ABOUT THE A'S: The A's have a tragic number of one in the race for hosting the Wild Card game (would lose the tiebreaker to Yankees)...have won six of the last eight games but are 7-6 over the last 13 games...are 41-21 (.661) since the All-Star Break, which is the best record in the majors...are 62-27 (.697) over their last 89 games dating back to June 16, which is the best record in the majors over that span...are 96-63 (.604) overall, which is the fourth best record in the American League and the majors...are 13-2-2 over the last 17 series and 23-3-3 over the last 29...are 37-36 (.507) against the AL West, 59-27 (.686) against all other teams.

WINS: The A's won their 96th game of the season Wednesday, which is tied for eighth most in Oakland history and is the most since 2013 (96-66)...have not won more than 96 games since going 103-59 in 2002...the 96 wins are a 21-win improvement over last year, which is the third biggest turnaround in Oakland history...had a 23-win improvement from 1987 (81) to 1988 (104) and a 29-win improvement from 1979 (54) to 1980 (83).

IN SEPTEMBER: The A's are 14-8 (.636) in September, which is the third best record in the American League...have clinched a winning record for the month and have posted a winning record in each month this year...this is the sixth time in Oakland history the A's have posted a winning record in each month (1971, 1972, 1990, 2003, 2013)...are batting .269 (214-for-796) with a Major League leading 153 runs scored this month...also rank second in slugging (.466) and OPS (.816), third in home runs (37) and batting and fourth in on-base percentage (.350)...the runs scored are the most by the A's in any month since they had 162 in September of 2013.

OFFENSE: The A's have set an Athletics franchise record with 560 extra base hits, breaking the mark of 555 set in 2001...rank second in the majors in doubles (317) and extra base hits, third in home runs (223), runs (799) and slugging percentage (.440) and fourth in OPS (.766)...the home runs are fifth most in Athletics history (243 in 1996, 239 in 2000, 235 in 1999, 234 in 2017) and the doubles are tied for fifth (336 in 2004, 334 in 2001, 323 in 1928, 319 in 1930, 317 in 2003)...the runs are ninth most in Oakland history (t-7th is 800 in 1988 and 2002, 6th is 804 in 1998, 5th is 806 in 1987, 4th is 861 in 1996)...have just six sacrifice hits, which is second fewest in Major League history (Toronto, 5 in 2018).

PITCHING: The A's have a 3.45 ERA (216 er in 563.2 ip) since the All-Star Break, which is second lowest in the American League (CLE, 3.35)...overall, rank fourth in the AL in opponents on-base percentage (.301) and OPS (.693), fifth in batting (.237) and slugging (.391) and sixth in ERA (3.79)...are tied for second in shutouts (14), rank fourth in fewest walks (464) and extra base hits (461) and fifth in fewest home runs (180)...have 1213 strikeouts, which is fifth fewest in the AL but second most in Athletics history...need 32 in the final three games to break the record of 1244 set in 2014...have already set an Athletics record with 85 wild pitches, which is tied for second in the AL and tied for seventh in AL history.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have tossed fewer than five innings in 19 of the last 29 games and are 6-6 with a 5.05 ERA (60 er in 107.0 ip) over that span...have 819.1 innings pitched for the season, which is fifth fewest in the American League and an Athletics record for fewest innings pitched by starters in a non-strike season...the previous mark was 858.2 in 1997...have 11 different pitchers with seven or more starts, which is tied for the most in Major League history.

HOME AND AWAY SPLITS: The A's are batting .265 (737-for-2785) with 132 home runs and an average of 5.51 runs per game on the road (430 runs in 78 games), compared to .241 with 91 home runs and an average of 4.56 runs per game at home...lead the majors in home runs and runs per game on the road and rank second in batting...the 132 road home runs are an Athletics record, four short of the American League record and six short of the Major League record...the A's .468 slugging percentage is currently an Athletics road record (.458 in 2000)...have 287 extra base hits, which is 13 short of the A's record of 300 in 2001...have 430 runs scored, which is their most on the road since 2001 (461).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 46-32 (.590) on the road, which is tied for the third best road record in the majors...the wins are the A's most on the road since going 49-32 in 2002...are 50-31 (.617) at home...are 2-1 on their final road trip of the season, a six-game trip to Seattle (2-1) and Los Angeles-AL (three games)...are 38-20 (.655) on the road dating back to May 14 after starting the year 8-12...were 32-11 (.744) over the final 43 home games after starting the year 18-20 in the Coliseum.

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 31-13 (.705) in one-run games, which is the best record in the majors...the Athletics record for winning percentage in one-run games is .698 in 1928 (30-13) and the Oakland record is .696 in 2002 (32-14)...the 31 one-run wins are sixth most in Athletics history and are two short of the record of 33 set in 2004...are 13-6 (.684) in extra inning games, which is the second best record in the majors to Seattle (14-1)...the wins are one short of the Athletics record of 14, set in 1998...are 25-10 (.714) in games decided in the last at bat, which is the best record in the majors...the wins are the most in the majors and are one short of the Oakland record of 26 set in 2004.

THE LATE INNINGS: The A's are 69-1 when leading after seven innings and 78-1 when leading after eight...no other team has lost fewer than three games when leading after seven innings and only the Mariners have fewer losses when leading after eight...are tied for the Major League lead in wins when trailing after seven innings (11) and tied for second in wins when trailing after eight (5)...have scored 112 runs in the eighth inning, which is second most in the majors and the most by an A's team since the 1933 Philadelphia A's had 128...also rank second in the majors with 274 runs in the seventh inning or later, which is three short of the Oakland record of 277 in 2000.

THE PLAYOFFS: The A's clinched their third American League Wild Card Monday night, their second in the two wild card era...this will be the A's fourth postseason berth in the last seven years and their ninth in the last 19 seasons...over the last seven years, only the Dodgers (5) have more than four postseason appearances (Cardinals could also get their fifth) and over the last 19 seasons only the Yankees (15), Cardinals (12), Red Sox (10) and Braves (10) have more than nine (Dodgers could also get their 10th)...this is the A's 27th postseason appearance all-time, a total surpassed only by the Yankees (54), Dodgers (31) and Cardinals (28).

A's vs. ANGELS: The season series is even at eight games each...the A's went 5-5 in Oakland and are 3-3 in Anaheim...have scored 103 runs, which is second most in Athletics history against the Angels to the 104 by the Kansas City A's in 1961...have lost each of the previous four season series and are 39-53 (.424) against Los Angeles over the last five years...this marks the first time the Athletics franchise (Kansas City and Oakland) has lost four straight season series to the Angels...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 436-374 against the Angels...that includes 228-177 in Oakland and 208-197 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 485-451 against the Angels.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Chapman leads the majors with an Oakland record 25 doubles since the All-Star Break and ranks second with an Oakland record tying 42 extra base hits...**Khris Davis** has a career-high and Major League leading 47 home runs, which is tied for third in Oakland history and tied for fifth in Athletics history...now has 132 career home runs in an A's uniform, which ties Terry Steinbach for 10th most in Oakland history...has an Athletics record 26 home runs since the All-Star Break...has a career-high 121 RBI, which ranks second in the majors and sixth in Oakland history...**Blake Treinen** has a 0.79 ERA, which leads all relievers and is the lowest in ML history among pitchers with 75 or more innings pitched...has 98 strikeouts and has a chance to become the first pitcher in Major League history to save 30 games, compile an ERA under 1.00 and strikeout 100 batters.

OAKLAND A'S 50th ANNIVERSARY MOMENTS

In **1971** the A's win the fastest game in Oakland history 2-1 as the A's defeat the Royals in 1 hour and 35 minutes...in **1975** Vida Blue, Glenn Abbott, Paul Lindblad and Rollie Fingers combine to no-hit the California Angels, 5-0...in **1990** Dennis Eckersley breaks his own club record when he saves his 46th game of the season...in **1995** Terry Steinbach collects his 1000th career hit at California to become the seventh Oakland Athletic to reach the 1000 mark...in **1996**, in his final at bat as an Athletic, Terry Steinbach hits his 35th home run of the season...it is his 34th as a catcher which breaks Carlton Fisk's American League record for home runs by a catcher.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Mike Fiers (12-7, 3.31 ERA)

WITH THE A'S: Is 5-1 with a 2.90 ERA (16 er in 49.2 ip) and .211 (38-for-180) opponents batting average in nine starts since he was acquired from the Detroit Tigers on Aug. 6 for two players to be named later (minor league pitchers Nolan Blackwood on Aug. 18 and Logan Shore on Sept. 19)...won each of his first five decisions, matching Omar Olivares (1999) for the longest winning streak to start an Oakland career by an in-season acquisition...the A's are 8-1 (.889) in his starting assignments and his teams are 21-9 (.700)...went 7-6 with a 3.48 ERA and .258 opponents average in 21 starts with the Tigers.

BRIEFLY: Is scheduled to make his 31st start of the season today, which surpasses his career high of 30 from 2015 and 2016...also has a career-high 12 wins...his 30 home runs are two short of his high of 32 in 2017 and his 168.2 innings pitched are tied for second most to his high of 180.1 in 2015...is now 8-4 with a 2.71 ERA (36 er in 119.2 ip) over his last 21 starts dating back to May 30 after going 4-3 with a 4.78 ERA over his first nine starts...his ERA dating back to May 30 is the lowest in the American League and eighth lowest in the majors.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks second in the American League in opponents batting average with runners in scoring position (.158), seventh in fewest walks per nine innings (1.97) and eighth in ERA (3.31)...has the fewest pitches per game (87.7), has the fifth most home runs (30) and is eighth in fewest pitches per inning (15.6).

BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK: Is 6-1 with a 2.67 ERA (19 er in 64.0 ip) and .220 (52-for-236) opponents batting average in 12 starts since the All-Star Break...ranks fourth in the American League in ERA since the break...was 6-6 with a 3.70 ERA and .259 opponents batting average in 18 starts before the break.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has walked just five batters to lead off an inning...has issued 26 of his 37 walks to left-handed hitters...21 of the 30 home runs he has allowed have been solo shots...has held the opponents three hitter in the batting order to a .162 (12-for-74) average, which is third lowest in the American League.

HOME AND AWAY: Went 3-0 with a 2.91 ERA (11 er in 34.0 ip) in six starts in the Coliseum and 5-2 with a 2.77 ERA in 12 starts at Comerica Park...is a combined 8-2 with a 2.81 ERA (32 er in 102.1 ip) in 18 starts at home compared to 4-5 with a 4.07 ERA (30 er in 66.1 ip) in 12 starts on the road...ranks fifth in the American League in home ERA and tied for eighth in home wins.

WINNING STREAK SNAPPED: Had his winning streak snapped at a career-high six games Sept. 16 at Tampa Bay...compiled a 2.50 ERA and .220 opponents batting average during the winning streak, which spanned 10 starts from July 21 to Sept. 11.

THIS AND THAT: Has allowed one run or fewer in five of his nine starts with the A's and 14 of his 30 starts overall...has walked one batter or fewer 22 times...has a 3.01 ERA (48 er in 143.2 ip) over the first five innings of a game compared to 5.04 (14 er in 25.0 ip) from the sixth inning on.

2018 HIGHLIGHTS: Began the season on the 10-day disabled list with a right lumbar strain...was reinstated April 8 and made his Tigers debut that day at Chicago (AL)...combined with four relievers on a three-hit shutout in the Detroit's 1-0 win...tossed 6.0 innings and allowed all three of the hits...yielded a career-high tying 10 hits in 5.1 innings April 21 against Kansas City but picked up the win in a 12-4 Tigers victory...finished April with a 2-2 record and a 3.91 ERA in four starts...then went 2-1 with a 4.83 ERA in six starts in May...put together consecutive wins for the only time as a Tiger on May 8 at Texas and May 14 against Cleveland...was named Detroit's Pitcher of the Month for June after posting a 1-2 record and a 3.30 ERA and .239 opponents batting average in five starts...allowed one run in three consecutive starts on June 27 against Oakland (7.0 ip), July 2 at Toronto (8.0 ip) and July 7 against Texas (6.0 ip)...had a loss, a no decision and a win respectively in those three starts...combined with Wilson and Greene on an eight-hit shutout in a 5-0 win over Boston on July 21 for his final win as a Tiger...tossed 6.1 innings and allowed seven of the hits...went 2-1 with a 2.23 ERA in five starts in July...the ERA was the seventh lowest in the American League in the month and his .232 on-base percentage was 10th best...was traded to Oakland Aug. 6 and had a no decision in his first start on Aug. 8 against Los Angeles (NL)...struck out a season-high tying eight batters in 5.1 innings...left with a 2-1 lead but the bullpen blew the save...it was one of four times the bullpen blew a save in one of his starts (June 9 vs. Cleveland, July 2 at Toronto, Sept. 22 vs. Minnesota)...picked up his first win as an Athletic in the A's 3-2 win over Seattle on Aug. 14 in Oakland...combined with Buchter and Kelley on a three-hit shutout in the A's 9-0 win over Seattle on Texas on Aug. 20 in Oakland...tossed seven of the innings and allowed one of the hits...it was his longest scoreless outing since his Aug. 21, 2015 no-hitter against the Dodgers...went 3-0 with

a 2.73 ERA and .227 opponents batting average in six starts in the month of August...tied for sixth in the American League in wins.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 3-2 win over Minnesota last Saturday in Oakland...allowed his only run in six innings of work in the third inning when Astudillo doubled, went to third on a Petit single and scored on a Mauer sacrifice fly...the A's scored twice in the fifth to take a 2-1 lead and he was relieved by Familia to start the seventh...Familia allowed a run for the blown save before Oakland won the game on a walk-off wild pitch in the ninth.

FIERS vs. LOS ANGELES: Is 3-3 with a 5.16 ERA (52.1 ip, 54 h, 31 r, 30 er, 16 bb, 41 so, 10 hr) in nine career appearances, all starts...is 1-2 with a 9.78 ERA (21 er in 19.1 ip) in four starts in Angel Stadium and 2-1 with a 2.45 ERA (9 er in 33.0 ip) in five starts in his home ballparks...had a no decision in his only start this year, a 6-1 Detroit win on May 30 at Comerica Park...the Tigers scored once in the first and he allowed a RBI single to Pujols in the third...was relieved by Coleman with two outs in the sixth inning and the scored tied 1-1 and the Tigers scored five times in the bottom of the sixth for the win.

RHP Trevor Cahill (6-4, 3.91 ERA): Is 6-4 with a 3.91 ERA in 20 starts...the wins and starts are his most since 2013 with Arizona (8 wins, 25 starts)...his innings pitched (106.0) and strikeouts (98) are his most since 2014 with the Diamondbacks (110.2 ip, 105 so)...is 1-2 with a 7.45 ERA and .320 opponents batting average over his last five starts...has tossed five innings or fewer in all five starts...went 5-1 with a 1.84 ERA and .179 opponents batting average in 11 starts at home and is 1-3 with a 7.02 ERA and .301 opponents average in nine starts on the road...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 5-1 A's loss to Minnesota last Sunday in Oakland (3.1 ip, 5 h, 5 r, 3 er, 5 so, 1 hr)...is 5-3 with a 2.44 ERA (70.0 ip, 58 h, 22 r, 19 er, 33 bb, 40 so, 5 hr) in 12 career appearances, including 11 starts, against Los Angeles...had a no decision in his only start this year, an 8-7 A's win at Anaheim on Aug. 12 (4.2 ip, 7 h, 4 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 3 so).
