Angels have spent last 79 days in fourth place...13 remaining games are with divisional foes: Six vs. Oakland (3 home, 3 road), three vs. Texas (all at home), three at Houston and one vs. Seattle...Angels are 21-20-7 thru 48 series... On Monday, Angels set out on final road trip to Oakland (Sept. 18-20) and Houston (Sept. 21-23).

**HEAN MACHINE:** Starter Andrew Heaney has set career highs in wins (9), starts (27), strikeouts (161) and innings pitched (165.0)...He is the first Halo to reach 160+ Ks since 2015 (Garrett Richards; 176 & Hector Santiago; 162) and has four 10+ strikeout games this season... In his last outing Sunday at CWS, he logged a career-high 12 strikeouts joining Frank Tanana as only left-handers in team history to record 12+ Ks with zero walks in a game.

**NORTHWEST NIGHTMARE:** Mike Trout's 15 extra-base hits against Seattle are the most XBH during a single campaign against Mariners...Trout has hit safely in 15 of 17 meetings with M's this season, batting .435 (27/62) with 15 runs, eight doubles, one triple, six HRs & 10 RBI (15 BB/7 IBB).

**HALO HARDWARE:** Yesterday, the Angels announced the 2018 team awards with Mike Trout taking home Team MVP honors (7<sup>th</sup> straight season, Co-MVP in 2017 with A. Simmons) and tonight's starter Andrew Heaney securing the Nick Adenhardt Award as top hurler... Each honor is voted on by teammates.

**TIED WITH TY:** Trout's 63.4 career WAR is currently tied with Ty Cobb for tops all time by a position player through age-26 season.

**FROM THE START:** Since August 28<sup>th</sup>, Angels' starting pitchers have fashioned a 2.95 ERA (73.1 – 24 ER), second-best ERA in MLB in span and tops in A.L. (16 G; .232 BAA).

**KNOW THIS:** Mike Trout is two stolen bases shy of second career 30 HR/25 SB campaign (also, 2012)...Would be only player in franchise history with multiple 30/25 seasons (Bobby Bonds in 1977)...Leads MLB with 114 walks, two shy of his club record (116 BB) set in 2016.

**SHO OFF:** Shohei Ohtani is the seventh Japanese-born rookie with 40 extra-base hits, first since Nori Aoki in 2012...Ohtani has hit in 10 of last 12 games, batting .372 (16/43) with 12 runs, three doubles, a triple, four home runs, three SBs & 11 RBI in span... With 19 HRs, he has passed Seattle's Kenji Johjima (18 HR in 144 games in 2006) for most rookie HRs by a Japanese native...Ohtani has 19 HRs in 90 non-pitching games... With next HR, will be second-fastest Halo rookie to reach 20 HR (Wally Joyner hit 20 by his 82<sup>nd</sup> game in 1986) and eighth rookie in club history to reach 20 HRs...Ohtani is lone MLB player in 2018 with multiple games of two HRs and a stolen base (ESPN STATS)... He is the first Halo since Tim Salmon in 2000 to win A.L. Player of the Week honors twice in one season.

**FISH FACTS:** Mike Trout is just second A.L. player with seven seasons of 60+ extra-base hits by age 26 season-or-younger (Alex Rodriguez)...Trout has tied team record reaching base 4+ times on 16 occasions this season to equal mark set by Brian Downing in 1987 (STATS LLC)... Trout has joined Willie Mays as the only players with three seasons of 30 HR/20 SB prior to their age-27 campaign...Vying to be fifth player all-time (first in A.L.) with 120 walks, 30 HRs and 25 stolen bases: Barry Bonds (6 seasons), Jeff Bagwell (2 seasons), Chipper Jones (1999) and Bobby Abreu (2004).

**PUJOLS SURGERIES:** Albert Pujols underwent another surgery Wednesday, a procedure to remove a bone spur from his right elbow...He had an arthroscopic debridement of his left knee on August 30<sup>th</sup>...Pujols ranks 23<sup>rd</sup> all-time with 3,082 hits (Ichiro is 22<sup>nd</sup> with 3,089) and sixth all-time with 633 home runs (Willie Mays is 5<sup>th</sup> w/660 HR)... One of four players with 3,000 hits & 600 HR (Mays, Aaron & ARod).

**HI, MY NAME IS...** 59 players (35 pitchers-16 starters) have appeared in 2018 to set single-season franchise marks (MLB record for players used is 64 by 2014 Texas Rangers)...15 players have made MLB debuts in 2018 breaking team record of 12 (1996 & 1975).

**GOLD STANDARD:** Three-time Gold Glover Andrelton Simmons leads MLB shortstops with 216 putouts and has fourth-fewest errors (9) in junior circuit among shortstops (min. 100 GS)...Leads MLB with a 17.9 Ultimate Zone Rating in 2018 (UZR) – FanGraphs... Since 2015, his 96 defensive runs saved (DRS) also lead MLB...Thru 915 career games, Simmons' defensive WAR is 25.1 – best by any shortstop in MLB history...
