ABOUT THE A'S: Earned the win in extra-innings last night and are now 9-2 over the last 11 games...are 35-16 (.686) since the All-Star Break, which is the best record in the majors...are 56-22 (.718) over their last 78 games dating back to June 16, which is the best record in the majors over that span...are 90-58 (.608) overall, which is the fourth best record in the American League and the majors...the 32 games over .500 match the season high (89-57 on Sept. 12)...are 100-62 over the last 162 games dating back to Sept. 16 of last year...are 10-1-2 over the last 13 series and 20-2-3 over the last 25.

THE STANDINGS: The A's are in second place in the American League West and trail first place Houston by 2½ games...trail the New York Yankees by 1½ games for the first AL Wild Card spot (split the season series with the Yankees and trail in the second tiebreaker, which is intradivision record)...are 8½ games ahead of Seattle and nine games ahead of Tampa Bay for the second Wild Card and have a magic number of seven to clinch a playoff spot...were a season-high 11 games back of the second Wild Card at the conclusion of play June 15.

WINS: The A's won their 90th game of the season last night, which are their most wins since going 96-66 in 2013...the 90 wins are a 15-win improvement over last year...is their third 90-win season in the last seven years and their ninth dating back to 2000...only the Yankees (13 including this year), Red Sox (12 including this year) and Cardinals (10) have more 90-win seasons dating back to 2000.

AGAINST THE EAST: The A's conclude their schedule against American League East teams with this three-game series at Tampa Bay...are 21-9 (.700) against the AL East, which is the second best record by any team against the East (Boston, 48-19, .716)...the A's best mark ever against the East is 31-14 (.689) in 2001.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .258 (113-for-438) over their last 13 games with 78 runs scored (6.0 per game)...rank second in the majors in doubles (302) and extra base hits (523), third in home runs (202), slugging percentage (.436), and fifth in runs scored (717) and OPS (.759)...the home runs are sixth most in Athletics history, the extra base hits rank eighth (7th is 527 in 1932, 6th is 540 in 2004) and the doubles are 11th (10th is 303 in 1932, 9th is 305 in 2017, 8th is 307 in 2009, 7th is 310 in 2005).

PITCHING: The A's have a Major League leading 3.22 ERA (166 er in 464.1 ip) since the All-Star Break...overall, rank fourth in the American League in opponents OPS (.690) and on-base percentage (.301) and fifth in ERA (3.74), batting average (.237) and slugging percentage (.389)...rank third in shutouts (13), tied for fourth in fewest walks (431) and fifth in fewest home runs (165)...are second with 80 wild pitches, which is four short of the Athletics record (84 in 2017)...have 1132 strikeouts, which is fifth fewest in the AL but eighth most in Athletics history (7th is 1136 in 2012, 6th is 1160 in 2011)...have used an average of 6.17 pitchers per game in September (74 in 12 games), including nine once and eight three times...used eight pitchers in a nine-inning game a total of two times over the first 50 years in Oakland.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 6-6 with a 5.19 ERA (50 er in 86.2 ip) and .283 (95-for-336) opponents batting average over the last 22 games...have tossed six innings or fewer in all 22 contests, which is the second longest such streak in Athletics history...the record is a 29-game streak from June 29-July 31, 1997...have used an "opener" four times during the streak...starters have 779.0 innings pitched...the fewest in a non-strike season is Athletics history is 858.2 in 1997.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-1 on their penultimate road trip of the regular season, a six-game trip to Baltimore (2-1) and Tampa Bay (three games, 1-0)...went 4-3 on the last trip to Minnesota (3-1) and Houston (1-2) and are 36-17 (.679) on the road dating back to May 14 after starting the year 8-12...are 44-29 (.603) on the road for the season, which is the third best

road record in the majors, compared to 46-29 (.613) at home...have clinched their first winning record on the road since 2013 (44-37)...lead the majors with 120 home runs and an average of 5.45 runs per game on the road (397 runs in 73 games) and rank second and their .266 (685-for-2599) batting average ranks third...the home runs are third most in Athletics history on the road and the 397 runs scored are already the most since 2013 (414)...return home following the game Sunday for the final homestand of the season, a six-game stand against Los Angeles-AL (three games) and Minnesota (three games).

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 29-12 (.707) in one-run games, which is the best record in the majors...are tied for second in fewest losses and rank third in wins...the Athletics record for winning percentage in one-run games is .698 in 1928 (30-13)...are 12-5 (.706) in extra inning games...rank second in the majors in extra inning wins, have the third best record and are tied for third in games (17)...the wins are tied for third most in Oakland history.

LEADING LATE: The A's are 65-0 when leading after seven innings and are the only team in the majors that has not lost when leading after seven...have an Athletics record 80-game winning streak when leading after seven and have not lost since Sept. 2, 2017 at Texas...the last team to go undefeated when leading after seven is the 2012 Orioles (74-0)...the A's (74-0) and Mariners (69-0) are the only teams that have not lost when leading after eight innings...have a 101-game winning streak in those games and have not lost when leading after eight since July 27, 2017 at Toronto.

TEAMWORK: Khris Davis (111 RBI) and Jed Lowrie (90 RBI) are the first Oakland teammates to drive in 200 runs since Frank Thomas (114) and Nick Swisher (95) in 2006...the A's have five players with 20 or more home runs, which ties the Athletics record (1996, 1999, 2000, 2004, 2017)...have 15 pitchers with three or more wins, which are the most three-game winners on one club in Major League history.

ROSTER NOTES: The A's have 38 players on the active roster...have used 53 players, which is one short of the Oakland record of 54 set in 2007 and matched last year...it is tied for sixth most in the majors...have employed 34 pitchers, which is an on-going Athletics record (previous: 30 in 2015) and tied for fourth most in the majors...have used 24 relievers, which ties the Oakland record (2015) and falls two short of the Athletics record (26 in 1955)...have used 14 starters, which is tied for fourth in the majors and tied for second in Oakland history (16 in 1983).

A's vs. RAYS: The A's are 2-3 against the Rays after losing three of four in Oakland at the end of May and earning the win last night at Tropicana Field...have lost seven of their last 11 games against Tampa Bay, six by one run...10 of the last 15 games between the two clubs have been decided by one run...lost the season series last year, 2-5...it was their worst record ever against the Rays (previous: 3-6 in 2008)...have lost the season series in two of the previous three years and are 12-14 against Tampa Bay over the last four years...all-time, the A's are 105-71 (.597) against the Rays, which is their best record against any American League team...are 58-30 in Oakland and 47-41 at Tropicana Field...the mark in the Coliseum is the A's best record against any AL team.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Chapman leads the majors in doubles (23) and extra base hits (38) since the All-Star Break, ranks third in hits (67) and runs (43)...**Khris Davis** leads the Major Leagues with 42 home runs and ranks second with a career high 111 RBI...the home runs rank 10th in Oakland history...**Stephen Piscotty** has homered six times in his last 13 games and now has 24 home runs for the season, which is a career high...**Blake Treinen** leads Major League relievers in ERA (0.85)...has 37 saves, which ranks fourth in the majors and tied for eighth in Oakland history.

OAKLAND A'S 50th ANNIVERSARY MOMENTS

In 1971 the A's score twice in the eighth inning to defeat Chicago 3-2 in the first game of a doubleheader, clinching their first AL West title...in 1990 Dennis Eckersley becomes Oakland's all-time saves leader when he saves his 137th game as an Athletic, breaking Rollie Fingers record of 136.

FOR OPENERS: The A's will use an "opener" for the fifth time this year, all of which have come in September...Liam Hendriks has been the opener in each of the previous four games and he has a 3.86 ERA in those starts...tossed 1.2 innings the first time but exactly 1.0 in each of the last three...the A's are 2-2 in those four games, losing the first two and winning each of the last two.

TODAY'S OPENER: 16 RHP LIAM HENDRIKS (0-1, 5.94 ERA)

Last Outing: 9/12 at Baltimore (ND, 1.0 ip, 1 h)

- Was selected from Triple-A Nashville on Sept. 1 and has appeared in five games, four of which were starts, since his return...is 0-1 with a 3.18 ERA (5.2 ip, 3 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 4 so) in those five games.
- His start on Sept. 1 against Seattle was his first since Sept. 16, 2014 against Chicago (AL)...has made 38 starts in his career.
- Has not faced the Rays this year and is 0-1 with a 3.72 ERA (19.1 ip, 16 h, 8 r, 8 er, 3 bb, 16 so, 4 hr) in 12 games in his career, including two starts...last faced Tampa Bay on July 19, 2017 in Oakland (1.0 ip, 1 so)...his last start was a no decision in a 3-2 Blue Jays win at Toronto on May 28, 2014 (6.0 ip, 3 h, 2 r, 2 er, 0 bb, 5 so, 1 hr)...had a 2-0 lead when he allowed a two-run home run to Myers in the second.
- Was on the A's Opening Day roster and had a 7.36 ERA and .362 opponents batting average in 13 relief appearances when he was designated for assignment June 25 when the A's added Edwin Jackson to the 40-man roster.
- Has a .174 (4-for-23) opponents batting average against left-handed hitters, .364 (16-for-44) against right-handers.
- Opponents are hitting .176 (3-for-17) with runners in scoring position.
- Has a 2.61 ERA (3 er in 10.1 ip) in eight games in Oakland, an 11.37 ERA (8 er in 6.1 ip) in nine games on the road.
- Missed nearly two months of the season when he was on the disabled list from April 14 to June 4 with a strained right groin.
- Was 4-1 with a 2.84 ERA in 23 games, one start, with Nashville...struck out 43 in 25.1 innings (15.28 per nine innings) and walked just four (1.42 per nine innings) while surrendering one home run...did not allow a run in 16 of his final 17 appearances (0.45 ERA).

40 RHP CHRIS BASSITT (2-3, 3.40 ERA)

Last Outing: 9/7 vs. Texas (ND, 3.0 ip, 3 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 3 so)

- Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville Sept. 7 for his seventh stint with the A's this year...has pitched once since his return and it came in relief on Sept. 7 against Texas (3.0 ip, 3 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 3 so, 1 hr)...it was his first relief appearance since May 9, 2015 Seattle.
- Is 2-0 with a 3.09 ERA (8 er in 23.1 ip) in five games, four starts, over his last three stints after going 0-3 with a 3.86 ERA in three starts over his first four.
- Did not pitch in his first two stints (April 20-25 and May 26), made one start in his third (June 9), two in his fourth (June 14-22), three in his fifth (June 27-July 11) and one in his sixth (Aug. 26).
- Has faced Tampa Bay once in his career, a start on Aug. 21, 2015 in Oakland...was the losing pitcher in the A's 2-1 loss (6.2 ip, 6 h, 1 r, 1 r, 2 bb, 3 so, 1.35 ERA).
- Went 5-5 with a 4.30 ERA in 18 games, including 14 starts, with Nashville...struck out 83 batters in 81.2 innings (9.15 per nine innings)...allowed a .271 batting average, including .215 against left-handed hitters compared to .313 against right-handers...went 2-1 with a 1.85 ERA in five games, four starts, in August.

33 RHP DANIEL MENGDEN (7-6, 4.06 ERA)

Last Outing: 9/12 at Baltimore (W, 5.0 ip, 1 bb, 3 so)

- Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville Aug. 27 for his second stint with the A's and is 1-0 with a 1.72 ERA (15.2 ip, 10 h, 4 r, 3 er, 4 bb, 9 so) in four games since his return, all in relief...has tossed four or more innings in three of his appearances and has not allowed a run three times...the relief appearances are the first of his career.
- Was in the A's starting rotation to begin the season and was 6-6 with a 4.47 ERA in 16 starts when he was placed on the disabled list June 27 retroactive to June 24 with a sprained right foot...was reinstated from the DL and optioned to Nashville July 14.
- Was the winning pitcher in his only career start against Tampa Bay and it came earlier this year in Oakland on May 31 in a 7-3 A's win (8.0 ip, 6 h, 3 r, 3 er, 2 bb, 5 so)...shutout the Rays on three hits over the first eight innings before allowing a two-run double to Ramos in the ninth...was relieved by Lucas, who allowed an inherited runner to score.
- Is 7-0 with a 2.04 ERA (15 er in 66.0 ip) and .188 (45-for-239) opponents average in 11 interdivision games and now has a nine-game winning streak in those contests (15 er in 82.0 ip, 1.65 ERA)...has not lost since May 29, 2017 at Cleveland...is 0-6 with a 7.36 ERA (33 er in 40.1 ip) and .308 (52-for-169) opponents batting average in nine games American League West teams.
- Has allowed 14 of his 54 runs in the first inning...has a 7.88 ERA (14 er in 16.0 ip) and .348 (23-for-66) opponents batting average in the first inning, a 3.05 ERA (22 er in 70.0 ip) and .209 (54-for-258) opponents average from the second through fifth innings and a 5.31 ERA (12 er in 21.1 ip) and .238 (20-for-84) opponents average from the sixth inning on
- Has walked 23 batters in 106.1 innings, an average of 1.95 per nine innings...that is 10th lowest in the AL among pitchers with 100 or more innings.

- Is 1-0 with a 2.31 ERA (3 er in 11.2 ip) in three relief appearances in September...is now 4-1 with a 1.74 ERA (9 er in 46.2 ip) in eight games, including five starts, in September and October over the last two years.
- Has walked just three batters to lead off an inning and opponents are hitting .193 (21-for-109) with a .221 on-base percentage in that situation...based on a minimum of 100 innings pitched, the on-base percentage is the lowest mark in the majors while the batting average is fourth lowest in the AL.
- Has seven wins in 20 games this year after combining for five wins in 21 starts over the first two seasons of his career...also has career highs in games (20), games started (16), innings (106.1), hits (97) and home runs allowed (15) and has matched his high in runs (54)...is 10-7 with a 3.44 ERA (54 er in 141.1 ip) over his last 25 games dating back to Sept. 9, 2017...went 2-10 with a 6.86 ERA over the first 16 starts of his career.
- Was 4-1 with a 2.98 ERA in nine games, including eight starts, with Nashville...surrendered just two home runs in 45.1 innings...walked one batter or fewer in each of his nine appearances and issued seven free passes total, an average of 1.39 per nine innings.

47 RHP FRANKIE MONTAS (5-4, 3.96 ERA)

Last Outing: 8/30 vs. Seattle-GS (L, 6.0 ip, 8 h, 7 r, 4 er, 2 bb, 4 so)

- Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville Tuesday for his fourth stint with the A's this year.
- Went 5-2 with a 3.35 ERA in eight starts during his first stint from May 27 to July 9, 0-1 with a 5.79 ERA in two starts during his second stint from July 24 to 29 and 0-1 with a 6.00 ERA in one start during his third stint, which lasted one day on Aug. 30.
- Has never faced Tampa Bay in his career.
- Has allowed 14 of his 34 runs in the first inning for an 8.18 ERA (10 er in 11.0 ip)...has a 3.08 ERA (18 er in 52.2 ip) from the second inning on...has a .367 (18-for-49) opponents batting average in the first inning, .274 (55-for-201) from the second inning on.
- Has allowed 20 of his 27 extra base hits to left-handed hitters and has a .532 slugging percentage against lefties compared to .371 against righties.
- Was 4-5 with a 4.65 ERA in 15 starts, including one complete game, with Nashville...had a .255 opponents batting average, including .189 against left-handed hitters compared to .290 against right-handers...did not pitch following his Aug. 31 option.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Mike Fiers (12-6, 3.29 ERA): Is 5-0 with a 2.72 ERA and .208 opponents batting average in seven starts since he was acquired from the Detroit Tigers on Aug. 6...the five-game winning streak matches Omar Olivares (1999) for the longest to start an Oakland career by an in-season acquisition...the A's have won in each of his seven starting assignments...has a career-high six-game winning streak...is now 8-3 with a 2.63 ERA over his last 19 starts dating back to May 30 and his ERA is the lowest in the American League and sixth lowest in the majors over that span...overall, ranks seventh in fewest walks per nine innings (1.87) and eighth in ERA (3.29)...picked up his career high 12th win of the season in his last start, a 3-2 A's win at Baltimore on Tuesday (6.0 ip, 4 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 7 so, 1 hr)...is 1-1 with a 5.11 ERA (24.2 ip, 26 h, 14 r, 14 er, 6 bb, 15 so, 7 hr) in four career starts against Tampa Bay...has not faced the Rays since Aug. 1, 2017 at Houston (6.1 ip, 8 h, 6 r, 6 er, 3 bb, 2 so).

- The A's bullpen was credited with its 40th win of the season on Friday, adding to their new single season record for most wins by relievers...rank second in the majors in wins (Tampa Bay, 48)...are 40-12 (.769), which is the best winning percentage in the Majors.
- The bullpen is 2-0 with a 0.87 ERA on the current road trip (2 er in 20.2 innings pitched).
- The A's bullpen has compiled a 2.50 ERA (72 er in 259.0 ip) over the last 63 games dating back to July 3.
- Has converted 42-of-55 (76.8%) save opportunities, which is second in the Majors (Texas, 76.9%)...tied for third in the American League in saves.
- Ranks second in the AL in opponents on-base percentage (.294), third in batting average (.221), third in strikeouts (563), second in OPS (.651), third in slugging percentage (.358), third in innings pitched (562.1) and is second in ERA (3.15)
- Has allowed 74-of-214 (34.6%) inherited runners to score, which is the fourth highest percentage in the Majors.
