DL stints.

DON'T WALK: Has walked one batter or fewer in each of his last eight starts and has issued four free passes in 44.2 innings over that stretch (0.81 per nine innings)...has walked just 12 batters in 65.0 innings overall and his average of 1.66 walks per nine innings is the lowest of his career (1.76 in 2010)... has walked one batter or fewer in 10 of his 13 starts.

BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK: Is 2-2 with a 2.83 ERA (13 er in 41.1 ip) and .221 (33-for-149) opponents batting average in seven starts since the All-Star Break after going 1-2 with a 6.08 ERA and .356 opponents average in six starts before the break...has walked four in 41.1 innings since the break (0.87 per nine innings) after issuing eight free passes in 23.2 innings before the break (3.04 per nine innings)...is now 26-21 with a 3.74 ERA (167 er in 402.0 ip) in 78 career appearances after the All-Star Break compared to 19-30 with a 4.34 ERA in 75 games before the break.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to make his first start since Aug. 27...is 0-2 with a 5.60 ERA (11 er in 17.2 ip) in four starts on four days rest, 3-2 with a 3.42 ERA (18 er in 47.1 ip) in nine starts on five days rest or more...over the last two years, he is 1-3 with a 7.30 ERA (30 er in 37.0 ip) in nine starts on four days rest, 6-5 with a 4.10 ERA (38 er in 83.1 ip) in 17 starts on five days rest or more.

HOME AND AWAY: Is scheduled to make his 14th start of the season, his 10th on the road...is 2-3 with a 4.91 ERA (22 er in 40.1 ip) and .313 (51-for-163) opponents batting average in nine starts on the road compared to 1-1 with a 2.55 ERA (7 er in 24.2 ip) and .207 (18-for-87) opponents average in four starts at home.

MONTH BY MONTH: Has seen his ERA and opponents batting average improve each month...went 0-2 with a 7.63 ERA and .379 opponents batting average in four starts in May and then compiled a 2-1 record, a 3.98 ERA and .309 opponents average in four starts in July...was 1-1 with a 2.15 ERA and .184 opponents average in five starts in August...did not allow a run in three of his August starts and the game went into extra innings in two of his three no decisions...walked just two batters in 29.1 innings.

THIS AND THAT: Received 13 runs of support July 23 at Texas but has just 21 runs of support in his other 12 starts (59.0 ip, 3.20 RSA)...has received two runs of support or fewer in eight of his 13 starts...has yielded six of his seven home runs and surrendered 25 of his 28 RBI to right-handed hitters...opponents are hitting .315 with runners in scoring position.

2018 HIGHLIGHTS: Left his start on May 18 at Toronto after just one inning with a strained left shoulder...combined with Petit, Buchter and Pagán on a five-hit shutout in the A's 6-0 win at Cleveland July 8...it was his first win as an Athletic since April 7, 2013...tossed five of the innings and allowed three of the hits...struck out six in a 15-3 win at Texas July 23...those were his most strikeouts in a game since Sept. 15, 2015 vs. Colorado...retired each of the first 16 batters he faced Aug. 3 against Detroit but had a no decision in the A's 1-0, 13-inning win...allowed a two-run home run to Calhoun in the third inning Aug. 10 at Los Angeles (AL), which was the first home run he surrendered to a left-handed hitter since July 28, 2015 at Oakland (Reddick)... left with a 3-2 lead but the bullpen blew the save in a 4-3 loss...tossed 7.2 scoreless innings and allowed five hits without walking a batter in a 2-0, 12-inning loss to Seattle Aug. 15...it was his longest outing since Oct. 1, 2015 at San Francisco (7.2 ip) and his longest scoreless outing since May 26, 2011 at Los Angeles-AL (8.0 ip)...combined with Familia and Trivino on a two-hit shutout in the A's 6-0 win over Texas on Aug. 21 in Oakland...tossed seven of the inning and allowed one of the hits.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 11-4 loss at Houston Aug. 27...did not allow a run over the first two innings to extend his scoreless streak to 18.2 innings...then allowed five runs while retiring two batters in the third inning...surrendered three straight RBI doubles to Springer, Bregman and Altuve plus a RBI single to Gonzalez...the bullpen allowed one more run to score.

WITH NASHVILLE: Is 2-1 with a 2.78 ERA and .248 opponents batting average in seven starts with Triple-A Nashville...has not allowed a home run in 32.1 innings...has 36 strikeouts (10.02 per nine innings) and has walked just six (1.67 per nine innings) for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 6.0...his opponents batting average includes a .223 (21-for-94) mark against right-handed hitters compared to .314 (11-for-35) against left-handers...has yielded a .156 batting average and just one walk to batters leading off an inning (.182 onbase percentage)...opponents are hitting .182 with the bases empty, .346 with runners on...including .333 with runners in scoring position...tossed 4.0 innings in his first start on April 9 at New Orleans and allowed five runs, all unearned, for the loss...struck out a season-high eight batters in each of his next two starts on April 14 against Omaha (4.0 ip) and April 19 at Iowa (5.0 ip), but no decisions...tossed a season-high 6.0 innings and picked up his first win April 25 against New Orleans...that was his final start before he was selected by Oakland May 2...was 1-1 with a 1.89 ERA in four starts at the time of his promotion...returned on June 23 for a three-start rehab assignment and went 1-0 with a 4.05 ERA before returning to Oakland...tossed 4.0 scoreless innings in his first rehab start June 23 against Round Rock...then allowed a season-high six runs on a season-high seven hits in 3.2 innings in a no decision at Oklahoma City June 28.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Edwin Jackson (5-3, 3.26 ERA): Is 5-3 with a 3.26 ERA in 14 starts since he was selected by the A's June 25...his ERA is seventh lowest in the American League over that stretch...is 1-1 with a 5.09 ERA over his last five starts...went 1-2 with a 3.86 ERA over his first six starts and was 3-0 with a 0.00 ERA (19.1 ip, 1 r) in three starts in between...has held the opposition to a .188 batting average with runners in scoring position...had a no decision in his last start, an 8-6 A's win over Texas last Saturday in Oakland (3.0 ip, 5 h, 4 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 5 so)...is 3-3 with a 3.98 ERA (43.0 ip, 36 h, 20 r, 19 er, 20 bb, 33 so, 3 hr) in seven career appearances, including six starts, against Tampa Bay...has not faced the Rays since Aug. 16, 2016 when he was the losing pitcher in a 15-1 San Diego loss at Tropicana Field (4.0 ip, 9 h, 8 r, 8 er, 3 bb, 3 so)...tossed a 149-pitch no-hitter against the Rays June 25, 2010 at Tampa Bay...walked a career-high tying eight and struck out six.

- The A's bullpen was credited with its 39th win of the season on Wednesday, adding to their new single season record for most wins by relievers.. rank second in the majors in wins (Tampa Bay, 48)...are 39-12 (.765), which is the best winning percentage in the Majors.
- The A's bullpen has compiled a 2.56 ERA (71 er in 249.1 ip) over the last 61 games dating back to July 3.
- Has converted 42-of-55 (76.8%) save opportunities, which is second in the Majors (Texas, 76.9%)...tied for third in the American League in saves.
