# OAKLAND ATHLETICS (96-64) VS. LOS ANGELES ANGELS (79-81)

SATURDAY, SEPTEMBER 29, 2018 — ANGELS STADIUM — 6:07 P.M. PDT RHP LIAM HENDRIKS (0-1, 4.30) VS. LHP TYLER SKAGGS (8-9, 3.91) NBCSCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME)

**ABOUT THE A'S:** The A's will face New York in the Wild Card game at Yankee Stadium on Wednesday...have won six of the last nine games but are 7-7 over the last 14 games...are 41-22 (.651) since the All-Star Break, which is the best record in the majors...are 62-28 (.689) over their last 90 games dating back to June 16, which is the best record in the majors over that span...are 96-63 (.600) overall, which is the fourth bact record in the American Lagrage and

that span...are 96-63 (.600) overall, which is the fourth best record in the American League and the majors...are 13-2-2 over the last 17 series and 23-3-3 over the last 29...are 37-37 (.500) against the AL West, 59-27 (.686) against all other teams.

**WINS:** The A's won their 96th game of the season Wednesday, which is tied for eighth most in Oakland history and is the most since 2013 (96-66)...have not won more than 96 games since going 103-59 in 2002...the 96 wins are a 21-win improvement over last year, which is the third biggest turnaround in Oakland history...had a 23-win improvement from 1987 (81) to 1988 (104) and a 29-win improvement from 1979 (54) to 1980 (83).

*ELITE COMPANY*: Matt Chapman needs one run scored to reach the century mark this season...if he scores again in the final two games, it'll be just the 7th season in Athletics history that a player collected 100+ runs, 40+ doubles and 20+ home runs...he would join Jason Giambi (109 R, 47 2B, 38 HR in 2001), Wally Moses (113 R, 48 2B, 25 HR in 1937), Bob Johnson (103 R, 44 2B, 21 HR in 1933) and Al Simmons (3x, 152 R, 41 2B, 36 HR in 1930...114 R, 41 2B, 34 HR in 1929...122 R, 43 2B, 24 HR in 1925)...Chapman would join Cleveland's Francisco Lindor, St. Louis' Matt Carpenter, Boston's Mookie Betts and Houston's Alex Bregman as players to accomplish the feat this season.

**RUN THIS WAY:** Matt Chapman (99) and Khris Davis (97) have a chance to be the first pair of Athletics teammates to each reach the century mark in runs scored since 2001 when Jason Giambi (109), Johnny Damon (108) and Miguel Tejada (107) did so...the only AL teams this season with multiple 100+ run teammates are Boston (3), Cleveland (2) and Houston (2).

**IN SEPTEMBER:** The A's are 15-9 (.625) in September, which is the third best record in the American League...have clinched a winning record for the month and have posted a winning record in each month this year...this is the sixth time in Oakland history the A's have posted a winning record in each month (1971, 1972, 1990, 2003, 2013)...are batting .265 (219-for-827) with a Major League leading 158 runs scored this month...also rank fourth in slugging (.456) and OPS (.805), third in home runs (37) and third in on-base percentage (.350)...the runs scored are the most by the A's in any month since they had 162 in September of 2013.

*OFFENSE:* The A's have set an Athletics franchise record with 561 extra base hits, breaking the mark of 555 set in 2001...rank tied for second in the majors in doubles (318), 2nd in extra base hits, third in home runs (223), fourth in runs (804), third in slugging percentage (.439) and fifth in OPS (.756)...the home runs are fifth most in Athletics history (243 in 1996, 239 in 2000, 235 in 1999, 234 in 2017) and the doubles are fifth (336 in 2004, 334 in 2001, 323 in 1928, 319 in 1930)...the runs are tied for 6th most in Oakland history (6th is 804 in 1998, 5th is 806 in 1987, 4th is 861 in 1996).

**PITCHING:** The A's have a 3.535 ERA (224 er in 571.2 ip) since the All-Star Break, which is third lowest in the American League (CLE, 3.39 & HOU, 3.41)... overall, rank fourth in the AL in opponents on-base percentage (.302) and OPS (.691), fifth in batting (.237) and slugging (.393) and sixth in ERA (3.82)... are tied for second in shutouts (14), rank fourth in fewest walks (468) and extra base hits (467) and fifth in fewest home runs (182)...have 1219 strikeouts, which is fifth fewest in the AL but second most in Athletics history... need 25 in the final two games to tie the record of 1244 set in 2014...have already set an Athletics record with 85 wild pitches, which is third in the AL and tied for eighth in AL history.

HOME AND AWAY SPLITS: The A's are batting .263 (742-for-2816) with 132 home runs and an average of 5.51 runs per game on the road (435 runs in 79 games), compared to .241 with 91 home runs and an average of 4.56 runs per game at home...lead the majors in home runs and runs per game on the road and rank second in batting...the 132 road home runs are an Athletics record, four short of the American League record and six short of the Major League re-

cord...the A's .464 slugging percentage is currently an Athletics road record (.458 in 2000)...have 288 extra base hits, which is 12 short of A's record of 300 in 2001...have 435 runs scored, their most on the road since 2001 (461).

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 46-33 (.582) on the road, which is T4th best road record in the majors...the wins are the A's most on the road since going 49-32 in 2002...are 50-31 (.617) at home...are 2-2 on their final road trip of season, a six-game trip to Seattle (2-1) & Los Angeles-AL (0-1)...are 38-21 (.644) on road dating back to May 14 after starting the year 8-12...were 32-11 (.744) over final 43 home games after starting year 18-20 at home.

**ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS:** The A's are 31-13 (.705) in onerun games, which is the best record in the majors...the Athletics record for winning percentage in one-run games is .698 in 1928 (30-13) and the Oakland record is .696 in 2002 (32-14)...the 31 one-run wins are sixth most in Athletics history and are two short of the record of 33 set in 2004...are 13-6 (.684) in extra inning games, which is the second best record in the majors to Seattle (14-1)...the wins are one short of the Athletics record of 14, set in 1998...are 25-10 (.714) in games decided in the last at bat, which is the best record in the majors...the wins are the most in the majors and are one short of the Oakland record of 26 set in 2004.

**THE LATE INNINGS:** The A's are 69-1 when leading after seven innings and 78-1 when leading after eight...no other team has lost fewer than three games when leading after seven innings and only the Mariners have fewer losses when leading after eight...are tied for the Major League lead in wins when trailing after seven innings (11) and tied for second in wins when trailing after eight (5)...have scored 117 runs in the eighth inning, which is second most in the majors and the most by an A's team since the 1933 Philadelphia A's had 128...also rank second in the majors with 279 runs in the seventh inning or later, which bests the previous Oakland record of 277 in 2000.

**THE PLAYOFFS:** The A's clinched their third American League Wild Card Monday night, their second in the two wild card era...this will be the A's fourth postseason berth in the last seven years and their ninth in the last 19 seasons...over the last seven years, only the Dodgers (5) have more than four postseason appearances (Cardinals could also get their fifth) and over the last 19 seasons only the Yankees (15), Cardinals (12), Red Sox (10) and Braves (10) have more than nine (Dodgers could also get their 10th)...this is the A's 27th postseason appearance all-time, a total surpassed only by the Yankees (54), Dodgers (31) and Cardinals (28).

*A's vs. ANGELS:* Oakland trails season series 8-9...the A's went 5-5 in Oakland and are 3-4 in Anaheim...have scored 108 runs, which is most in A's history vs. Angels (104 in 1961 by KC A's)...have lost each of the previous four season series and are 39-54 (.419) against Los Angeles over the last five years...this marks the first time the Athletics franchise (Kansas City and Oakland) has lost four straight season series to the Angels...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 436-375 vs. the Angels...that includes 228-177 in Oakland and 208-198 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 485-452 against the Angels.

#### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Matt Chapman** leads the majors with an Oakland record 25 doubles since the All-Star Break and ranks second with an Oakland record tying 42 extra base hits...*Khris Davis* has a career-high and Major League leading 47 home runs, which is tied for third in Oakland history and tied for fifth in Athletics history...now has 132 career home runs in an A's uniform, which ties Terry Steinbach for 10th most in Oakland history...has an Athletics record 26 home runs since the All-Star Break...has a career-high 121 RBI, which ranks second in the majors and sixth in Oakland history...*Blake Treinen* has a 0.79 ERA, which leads all relievers and is the lowest in ML history among pitchers with 75 or more innings pitched...has 98 strikeouts and has a chance to become the first pitcher in Major League history to save 30 games, compile an ERA under 1.00 and strike out 100 batters.

#### OAKLAND A'S 50th ANNIVERSARY MOMENTS

In **1983** rookie pitcher Mike Warren no hits the Western Division Champion Chicago White Sox in A's 3-0 win...in **1988** the A's defeat Twins 6-2 for their 102<sup>nd</sup> win of season, breaking Oakland record of 101 set in 1971... Oakland would go on to win 104 games...in **1991** Rickey Henderson is a perfect 5 for 5 as the A's defeat Texas 19-5...Jose Canseco is 4 for 4 and Henderson, Canseco and Dave Henderson drive in four runs each...in **2001** Miguel Tejada hits for the cycle, capping the feat with a seventh inning grand slam in the A's 8-4 win at Seattle.

# TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Trevor Cahill (6-4, 3.91 ERA)

**FOR STARTERS:** Is 6-4 with a 3.91 ERA in 20 starts...the wins and starts are his most since 2013 with Arizona (8 wins, 25 starts)...his innings pitched (106.0 and strikeouts (98) are his most since 2014 with the Diamondbacks (110.2 ip, 105 so)...currently has a career low in fewest home runs per nine innings (0.68).

LAST FIVE STARTS: Is 1-2 with a 7.45 ERA (16 er in 19.1 ip) and .320 (24-for-75) opponents batting average over his last five starts...has tossed five innings or fewer in all five starts...has walked 15 batters in 19.1 innings (6.98 per nine innings) after issuing 25 walks over his first 86.2 innings and 15 starts (2.60 per nine innings)...walked a season-high six batters Aug. 29 at Houston and Sept. 9 vs. Texas.

**HOME AND AWAY:** Went 5-1 with a 1.84 ERA and .179 opponents batting average in 11 starts at home and is 1-3 with a 7.02 ERA (33 er in 42.1 ip) and .301 (50-for-166) opponents average in nine starts on the road...took the loss in his last start last Sunday against Minnesota to snap an 11-game home winning streak...it was his first loss at home since July 6, 2016 against Cincinnati...did not allow a run in five of his 11 starts in Oakland and his home ERA is fifth lowest in the majors among pitchers with 60 or more innings pitched at home...his road ERA is fifth highest in the majors among pitchers with 40 or more innings on the road...picked up the win July 26 at Texas to snap a six-game road losing streak...it was his first win on the road since Aug. 20 2016 at Colorado.

**QUALIFICATIONS:** Has 106.0 innings pitched...based on a minimum of 100 innings pitched, he ranks fourth in the American League in fewest home runs per nine innings (0.68) and sixth in opponents slugging percentage (.357).

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has held the opposition to a .117 (23-for-197) batting average with two strikes...has allowed a .198 (19-for-96) opponents batting average to hitters leading off an inning but has 12 walks and two hit batters for a .300 on-base percentage...opponents are hitting .326 (28-for-86) with runners in scoring position but that mark drops to .229 with RISP and two outs.

**BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK:** Is 5-2 with a 4.70 ERA (28 er in 53.2 ip) in 11 starts since the All-Star Break after going 1-2 with a 3.10 ERA (18 er in 52.1 ip) in nine starts before the break.

**AGAINST THE WEST:** Is 2-1 with a 5.28 ERA (26 er in 44.1 ip) in nine starts against American League West teams compared to 4-3 with a 2.92 ERA (20 er in 61.2 ip) in 11 starts against everyone else.

**DAYS REST:** Is scheduled to start on five days rest...is 4-1 with a 5.12 ERA (18 er in 31.2 ip) in six starts on four days rest and 2-3 with a 3.39 ERA (28 er in 74.1 ip) in 14 starts on five days rest or more.

**1,000 STRIKEOUTS:** Struck out Jurickson Profar to start the second inning Sept. 9 against Texas for the 1,000th strikeout of his career...struck out 732 batters in 1066.2 innings with his first three teams (Oakland, Arizona and Atlanta), an average of 6.18 strikeouts per nine innings...was released by the Braves on June 19, 2015 and signed by the Dodgers to a minor league contract July 2, 2015...has 273 strikeouts in 272.2 innings since then (9.01 per nine innings).

**BRIEFLY:** Is 5-2 with a 4.87 ERA (31 er in 57.1 ip), .246 (52-for-211) opponents batting average and 29 walks (4.55 per nine innings) in 12 starts since he was reinstated from the disabled list July 12...went 1-2 with a 2.77 ERA, .214 opponents batting average and 11 walks (2.03 per nine innings) over his first eight starts...has two stints on the disabled this year as he was out from May 6 to 15 with a right elbow impingement and June 11 to July 11 with a strained right achilles...was signed by the A's as a free agent March 19 and made two spring training appearances before he was optioned to Nashville March 28...was recalled from Triple-A Nashville April 17.

2018 HIGHLIGHTS: Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville April 17 and started and won that day in a 10-2 victory over Chicago (AL)...tossed 7.0 shutout innings and allowed five hits and two walks in his first start as an Athletic since Sept. 27, 2011 at Seattle...struck out a career-high 12 batters in just 6.0 innings May 5 against Baltimore...it was his third career game of 10 or more strikeouts, his first since June 14, 2013 at San Diego...became the third A's pitcher since at least 1908 to strikeout 12 or more batters in six innings or fewer, the first since Steve Karsay on April 26, 1997 vs. Kansas City (12 so in 6.0 ip)...ended up with a no decision in the A's 2-0, 12-inning win...was 1-1 with a 2.25 ERA in four starts when he was placed on the disabled list May 9 retroactive to May 6 with a right elbow impingement...did not make a rehab appearance before he was reinstated May 16...lost to Boston that day and then had back-to-back no decisions in extra innings on May 22 against Seattle and May 28 against Tampa Bay...tossed 8.0 scoreless innings and allowed just four hits while not walking a batter in the latter contest...was 0-1 with a 3.28 ERA and .225 opponents batting average in four starts after returning from the DL and was 1-2 with a 2.77 ERA and .214 opponents batting aver-

age in eight starts before returning to the DL a second time...was placed on the 10-day DL June 14 retroactive to June 11 with a right achilles strain...was reinstated July 12 and had a no decision in each of his first two starts...then went 4-0 with a 3.45 ERA over his next five starts from July 26 to Aug. 18...the winning streak was his longest since he won five in a row from Aug. 17-Sept. 21, 2013 while pitching for Arizona...was the winning pitcher in his 200th career start, a 6-2 A's win over Toronto on July 31...combined with Petit, Trivino and Buchter on a five-hit shutout in the A's 6-0 win over Detroit on Aug. 5 in Oakland...struck out 10, which was his second game of 10 or more strikeouts this year and the fourth of his career...had a no decision in his 300th career appearance, a 5-4 A's loss at Houston Aug. 29.

**LAST START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-1 loss to Minnesota last Sunday in Oakland...allowed a two-run home run to Cave in the first inning but the A's got one of those runs back in the second...he then allowed three runs, one earned, in the fourth inning...Kepler had a RBI single and Adrianza a RBI double, and he was relieved by Kelley, who allowed a Gimenez sacrifice fly, with one out in the fourth inning

### TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Brett Anderson (4-5, 4.42 ERA): Was reinstated from the 10-day disabled list Sept. 13 and is 1-1 with a 6.57 ERA and .321 opponents batting average in three starts since his return...was placed on the DL Aug. 28 with a strained left forearm and did not have a rehab assignment...has walked one batter or fewer in each of his last 11 starts and has issued five free passes in 57.0 innings over that stretch (0.79 per nine innings)...is 3-3 with a 3.69 ERA and .248 opponents batting average in 10 starts since the All-Star Break after going 1-2 with a 6.08 ERA and .356 opponents average in six starts before the break...had a no decision in his last start, a 10-8 A's loss in 11 innings at Seattle on Tuesday (2.1 ip, 7 h, 5 r, 5 er, 3 so, 2 hr)...is 2-3 with a 3.36 ERA (64.1 ip, 53 h, 24 r, 24 er, 14 bb, 40 so, 3 hr) in 12 career appearances, including nine starts, against Los Angeles...is 1-0 with a 1.54 ERA (11.2 ip, 7 h, 2 r, 2 er, 0 bb, 7 so, 1 hr) in two starts this year.

- The A's bullpen was credited with its 44th win of the season Wednesday night, which is an on-going Athletics record for wins by the bullpen...it is also second most in Major League history (TB 52 in 2018)...are 44-16 (.733), which is the best winning percentage in the Majors.
- A's relievers have 628.1 innings pitched, which is an Athletics record, 2nd most in the majors this year and third most in Major League history.
- Has compiled a 3.05 ERA (110 er in 325.0 ip) over the last 75 games dating back to July 3.
- Has converted 43-of-60 (71.7%) save opportunities, which is fifth best in the Majors...rank sixth in the American League in saves.
- Ranks second in the AL in opponents on-base percentage (.295), third in OPS (.662), third in batting average (.222), strikeouts (614), ERA (3.37), and slugging percentage (.367).
- Has allowed 83-of-238 (34.9%) inherited runners to score, which is the fourth highest percentage in the Majors.

- Is batting .314 (80-for-255) with 14 home runs, 39 RBI and a .974 OPS in 62 games since the All-Star Break after hitting .250 with 10 home runs, 29 RBI and a .776 OPS in 81 games before the break...leads the majors in doubles since the break (25), is second in extra base hits (42), tied for third in hits (80), and is fourth in runs (51)...the 25 doubles are an Oakland postbreak record and are the most by an Athletic since Ferris Fain had 26 with the 1952 Philadelphia A's...the 42 extra base hits tie the Oakland record (42, Giambi in 2001 and Jackson in 1975).
- Has 19 doubles in his last 40 games and now has 42 for the season, which is tied for sixth in the American League and tied for fifth in Oakland history.
- Has scored 99 runs, which is 10th in the AL...needs one more to become the first Athletic to score 100 runs in a season since Nick Swisher had 106 in 2006
