#### SATURDAY, MARCH 31, 2018 OAKLAND, CA

LEADING OFF: Halos are 1-1 after two games for second straight season (started 2-1 and 2-2 in Oakland in 2017)... 2018 represents the Angels' 58th MLB season and 53rd campaign in Anaheim...LAA has dropped each of last five season openers (2014-18) after winning each of five previous openers (2009-13)...LAA holds an all-time record of 10 games over .500 at 4,558-4,548-3...Today marks the 9,110th regular season game in team history...Following this series, Angels open the home slate vs. Cleveland (April 2-4) and Oakland (April 6-8).

SKIPPIN' UP: With a win today, Mike Scioscia (1,571 wins) will pass Dick Williams (1,571 wins) for sole possession of 21<sup>st</sup> on all-time managerial wins list.

ELIAS SAYS: Mike Trout's HR last night was his 14th in 58 games played in Oakland. Trout has hit at least one HR at Oakland in each of the last seven seasons, the longest streak by a visiting player since Mike Napoli connected there in each of seven straight seasons from 2006 to 2012.

IT'S A SHOE-IN: In his last six starts vs. Oakland, Matt Shoemaker is 4-0 with a 2.00 ERA (36 IP – 8 ER) with 31 strikeouts...In six career starts at the Coliseum, he is 2-0 with a 3.21 ERA (33.2 IP - 12 ER).

#### FOR OPENERS:

- Shohei Ohtani joins Hideki Matsui, Kaz Matsui, Tsuyoshi Shinjo and Kosuke Fukudome as Japanese-born players with a hit on Opening Day in their first MLB at-bat.
- LAA had three players (Calhoun, Cozart & Maldonado) post three hits apiece on Opening Day for first time in Club history...Angels also matched a team record with 3 HRs on Opening Day (Pujols, Cozart, Calhoun) - 6th time.
- Albert Pujols hit his 5th career Opening Day HR to tie Ian Kinsler & Bryce Harper for MLB lead among actives.
- LAA has now played extra innings on Opening Day five times: 2018 at OAK (L, 5-6), 2013 at CIN (W, 3-1), 1986 at SEA (L, 4-8), 1982 at OAK (L, 2-3) & 1966 at CWS (L, 2-3).
- Kole Calhoun joins Dave Parker (1991) as only Angels with a triple and a home run on Opening Day.
- Zack Cozart is first Angel to homer in his Halo debut on Opening Day since Hideki Matsui in 2010.

MARCH ON: 2018 marks the sixth time the Halos open a campaign in the month of March...Angels are 1-5 all-time in March season openers, last coming in 2014 (March 31; 10-3 loss at Seattle)...March 29th marked the earliest Opening Day date in Club history ... Today marks the first time the Angels will have played three regular season games in March (are now 2-5 all-time in the month).

THE MANAGER: Mike Scioscia is the longest tenured manager in the Majors (19th season) and the only active manager to collect over 1,000 victories with current club...His current .538 (1,571-1,347) winning percentage and 1,570 wins are both tops in franchise history... Scioscia is one of just four active managers with at least 1,500 career wins (Bochy, Baker & Showalter).

VS. OAKLAND: Thursday marked the sixth Opening Day meeting between the Angels and A's, tied for second-most openers vs. one opponent (CWS)...Halos claimed 2017 series 12-7 (5-5 on road) and have won six of last eight meetings...LAA has won four consecutive season series vs. A's (2014-17)...Since 2013, Mike Trout is batting .320 (108/337) with 24 HR & 56 RBI in 88 games vs. Oakland.

ONLY ONE: There have been 19,183 people to play Major League Baseball (entering 2018). Of those players, just one of them has 200 HR, 150 SB, and a .400 OBP through his first seven seasons. His name is Mike Trout.

3000/600: Albert Pujols is 30 hits shy of 3,000...When he reaches the mark, he will become just the fourth player in MLB history with at least 3,000 knocks and 600 HRs joining Hank Aaron, Willie Mays and Alex Rodriguez

MORE ALBERT: Puiols is vving to become the 32nd player all time with 3,000 hits, the sixth foreign born player to accomplish the feat and the second player to do so in an Angels' uniform (Rod Carew in 1985).

NEW HALOS: Angels Opening Day active roster features seven players new to the organization: Luke Bard, Jim Johnson, Shohei Ohtani, Rene Rivera, Zack Cozart, Ian Kinsler and Chris Young.

HOT SPRINGS: Several Halos posted strong numbers during Spring Training including Zack Cozart (.353, 4 HR, 9 RBI), Kole Calhoun (.353, 1 HR, 9 RBI), Mike Trout (.308, 3 HR, 8 RBI), Justin Upton (3 HR, 11 RBI), Jose Alvarez (1-0, 2.38), Garrett Richards (1-0, 2.84) and Nick Tropeano (2-0, 3.12)

LEFT FIELD TURNOVER: The 2018 season marks the seventh consecutive year the Angels have a new Opening Day starting left fielder (franchise record for LF). Upton (2018), Maybin (2017), Nava (2016), Joyce (2015), Hamilton (2014), Trumbo (2013), Wells (2012).

**OHTANI = BASEBALL RARITY**: The last time a player started as a pitcher and a non-pitcher in the first 10 games of a season was 1920, when both Joe Bush (Red Sox) and Clarence Mitchell (Dodgers) started as pitchers and outfielders...Last player to start as a pitcher and a non-pitcher within the same season was Rick Rhoden (Yankees) in 1988 (30 starts as pitcher, one as DH). INDIANS ON DECK: Angels will open at home vs. the Tribe for the fifth time in club annals (1965, 1980, 1999 and 2002)...In last such meeting, Halos were shutout 6-0 by Bartolo Colon...Halos have dropped 11 straight and 15 of last 16 games to the Tribe ... A loss to the Indians in next meeting would match longest losing streak in Club history vs. one team (also to Baltimore from 1979-80 and Kansas City in 1975)...LAA has dropped last 10 games in Cleveland (9-20 last 29 there)...Halos are 6-6 in last 12 at the Big A.

#### TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER – RHP MATT SHOEMAKER 0-0, --- ERA

First regular season start since June 14, 2017 vs. New York (A.L.)

Entering sixth Major League season...Made Angels Opening Day roster for fifth consecutive season.

- 2018 SPRING TRAINING: In five Spring Training starts, went 2-2 with a 5.71 ERA (17.1 IP 11 ER)...Led Angels pitching staff with 18 strikeouts... Tossed four scoreless innings in last Spring start on Monday at Dodger Stadium. WELCOME BACK: Today marks first regular season start for Angels since June 14, 2017 vs. New York (A.L.)...Exited that start against the Yankees with a right forearm strain and missed remainder of season on disabled list....Had season cut short for a second consecutive season (missed final month of 2016 season after being struck on right side
- of head by a line drive off bat of Kyle Seager. GOOD NIGHT SHOE: Has a career record of 34-19 with a 3.71 ERA (412 IP – 170 ER) in night games, compared with a 4-11 record and 4.50 ERA (102 IP – 51 ER) in day games...Last season, was 6-0 with a 3.56 ERA (55.2 IP – 22 ER) in night games, compared with a 0-3 record and 6.95 ERA (22 IP – 17 ER) in day games.
- TALE OF TWO HALVES: Owns a 4.56 career ERA (329.1 IP 167 ER) in the first half of the season, compared with a 2.63 ERA (184.2 IP – 54 ER) after the All-Star Break.
- HURT BY THE HOMER: Yielded 15 home runs last year across his 14 starts...24 of 41 runs allowed scored via HR.
- VS. OAKLAND: In 12 career games (11 starts) against the A's, is 5-2 with a 3.50 ERA (61.2 IP 24 ER)...Made two starts against the A's last year, and went 1-0 with a 3.60 ERA (10 IP 4 ER)...In last six starts vs. Oakland, is 4-0 with a 2.00 ERA (36 IP – 8 ER) and 31 strikeouts.
- AT OAKLAND COLISEUM: In six career starts at the Coliseum, is 2-0 with a 3.21 ERA (33.2 IP 12 ER)...Only start in Oakland last year, was season debut on April 4 (ND; 5 IP, 4 H, 2 ER, 3 BB, 4 SO)...Has allowed just four earned runs in his last 24 innings pitched at the ballpark (1.50 ERA in that span – dating back to Sept. 1, 2015).
- 2017 RECAP: In 14 starts for the Angels last season, went 6-3 with a 4.52 ERA (77.2 IP 39 ER)...Led Angels pitching staff with 69 strikeouts at the time of season ending injury (June 14)...In last seven starts, was 5-1 with a 3.86 ERA (39.2 IP – 17 ER), before suffering the right forearm strain in final start against the Yankees.
- HOME COOKING: In last 16 home starts, is 9-2 with a 2.78 ERA (103.2 IP 32 ER) with 111 strikeouts...In that span (since May 21, 2016), ranks fourth in A.L. in home ERA (min. 15 GS) behind Corey Kluber (2.22), Justin Verlander (2.57) and Lance McCullers (2.67).
- CAREER NOTES: Owns a 38-30 record and 3.87 ERA (514 IP 221 ER) with 457 strikeouts in 94 games (86 starts) for Angels.
