OAKLAND ATHLETICS (89-58) VS. TAMPA BAY RAYS (80-65)

ABOUT THE A'S: Had their winning streak snapped at a season-high tying six games last night and are now 8-2 over the last 10 games...are 34-16 (.680) since the All-Star Break, which is the best record in the majors...are 55-22 (.714) over their last 77 games dating back to June 16, which is the best record in the majors over that span...are 89-58 (.605) overall, which is the fourth best record in the American League and the majors...the 31 games over .500 are one short of the season high of 32 (89-57 on Sept. 12)...are 99-63 over the last 162 games dating back to Sept. 16 of last year (would improve to 100-62 with a win tonight)...are 10-1-2 over the last 13 series and 20-2-3 over the last 25.

THE STANDINGS: The A's are in second place in the American League West and trail first place Houston by 3½ games...trail New York by 1½ games for the first AL Wild Card spot (split the season series with the Yankees and trail in the second tiebreaker, which is intradivision record)...are eight games ahead of Tampa Bay for the second Wild Card and have a magic number of nine to clinch a playoff spot...were a season-high 11 games back of the second Wild Card at the conclusion of play June 15.

WINS: The A's won their 89th game of the season Wednesday, which are their most wins since going 96-66 in 2013...the 89 wins are a 14-win improvement over last year...need one more win for their third 90-win season in the last seven years and their ninth dating back to 2000...only the Yankees (13 including this year), Red Sox (12 including this year) and Cardinals (10) have more 90-win seasons dating back to 2000.

AGAINST THE EAST: The A's conclude their schedule against American League East teams with this three-game series at Tampa Bay...are 20-9 (.690) against the AL East, which is the second best record by any team against the East (Boston, 48-19, .716)...the A's best mark ever against the East is 31-14 (.689) in 2001.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .271 (110-for-406) over their last 12 games with 76 runs scored (6.3 per game)...rank second in the majors in doubles (301) and extra base hits (521), third in home runs (201), slugging percentage (.438) and OPS (.761) and fifth in runs scored (715)...the home runs are sixth most in Athletics history, the extra base hits rank eighth (7th is 527 in 1932, 6th is 540 in 2004) and the doubles are tied for 11th (10th is 303 in 1932, 9th is 305 in 2017, 8th is 307 in 2009, 7th is 310 in 2005).

PITCHING: The A's have a Major League leading 3.27 ERA (165 er in 454.1 ip) since the All-Star Break...overall, rank fourth in the American League in opponents OPS (.692) and on-base percentage (.301) and fifth in ERA (3.76), batting average (.237) and slugging percentage (.390)...rank third in shutouts (13), tied for fourth in fewest walks (427) and fifth in fewest home runs (165)...are second with 79 wild pitches, which is five short of the Athletics record (84 in 2017)...have 1125 strikeouts, which is fifth fewest in the AL but eighth most in Athletics history (7th is 1136 in 2012, 6th is 1160 in 2011)...have used an average of 6.27 pitchers per game in September (69 in 11 games), including nine once and eight three times...used eight pitchers in a nine-inning game a total of two times over the first 50 years in Oakland.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 6-6 with a 5.40 ERA (49 er in 81.2 ip) and .284 (91-for-320) opponents batting average over the last 21 games...have tossed six innings or fewer in all 21 contests, which is the second longest such streak in Athletics history...the record is a 29-game streak from June 29-July 31, 1997...have used an "opener" four times during the streak...starters have 774.0 innings pitched...the fewest in a non-strike season is Athletics history is 858.2 in 1997.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-1 on their penultimate road trip of the regular season, a six-game trip to Baltimore (2-1) and Tampa Bay (three games)...went 4-3 on the last trip to Minnesota (3-1) and Houston (1-2) and are 35-17 (.673) on the road dating back to May 14 after starting the year 8-12...are 43-29 (.597) on the road for the season, which is the fourth best road record in the majors, compared to 46-29 (.613) at home...have clinched their first winning record on the road since 2013 (44-37)...lead the majors with

119 home runs and an average of 5.49 runs per game on the road (395 runs in 72 games) and rank second with a .266 (682-for-2567) batting average...the home runs are third most in Athletics history on the road and the 395 runs scored are already the most since 2013 (414)...return home following the game Sunday for the final homestand of the season, a six-game stand against Los Angeles-AL (three games) and Minnesota (three games).

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 28-12 (.700) in one-run games, which is the best record in the majors...are tied for second in fewest losses and rank third in wins...the Athletics record for winning percentage in one-run games is .698 in 1928 (30-13)...are 11-5 (.688) in extra inning games...rank second in the majors in extra inning wins, have the third best record and are tied for fourth in games (16)...the wins are tied for fourth most in Oakland history...are 22-8 (.724) in games decided in the last at bat...the record is the best in the majors, the losses are tied for the fewest (BOS) and the wins rank second (TOR, 23).

LEADING LATE: The A's are 65-0 when leading after seven innings and are the only team in the majors that has not lost when leading after seven...have an Athletics record 80-game winning streak when leading after seven and have not lost since Sept. 2, 2017 at Texas...the last team to go undefeated when leading after seven is the 2012 Orioles (74-0)...the A's (74-0) and Mariners (69-0) are the only teams that have not lost when leading after eight innings...have a 101-game winning streak in those games and have not lost when leading after eight since July 27, 2017 at Toronto.

TEAMWORK: Khris Davis (110 RBI) and Jed Lowrie (90 RBI) are the first Oakland teammates to drive in 200 runs since Frank Thomas (114) and Nick Swisher (95) in 2006...the A's have players with 20 or more home runs, which ties the Athletics record (1996, 1999, 2000, 2004, 2017)...have 15 pitchers with three or more wins, which are the most three-game winners on one club in Major League history.

ROSTER NOTES: The A's have 38 players on the active roster...have used 53 players, which is one short of the Oakland record of 54 set in 2007 and matched last year...it is tied for sixth most in the majors...have employed 34 pitchers, which is an on-going Athletics record (previous: 30 in 2015) and tied for fourth most in the majors...have used 24 relievers, which ties the Oakland record (2015) and falls two short of the Athletics record (26 in 1955)...have used 14 starters, which is tied for fourth in the majors and tied for second in Oakland history (16 in 1983).

A's vs. RAYS: The A's are 1-3 against the Rays after losing three of four in Oakland at the end of May...have now lost seven of their last 10 games against Tampa Bay, six by one run...nine of the last 14 games between the two clubs have been decided by one run...lost the season series last year, 2-5...it was their worst record ever against the Rays (previous: 3-6 in 2008)...have lost the season series in two of the previous three years and are 11-14 against Tampa Bay over the last four years...all-time, the A's are 104-71 (.594) against the Rays, which is their best record against any American League team...are 58-30 in Oakland and 46-41 at Tropicana Field...the mark in the Coliseum is the A's best record against any AL team.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Chapman leads the majors in doubles (22) and extra base hits (37) since the All-Star Break, ranks second in hits (66) and third in runs (42)...**Khris Davis** is tied for the Major League lead with 41 home runs and ranks second with a career high 110 RBI...the home runs rank 10th in Oakland history...**Stephen Piscotty** has a career-high an A's season-high tying 14-game hitting streak (19-for-51, .373), which is the second longest active streak in the majors (Pham, TB 16)...**Blake Treinen** leads Major League relievers in ERA (0.87)...has 37 saves, which ranks fourth in the majors and tied for eighth in Oakland history.

OAKLAND A'S 50th ANNIVERSARY MOMENTS

In in 1990 Dave Stewart tosses a five-hitter in the A's 9-1 victory over Minnesota to win his 20th for the fourth consecutive season...he would go on to win 22 games and combined with Bob Welch to record 49 of the A's 103 victories...in 1995 Mark McGwire hits his 269th career home run off Kansas City's Mark Gubicza, breaking Reggie Jackson's Oakland career record for home runs...in 1996 Mark McGwire homers in the first inning of both games of a double header at Cleveland, his 49th and 50th of the season, breaking the Oakland record of 49 which he previously held

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Edwin Jackson (5-3, 3.26 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is 5-3 with a 3.26 ERA in 14 starts since he was selected by the A's June 25...his ERA is seventh lowest in the American League over that stretch...is scheduled to make his 15th start today, which will be his most since 2014 when he had 27 with the Cubs...his five wins match his total from each of the previous two seasons...his .288 opponents on-base percentage is a career low.

BRIEFLY: Is 1-1 with a 5.09 ERA (13 er in 23.0 ip) over his last five starts...went 1-2 with a 3.86 ERA over his first six starts and was 3-0 with a 0.00 ERA (19.1 ip, 1 r) in three starts in between...the three-game winning streak from July 30 to Aug. 11 was his longest since June 30-July 11, 2013 when he also won three in a row...it fell one short of his career high.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has held the opposition to a .188 (12-for-64) batting average with runners in scoring position...10 of the 11 home runs he has allowed have been solo shots...10 have come at home and seven have been hit by left-handed hitters...has a .172 (20-for-116) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup...has allowed seven of his 11 home runs the second time through the lineup...opponents are hitting .094 (12-for-127) with two strikes...has allowed a .288 (21-for-73) batting average with nine walks (.373 on-base percentage) and six home runs (.603 slugging percentage) to batters leading off an inning.

INNING BY INNING: Has a 2.14 ERA (10 er in 42.0 ip) and .168 (25-for-149) opponents batting average over the first three innings of a game and a 5.35 ERA (21 er in 35.1 ip) and .273 (38-for-139) opponents batting average from the fourth inning on.

THIS AND THAT: The A's have won in each of his six no decisions and are 11-3 (.786) in his starting assignments...has allowed two runs or fewer in eight of his 14 starts...has received one run of support or fewer in six of his 14 starts and his season run support average is 3.72 (32 rs in 77.1 ip).

BEFORE OAKLAND: Began the season at Triple-A Syracuse in the Washington organization and was 4-2 with a 3.40 ERA and .238 opponents batting average in 10 starts with the Chiefs when he was released June 1 (contract opt-out)...signed a minor league deal with the A's June 6 and was assigned to Triple-A Nashville...went 0-1 with a 4.02 ERA and .207 opponents average in three starts with the Sounds and was 4-3 with a 3.53 ERA in 13 minor league starts overall.

16 SEASONS AND 13 TEAMS: Is in his 16th season in the majors with his 13th team (Los Angeles-NL, Tampa Bay, Detroit, Arizona, Chicago-AL, St. Louis, Washington, Chicago-NL, Atlanta, Miami, San Diego, Baltimore)...has tied Octavio Dotel's Major League record for teams played for in a career.

2018 HIGHLIGHTS: Made his A's debut June 25 at Detroit and had a no decision, despite allowing just one run in 6.0 innings...picked up his first win as an Athletic in his second start on June 30 against Cleveland...the A's are the 11th team for which he has won a game...made consecutive starts against San Francisco on July 13 and 20 and took the loss in each outing for his **only** losing streak of the season...earned the 100th win of his career in the A's 10-1 win over Toronto on July 30 in Oakland...became the first pitcher to record his 100th career victory in an A's uniform since Brett Tomko on Sept. 14, 2009 at Texas...combined with Buchter and Pagán on a five-hit shut in the A's 7-0 win at Los Angeles (AL) on August 11...tossed 7.1 innings and allowed three of the hits...it was his **longest** outing since Aug. 3, 2016 vs. Milwaukee (8.0 ip) and his **longest** scoreless outing since July 16, 2011 at Detroit (9.0 ip)...made the 300th start of his career Aug. 28 at Houston and had a no decision in the A's 4-3 win.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 8-6 win over Texas last Saturday in Oakland...the A's scored twice in the bottom of the first but he allowed a lead off home run to Beltre in the second...yielded a two-run double to Mazaara in the third and a lead off home run to Profar in the fourth...was relieved by Kelley following the home run with the A's trailing 4-2.

JACKSON vs. TAMPA BAY: Is 3-3 with a 3.98 ERA (43.0 ip, 36 h, 20 r, 19 er, 20 bb, 33 so, 3 hr) in seven career appearances, including six starts...is 2-2 with a 4.82 ERA (15 er in 28.0 ip) at Tropicana Field and 1-1 with a 2.40 ERA (4 er in 15.0 ip) in three games in his home ballparks...has not faced the Rays since Aug. 16, 2016 when he was the losing pitcher in a 15-1 San Diego loss at Tropicana Field...allowed three runs in the second, four in the third and a Miller solo home run in the fourth...tossed a 149-pitch no-hitter against the Rays June 25, 2010 at Tampa Bay...walked a career-high tying eight and struck out six.

2018 IN THE MINORS: Combined for a 4-3 record and a 3.53 ERA in 13 games, all starts, with Triple-A Syracuse in the Washington organization and Triple-A Nashville in the Oakland farm system...the starts were his most as a minor leaguer since 2006 when he made 13 starts with Triple-A Durham in the Tampa Bay farm system...had no decisions and a 5.09 ERA in four starts in April...then went 4-3 with a 3.02 ERA over his final nine starts...surrendered five home runs in 71.1 innings...allowed a .232 opponents batting average, including .221 (32-for-145) by right-handed hitters compared to .244 (31-for-127) by left-handed hitters...surrendered four of his five home runs to lefties...had a .266 (41-for-154) opponents average with the bases empty compared to .186 (22-for-118) with runners on...three of the five home runs he allowed were solo shots...yielded a .174 (12-for-69) average with runners in scoring position...opponents were 11-for-64 (.172) with eight walks (.264 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning...went 1-for-5 with a double, walk and two strikeouts as a hitter, including 1-for-2 with a double and a walk in three pinch hitting appearances...allowed one run or fewer in seven of his 13 starts.
