OAKLAND ATHLETICS (97-64) VS. LOS ANGELES ANGELS (79-82)

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's will face New York in Wild Card game at Yankee Stadium on Wednesday...have won seven of the last 10 games but are 8-7 over the last 15 games...are 42-22 (.656) since the All-Star Break, which is the best record in the majors...are 63-28 (.692) over their last 91 games dating back to June 16, which is the best record in the majors over that span... are 97-64 (.602) overall, which is fourth best re-

cord in American League and majors...are 13-2-2 over last 17 series and 23-3-3 over last 29...are 38-37 (.507) vs. AL West, 59-27 (.686) vs. all other teams.

WINS: The A's won their 97th game of the season last night, which is the eighth most in Oakland history and is the most since 2013 (96-66)...have not won more than 97 games since going 103-59 in 2002...the 97 wins are a 22-win improvement over last year, which is the third biggest turnaround in Oakland history...had a 23-win improvement from 1987 (81) to 1988 (104) and a 29-win improvement from 1979 (54) to 1980 (83).

TWO-THIRDS CROWN: Khris Davis leads Majors with 48 home runs and is 2nd with 123 RBI (J.D. Martinez, 127)...the last A's players to lead American League in two of the three Triple Crown categories was Jose Canseco in 1988 (42 HR, 124 RBI) and Reggie Jackson in 1973 (32 HR, 117 RBI)...his 123 RBI are T4th most in Oakland history behind Jason Giambi (137 in 2000), Miguel Tejada (131 in 2002) and Jose Canseco (124 in 1988)...his 48 homers are 3rdmost in Oakland era behind Mark McGwire (52 in 1996 & 49 in 1987).

KEYSTONE RBI: Jed Lowrie has driven in 99 RBI this season (82 as 2B, 14 as 3B, 2 as DH, 1 as PH)...his 99 RBI as a primary second baseman are the 2nd-most in club history behind Nap Lajoie (125 in 1901)...overall, he ranks 8th in the American League in RBI this season...if he records one more RBI, he'll join Khris Davis as the first pair of A's players with 100+ RBI since 2003 when Eric Chavez (101) and Miguel Tejada (106) did so.

ELITE COMPANY: Matt Chapman (100 R, 42 2B, 24 HR) is just the 7th season in Athletics history that a player collected 100+ runs, 40+ doubles and 20+ home runs...he joined Jason Giambi (109 R, 47 2B, 38 HR in 2001), Wally Moses (113 R, 48 2B, 25 HR in 1937), Bob Johnson (103 R, 44 2B, 21 HR in 1933) and Al Simmons (3x, 152 R, 41 2B, 36 HR in 1930...114 R, 41 2B, 34 HR in 1929...122 R, 43 2B, 24 HR in 1925)...Chapman would join Cleveland's Francisco Lindor, St. Louis' Matt Carpenter, Boston's Mookie Betts, Atlanta's Ozzie Albers & Houston's Alex Bregman as players to accomplish the feat in 2018.

RUN THIS WAY: Matt Chapman (100) and Khris Davis (98) have a chance to be the first pair of Athletics teammates to each reach the century mark in runs scored since 2001 when Jason Giambi (109), Johnny Damon (108) and Miguel Tejada (107) did so...the only AL teams this season with multiple 100+ run teammates are Boston (3), Cleveland (2) and Houston (2).

IN SEPTEMBER: The A's are 16-9 (.640) in September, which is the third best record in the American League...have clinched a winning record for the month and have posted a winning record in each month this year...this is the sixth time in Oakland history the A's have posted a winning record in each month (1971, 1972, 1990, 2003, 2013)...are batting .265 (227-for-858) with a Major League leading 163 runs scored this month...the runs scored are the third most by the A's in September (198 in 2000 & 167 in 2009).

OFFENSE: The A's have set an Athletics franchise record with 566 extra base hits, breaking the mark of 555 set in 2001...rank second in the majors in doubles (321), 2nd in extra base hits, third in home runs (225), fourth in runs (809), third in slugging percentage (.440) and fifth in OPS (.766)...the home runs are fifth most in Athletics history (243 in 1996, 239 in 2000, 235 in 1999, 234 in 2017) and the doubles are fourth (336 in 2004, 334 in 2001, 323 in 1928)...the runs are 5th most in Oakland history (4th is 861 in 1996).

PITCHING: The A's have a 3.49 ERA (225 er in 580.2 ip) since the All-Star Break, which is third lowest in the American League (HOU, 3.39 & CLE, 3.48)...overall, rank fourth in the AL in opponents on-base percentage (.302) and OPS (.693), fourth in batting (.236) and fifth in slugging (.391) and sixth in ERA (3.80)...are tied for second in shutouts (14), rank fourth in fewest walks (473) and extra base hits (467) and fifth in fewest home runs (182)...have 1226 strikeouts, which is fifth fewest in the AL but second most in Athletics history...need 18 in the final two games to tie the record of 1244 set in 2014.

HOME AND AWAY SPLITS: The A's are batting .263 (750-for-2847) with 134 home runs and an average of 5.50 runs per game on road (440 runs in 80 games), compared to .241 with 91 home runs and an average of 4.56 runs per game at home...lead MLB in home runs and runs per game on road and rank 2nd in batting...the 134 road home runs are an A's record, two short of the American League record and four short of the MLB record...the A's .465 slugging percentage is currently an Athletics road record

(.458 in 2000)...have 293 extra base hits, which is 7 short of A's record of 300 in 2001...have 440 runs scored, their most on the road since 2001 (461).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 47-33 (.588) on the road, which is T3rd best road record in the majors...the wins are the A's most on the road since going 49-32 in 2002...are 50-31 (.617) at home...are 3-2 on their final road trip of season, a six-game trip to Seattle (2-1) & Los Angeles-AL (1-1)...are 39-21 (.650) on road dating back to May 14 after starting the year 8-12...were 32-11 (.744) over final 43 home games after starting year 18-20 at home.

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 31-13 (.705) in onerun games, which is the best record in the majors...the Athletics record for winning percentage in one-run games is .698 in 1928 (30-13) and the Oakland record is .696 in 2002 (32-14)...the 31 one-run wins are sixth most in Athletics history and are two short of the record of 33 set in 2004.

THE LATE INNINGS: The A's are 70-1 when leading after seven innings and 79-1 when leading after eight...no other team has lost fewer than three games when leading after seven innings and only the Mariners have fewer losses when leading after eight...are tied for the Major League lead in wins when trailing after seven innings (11) and tied for second in wins when trailing after eight (5)...have scored 118 runs in the eighth inning, which is second most in the majors and the most by an A's team since the 1933 Philadelphia A's had 128...also rank second in the majors with 280 runs in the seventh inning or later, which bests the previous Oakland record of 277 in 2000.

THE PLAYOFFS: The A's clinched their third American League Wild Card, their second in the two wild card era...this will be A's fourth postseason berth in last seven years and their ninth in last 19 seasons...over the last seven years, only the Dodgers (6) have more than four postseason appearances and over the last 19 seasons only the Yankees (15), Cardinals (12), Red Sox (10), Braves (10) & Dodgers (10)...this is A's 27th postseason appearance all-time, a total surpassed only by the Yankees (54), Dodgers (31) and Cardinals (28).

A's vs. ANGELS: Oakland is tied in the season series 9-9...the A's went 5-5 in Oakland and are 4-4 in Anaheim...have scored 113 runs, which is most in A's history vs. Angels (104 in 1961 by KC A's)...have lost each of the previous four season series and are 40-54 (.426) vs. Los Angeles over the last five years... this marks the first time the A's franchise (Kansas City and Oakland) has lost four straight season series to the Angels...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 437-375 vs. Angels...that includes 228-177 in Oakland and 209-198 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 486-452 against the Angels.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Chapman leads majors with Oakland record 25 doubles since All-Star Break and ranks 2nd with Oakland record tying 42 extra base hits...*Khris Davis* has 133 career home runs in an A's uniform, which is 10th most in Oakland history; has A's record 27 home runs since the All-Star Break...has a career-high 123 RBI...*Blake Treinen* has a 0.78 ERA, which leads all relievers and is the lowest in ML history among pitchers with 75 or more innings pitched...has 100 strikeouts and is the first pitcher in MLB history to save 30 games, compile an ERA under 1.00 and strike out 100 batters.

OAKLAND A'S 50th ANNIVERSARY MOMENTS

In **1987** Dave Stewart becomes the A's first 20-game winner in seven years when he picks up the decision in the A's 4-3 victory over Cleveland...in **1995** Dennis Eckersley becomes the ninth major leaguer to pitch 900 games in his career when he tossed one inning at California...in **2000** the A's set Oakland records with 23 runs scored and a 21-run margin of victory in a 23-2 win over Texas...in **2014** Brandon Moss hits two home runs and sets an Athletics postseason record with five RBI in a 9-8, 12-inning loss to Kansas City in the American League Wild Card game.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Brett Anderson (4-5, 4.42 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was reinstated from the 10-day disabled list Sept. 13 and is 1-1 with a 6.57 ERA (12.1 ip, 17 h, 9 r, 9 er, 1 bb, 8 so) and .321 (17-for-53) opponents batting average in three starts since his return...was placed on the DL Aug. 28 with a strained left forearm and did not have a rehab assignment...it was his second stint on the DL this year as he was also out from May 19 to July 7 with a strained left shoulder...was signed by the A's to a minor league contract March 19 and began the season at Triple-A Nashville... was selected by Oakland May 2 and went 0-2 with a 7.63 ERA and .379 opponents batting average in four starts before his first stint on the DL...went 3-2 with a 2.90 ERA and .239 opponents batting average in nine starts in between his DL stints.

DON'T WALK: Has walked one batter or fewer in each of his last 11 starts and has issued five free passes in 57.0 innings over that stretch (0.79 per nine innings)...has walked just 13 batters in 77.1 innings overall and his average of 1.51 walks per nine innings is the lowest of his career (1.76 in 2010)...based on a minimum of 75 innings pitched, it is second lowest in the American League (Kluber, CLE 1.42)...has walked one batter or fewer in 13 of his 16 starts.

BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK: Is 3-3 with a 3.69 ERA (22 er in 53.2 ip) and .248 (50-for-202) opponents batting average in 10 starts since the All-Star Break after going 1-2 with a 6.08 ERA and .356 opponents average in six starts before the break...has walked five in 53.2 innings since the break (0.84 per nine innings) after issuing eight free passes in 23.2 innings before the break (3.04 per nine innings)...is now 27-22 with a 3.82 ERA (176 er in 414.1 ip) in 81 career appearances after the All-Star Break compared to 19-30 with a 4.34 ERA in 75 games before the break.

HOME AND AWAY: Is scheduled to make his 17th start of the season, his 12th on the road...is 2-4 with a 6.07 ERA (31 er in 46.0 ip) and .337 (65-for-193) opponents batting average in 11 starts on the road compared to 2-1 with a 2.01 ERA (7 er in 31.1 ip) and .191 (21-for-110) opponents average in five starts at home...has eight home runs in 46.0 innings on the road, one in 31.1 innings at home.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to pitch on four days rest...is 0-2 with a 5.60 ERA (11 er in 17.2 ip) in four starts on four days rest, 4-3 with a 4.07 ERA (27 er in 59.2 ip) in 12 starts on five days rest or more...over the last two years, he is 1-3 with a 7.30 ERA (30 er in 37.0 ip) in nine starts on four days rest, 7-6 with a 4.42 ERA (47 er in 95.2 ip) in 20 starts on five days rest or more.

BY INNING: Has a 4.94 ERA (17 er in 31.0 ip) in the first and second innings, a 7.30 ERA (20 er in 24.2 ip) in innings three and four and a 0.42 ERA (1 er in 21.2 ip) from the fifth inning on...has surrendered five of his nine home runs in the third inning.

MONTH BY MONTH: His ERA and opponents batting average improve each of his first three months...went 0-2 with a 7.63 ERA and .379 opponents batting average in four starts in May and then compiled a 2-1 record, a 3.98 ERA and .309 opponents average in four starts in July...was 1-1 with a 2.15 ERA and .184 opponents average in five starts in August...did not allow a run in three of his August starts and the game went into extra innings in two of his three no decisions...walked just two batters in 29.1 innings...however, is 1-1 with a 6.57 ERA (9 er in 12.1 ip) and .321 (17-for-53) opponents batting average in three starts in September.

THIS AND THAT: Is scheduled to make his 17th start of the season, which are his most since 2015 when he made 31 with the Dodgers...his 77.1 innings pitched are also his most since 2015 (180.1)...has walked just three batters to lead off an inning...has yielded eight of his nine home runs and surrendered 33 of his 37 RBI to right-handed hitters...has received two runs of support or fewer in nine of his 16 starts...opponents are hitting .339 (21-for-62) with runners in scoring position.

2018 *HIGHLIGHTS:* Left his start on May 18 at Toronto after just one inning with a strained left shoulder...combined with Petit, Buchter and Pagán on a five-hit shutout in the A's 6-0 win at Cleveland July 8...it was his first win as an Athletic since April 7, 2013...struck out six in a 15-3 win at Texas July 23... those were his most strikeouts in a game since Sept. 15, 2015 vs. Colorado... retired each of the first 16 batters he faced Aug. 3 against Detroit but had a no decision in the A's 1-0, 13-inning win...allowed a two-run home run to Calhoun in the third inning Aug. 10 at Los Angeles (AL), which was the first home run he surrendered to a left-handed hitter since July 28, 2015 at Oakland (Reddick)...left with a 3-2 lead but the bullpen blew the save in a 4-3 loss...tossed 7.2 scoreless innings and allowed five hits without walking a batter in a 2-0, 12-inning loss to Seattle Aug. 15...it was his longest outing since Oct. 1, 2015 at San Francisco (7.2 ip) and his longest scoreless outing since May 26, 2011 at Los Angeles-AL (8.0 ip)...combined with Familia and Trivino on a two-hit shutout in the A's 6-0 win over Texas on Aug. 21 in Oakland...did not allow a run over the first two innings of his start on Aug. 27 at Houston to extend his scoreless streak to 18.2 innings.

WITH NASHVILLE: Is 2-1 with a 2.78 ERA and .248 opponents batting average in seven starts with Triple-A Nashville...has not allowed a home run in 32.1 innings...has 36 strikeouts (10.02 per nine innings) and has walked just six (1.67 per nine innings) for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 6.0...his opponents batting average includes a .223 (21-for-94) mark against right-handed hitters compared to .314 (11-for-35) against left-handers...has yielded a .156 batting average and just one walk to batters leading off an inning (.182 on-base percentage)...opponents are hitting .182 with the bases empty, .346 with runners on...including .333 with runners in scoring position.

45-16, 3.34 ERA (236 er in 636.1 ip) Saves/Opportunities: 43-for-60 (71.7%)

- The A's bullpen was credited with its 45th win of the season last night, which is an on-going Athletics record for wins by the bullpen...it is also second most in Major League history (TB 54 in 2018)...are 45-16 (.738), which is the best winning percentage in the Majors.
- A's relievers have 636.1 innings pitched, which is an Athletics record and second most in the majors this year.
- Has compiled a 3.00 ERA (111 er in 333.0 ip) over the last 75 games dating back to July 3.
- Has converted 44-of-61 (72.1%) save opportunities, which is fifth best in the Majors...rank sixth in the American League in saves.
- Ranks second in the AL in opponents on-base percentage (.295) and ERA (3.34), third in OPS (.659), third in batting average (.221), strikeouts (621), and slugging percentage (.364).
- Has allowed 83-of-238 (34.9%) inherited runners to score, which is the fourth highest percentage in the Majors.

- Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville September 7 for his seventh stint with the A's this year...pitched in relief that day against Texas (3.0 ip, 3 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 3 so)...it was his first relief appearance since May 9, 2015 Seattle.
