## OAKLAND ATHLETICS (90-59) VS. TAMPA BAY RAYS (81-66)

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Fell to Rays last night by a score of 7-5 and are now 9-3 over the last 12 games...are 35-17 (.673) since the All-Star Break, which is the best record in the majors...are 56-23 (.709) over their last 79 games dating back to June 16, which is the best record in the majors over that span...are 90-59 (.604) overall, which is the fourth best record in the American League and the majors...the 31 games over .500 are one short of the season high (32, 90-58 on Sept. 14 & 89-57 on Sept. 12)...are 99-63 over the last 162 games dating back to Sept. 18 of last year...are 10-1-2 over the last 13 series and 20-2-3 over the last 25.

**THE STANDINGS:** The A's are in second place in the American League West and trail first place Houston by 3½ games...trail the New York Yankees by 1½ games for the first AL Wild Card spot (split the season series with the Yankees and trail in the second tiebreaker, which is intradivision record)...are 7½ games ahead of Seattle and eight games ahead of Tampa Bay for the second Wild Card and have a magic number of seven to clinch a playoff spot...were a season-high 11 games back of the second Wild Card at the conclusion of play June 15.

**WINS:** The A's have 90 wins so far this season, which are their most wins since going 96-66 in 2013...the 90 wins are a 15-win improvement over last year...is their third 90-win season in the last seven years and their ninth dating back to 2000...only the Yankees (13 including this year), Red Sox (12 including this year) and Cardinals (10) have more 90-win seasons dating back to 2000.

**AGAINST THE EAST:** The A's conclude their schedule against American League East teams with today's matchup at Tampa Bay...are 21-10 (.677) against the AL East, which is the second best record by any team against the East (Boston, 48-19, .716)...the A's best mark ever against the East is 31-14 (.689) in 2001.

**OFFENSE:** The A's are batting .265 (126-for-476) over their last 14 games with 83 runs scored (5.93 per game)...rank second in the majors in doubles (303) and extra base hits (526), third in home runs (204) and slugging percentage (.437), and fifth in runs scored (722) and OPS (.760)...the home runs are sixth most in Athletics history, the extra base hits rank eighth (7th is 527 in 1932, 6th is 540 in 2004) and the doubles are tied for 10th (303 in 1932, 9th is 305 in 2017, 8th is 307 in 2009, 7th is 310 in 2005).

**PITCHING:** The A's have a Major League leading 3.30 ERA (173 er in 472.1 ip) since the All-Star Break...overall, rank fourth in the American League in opponents OPS (.692) and on-base percentage (.302), and fifth in ERA (3.76), batting average (.237) and slugging percentage (.390)...rank third in shutouts (13), tied for fourth in fewest walks (436) and fifth in fewest home runs (167)...are third with 81 wild pitches, which is three short of the Athletics record (84 in 2017)...have 1138 strikeouts, which is fifth fewest in the AL but seventh most in Athletics history (6th is 1160 in 2011)...have used an average of 6.23 pitchers per game in September (81 in 13 games), including nine once and eight three times...used eight pitchers in a nine-inning game a total of two times over the first 50 years in Oakland.

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers are 6-6 with a 5.13 ERA (50 er in 87.2 ip) and .282 (96-for-340) opponents batting average over the last 23 games dating back to August 22 at home against Texas...have tossed six innings or fewer in all 23 contests, which is the second longest such streak in Athletics history...the record is a 29-game streak from June 29-July 31, 1997...have used an "opener" five times during the streak...starters have 780.0 innings pitched...the fewest in a non-strike season is Athletics history is 858.2 in 1997.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 3-2 on their penultimate road trip of the regular season, a six-game trip to Baltimore (2-1) and Tampa Bay (three games, 1-1)...went 4-3 on the last trip to Minnesota (3-1) and Houston (1-2) and are 36-18 (.667) on the road dating back to May 14 after starting the year 8-12...are 44-30 (.595) on the road for the season, which is the fourth best

road record in the majors, compared to 46-29 (.613) at home...have clinched their first winning record on the road since 2013 (44-37)...lead the majors with 122 home runs and an average of 5.43 runs per game on the road (402 runs in 74 games) which ranks second, and their .265 (698-for-2637) batting average also ranks second...the home runs are third most in Athletics history on the road and the 397 runs scored are already the most since 2013 (414)...return home following the game Sunday for the final homestand of the season, a six-game stand against Los Angeles-AL (three games) and Minnesota (three games).

**ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS:** The A's are 29-12 (.707) in one-run games, which is the best record in the majors...are tied for second in fewest losses and rank third in wins...the Athletics record for winning percentage in one-run games is .698 in 1928 (30-13)...are 12-5 (.706) in extra inning games...rank second in the majors in extra inning wins, have the third best record and are tied for third in games (17)...the wins are tied for third most in Oakland history.

**LEADING LATE:** The A's are 65-0 when leading after seven innings and are the only team in the majors that has not lost when leading after seven...have an Athletics record 80-game winning streak when leading after seven and have not lost since Sept. 2, 2017 at Texas...the last team to go undefeated when leading after seven is the 2012 Orioles (74-0)...the A's (74-0) and Mariners (69-0) are the only teams that have not lost when leading after eight innings...have a 101-game winning streak in those games and have not lost when leading after eight since July 27, 2017 at Toronto.

**TEAMWORK:** Khris Davis (111 RBI) and Jed Lowrie (91 RBI) are the first Oakland teammates to drive in 200 runs since Frank Thomas (114) and Nick Swisher (95) in 2006...the A's have five players with 20 or more home runs, which ties the Athletics record (1996, 1999, 2000, 2004, 2017)...have 15 pitchers with three or more wins, which are the most three-game winners on one club in Major League history.

**ROSTER NOTES:** The A's have 38 players on the active roster...have used 53 players, which is one short of the Oakland record of 54 set in 2007 and matched last year...it is tied for sixth most in the majors...have employed 34 pitchers, which is an on-going Athletics record (previous: 30 in 2015) and tied for fourth most in the majors...have used 24 relievers, which ties the Oakland record (2015) and falls two short of the Athletics record (26 in 1955)...have used 14 starters, which is tied for fourth in the majors and tied for second in Oakland history (16 in 1983).

**A's vs. RAYS:** The A's are 2-4 against the Rays after losing three of four in Oakland at the end of May and splitting the first two games of this series at Tropicana Field...have lost eight of their last 12 games against Tampa Bay, six by one run...10 of the last 16 games between the two clubs have been decided by one run...lost the season series last year, 2-5...it was their worst record ever against the Rays (previous: 3-6 in 2008)...have lost the season series in two of the previous three years and are 12-15 against Tampa Bay over the last four years...all-time, the A's are 105-72 (.593) against the Rays, which is their best record against any American League team...are 58-30 in Oakland and 47-42 at Tropicana Field...the mark in the Coliseum is the A's best record against any AL team.

### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Matt Chapman** leads the majors in doubles (23) and extra base hits (39) since the All-Star Break, ranks tied for second in hits (70) and runs (44)...for the year, ranks sixth in OPS (.889), tied for fifth in doubles (40), and tied for ninth in runs scored...**Khris Davis** leads the Major Leagues with 42 home runs and ranks second with a career high 111 RBI...the home runs rank 10th in Oakland history...**Stephen Piscotty** has homered six times in his last 14 games and now has 24 home runs for the season, which is a career high...**Blake Treinen** leads Major League relievers in ERA (0.85)...has 37 saves, which ranks fourth in the majors and tied for eighth in Oakland history.

# TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Mike Fiers (12-6, 3.29 ERA)

**WITH THE A'S:** Is 5-0 with a 2.72 ERA (12 er in 39.2 ip) and .208 (30-for-144) opponents batting average in seven starts since he was acquired from the Detroit Tigers on Aug. 6 for two players to be named later (one was Nolan Blackwood on Aug. 18) or cash considerations...the five-game winning streak matches Omar Olivares (1999) for the longest to start an Oakland career by an in-season acquisition...the A's have won in each of his seven starting assignments and his teams are 20-8 (.714) in his starting assignment this year...went 7-6 with a 3.48 ERA and .258 opponents average in 21 starts with the Tigers.

**BRIEFLY:** Picked up his career-high 12th win of the season in his last start, which surpasses his previous high of 11 with Houston in 2016...is now 8-3 with a 2.63 ERA (32 er in 109.2 ip) over his last 19 starts dating back to May 30 after going 4-3 with a 4.78 ERA over his first nine starts...his ERA dating back to May 30 is the lowest in the American League and sixth lowest in the majors.

**SIX-GAME WINNING STREAK SINCE THE BREAK:** Is 6-0 with a 2.50 ERA (15 er in 54.0 ip) and .220 (44-for-200) opponents batting average in 10 starts since the All-Star Break...lost his final start before the break and the six-game winning streak is a career high...five of the wins have come with Oakland, which matches the A's season high...is tied for second in the AL in wins since the break...was 6-6 with a 3.70 ERA and .259 opponents batting average in 18 starts before the break.

**AMONG THE LEADERS:** Ranks seventh in fewest walks per nine innings (1.87) and eighth in ERA (3.29)...also ranks second in fewest pitches per game (88.3), fifth in most home runs (28) and ninth in fewest pitches per inning (15.6).

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has walked just five batters to lead off an inning...has issued 23 of his 33 walks to left-handed hitters...20 of the 28 home runs he has allowed have been solo shots...has held the opponents three hitter in the batting order to a .174 (12-for-69) average.

**HOME AND AWAY:** Is 3-0 with a 3.21 ERA (10 er in 28.0 ip) in five starts in the Coliseum and 5-2 with a 2.77 ERA in 12 starts at Comerica Park...is a combined 8-2 with a 2.90 ERA (31 er in 96.1 ip) in 17 starts at home compared to 4-4 with a 3.90 ERA (27 er in 62.1 ip) in 11 starts on the road...is tied for seventh in the American League in wins at home, while he ranks seventh in home ERA.

**DAYS REST:** Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 5-3 with a 2.74 ERA (21 er in 69.0 ip) in 12 starts on four days rest compared to 7-3 with a 3.71 ERA (37 er in 89.2 ip) in 16 starts on five days rest or more.

**THIS AND THAT:** Has allowed one run or fewer in 13 of his 28 starts and walked one batter or fewer 21 times...has a 2.94 ERA (44 er in 134.2 ip) over the first five innings of a game compared to 5.25 (14 er in 24.0 ip) from the sixth inning on...has allowed more home runs (8) than walks (7) in his seven starts with the A's.

**2018 HIGHLIGHTS:** Began the season on the 10-day disabled list with a right lumbar strain...was reinstated April 8 and made his Tigers debut that day at Chicago (AL)...combined with four relievers on a three-hit shutout in the Detroit's 1-0 win...tossed 6.0 innings and allowed all three of the hits...also struck out six to become the third pitcher in club history to throw six or more innings, allow no runs and strike out six or more in his Tigers debut, joining Alex Main and Joe Niekro...yielded a career-high tying 10 hits in 5.1 innings April 21 against Kansas City but picked up the win in a 12-4 Tigers victory...finished April with a 2-2 record and a 3.91 ERA in four starts...then went 2-1 with a 4.83 ERA in six starts in May...put together consecutive wins for the only time as a Tiger on May 8 at Texas and May 14 against Cleveland...was named Detroit's Pitcher of the Month for June after posting a 1-2 record and a 3.30 ERA and .239 opponents batting average in five starts...allowed one run in three consecutive starts on June 27 against Oakland (7.0 ip), July 2 at Toronto (8.0 ip) and July 7 against Texas (6.0 ip)...had a loss, a no decision and a win respectively in those three starts...combined with Wilson and Greene on an eight-hit shutout in a 5-0 win over Boston on July 21 for his final win as a Tiger...tossed 6.1 innings and allowed seven of the hits...went 2-1 with a 2.23 ERA in five starts in July...the ERA was the seventh lowest in the American League in the month and his .232 on-base percentage was 10th best...was traded to Oakland Aug. 6 and had a no decision in his first start on Aug. 8 against Los Angeles (NL)...struck out a season-high tying eight batters in 5.1 innings...left with a 2-1 lead but the bullpen blew the save...it was the third time this year the bullpen blew a save in one of his starts (June 9 vs. Cleveland and July 2 at Toronto)...picked up his first win as an Athletic in the A's 3-2 win over Seattle on Aug. 14 in Oakland...combined with Buchter and Kelley on a three-hit shutout in the A's 9-0 win over Seattle on Texas on Aug. 20 in Oakland...tossed seven of the innings and allowed one of the hits...it

was his longest scoreless outing since his Aug. 21, 2015 no-hitter against the Dodgers...went 3-0 with a 2.73 ERA and .227 opponents batting average in six starts in the month of August...tied for sixth in the American League in wins.

**LAST START:** He won his second consecutive start in the A's 3-2 win at Baltimore last Tuesday...shutout the Orioles on three hits and a walk over the first five innings...had a 3-0 lead when he allowed a one-out solo home run to Villar in the sixth inning...it was the only run he would allow in six innings of work.

## ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

### TEAM

40-13, 3.22 ERA (204 er in 569.1 ip)  
Saves/Opportunities: 43-for-56 (76.8%)

- The A's bullpen was credited with its 40th win of the season on Friday, adding to their new single season record for most wins by relievers...rank second in the majors in wins (Tampa Bay, 48)...are 40-13 (.755), which is the second best winning percentage in the Majors (Boston, .766).
- The bullpen allowed seven runs last night after allowing two runs combined in their previous four games...it was the second highest output of earned runs allowed on the season (12 earned runs on 7/1 at Cleveland).
- The A's bullpen has compiled a 2.67 ERA (79 er in 266.0 ip) over the last 64 games dating back to July 3.
- Is 2-0 with a 3.22 ERA (204 er in 569.1 ip) over the last 64 games dating back to July 3.
- Has converted 42-of-55 (76.8%) save opportunities, which is second in the Majors (Texas, 77.4%)...tied for third in the American League in saves.
- Ranks second in the AL in opponents on-base percentage (.295), third in batting average (.221), third in strikeouts (568), third in OPS (.655), third in slugging percentage (.360), third in innings pitched (569.1) and is second in ERA (3.22)
